## **Notice of Water Quality Certification**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has drafted a water quality certification per Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA) requested by Mike Christianson, GFT (formerly TranSystems), for Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Railroad. The United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) CWA Section 404 Public Notice No. NWK-2025-00615 found at https://www.nwk.usace.army.mil/Media/Public-Notices. The purpose of the project is to stabilize 1302 linear feet of the actively eroding riverbank to protect railroad infrastructure and reduce sedimentation into Mill Creek in Johnson County. Installation will include placement of rip-rap along the left descending bank, placed to maintain a 1.5:1 slope, and filter fabric laid and keyed in at the toe of the slope. The quantity of material proposed represents the minimal amount of fill necessary to protect the streambank. A small amount of cutting will be required along the right descending bank, but all trees greater than 4-inch diameter-at-breast-height (DBH) will be preserved where feasible. Site construction will occur in the winter/spring of 2026.

In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57a through 63, 28-18-1 through 17, 28-18a-1 through 31 and 33, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, various draft water pollution control documents (permits, notices to revoke and reissue, notices to terminate) have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to waters of the United States and the state of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

The program also coordinates supportive services intended to increase opportunities for families to thrive.

The DEA has been prepared per provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), (Public Law 91-19042 U.S.C. §§ 4321-4347, January 1, 1970), its associated amendments, and VA's implementing regulations (38 CFR, Part 26). VA intends to issue a "Finding of No Significant Impact" (FONSI) following a 30-day comment period, providing there are no substantive comments that warrant further evaluation.

The proposed regulation will help implement the Kansas Pregnancy Resource Act Tax Credit. 2024 House Bill 2465, New Section 8, was enacted as K.S.A. 79-32,316. For tax years beginning after December 31, 2023, a taxpayer is allowed a Kansas income, privilege or premium tax credit equal to 70% of the total amount contributed during the taxable year by the taxpayer to an eligible charitable organization. The term "eligible charitable organization" is defined in K.S.A. 79-32,316 and includes nonprofit organizations dedicated to providing resources for pregnant women.

The proposed regulation establishes contribution rules that are consistent with the rules specified in statute or regulation for other, similar contribution-based credits. These rules allow contributions of stocks, bonds, personal property, or real property to qualify for credit and establish guidelines for valuing these other-than-cash contributions that are consistent with the guidelines specified in statute or regulation for similar contribution-based credits. In addition, the proposed regulation clarifies that distributions to an eligible charitable organization from a separately owned donor advised fund do not qualify as the donor's contributions to an eligible charitable organization. The proposed regulation also clarifies the treatment of contributions through "giving days" and other limited-time fundraising events.

- **5-4-1b. Impairment complaints; regulation of impairing rights.** (a) Each complaint that a prior right to the use of water is being impaired shall be made to the chief engineer or an authorized representative of the chief engineer in writing.
- (b) If the source of supply of the water right claimed to be impaired is groundwater, the complainant shall, upon request of the chief engineer, provide to the chief engineer a written report completed within 180 days preceding the date of the complaint that meets the following requirements:
- (1) Is prepared by a licensed well driller, professional engineer, or professional geologist or an individual who the chief engineer determines is qualified to prepare the report;
- (2) describes the construction and components of the water right's well;
- (3) includes a well log or similar data that shows the depth and extent of the well construction; and
- (4) includes testing and inspection data that shows the depth of the pump in the well column and the extent to which the pump, power unit, well casing, and screen are in good working condition.
- (c) Following receipt by the chief engineer or an authorized representative of the chief engineer of any report required pursuant to this regulation, a complaint of impairment shall be considered submitted for purposes of K.S.A. 82a-717a.
- (d) Following a determination of impairment or a substantial likelihood of impairment by the chief engineer, each impairing or allegedly impairing water right shall be subject to temporary or final order issued in accordance with K.S.A. 82a-717a, and amendments thereto, that contains the chief engineer's determination regarding how to administer each impairing or allegedly impairing water right.
