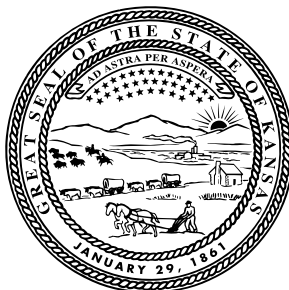

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health Care Finance (DHCF), is proposing to change the reimbursement methodology for critical access hospitals (CAHs). Effective January 1, 2013, pending CMS approval, a CAH adjustment factor (CAF) will be applied to CAH reimbursement for the inpatient discharges and outpatient dates of service on or after January 1, 2013. KanCare managed care organizations (MCOs) are required to adopt the methodology as the basis of their reimbursement for CAHs. The hospital-specific CAF is a prospective factor rather than a settlement, but it is calculated using experience in previous cost reporting years.

The Division of Health Care Finance anticipates moving \$5,840,021 in FFY 2013 and \$11,680,041 in FFY 2014 from the state plan authority to the Kansas 1115 Waiver authority, with the result being no expected increase or decrease in annual aggregate expenditures.

Contained in the permit is a schedule of compliance requiring the permittee to decommission the current wastewater lagoon in compliance with KDHE requirements following the installation and startup of the evaporator system.

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-294. Cosentino’s Price Chopper grocery give-a-way. (a) During the term of this promotion with participating chain numbers 1436 and 1732 Cosentino’s Price Chopper stores in Kansas, for every Super Kansas Cash single ticket purchase of \$3 or more, the player shall receive an entry for the “Grocery Give-A-Way” promotion drawing. Lottery terminals shall automatically dispense an entry form for each \$3 or more Super Kansas Cash single ticket purchase at participating Cosentino’s Price Chopper Kansas lottery retailers during the term of this promotion. The qualifying Super Kansas Cash purchase may be for a single draw or for multiple draws.

(b) The term of this promotion shall be from 5 a.m. on October 1, 2012, through 11:59 p.m. on October 31, 2012.

(c) During the term of this promotion, drop boxes for the deposit of entries shall be provided by the lottery and placed at all participating Cosentino’s Price Chopper locations. All drop boxes shall be retrieved by the Kansas lottery at the end of the promotion.

(d) After the term of this promotion has ended, one entry and two alternate entries shall be drawn by the Kansas lottery pursuant to standard lottery drawing procedures for each of the four Price Chopper grocery store locations.

Article 15.—RAFFLE GAMES

111-15-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lotto game entitled "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" beginning on or about October 1, 2012, for a drawing to be conducted on or about December 31, 2012.

The rules and regulations for the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-15-1 through 111-15-11, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-12-7-10, Sept. 8, 2010; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012.)

111-15-2. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game:

(a) "Available ticket(s)" or "ticket(s) available for sale" means one or any number of tickets from one through 150,000 that is available to sell during the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game.

(b) "Check-A-Ticket Machine" means an electronic machine operated by the Kansas lottery for the purpose of determining whether or not an online ticket is a winning ticket.

(c) "Computer pick" or "quick pick" means the selection of a six-digit number by the computer system, which appears on a ticket and is played by a player in the game. This is the only type of ticket sold by a retailer for the game.

(d) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(e) "Early Bird Drawings" means a series of drawings for prizes to be held on October 14, 21, and 28, 2012, and November 4 and 11, 2012, before final raffle drawings on December 31, 2012.

(f) "Electronic drawing machine" or "random number generator" means the electronic device approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery to electronically select the winning numbers for this drawing.

(g) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the ticket a person has purchased.

(h) "Online lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(i) "Order drawn" means the sequential order in which a "WINNING" ticket or tickets are selected during the drawing process.

(j) "Pari-mutuel prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash

lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game.

(k) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(l) "Serial number" means the identifying number printed on the top line of the ticket.

(m) "Set Prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, and which will be equal to the prize amount established by these rules for the prize level.

(n) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(o) "Ticket Number" means the six-digit number that was selected by the computer, which appears on the face of the ticket and is identified on the ticket as such.

(p) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(q) "Winning number" or "winning numbers" means a six-digit number which is selected by an electronic drawing machine to be a winner of a prize in this drawing.

(r) "Winning ticket" or "winning tickets" means a raffle ticket which was available for sale for this game where the ticket number matches a winning number drawn for the raffle, in exact order, reading from left to right. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012.)

111-15-3. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" is a raffle drawing which offers a total of 150,000 online tickets available for sale. Each ticket shall bear a "TICKET NUMBER" on the face of the ticket. The Kansas lottery will conduct "Holiday Millionaire Raffle Early Bird Drawings" according to the following schedule, unless otherwise determined by the executive director:

For each early bird drawing, one ticket number will be drawn to determine the winner of one \$10,000 prize. A ticket must be purchased before 8:59 p.m. the day of the drawing to be eligible for that drawing. In the event a ticket wins the prize in an early bird drawing, the ticket will remain eligible for any remaining drawings, including the final drawing held on December 31, 2012. Then, on a date specified in these rules, an electronic drawing machine, which has been approved by the executive di-

rector of the Kansas lottery, shall randomly select a total of 2,551 "WINNING NUMBERS." Each "WINNING NUMBER" consists of a six-digit number as it appears in exact order reading from left to right. A player wins by exactly matching his or her "TICKET NUMBER" to a "WINNING NUMBER" that was selected in the drawing. The first "WINNING NUMBER" selected during the drawing process shall be the grand prize winner. The next 25 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the twenty-seventh (27th) "WINNING NUMBER" through the fifty-first (51st) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the third prize winners. The next 2,500 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the fifty-second (52nd) "WINNING NUMBER" through the two thousand five hundred fifty-first (2,551st) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the fourth prize winners. If 145,000 of the 150,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid as a cash lump sum payment. If less than 145,000 tickets available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. To play the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle," a player shall purchase a "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket which bears a ticket number on the face of the ticket.

(b) A "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket shall sell for \$20 (twenty) dollars.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer.

(e) All tickets sold by a retailer shall be a "computer pick" or "quick pick" ticket.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the original winning ticket to and receipt of said ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent.

(g) The only guaranteed methods of win checking a ticket to determine whether the ticket bears a winning number shall be through the Kansas lottery check-a-ticket machines, or submission of a ticket to the Kansas lottery or an authorized retail agent.

(h) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error. Exchange tickets may be printed by the lottery for early bird drawing winners at the discretion of the executive director.

(j) Ticket sales will begin at 5:00 a.m. central time on or about October 1, 2012.

(l) The game will officially close on or about 4:30 a.m. on December 31, 2012.

(m) The drawing shall be conducted on or about December 31, 2012, before noon central time, at a secure location as determined by the executive director, after the game is closed and the drawing official has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(n) Each player shall have the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the ticket. The purchase of a ticket is done at the player's own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES

111-17-6. Tech the Halls second-chance online event drawings. The Kansas lottery will accept online entries into the drawings no earlier than 5 a.m. on October 1, 2012, and no later than 5:00 p.m. on January 29, 2013. Specific tickets eligible for entry into this second-chance online drawing shall be announced on the Kansas lottery's website at www.kslottery.com as part of the "Tech the Halls Second-Chance Online Event Drawings."

(b) A player shall enter the online drawing(s) in accordance with instructions announced on the Kansas lottery's website. All of the non-winning tickets eligible for entry will have "ONLINE ENTRY TICKET" printed on the front of the ticket. A player may enter each drawing an unlimited number of times, but can only win one time in each drawing.

(c) The Kansas lottery will award 25 Sony cyber shot cameras as prizes to players who entered the online event drawings using the \$1 Kansas lottery instant tickets named Stocking Stuffer and Merry Christmose. (d) The \$1 Kansas lottery instant non-winning tickets named Stocking Stuffer and Merry Christmose are only eligible to win Sony camera prizes. The \$2 Kansas lottery instant non-winning tickets named Bingo Bucks are only

eligible to win the Sony PlayStation 3 bundles prize. The \$5 Kansas lottery instant non-winning tickets named Holiday Lights are only eligible to win the Sony S tablet prize. The \$10 Kansas lottery instant non-winning tickets named Winner Wishes are only eligible to win the 50-inch Sony LED television with Blu-ray home theater system prize. Entries not entered in the appropriate prize category shall be disqualified.

(e) There will be four drawings held to select winners of prizes. Each drawing shall select 50 winners. The first 25 winners drawn in each drawing will be awarded prizes. The next 25 winners drawn in each drawing will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn. The winners of the first drawing conducted will be selected from among the \$1 instant Kansas lottery tickets specified in subsection (c) above to receive prizes of Sony cyber shot cameras. The winners of the second drawing conducted will be selected from among the \$2 instant Kansas lottery tickets specified in subsection (c) above to receive prizes of Sony PlayStation 3 bundles. The winners of the third drawing conducted will be selected from among the \$5 instant Kansas lottery tickets specified in subsection (c) above to receive prizes of Sony S tablets. The winners of the fourth drawing conducted will be selected from among the \$10 instant Kansas lottery tickets specified in subsection (c) above to receive prizes of Sony 50-inch LED televisions with Blu-ray home theater systems.

(f) A winner of a prize will be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. A claim form will be mailed to the winner. The winner will be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(g) A player (not including alternate winners) must return his or her completed claim form, and original non-winning ticket entered into the online event drawings within 15 days following the date of the online event drawing.

(h) Completed claim forms and previously entered winning ticket(s) can be mailed by the winner via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winner can deliver the completed claim form and winning ticket to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during the hours that the office is open to the public for business.

(i) If a player fails to fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.
