- · Perform rail maintenance of mismatched joints, grinding and repairing separations.
- Perform joint maintenance as necessary with comp or relay bars and replace and/or tighten all loose track bolts.
- · Install new ballast to provide an adequate base for maintaining or exceeding FRA Class-1.
- · Machine tamp, skim lift, and surface tracks removing all cross-level and joint dips.
- Perform turnout rehabilitation on five switches including weld and face points, adjust switches for proper throw and lubricate, and furnish/install switch ties between all switches.
- · Clean up track area according to the description under "Other Responsibilities" in this document.

All pre-existing rail, ties, OTM, or other materials that are removed must be disposed of according to all local, state, and federal regulations.

Minimum Requirements

- 1. Roadway Worker Protection.
- 2. Comply with all Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad requirements.
- 3. Contractors shall comply with all parts of 49 CFR Part 214 and 219 regarding FRA Roadway Worker Safety at all times. Workers and equipment shall remain clear of the track unless they have gained Roadway Worker Protection from a qualified person.
- 4. Contractor, contractor employees, agents, and/or subcontractors must be enrolled and comply with the FRA 219 approved drug testing program.

Senate Bill No. 194

An Act concerning real property; relating to covenants, conditions or restrictions; providing that certain covenants, conditions or restrictions on property owned by a state educational institution that restrict the use of real property to be only for single-family residence purposes or from being used for any purpose other than a single-family residence, and contain discriminatory provisions to restrict ownership or tenancy by race are void.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Any provision of a covenant, condition or restriction that restricts any real property owned by a state educational institution, as defined in K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto: (1) To be used only for single-family residence purposes; or (2) from being used for any purpose other than a single-family residence, and contains discriminatory provisions to restrict ownership or tenancy by race is hereby declared to be against public policy, and such provisions, and any additional amendments, covenants or conditions related thereto, shall be void and unenforceable.

(b) The provisions of this section shall only apply to any covenant, condition or restriction, including any amendments or supplements thereto, established between January 1, 1948, and December 31, 1958.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
