The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is seeking a qualified consulting firm, or team of firms, to perform construction inspection services on multiple projects in various counties. Summary information for each project is provided below in Table 1.

Interested consultants must upload a proposal by 12:00 p.m. (Central Time) March 25, 2026, to the Bid Express page to be considered for selection.

Consultant Prequalification

Consulting firms interested in providing service on any project listed below must be prequalified by KDOT in the following category(s):

- 241 – Construction Inspection and Testing

If a firm is not currently prequalified by KDOT, a proposal may still be submitted. Firms not prequalified must also provide documentation that demonstrates the firm is qualified for each specified category listed in this notice for the project. Firms must use the KDOT prequalification form to provide this documentation. KDOT 1050 Prequalification Category Definitions (Blue Book) can be found at <https://www.ksdot.gov/doing-business/design-consultants/design-consultant-prequalification>. Consultants may create a team to meet the prequalification requirements. All firms doing business with KDOT must be registered and in good standing under the laws of the State of Kansas at the time of contracting and must comply with applicable state and federal laws, rules, and regulations.

Background and Scope of Projects

With this single solicitation, KDOT is requesting consulting services for construction inspections on the projects listed in Table 1. This table provides summary information for each project. One consultant will be selected to perform services associated with each group listed. Watch the website linked above for updated information. Tabulated information (both in this Request for Proposals and on the website) shall not be relied upon during inspections. It is provided for the convenience of consultants, specifically to aid in making decisions about which projects they are interested in performing.

Specific project needs are subject to modification and/or cancellation at KDOT's discretion.

Anticipated Consultant Scope

The scope of construction inspection services and certifications required will vary for each project and are listed in the table available on the website noted above. Inspection efforts will be managed out of the offices listed. Also included for the convenience of consultants are indications of which grouped projects are currently slated to be performed by the same contractors.

Anticipated Schedule and Key Dates

- Proposals are due by or before 12:00 p.m. (Central Time) March 25, 2026.
- Ranking of proposals is expected to occur on or around March 27, 2026. Negotiations with the most highly ranked firm are expected to begin on or around April 6, 2026. An executed agreement is anticipated shortly thereafter.
- Anticipated scope starts dates and working days or anticipated calendar completion dates are shown in the table. All dates are subject to change.

Instructions for Proposal

- No cost or pricing information shall be submitted with the proposal. Proposals including cost or pricing information will be considered non-responsive and withdrawn from further consideration.

2. The consultant's proposal must not exceed the page limit laid out in Table 2 below (including any cover letter, index, etc.). All pages shall be standard letter size (8.5" x 11"). Any page larger than standard letter size will be counted as two or more pages depending on size.
3. A single PDF (10MB maximum size) of the proposal including all attachments must be uploaded to the appropriate bid form on Bid Express by the proposal due date and time.
4. The proposal PDF file name must read:
 - a. "ConstInsp Multiple Projects_2026.03 Release FIRM NAME"
5. The proposal must be accompanied by Special Attachments No. 8 ("Tax Clearance Certificate"); No. 10 ("Policy Regarding Sexual Harassment"); and No. 12 ("Certification of Company Not Currently Engaged in the Procurement or Obtainment of Certain Equipment, Services, or Systems"). If you need a Tax Clearance Certificate, you can request one at <https://www.ksrevenue.gov/taxclearance.html>. Allow 2-3 business days for processing. All attachments are required for every firm involved in a multi-consultant team. Upload these files as instructed in Bid Express.
6. Note: Federal Restrictions on Foreign Drones - Effective December 22, 2025, the American Security Drone Act of 2023 (ASDA) and OMB Memorandum M-26-02 strictly prohibit the use of federal funds for UAS manufactured by covered foreign entities.

This includes any aircraft, flight controller, camera, or ground control station supplied by a manufacturer that is based in, or subject to the control of, a foreign adversary country, specifically the People's Republic of China.

This prohibition restricts the use of drones from these countries on any federal-aid project even if the drone related costs are billed separately or not at all. Any use of these covered drones including operation, maintenance or data processing on federal aid project is prohibited. KDOT is evaluating adding a contract provision acknowledging this requirement on contracts moving forward. The prime consultant shall remain fully responsible for monitoring their team, (subconsultant and vendor) compliance with this requirement.

7. The outline in Table 2 below describes the expected proposal organization, content sections, and limits on number of pages.
 - a. Each team is limited to a single, one-page cover letter.
 - b. Consultants may indicate interest in any and all projects, indicate preference (s) for up to three projects, and shall indicate both interest and preferences on the "March 2026 Construction Inspections Interest & Preference Form that is provided on the Bid Express page to complete and upload. Also, consultants are to use the bottom of that form to indicate any capacity limitations that need to be taken into account when making selections.
 - c. Thereafter, each team is limited to two pages per project in which they express interest. In these pages, consultants shall:
 - i. Describe the approach they plan to execute to deliver success on the project.
 - ii. Present the relevant qualifications and experience of the people they are proposing will provide the services.
 - iii. Provide the firm's familiarity with KDOT and the project area.
 - d. Finally, consultants are limited to a single, on-page descriptions of general qualifications ("Past Performance" selection plus "Approach to Quality Control" section) regardless of the number of projects in which they are expressing interest.

9. Although not anticipated at this time, KDOT reserves the right to interview for the requested services associated with any of the listed projects prior to making final selections.

The website will allow the contractor to request approval from KDOT to bid as a prime contractor and be included on the “Bid Holders List,” or to be included on the “Non-Bid Holders List” as a subcontractor/supplier. KDOT’s approval is required to bid as a prime contractor. To bid as a prime contractor, KDOT needs to be notified of the intent to bid no later than the close of business on the Monday preceding the scheduled letting date. Failure to obtain prior approval to bid as a prime contractor on any projects listed below will be reason to reject your bid. The Secretary reserves the right to reject bids that do not comply with all requirements for preparing a bidding proposal as specified in the 2015 edition of the Kansas Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for State Road and Bridge Construction.

KDOT will only accept electronic internet proposals using the Bid Express website at <https://bidx.com/ks/main> until 1:00 p.m. (Central Time) on letting day. The KDOT bid letting will be conducted remotely by audio broadcast only at 3:00 p.m. (Central Time) on letting day. Each bidder shall certify that such person, firm, association, or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid. This certification shall be in the form of a required contract provision provided by the state to each prospective bidder. State of Disaster Emergency Proclamation

By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kansas Emergency Management Act, Chapter 48, Article 9, of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, to meet the inherent dangers of disasters to which the State and its citizens have been exposed, and upon advice of the State Adjutant General as the Director of the Division of Emergency Management, I hereby proclaim a State of Disaster Emergency as follows:

NATURE OF THE DISASTER

Weather conditions are such that a high risk exists for wildland fires in the coming days. The forecast includes high winds, low relative humidity, and Red Flag Warnings due to ongoing drought and dry vegetation. Activation of the state emergency operations center and state mission assignments may be needed to support local fire suppression efforts.

Any or all of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Kansas Emergency Management Act may be delegated to the Adjutant General as deemed appropriate during this period of proclaimed State of Disaster Emergency. This may be delegated by written orders, or oral orders subsequently reduced to writing with reference to this Proclamation.

I hereby suspend the provisions of any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business, or the order or rules and regulations of any state agency which implements such statute, if strict compliance with the provisions of such statutes, order or rule and regulation would prevent, hinder, or delay in any way necessary action in coping with the disaster as set forth in KSA 48-925(c)(1).

This Proclamation shall be filed promptly with the Division of Emergency Management, the Office of the

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Secretary of State and each city clerk or county clerk, as appropriate, in the area to which this Proclamation applies. Further dissemination of this Proclamation shall occur by means calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public.

Executive Order No. 26-01

Relief from Certain Transportation Restrictions for Wildfire Response

WHEREAS, since February 15, 2026, there have been several large wildland fires causing extensive damage to property, including agricultural land, and continuing since that time, weather conditions are such that a risk exists for more wildland fires. The forecast includes the potential for above normal temperatures, high winds, low relative humidity, and fire warnings or watches due to ongoing drought and dry vegetation. Activation of the state emergency operations center and state mission assignments may be needed to support local fire suppression efforts.

WHEREAS, these conditions meet the definition of disaster in K.S.A. 48-904, and I verbally declared a state of disaster emergency on February 15, 2026.

WHEREAS, agricultural producers throughout Kansas and in other states are delivering hay and fencing supplies to drop off points or directly to ranches affected by wildfires in multiple locations in Kansas for immediate relief from loss of winter feed supplies and extensive damage to fences. Furthermore, most donated hay will be in large cylindrically shaped bales that constitute loads that exceed the standard width and height.

WHEREAS, by operation of law 49 C.F.R. § 390. 23(b), my verbal state of disaster emergency on February 15, 2026, waives certain hours of service requirements for commercial motor vehicle carriers and drivers provided in 49 C.F.R. §§ 395.3 and 395.5 so long as the motor carrier or driver is providing direct assistance during an emergency, up to 14 days from the date of the February 15, 2025 disaster declaration.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, including the authority granted me by K.S.A 48-924 and K.S.A 48-925, to address the conditions noted above, I hereby direct and order the following:

1. Motor carriers participating in restoration and relief efforts must still obtain the requisite over-dimension permits as required by the Kansas Department of Transportation prior to operating; however, the fees associated with these permits are temporarily waived; permits may be obtained at <https://k-trips.ksdot.gov/>.
2. Participating motor carriers bringing foliage for livestock are limited to a load that does not exceed 12 feet in width and does not exceed a height of 14 feet, six inches.
3. Participating motor carriers operating under over-dimension permits under this executive order may not haul over-dimension from thirty minutes after sunset to thirty minutes before sunrise.
4. All other applicable state and federal regulations shall apply to include but not limited to: Title 49 C.F.R. Part 382, Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing; the Kansas Motor Vehicle Driver's License Act, K.S.A. 8-234 *et. seq.* and Title 49 C.F.R. Part 383 Commercial Driver's License Standards as adopted by the Kansas Uniform Commercial Drivers' License Act, K.S.A. 8-2,125 *et. seq.*, the federal Minimum Levels of Financial Responsibility (insurance requirements) Title 49 C.F.R. Part 387 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3n and state insurance requirements as provided in K.A.R. 82-4-23, and the regulations governing transportation of hazardous materials in Kansas in 49 C.F.R. Part 107, 171, 172, 173, 177, 178 and 180 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-20.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 26-01 and shall become effective immediately. This order will continue in effect until 11:59 PM on March 1, 2026, or until rescinded, whichever occurs first.

Payment of Principal and Interest

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Bureau of Water, will conduct a public hearing at 10:00 a.m. Thursday, May 21, 2026, in the Azure Conference Room, Fourth floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 SW Jackson, Topeka, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed amended regulation K.A.R. 28-15-16.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled public hearing constitutes a comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. Interested parties may submit written comments prior to 10:00 a.m. May 21, 2026, to William Carr, Bureau Director, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Water, 1000 SW Jackson St., Suite 420, Topeka, KS, 66612, or by email to William.J.Carr@ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally regarding the adoption of the proposed regulation during the public hearing. To provide all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes. It is requested that each individual giving oral comments also provide a written copy of the comments for the record.

Any individual with a disability may request an accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the regulation, economic impact statement, and environmental benefit statement in an accessible format. A summary of the proposed regulation, its estimated economic impact, and the environmental benefit follows:

Summary of Regulation

K.A.R. 28-15-16. Permit requirements for public water supply systems. This regulation provides suppliers of water the option to participate in a certification program to extend existing permitted distribution systems without obtaining a permit. K.S.A. 65-163(a)(3) allows for KDHE to establish a certification program for approval of distribution system extensions without the need for an additional permit. However, no rules and regulations have ever been developed. The proposed regulation amendments would implement K.S.A. 65-163(a)(3).

Economic Impact

There would be a positive economic effect to businesses and local governments that own or operate a public water supply as any costs associated with waiting for KDHE review and approval of distribution extensions would be eliminated for those participating in the certification program. For those entities that choose to participate in the program, there could be costs associated with employing a full-time professional engineer; however, it is likely that entities would not be interested in participating in the certification program unless they already employed a professional engineer or if it was cost effective to hire a professional engineer for this purpose. There is no fee to participate in the program. It would be the public water supply owner's choice to pass costs or savings on to public utility ratepayers. Eliminating the time for KDHE review of these projects should have a positive economic effect on the state economy as a whole.

These regulations will enhance business activities and growth by reducing the time between project design and construction of the distribution system extensions of participating suppliers of water. The regulations will allow suppliers of water who participate in the program to review and approve these distribution extensions

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eliminating the time needed for the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) to review and approve the project for construction. Additionally, this will free up KDHE staff time and allow for more timely review of more complex projects that are associated with business and growth.

Environmental Benefit

There will not be an environmental benefit due to these proposed regulation changes. The changes in the regulation would create a voluntary certification program for approving distribution system extensions without obtaining a permit. Any impact or benefit to the environment made by distribution system expansions would not change due to this certification program.

K.A.R. 109-2-6 is being amended to remove specific staffing requirements in maintaining the regulation upon the topic of types of ambulance services and their requirements.

K.A.R. 109-2-7a is a proposed new regulation to receive the staffing requirements for ground ambulance services from K.A.R. 109-2-6; to address the ability to utilize providers with a valid interstate compact license; and to reflect the staffing model adopted by the Kansas Legislature in the 2025 session.

K.A.R. 109-2-11 is being amended to reflect utilization of providers with a valid interstate compact license as well as to modernize existing language to align with current practice.

There is no anticipated economic impact in the adoption of these regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments regarding the proposed regulations. All interested parties will also be given a reasonable opportunity to orally present their views regarding the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis.

The Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) is proposing amended regulations for the domesticated cervid operations and Chronic Wasting Disease Herd Certification Program (CWD HCP) within Kansas. The CWD HCP is a voluntary program that operates under guidance of the federal CWD HCP and associated program standards. The program is designed to require a minimum set of standards a CWD-susceptible herd must comply with to establish its status as a CWD-free herd.

A summary of each proposed regulation and its economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 9-3-6 – This amended regulation provides an expanded list of definitions that are relevant to and used throughout the regulations.

K.A.R. 9-3-7 – This amended regulation outlines the fees necessary to obtain a domesticated cervid permit. An exception was added that clarifies that non-owner haulers are exempt from the requirement to have a domesticated cervid permit.

K.A.R. 9-3-8 – This amended regulation outlines the recordkeeping and submission requirements necessary to maintain a domesticated cervid permit. The regulation sets forth the information that must be retained for each animal that is part of a domesticated cervid operation. This includes the requirements for a domesticated cervid movement notification to be filed with KDA for any intrastate movements.

K.A.R. 9-3-9 – This amended regulation governs the issuance of certificates of veterinary inspection for the importation of cervids into Kansas as well as the domestic cervid movement notification required for intrastate movements.

K.A.R. 9-3-11 – This amended regulation governs the tuberculosis (TB) requirements for a Kansas cervid herd. The requirement for a negative TB test prior to an intrastate movement is being rescinded.

K.A.R. 9-3-12 – This amended regulation provides the requirements for the confinement, handling and health

management of a domesticated cervid operation. It was revised to clarify the fencing requirements for herds enrolled in the CWD HCP and recognize the use of chemical restraint as an acceptable herd management practice.

K.A.R. 9-3-15 – This amended regulation provides the requirements necessary for participation in the CWD HCP and outlines the expanded record submission and CWD testing requirements for a herd enrolled in the CWD HCP. Revisions within this regulation include the latitude via a state risk assessment to exchange alternative testing modalities for the post-mortem test that may have been missed or found to be not adequate.

K.A.R. 9-3-16 – This amended regulation outlines the program levels of the CWD HCP and what is required of a herd to obtain CWD herd certification status. The language was changed to better align with the federal definitions and description within the federal CWD HCP rules and program standards. It describes the changes of a herd status that will occur as the result of a suspect or positive CWD test.

K.A.R. 9-3-17 – This amended regulation describes the requirements for a herd that is designated as a positive CWD herd. Revisions include outlining what is required of a CWD-positive herd plan and establishing the timeline for plan development and response protocols. It further outlines the protocol that will be used for carcass disposal of cervids from positive CWD premises.

The proposed regulations are not mandated by federal law as the CWD HCP is a voluntary program for cervid operations to establish a certification for their animals.

The regulation changes will:

- Enhance the ability to move cervids intrastate by removing the negative tuberculosis test requirement
- Enhance industry members' ability to understand the requirements necessary to be a CWD HCP certified herd
- Enhance interstate business opportunities by ensuring that the Kansas CWD HCP is aligned and compliant with the expectations of the federal CWD HCP rule and program standards
- Enhance business operations by providing clearer requirements for a cervid herd that has been designated as a CWD-positive herd, which will allow Kansas to maintain its CWD HCP compliant status and will allow other herds in Kansas to maintain business continuity

The proposed amendments also provide producers with the latitude to implement alternative ante-mortem testing regimens for missed or inadequate postmortem CWD samples. This could result in significant savings by allowing an operation to avoid sacrificing an animal that could be worth several thousand dollars to replace a missed sample. In contrast to the minimal additional cost of ante-mortem testing options, the benefits of the proposed amendments far outweigh the costs.

The only additional cost that may affect businesses would be the choice to employ ante-mortem testing as opposed to the current practice of performing postmortem testing on a replacement animal. Based on a history of 14 missed or inadequate test results over the last 5 years, it is reasonable to expect an average of approximately 3 missed or inadequate test results per year. Each of those three missed tests would require five ante-mortem samples to be collected and analyzed, at a cost of \$28 per sample. A reasonable estimate of veterinarian fees would be \$50 per sample. (3 missed tests x 5 samples = 15 samples; 15 samples x \$78 per sample = \$1,170 per year)

KDA does not anticipate that the proposed regulations will present any implementation and compliance costs to state businesses, sectors, public utility ratepayers, individuals, or local governments. In addition, KDA does not anticipate any changes in aggregate state revenues and expenditures, any significant increase or decrease in revenues, or any imposed functions or responsibilities on cities, counties or school districts. Letters were mailed to the League of Kansas Municipalities, the Kansas Association of School Boards, and the Kansas Association of Counties. No responses were received from those entities.

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KDA engaged in extensive outreach and discussions with the Kansas Cervid operations as well as the USDA APHIS Cervid Health team. These conversations and feedback aimed to address some of the regulatory burdens of the current program while maintaining the level of oversight necessary to minimize the risk of Kansas cervid producers' herds being exposed to CWD from another domestic herd. The proposed regulations were also provided to all livestock stakeholder groups and licensees for a 60-day informal comment period. All responses received were favorable and encouraged KDA to move the regulations forward.

The Kansas Cervid industry requested a review of the current Kansas regulations and the implementation of possible revisions. This resulted in meetings with a working group of Kansas Cervid stakeholders and leadership multiple times over the last two years to discuss the current domestic cervid regulations and the proposed changes. All comments received were positive and supported moving forward.

Additionally, KDA consulted with the USDA APHIS Cervid Health team and included many of their recommendations to ensure that the Kansas CWD HCP remains compliant with the federal program. Likewise, KDA consulted with KDW&P to get concurrence and agreement with the changes.
