## Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, October 14, at the Elks Lodge, 1523 Arcade St., Goodland, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A general discussion and workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. October 14 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5:30 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for more business and the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any

issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. October 15 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting and may request the meeting materials in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the meeting by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at (800) 432-0698 to request special accommodations.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, 1020 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 200, Topeka, 66612, or to sheilak@wp.state.ks.us if electronically. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

**K.A.R. 115-2-1.** This permanent regulation establishes amount of fees for various issues of the department. The proposed amendment would add categories for combination antlered and antlerless deer permits as well as multi-year hunting, fishing and combination licenses for residents 16-20 years of age.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R.** 115-2-3. This permanent regulation establishes camping, utility and other fees for state parks. The proposed amendments would increase the annual camping permit fee as well as increase fees for recreational vehicle long-term camping permits.

Economic Impact Summary: As the fees are borne by users, the proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-2-3a.** This permanent regulation establishes cabin camping permit fees. The proposed amendments would add cabin locations and fees for cabins expected to become available in FY 2011 and FY 2012.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-7-1.** This permanent regulation establishes legal equipment, taking methods and other provisions for

fishing. The proposed amendment would prohibit hand fishing within 150 yards of a dam.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R.** 115-7-8. This permanent regulation establishes the provisions for weigh-in black bass tournaments using the tournament black bass pass. The proposal is to repeal the regulation.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R.** 115-7-9. This permanent regulation establishes provisions for weigh-in black bass tournaments not using the tournament black bass pass. The proposed amendments would make the provisions applicable to all weighin black bass fishing tournaments.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R.** 115-18-20. This permanent regulation establishes provisions for the tournament black bass pass. The proposed amendments would allow culling even after reaching the daily creel limit during a weigh-in black bass tournament.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-25-6.** This exempt regulation establishes the spring season, bag limit, permits and game tags for wild turkeys. The proposed version of the regulation increases the spring permit numbers in Unit 4.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

**K.A.R.** 115-25-14. This exempt regulation establishes creel limits, size limits, possession limits and open seasons for fishing. The proposed version would expand handfishing opportunities, add trout waters and adjust creel and length limits for various water bodies.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

### Article 2.—UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE; CONTRIBUTING, REIMBURSING AND RATED GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYMENT

**50-2-21a.** Computation of employer contribution rates for calendar years 2010 and 2011. (a) For the purpose of computation of employer contribution rates for calendar years 2010 and 2011, the following definitions shall apply:

(1) The term "contribution rate," as used in K.A.R. 50-2-21, shall mean the specific tax rate assigned to a particular tax rate group. The contribution rate is the rate assessed on each of the 51 rate groups determined pursuant to K.S.A. 44-710a(a)(2)(D), and amendments thereto.

- (2) The term "the 2010 original tax rate computation table," as used in K.S.A. 44-710 and amendments thereto and in this regulation, shall mean the rates calculated in the initial calculation for calendar year 2010 of active eligible employer accounts pursuant to K.A.R. 50-2-21(e) before any readjustments leading to the readjusted final effective contribution rates are calculated pursuant to K.A.R. 50-2-21.
- (b) Despite the planned yield determined pursuant to schedule III and other provisions of K.S.A. 44-710a and amendments thereto, for calendar years 2010 and 2011, the tax rates for eligible employers with positive account balances shall be calculated pursuant to K.S.A. 44-710, and amendments thereto, and these regulations.
- (c) Despite K.A.R. 50-2-21(e), for calendar years 2010 and 2011, the contribution rates assigned to groups 1 through 51 of eligible employers as determined pursuant to K.S.A. 44-710a(a)(2)(D), and amendments thereto, shall be the rates listed in the 2010 original tax rate computation table. For the purposes of K.S.A. 44-710a and amendments thereto, for calendar years 2010 and 2011, employers in groups 33 through 51 shall pay a contribution rate of 5.4 percent.
- (d) For calendar year 2011, new experience ratings for employers shall be calculated by the secretary, and employers shall be assigned to tax rate groups based upon these experience ratings. However, the tax rates for rate groups 1 through 51 of eligible employers shall not be recalculated for 2011, and the rates for the individual rate groups shall be those set for calendar year 2010 as specified in subsection (c).
- (e) This regulation shall expire on January 1, 2012. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 44-714; implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 44-710, as amended by 2010 HB 2676, sec. 1; effective, T-50-5-12-10, May 12, 2010; effective Aug. 27, 2010.)

#### **Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS**

**111-2-235.** 10577 Felt's One Stop 4 lottery give-away. (a) During the term of this promotion with 10577 Felt's One Stop 4 in Kansas, for every Kansas Hold'Em single ticket purchase of \$10 or more, the player shall receive an entry for the "Lottery Give-A-Way" promotion drawing. Lottery terminals shall automatically dispense an entry form for each \$10 or more Kansas Hold'Em single ticket purchase at 10577 Felt's One Stop 4 Kansas lottery retailer during the term of this promotion. The qualifying Kansas Hold'Em purchase may be for a single draw or for multiple draws.

The Western Plains store with the second highest sales in cumulative fast \$5 sampler sales for the period designated in subsection (a) above, will win Kansas lottery instant ticket coupons valued at \$25 and other promotional items determined by the lottery.

The Western Plains store with the third highest sales in cumulative fast \$5 sampler sales for the period designated in subsection (a) above, will win Kansas lottery instant ticket coupons valued at \$15 and other promotional items determined by the lottery. - (h) Each ticket in this game may win up to 17 times.
- (i) Approximately 300,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this instant game. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 150,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

## KANSAS EXPANDED LOTTERY RULES AND REGULATIONS

### Article 306.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES; PAI-GOW POKER FORTUNE BONUS

**111-306-6.** Play. (a) The starting position for the dealing of cards or the delivery of stacks of cards for the

- game of pai-gow poker may be determined in one of the following manners:
- (1) The dealer shall shake the pai-gow poker shaker and dice at least three times so as to cause a random mixture of the dice.
- (A) The dealer shall then remove the lid covering the pai-gow poker shaker, total the dice and announce the total.
- (B) To determine the starting position, the dealer shall count counterclockwise around the table, with the position of the dealer considered number one, and continuing around the table with each betting position counted in order, including the dealer, regardless of whether there is a wager at the position, until the count matches the total of the three dice.
- (C) The dealer shall place the cover on the pai-gow poker shaker and shake the shaker once. The pai-gow poker shaker shall then be placed to the left of the dealer's rack.
- (2) The dealer may use a computerized random number generator to select and display a number from 1 through 7, inclusive, and verbally announce the number. To determine the starting position, the dealer shall count counterclockwise around the table, with the position of the dealer considered number one, and continuing around the table with each betting position counted in order, including the dealer, regardless of whether there is a wager at the position, until the count matches the number displayed by the random number generator.
- (b) After all players have set their hands and placed the cards on the table, the seven cards of the dealer shall be turned over and the dealer shall set his or her hands by arranging the cards into a high and low hand using the following rules:
- (1) No pair use the highest card in the high hand. Use the second and third highest cards in the low hand.
  - (2) One pair always play the pair in the high hand.
- (3) Two pair always split unless one or both pair are five and under and the dealer has an ace, together with a king, queen, or jack. Split if both pair are six or above.
- (4) Three pair always play the highest pair in the low hand.
- (5) Three-of-a-kind always play the three-of-a-kind in the high hand and play the next two highest cards in the low hand, except that if the three-of-a-kind is aces, play a pair of aces in the high hand and an ace and the next highest card in the low hand, and if the dealer has two three-of-a-kinds, the dealer musts break the higher three-of-a-kind and use it as a pair for the low hand keeping the lower three-of-a-kind in the high hand.
- (6) Straights six and seven card straights always play the highest two cards possible for the low hand while still playing a straight in the high hand, except that if two pair is with the straight, always apply the two pair rule, and if the dealer holds a straight with a flush at the same time, the dealer must always play the highest possible low hand. The ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 are the second highest straight.
- (7) Flush, including straight flush and royal flush for six and seven card flushes (and straight flushes) the dealer must play the highest two cards possible in the

(continued)

low hand while still playing the flush in the high hand, except that if two pair is with the flush (or straight flush), the two pair rule will apply, and if the dealer holds a flush with a straight at the same time, the dealer must always play the highest possible low hand.

(8) Full house - always play the pair in the low hand and the three-of-a-kind in the high hand, except that if the dealer holds a full house with another pair, the dealer must play the highest pair in the low hand and the full house in the high hand.

(9) Four-of-a-kind - apply the two pair rule, except that if one pair of three-of-a-kind is with the four-of-a-kind is aces and the pair or three-of-a-kind is kings, then play the kings in the low hand the four aces in the high hand.

- (10) Five aces always play a pair of aces in the low hand and the three aces in the high hand, except that if the dealer holds a pair of kings with five aces, the dealer must play the pair of kings in the low hand and the five aces in the high hand.
- (c) The dealer shall then place the two hands face up on the appropriate area of the layout.
  - (d) A player may not surrender his or her hand.
- (e) Once the dealer has set a high hand and a low hand, the dealer shall expose both hands of each player, starting from the right and proceeding counterclockwise around the table. The dealer shall compare the high and low hand of each player to the high and low hand of the dealer and shall announce if the pai-gow poker wager of that player shall win, lose, or be considered a tie.
- (f) All losing wagers shall be immediately collected by the dealer and put in the table games chip tray. A paigow poker wager made by a player shall lose if:
- (1) The high hand of the player is lower in rank than the high hand of the dealer and the low hand of the player is lower in rank than the low hand of the dealer;
- (2) The high hand of the player is identical in rank to the high hand of the dealer or the low hand of the player is identical in rank to the low hand of the dealer (a copy hand) and the other hand of the player is identical in rank or lower in rank than the other hand of the dealer;
- (3) The high hand of the player was not set so as to rank equal to or higher than the low hand of that player; or
- (4) The two hands of the player were not otherwise set correctly in accordance with the rules of the game (for example, a player forms a three-card low hand and a four-card high hand).
- (g) All hands that resulted in a winning pai-gow poker wager shall remain face up on the layout. Winning wagers shall be paid as the dealer exposes the players' cards with the exception of the hands that require income tax withholding and/or reporting, which are paid once the necessary documents are completed.
- (h) After a winning pai-gow poker wager has been paid and the vigorish collected, the dealer shall then, if applicable, pay the winning bonus wager of that player. Before paying a winning bonus wager, the dealer shall, if necessary, reset the player's high hand and low hand to form the hand type yielding the highest bonus payout to which the player is entitled. The dealer shall then collect the cards from that player.

- (i) All cards collected by the dealer shall be picked up in order and placed in the discard rack in such a way that they can be readily arranged to reconstruct each hand in case of a question or dispute.
- (j) The following irregularities or invalid roll of dice shall apply:
- (1) If the dealer uncovers the pai-gow poker shaker and all three dice do not land flat on the bottom of the shaker, the dealer shall call a "No roll" and reshake the dice.
- (2) If the dealer uncovers the pai-gow poker shaker and a die or dice fall out of the shaker, the dealer shall call a "No roll" and reshake the dice.
- (3) If the dealer incorrectly totals the dice and deals the first card or delivers the first stack to the wrong position, all hands shall be called dead and the dealer shall reshuffle the cards.
- (4) If the dealer exposes any of the cards dealt to a player, the player has the option of voiding the hand. Without looking at the unexposed cards, the player shall make the decision either to play out the hand or to void the hand.
- (5) If a card or cards in the hand of the dealer or bank is (are) exposed, all hands shall be void and the cards shall be reshuffled.
- (6) A card found turned face up in the shoe shall not be used in the game and shall be placed in the discard rack. If more than one card is found turned face up in the shoe, all hands shall be void and the cards shall be reshuffled.
- (7) A card drawn in error without its face being exposed shall be used as though it was the next card from the shoe.
- (8) If any player or the dealer is dealt an incorrect number of cards, all hands shall be void and the cards reshuffled.
- (9) If the dealer does not set his or her hands in the manner specified above, the hands must be reset in accordance with this submission and the round of play completed.
- (10) If an automated card shuffling device is being used and the device jams, stop shuffling during a shuffle, or fails to complete a shuffle cycle, the cards shall be reshuffled.
- (11) If an automated dealing shoe is being used and the device jams, stops dealing cards, or fails to deal all cards during a round of play, the round of play shall be void, and the cards shall be removed from the device and reshuffled with any cards already dealt.
- (12) If cards become soiled in the course of play and the dealer finds that a card is unsuitable for use, a table games floor supervisor will bring a substitute card from the card reserve in the pit stand and the unsuitable card is placed in a sealed envelope or container. The table games floor supervisor will maintain the envelope in a secure place within the pit until collection by security personnel.
