Public notice is hereby given that Wichita State University (WSU) intends to directly lease, and indirectly sublease through its affiliate corporation Wichita State Innovation Alliance, Inc., subject to all required state approvals, an approximate ground area consisting of 150,000 square feet or less with the potential for expansion for parking, for the private development of one or more partnership buildings. This private development shall be located west of Oliver, between 17th and 18th streets, on the Wichita State University main campus. The university is interested in leasing such ground to any individual, organization, or entity whose presence on campus would advance the university’s applied learning vision or its mission as an educational, cultural, and economic driver for Kansas and the greater public good, and specifically an emphasis on supporting and growing advanced laboratories for research, testing, and innovation in data infrastructure/storage, video surveillance storage, IOT, security, analytics, visualization/modeling, and machine learning/AI. The university intends to lease such ground for any period of time up to sixty-five years, but extended terms and renewal options would be considered. Interested tenants must be willing to be a good fit with the university’s educational mission and identify anticipated benefits to the university, its students, and the WSU community (i.e. applied learning, joint research, faculty start-up, WSU curriculum or program support, etc.), and must agree to the essential ground lease terms and restrictive covenants. Interested tenants will be evaluated on: proposal terms, demonstrated benefit to WSU, design concepts, financial stability, and proposed use. Rental rate shall be assessed per leased or leasable square foot of the building but is negotiable based on term of lease and benefit to the university. Notice Concerning Proposed Kansas Air Quality Construction Permit and Public Hearing

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. HollyFrontier El Dorado Refining, LLC (HFEDR) has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 for the debottlenecking project at their refinery located at 1401 Douglas Rd., El Dorado, KS 67042 in Butler County, Kansas. Emission of oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), carbon monoxide (CO), volatile organic compounds (VOC), sulfur dioxide (SO₂), particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in aerodynamic diameter (PM₁₀), PM equal to or less than 2.5 microns in aerodynamic diameter (PM_{2.5}) and greenhouse gases (GHG), as carbon dioxide equivalent (CO₂e), were evaluated during the permit review process.

The proposed permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, *Prevention of Significant Deterioration* (PSD) which adopt the federal standards, procedures, and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or is better than the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS).

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each regulated pollutant, including GHG, for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental, and economic impacts for each pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions increases for the debottlenecking project indicates that the emission rates of NO_x, CO, VOC, SO₂, PM, PM₁₀, PM_{2.5}, and GHGs (as CO₂e) exceed the significance levels. HFEDR conducted the required BACT analyses and KDHE concurs with their findings.

An ambient air quality impact analysis was performed on the air emissions of PM₁₀, PM_{2.5}, NO_x, SO₂, CO, and Ozone (O₃) from the debottlenecking project. The analysis demonstrated no significant impact on ambient air quality for PM₁₀, PM_{2.5}, NO_x, SO₂, CO, and O₃.

On September 26, 2019, this project established the minor source baseline dates for both PM_{2.5} and PM₁₀. This will be the first PSD increment consuming source in Butler County. Increment modeling results indicated maximum increment consumption as follows: 52% for annual NO₂, 29% for 3-hour SO₂, 98% for 24-hour SO₂, 10 % for annual SO₂, 42% for 24-hour PM₁₀, 7% for annual PM₁₀, 65% for 24-hour PM_{2.5}, and 21% for annual PM_{2.5}.

No assessment of visibility impacts at a Class I area was performed by the facility because there are no Federal Class I areas located within 300 km of the proposed facility. The facility did a visibility impact analysis for a local Class II area, Captain Jack Thomas El Dorado Airport (El Dorado Airport). The El Dorado Airport is located approximately 5.25 kilometers southeast of HFEDR. The results indicate that there are exceedances for the sky and the terrain inside and outside the El Dorado Airport area. Thus, Level 2 VISCREEN analysis was conducted for El Dorado Airport. The results for Level 2 indicate that there are no exceedances of the screening criteria inside or outside of the El Dorado Airport. Therefore, there are no potential visibility impacts for El Dorado Airport that would require additional analysis.

A public comment period has been established to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. The public comment period is to begin on Thursday, September 26, 2019 and end at 12:00 p.m. Monday, October 28, 2019. Written comments should be submitted to Dean Williams, Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Bureau of Air (BOA), 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, KS 66612-1366.

Any member of the public may request to hold a public hearing to provide comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. If a request is received, a public hearing is tentatively scheduled at the Civic Center Breakout Room, 201 E. Central, El Dorado, Kansas, 67042, Tuesday, October 29, 2019, beginning at 2:00 p.m. and will continue until audience members have an opportunity to submit comments. If no requests to hold the public hearing are received by 12:00 p.m. Monday, October 28, 2019, the public hearing will be cancelled. A notice of the cancellation will be posted at the KDHE website at <http://www.kdheks.gov/bar/publicnotice.html>.

If a hearing is conducted, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally or by submission of written materials during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to limit oral presentations to a specific time limit.
