Request for Comments

In accordance with Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirements, the Kansas Department of Transportation requests comments on the draft Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

The STIP is a project-specific document that includes a list of all highway and transit projects in the state for a four-year period (October 1, 2010 to September 30, 2014). The STIP has been categorized into three general sections, as follows:

1. All street and highway projects administered by KDOT.
2. Statewide Public Transit Projects.
3. Federal Lands Highway Program Projects.

The comprehensive list of programmed projects provided under category one above includes all projects, regardless of funding source, to be administered by KDOT. This list includes projects for counties and cities, and projects on the State Highway System. Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) for the five urbanized areas in Kansas are included in this STIP by reference (Douglas County; MARC-Johnson, Leavenworth and Wyandotte counties; WAMPO-Sedgwick County and the cities of Andover and Mulvane; Shawnee County; and Doniphan County in the cities of Wathena and Ellwood).

A summary of the proposed regulation and the estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of Regulation:

K.A.R. 28-4-92. Amends the fee amount required for licenses and license renewals for day care homes, group day care homes and child care centers.

Economic Impact:

Cost to the agency: Senate Substitute for HB 2356, also known as "Lexie's Law," eliminated the child care category of "family day care homes" and required all child care facilities to be inspected and licensed. The results of this bill include an increase in inspection responsibilities for approximately 2600 additional day care homes. The bill created a maternity centers and child care licensing fee fund and increased licensing fees to generate additional revenue for KDHE and local health department licensing and inspection activities.

Cost to licensees: The bill amended K.S.A. 65-505, increasing the maximum licensing fees that may be set by the Secretary of Health and Environment including those for child care facilities and maternity center applicants and licensees. The amended regulation includes increases in the initial license and renewal fees for licensed day care homes, group day care homes, and child care centers.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: The bill created a maternity centers and child care licensing fee fund and increased licensing fees to generate additional revenue for local health department licensing and inspection activities.

K.A.R. 28-4-505. Requires the department to notify the sending agency or facility if a specimen is unsatisfactory and to notify the physician or birth attendant with a request to submit another specimen. Specimens shall be labeled unsatisfactory if identifying information is missing, more than 10 days have elapsed since date of collection, or the specimen is of unacceptable quality or quantity for analysis.

K.A.R. 28-4-514. Proposed amendments change family eligibility for 100 percent financial assistance for necessary treatment products from less than 300 percent of the federal poverty level to less than or equal to 185 percent of the federal poverty level and change eligibility from \$1500 to \$1000 for medically necessary food treatment products; change eligibility for 50 percent financial assistance from 301 to 500 percent of the federal poverty level to more than 185 percent but not more than 285 percent

of the federal poverty level; and change eligibility for 25 percent financial assistance from 501 to 700 percent of the federal poverty level to more than 285 percent but not more than 385 percent of the federal poverty level.

K.A.R. 28-4-520 and 28-4-521. Provide definitions of terms, including abnormal condition, birth defects information system, and congenital anomaly; adopt by reference portions of volume one, International Classification of Diseases, ninth revision, published by Ingenix Inc., used to code and classify morbidity data; require reporting to the birth defects information system from physicians, hospitals and freestanding birthing centers; and provide for the method of reporting information and requesting removal of reported information from the birth defects information system.

Economic Impact:

Costs to persons affected by the regulations: K.A.R. 28-4-514 will result in a sliding fee scale and changed eligibility for financial assistance to families. The change is predicted to increase eligibility requirements for financial assistance.

Cost to the agency: There is no additional cost to the agency.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: There is no known additional cost.

Article 11.—FARM WINERIES

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-11-11. This regulation requires any farm winery engaged in sales to distributors to notify the director of any shortage of product that would prevent delivery to the distributors of all the wine ordered and file with the director an equitable plan of distribution for wine in short supply.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Adoption of K.A.R. 14-11-22. Special order shipping; license requirements. This new regulation specifies certain application requirements and factors that may lead to rejection of an application for a special order shipping license.

Economic Impact: The special order shipping license fee is \$50. The application fee is \$50 for a new application and \$10 for a renewal. The ABC estimates that there will be many wineries submitting applications for the special order shipping license, resulting in a small increase in licensing revenues.

This regulation creates no economic impact on other government agencies. The licensing and application fees, as well as the \$750 bond requirement, may prevent smaller wineries from participating.

Article 24.—LIQUOR DRINK TAX

Amendment of K.A.R. 92-24-23. K.A.R. 92-24-23 includes the Liquor Drink Tax bonding requirements, such as bond amounts, bond types and bond relief. This regulation is supplemental to K.S.A. 79-41a03.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

If bond relief is granted, there would be some financial relief to the business or individual as a result of the bond release.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Monday, October 25, in the fourth floor training room of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, 4th Floor, Topeka, 66612, or by e-mail at leslie.garner@kda.ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 5-3-23 establishes the maximum reasonable annual quantity approvable for irrigation use for an application for change in place of use and a request to reduce a water right. The amendment will establish a one-time exception to allow the currently authorized quantity of water to remain unchanged on water rights for which a reduction of the authorized place of use is requested pursuant to the requirements of the Agricultural Water Enhancement Program (AWEP). AWEP is a voluntary federal program to reduce water use in the Big Bend

Groundwater Management District No. 5 and the Rattlesnake Creek subbasin. Water rights reduced pursuant to the exception will not be eligible for the exception if any other changes to the terms and conditions of such water rights are sought.

Economic Impact Statement: The economic impact is estimated based on the requirements of the 2010 Agricultural Water Enhancement Program (AWEP) in Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5. Participating owners of water rights located in the Rattlesnake Creek subbasin will benefit by compensation, which may total as much as \$2,800,000 over four years paid by the federal government and GMD 5. This estimate is based on 350 applications, 8 acres average reduction per application, at \$1,000 per acre reduced from the water right.

Nominal costs to water users may be associated with the removal of end guns from approximately 350 center-pivot irrigation systems in the Rattlesnake Creek subbasin due to the voluntary reduction of the authorized places of use. The costs to the agency are estimated to be \$57,000 over four years to assist in preparing applications to reduce authorized places of use for irrigation water rights and administrative processing (mailing, data entry, etc.).

K.A.R. 5-25-5 requires each nondomestic well in the Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5 (GMD 5) to be equipped with a water flowmeter. The proposed amendment will clean up the regulation by removing a check valve requirement that was not enforced by the GMD 5, but enforced under the authority of state regulations by the Kansas Department of Agriculture. The proposed amendment will apply check valve requirements within GMD 5 to be consistent with statewide regulations currently outside of the GMDs.

Economic Impact Statement: No economic impact is anticipated to the department, governmental agencies, private business or individuals.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and impact statements in an accessible format. 99-25-1. Adoption by reference, exceptions; availability of copies. (a) Except for the codes pertaining to grain moisture meters, secs. 5.56(a) and 5.56(b), and the use requirements for ticket printers on vehicle-tank meters, sec. 3.31.UR.2.2, "specifications, tolerances, and other technical requirements for weighing and measuring devices, as adopted by the 94th national conference on weights and measures 2009," including the appendices, published by the national institute of standards and technology (NIST), Gaithersburg, MD, as the 2010 edition of NIST handbook 44, is hereby adopted by reference and shall apply to commercial, data-gathering, and weighing and measuring devices in the state.

(b) Each vehicle-mounted metering system manufactured on or after January 1, 1995 shall be equipped with a ticket printer. A copy of the ticket issued by the vehicle-mounted metering system shall be given to the customer at the time of delivery or as otherwise specified by the customer.

(c) Copies of the handbook adopted by this regulation or pertinent portions from it shall be available from the office of weights and measures, Kansas department of agriculture, Topeka, Kansas. (Authorized by K.S.A. 83-207; implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 83-202; effective May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1986; amended Aug. 14, 1989; amended Oct. 21, 1991; amended March 6, 1998; amended March 5, 1999; amended Jan. 18, 2002; amended Aug. 26, 2005; amended Feb. 8, 2008; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

Article 13.—PESTICIDES

4-13-25. Bulk pesticide storage and handling of pesticides; definitions. As used in K.A.R. 4-13-25 through 4-13-25m, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

(a) "Appurtenance" means any valve, pump, fitting, pipe, hose, auger, metering device, and dispensing device connected to a storage container. "Dispensing device" shall include any device that is used to transfer bulk pesticides into or out of a container.

(b) "Bulk pesticide" means any pesticide, whether liquid or solid, that is kept at ambient temperature and pressure and is stored, loaded, or unloaded in an individual

container of undivided capacity in quantities identified in K.A.R. 4-13-25b.

(c) "Bulk pesticide container" means any receptacle or device in which a pesticide is stored, mixed, treated, disposed of, or handled in any manner in quantities greater than 55 gallons liquid measure or quantities greater than 100 pounds net dry weight.

(d) "Bulk pesticide storage facility" and "facility" mean any warehouse, loading pad, or other area where a bulk pesticide is stored, mixed, loaded, or unloaded, unless otherwise exempted. Each bulk pesticide storage facility located within 300 feet of another facility owned or operated by the same person shall be considered the same facility for the purpose of finding the number of consecutive days in storage and determining whether the facility is exempt from the requirements of K.A.R. 4-13-25 through K.A.R. 4-13-25m.

(e) "Chemically compatible" means that the material will not react chemically adversely or electrolytically adversely to the bulk pesticide being stored, loaded, unloaded, mixed, or handled.

(f) "Discharge" means any spilling, leaking, depositing, pumping, dumping, or emptying, whether accidental or intentional, resulting in the release of a pesticide or material containing a pesticide at a bulk pesticide storage facility. "Discharge" shall not include the lawful transferring, loading, unloading, repackaging, refilling, distributing, using, disposing, or application of a pesticide. This term shall also exclude the normal washing and rinsing activities on a mixing and loading pad.

(g) "Dry bulk pesticide" means any bulk pesticide that is in solid form before any end-use application or before any mixing for end-use application. This term shall include making formulations including dusts, powders, and granules.

(h) "End-use application" means the application of a pesticide by the owner or lessee of the real property upon which the application is made to control a pest covered by the pesticide label.

(i) "Flood plain" means an area at one percent or greater risk of flood occurrence in any given year.

(j) "Gallon" means the United States standard measure of a gallon.

(k) "Liquid bulk pesticide" means any bulk pesticide in liquid form before dilution for end-use application. This term shall include solutions, emulsions, suspensions, slurries, and gels.

(l) "Mixing and loading pad" and "pad" mean a surface designed to provide containment of a pesticide during the loading, unloading, mixing, or handling of a pesticide, or during the cleaning, rinsing, or refilling of a pesticide container.

(m) "Mobile container" means a bulk pesticide container that is designed and used for transporting bulk pesticides.

(n) "Owner or operator" shall include any agent or employee of an owner or operator and mean any of the following:

(1) A pesticide dealer as defined by K.S.A. 2-2438a(q) and amendments thereto;

(2) a pesticide business licensee as defined by K.S.A. 2-2438a(p) and amendments thereto;

(3) a government agency registrant as addressed in K.S.A. 2-2440(e) and amendments thereto;

(4) a certified private applicator, as defined by K.S.A. 2-2438a(c)(2) and amendments thereto, of a bulk pesticide storage facility; or

(5) any other person, as defined by K.S.A. 2-2438a(l) and amendments thereto, responsible for the storage of bulk pesticides as defined by subsection (b).

(o) "Permanent cessation of operations" means either of the following:

(1) No pesticides have been loaded, unloaded, or stored at the facility for 12 consecutive months.

(2) The facility has gone out of business and is no longer a going concern.

(p) "Reasonably foreseeable" means what the secretary determines would have been foreseeable at the time the decision affecting the facility or its condition was made. "Reasonable foreseeability" shall include consideration of the owner's or operator's knowledge of conditions at the time the condition was created or the decision was made.

(q) "Secondary containment" means any structure, tank, or container, including rigid diking, that is designed, constructed, and maintained to intercept, hold, contain, or confine a discharge from a bulk pesticide container and to contain spills, prevent runoff, and avoid leaching.

(r) "Static pressure" means the pressure exerted by a fluid that is not flowing or moving.

(s) "Sump" means a recessed reservoir or catch basin designed to be a receptacle for the collection of liquids in the floor of secondary containment or in the part of the secondary containment that constitutes the loading pad. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective May 1, 1985; amended Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25b. Quantities of bulk pesticide. A facility shall be subject to the requirements of K.A.R. 4-13-25 through K.A.R. 4-13-25k if any of the following conditions is met:

(a) A cumulative total of 1,000 gallons or more of liquid bulk pesticide is transferred away from the facility during any consecutive 365-day period.

(b) A total of 1,000 gallons or more of liquid bulk pesticide is stored, held, or maintained at the facility at any time.

(c) A cumulative total of 3,000 pounds or more of dry bulk pesticide is transferred away from the facility during any consecutive 365-day period.

(d) A total of 3,000 pounds or more of dry bulk pesticide is stored, held, or maintained at the facility at any time. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25c. Location, design, and construction requirements of a bulk pesticide storage facility. Each owner or operator shall meet the following requirements: (a)(1) Each bulk pesticide storage facility shall be designed, constructed, and maintained according to the pesticide manufacturers' directions, instructions, or recommendations. The facility shall be constructed of materials

(continued)

that contain spills, prevent runoff, and avoid leaching of the pesticide being mixed, loaded, or unloaded. Construction materials shall be chemically compatible with the pesticides that come in contact with the material.

(2) Each bulk pesticide storage facility shall be designed, constructed, and maintained to accommodate all reasonably foreseeable loading and unloading conditions, including the anticipated wheel load of a vehicle, and to protect appurtenances and bulk pesticide containers against damage from operating personnel and moving equipment through the use of flexible connections, guard rails, barriers, and protective cages, where necessary.

(3) Asphalt shall not be used as a material in the construction of a bulk pesticide storage facility.

(b) No bulk pesticide storage facility shall be constructed or maintained in a flood plain unless the bulk pesticide is stored above the base flood elevation.

(c) The floor of each bulk pesticide storage facility shall be constructed of material that prevents the movement of pesticide materials and moisture through the floor and shall be designed, constructed, and maintained in a manner that allows discharges to be collected, contained, and recovered.

(d) All electrical equipment and wiring shall be elevated to prevent the equipment and wiring from becoming submerged and shall be grounded to dissipate static electricity.

(e) Both private and public water supplies shall be protected from contamination from the bulk pesticide storage facility.

(f) Each bulk pesticide storage facility shall contain a mixing and loading pad.

(g) Each bulk pesticide storage facility shall be secured to protect against reasonably foreseeable unauthorized access that could result in a discharge.

(h) Each bulk pesticide storage facility shall be designed, constructed, and maintained to prevent contact of any dry bulk pesticide with precipitation. Contact with precipitation shall be prevented by the following:

(1) Using a permanent cover; and

(2) placing dry bulk pesticide on pallets or a raised concrete platform enclosed by a curb that is at least six inches high and extends at least two feet beyond the perimeter of the dry bulk pesticide storage area.

(i) Each bulk pesticide storage facility shall be designed, constructed, and maintained to avoid the creation of pesticide waste and to prevent cross-contamination of pesticides.

(j) Bulk pesticides shall not be stored or mixed in underground containers. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25d. Secondary containment for bulk pesticide storage. Each owner or operator shall meet the following requirements: (a) All bulk pesticide shall be stored within secondary containment. The secondary containment capacity shall be at least 110 percent of the capacity of the largest single bulk pesticide container in addition to the displacement of tanks, appurtenances, fixtures, equipment, and material located within the secondary containment.

(b) The secondary containment, including the floor or bottom of the secondary containment, shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Be constructed of steel, reinforced concrete, or any other material of sufficient thickness, density, and composition to contain any discharged pesticide material;

(2) be leakproof with cracks, seams, and joints sealed; and

(3) for liquids, be capable of withstanding the static pressure resulting from the secondary containment being completely filled with a liquid having a density greater than or equal to the density of the most dense liquid bulk pesticide to be stored within the containment.

(c) A soil liner shall not be considered adequate for the secondary containment of pesticides. Masonry block, asphalt, earthen materials, unfired or fired clay, clay, natural soil-clay mixtures, clay-bentonite mixtures, and prefabricated bentonite liners shall not be deemed to be of appropriate density and composition to contain discharged pesticide material and shall not be used as secondary containment. Sealant-coated concrete blocks may be used if the facility owner's or operator's use of the blocks is approved in writing by the manufacturer of the pesticide.

(d) The floor of the secondary containment shall drain to a sump or other specific point of recovery.

(e) The sump or other specific point of recovery shall be emptied daily in accordance with K.A.R. 4-13-25g(a) by an on-site operator, who shall continuously monitor this process. The on-site operator may use an automatically activated pump to empty the sump if an automatic overflow switch is installed for the receiving container.

(f) No outlet, drain, or other means of penetration shall be located through the floor, bottom, or walls of the secondary containment.

(g) Secondary containment shall be constructed to allow the interior and exterior of the walls to be viewed.

(h) A synthetic liner used to line the secondary containment shall be installed and maintained according to the liner manufacturer's specifications, directions, and recommendations. The specifications, directions, and recommendations about liners from the manufacturers of the pesticides stored in the facility shall also be followed. All seams shall be tested, maintained, and repaired according to the manufacturer's specifications, directions, and recommendations. The liner shall be replaced if it cannot be repaired to meet the liner manufacturer's requirements. In no event shall a liner that is incapable of containing bulk pesticides independent of the support of another container be used in lieu of secondary containment. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25e. Requirements for mixing and loading pads for bulk pesticides. Each owner or operator shall meet the following requirements: (a) Each mixing and loading pad not connected to a storage area shall be of adequate size and design to contain at least 110 percent of the capacity of the container or tank on the pad and the displacement of tanks, equipment, appurtenances, fixtures, and material located on the pad.

(b) Each mixing and loading pad shall be constructed to contain any discharge and shall be leakproof with all

cracks, seams, and joints sealed. The pad shall be impervious to spills and capable of supporting the weight of the heaviest vehicle plus all loading, unloading, and mixing operations. The floor of the mixing and loading pad shall slope to a single point or to a sump, for the recovery of liquid spills.

(c) The sump shall be emptied daily by an on-site operator, who shall continuously monitor this process. The on-site operator may use an automatically activated pump to empty the sump if an automatic overflow switch is installed for the receiving container. The owner or operator may use the recovered pesticide for its intended purpose if it can be used according to the recovered pesticide's label. The owner or operator shall dispose of, in accordance with the label, any recovered pesticide that cannot be used.

(d) The following activities conducted at the facility shall be performed on the mixing and loading pad or within secondary containment:

- (1) Filling pesticide containers;
- (2) washing application equipment;
- (3) rinsing pesticide containers or application equipment;
- (4) mixing operations; and
- (5) loading application equipment. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25f. Requirements for bulk pesticide containers and appurtenances. Each owner or operator shall meet the following requirements: (a) Each bulk pesticide container shall be designed to handle all operating stresses, including static pressure, pressure buildup from pumps and compressors, and any other mechanical stresses to which the storage container could be subject during operations. Each bulk pesticide container shall be chemically compatible with the pesticide it holds and shall meet all specifications, directions, and recommendations of the manufacturers of the pesticide and bulk pesticide container.

(b) Each bulk pesticide container connection, except for safety relief connections, shall be equipped with a shutoff valve accessible and located within the secondary containment.

(c) Except while the stored pesticide is being removed from the container, shutoff valves shall be left either closed and locked or otherwise secured from access. The transfer of pesticide from one bulk pesticide container to another and between a bulk pesticide container and a transport vehicle shall be attended at all times by an on-site operator.

(d) Bulk pesticide containers and appurtenances shall be supported to prevent sagging.

(e) Sight gauges shall not be used on bulk pesticide containers.

(f) Each bulk pesticide container that is not located within a structure with a roof and walls shall be designed, installed, and maintained to prevent flotation and to withstand winds of 90 miles per hour or less.

(g) Each bulk pesticide container shall be designed to protect against excessive internal pressure or vacuum.

(h) Each bulk pesticide container used for storage shall be marked clearly to identify the pesticide stored in the

container. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25g. Discharge, recovery, and reporting requirements. (a) Each owner or operator shall recover promptly any discharge. The owner or operator may use the recovered pesticide for its intended purpose if it can be used according to the recovered pesticide's label or labeling. The owner or operator shall dispose of, in accordance with the label, any recovered pesticide that cannot be used.

(b) The owner or operator shall notify the secretary within 48 hours of any discharge not contained by secondary containment. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25h. Submission of diagrams, plans, and specifications. (a) The owner or operator of each bulk pesticide storage facility shall maintain diagrams, plans, and specifications of the facility on site and with the secretary. The copy maintained at the facility shall be made available to a representative of the secretary upon request.

(b)(1) Each owner or operator of a bulk pesticide storage facility that is to be remodeled, an existing structure that is to be converted to use as a bulk pesticide storage facility, or a proposed bulk pesticide storage facility shall submit diagrams, plans, and specifications to the secretary before commencement of remodeling, conversion, or construction. Remodeling, conversion, or construction shall not commence until the owner or operator receives written notice from the secretary that no further information is required.

(2) The owner or operator of each facility under this subsection shall complete remodeling, conversion, or construction within two years after the secretary's written notice that no additional information is required. Upon completion of the remodel, conversion, or construction, the owner or operator of a facility under this subsection shall certify on a form prescribed by the secretary that the facility meets or exceeds all the requirements of K.A.R. 4-13-25 through K.A.R. 4-13-25k and is constructed in accordance with the diagrams, plans, and specifications submitted to the secretary.

(c) The diagrams, plans, and specifications shall include the facility layout, mechanical and electrical diagrams, construction materials, and the type of equipment that is located in the facility or that is to be fixed or installed in the facility. The diagrams shall be drawn to scale and shall be legible without magnification. The diagrams, plans, and specifications shall contain all information required in subsection (d).

(d) The diagrams, plans, and specifications of the bulk pesticide storage facility shall be submitted with the form prescribed by the secretary. The required documentation shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- (1) The location of the facility relative to the flood plain;
- (2) the location of the facility relative to any surface water within 1,320 feet of the facility and the distance between the facility and the surface water;

(continued)

(3) the distance from both the facility and the area within 100 feet of the facility to groundwater, and the location of the groundwater relative to the facility;

(4) the location of any plumbing and access to private and public water supplies and the distance from the plumbing and access to the private and public water supplies;

(5) the drainage pattern of the facility;

(6) certification that the facility is not located on any abandoned or active oil, gas, or water well;

(7) certification that the facility is not located on a utility easement;

(8) the size and location of the proposed walls and flooring to be located within the facility;

(9) the location and size of each bulk pesticide storage container;

(10) the location and size of each loading and mixing pad;

(11) the location of each appurtenance used in the storage or transfer of bulk pesticide within the facility;

(12) the location of electrical equipment, wiring, and static grounding wires;

(13) the location and size of dry bulk pesticide storage; and

(14) any other relevant information required by the secretary.

(e) Each owner or operator of a bulk pesticide storage facility shall submit the diagrams, plans, and specifications required in this regulation to the secretary at least 30 days before the date the owner or operator proposes that the construction will commence.

(f) Additional time to comply with any deadline in this regulation may be granted by the secretary upon receipt of a written request and upon a showing of good cause for the additional time requested. Each request shall state the reason for the additional time requested and the amount of additional time needed.

(g) The construction, remodeling, conversion, and maintenance of a facility shall conform with the diagrams, plans, and specifications submitted and required by K.A.R. 4-13-25a through K.A.R. 4-13-25k. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25i. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a and 2-2471; effective Dec. 27, 2002; revoked Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25j. Bulk pesticide storage facility inspection and maintenance requirements. (a) Each owner or operator shall inspect the bulk pesticide storage facility and secondary containment, including all appurtenances, at least monthly for any defects, including the following:

- (1) Corrosion;
- (2) leaks;
- (3) cracks;
- (4) spills;
- (5) gaps;
- (6) tears;
- (7) unsealed joints;
- (8) cross-contamination of pesticides;
- (9) structural defects;
- (10) equipment defects; and

(11) any other defect in the facility or potential violation of K.A.R. 4-13-25 through K.A.R. 4-13-25k.

The owner or operator shall promptly correct any defect.

(b) Upon the discovery of each defect or potential violation specified in subsection (a) that compromises the facility's ability to contain the pesticide, the owner or operator shall, within 24 hours after the discovery, either initiate repairs to correct the defect or take the appurtenance or secondary containment out of service. If the appurtenance or secondary containment is left in service, the defect or potential violation shall be corrected within 14 days following the discovery. If the defect or potential violation is not corrected within 14 days following the discovery, the appurtenance or secondary containment shall be removed from service.

(c) The owner or operator shall make a record of the following:

(1) Each inspection performed pursuant to subsection (a);

(2) each discharge within the facility in excess of 55 gallons; and

(3) more than one discharge within the facility in a 24-hour period totaling or exceeding 55 gallons.

(d) Each record made pursuant to subsection (c) shall include the following:

(1) The name of the person making the record;

(2) the date the record was made;

(3) if any inspection is performed, the following:

(A) The date of the inspection;

(B) a description of any defect found; and

(C) a description of any repairs made to remedy the defect;

(4) if a discharge occurred, the following:

(A) The date of the discharge;

(B) the amount of the discharge;

(C) the cause of the discharge;

(D) a description of any repairs made; and

(E) the date and time the secretary was notified pursuant to K.A.R. 5-13-25g;

(5) the date any defective equipment at the facility is taken out of service; and

(6) the date any defective equipment is placed back into service.

(e) All records maintained at the facility shall be retained for three years from the date of the record and shall be made available to the secretary or an authorized representative of the secretary upon request. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25k. Site closure and discontinuation of operation. (a) The owner or operator shall notify the secretary within 30 calendar days following the permanent cessation of operations of a bulk pesticide storage facility.

(b) Whenever a bulk pesticide storage facility permanently ceases operations, the owner or operator shall provide the secretary with written verification of both of the following, on a form prescribed by the secretary:

(1) All pesticides, solutions containing a pesticide, wash waters, and other materials that may contain pesticides have been removed from the facility and have

been used or disposed of according to the pesticide's label or labeling and according to all federal, state, and local requirements.

(2) All bulk pesticide containers, appurtenances, mixing and loading pads, and sumps have been thoroughly cleaned according to each pesticide manufacturer's requirements, instructions, directions, or recommendations or, if none exist, according to standard industry practice. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25l. Penalty for noncompliance with pesticide containment. (a) The license, certification, or registration of any pesticide business licensee, governmental agency registrant, pesticide dealer, or certified private applicator who is found to have violated a pesticide containment requirement in K.A.R. 4-13-25a through 4-13-25k shall be subject to suspension, revocation, nonrenewal, or cancellation.

(b) Any pesticide business licensee or pesticide dealer who is found to have violated a pesticide containment requirement in K.A.R. 4-13-25 through 4-13-25k may incur a civil penalty in accordance with K.A.R. 4-13-62.

(c) Enforcement of K.A.R. 4-13-25 through K.A.R. 4-13-25k shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedures act, K.S.A. 77-501 et seq. and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 2-2449 and K.S.A. 2-2467a; implementing K.S.A. 2-2440e, K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 2-2449, K.S.A. 2-2453, 2-2454, and 2-2467a; effective Dec. 27, 2002; amended Sept. 3, 2010.)

4-13-25m. Change in owner or operator of bulk pesticide storage facility; reporting requirements. (a) If the owner or operator of a bulk pesticide storage facility changes, the new owner or operator shall notify the secretary of the change within 30 days after the effective date of the change, on a form prescribed by the secretary.

(b) The new owner or operator shall meet one of the following requirements:

(1) Submit to the secretary the diagram, plans, and specifications of the bulk pesticide storage facility required by K.A.R. 4-13-25h; or

(2)(A) State on the notification form that the owner or operator has reviewed the existing diagrams, plans, and specifications maintained by the secretary;

(B) certify that the bulk pesticide storage facility remains consistent with those existing diagrams, plans, and specifications; and

(C) certify that the bulk pesticide storage facility has been constructed, remodeled, or converted and is maintained and operated in accordance with K.A.R. 4-13-25 through K.A.R. 4-13-25k. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2-2467a; effective Sept. 3, 2010.)

KANSAS EXPANDED LOTTERY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Article 306.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES; PAI-GOW POKER FORTUNE BONUS

111-306-4. Hand rankings. (a) The ranking of the cards used in pai-gow poker, in order of highest to lowest rank, is ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2. An ace may be used to complete a "straight flush" or a "straight" formed with a 2, 3, 4, and 5. Except as otherwise provided below, the joker is used and ranked as an ace.

(1) Five aces - a high hand consisting of the four "natural aces" in the deck with the joker played in the five-card hand.

(2) Royal flush - a high hand consisting of an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 of the same suit with or without the joker in the five-card hand.

(3) Straight flush - a high hand consisting of five cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking with ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 being the highest ranking and 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 being the lowest.

(4) Four of a kind - a high hand consisting of four cards of the same rank with four aces being the highest and four 2's being the lowest.

(5) Full house - a high hand consisting of three-of-a-kind and a pair, with three aces with two kings being the highest and three 2's with two 3's being the lowest.

(6) Flush - a high hand consisting of five cards of the same suit.

(7) Straight - a high hand consisting of five cards of consecutive rank regardless of suit, with the rankings as follows:

(i) Ace, king, queen, jack, 10 is the highest ranking straight.

(ii) Ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, is the second ranking straight.

(iii) All other straight rankings will be determined by the highest card in the straight.

(8) Three-of-a-kind - a high hand consisting of three cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(9) Two pair - a high hand consisting of two pairs of two cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(10) One pair - a high hand consisting of two cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(11) High card - a hand that does not encompass any of the hands above.

For purposes of setting the hands, a joker may be used as any card to complete a straight, a flush, a straight flush, or a royal flush.

(b) The following hand rankings are only applicable to pai-gow poker bonus wagers:

(1) Seven-card natural straight flush - a hand consisting of all seven of the player's cards in the same suit in consecutive ranking using no joker.

(2) Royal flush plus royal match - a high hand consisting of an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 of the same suit in the five-card hand and a king and queen of the same suit in the two-card hand.

(3) Seven-card straight flush utilizing a joker - same as subsection (b)(1) above, except using the joker as one of

the seven cards. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-16-2010; May 19, 2010; amended, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)

**Article 308.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY
GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES;
OMAHA POKER**

111-308-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort in Dodge City, Kansas, entitled "Omaha Poker" beginning on or after July 14, 2010.

The rules and regulations for the game of "Omaha Poker" are contained in K.A.R. 111-308-1 through 111-308-7, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)

111-308-2. Object of game. Omaha Poker is played at a large table with a maximum number of 10 players using one deck of playing cards. The object of the game is for a player to either:

(1) create a five-card poker hand of a higher rank than the poker hand of all other players, with each player utilizing two of the four cards dealt to them and three of the community cards available for use by all players; or

(2) remain the only player in the hand after all other players have folded. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)

111-308-3. Definitions. The following words and terms, when used in the Southwest Kansas Lottery Gaming Zone and pertaining to the game of Omaha Poker, shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "All in" means when a player who has no funds remaining on the poker table to continue betting in a round of play still retains the right to contend for that portion of the pot in which the player has already placed a bet.

(b) "Ante" means a predetermined wager, which a player may be required to make prior to any cards being dealt in order to participate in the round of play.

(c) "Bet" or "wager" means an action by which a player places gaming chips into the pot on any betting round.

(d) "Betting round" means a complete wagering cycle in a hand of poker.

(e) "Blind bet" means a forced bet that only players sitting in specific betting positions at the poker table shall be required to place prior to looking at any cards.

(f) "Burn a card" means to remove a card from the top of a deck, which is discarded face down, which card is not in play and the identity of which remains unknown.

(g) "Button" or "dealer button" means an object, which is moved clockwise around the table after each hand is complete to denote an imaginary dealer and thereby determine the betting and dealing sequence.

(h) "Call" means a wager made in an amount equal to the immediately preceding wager.

(i) "Check" means when a player waives the right to initiate the betting in a betting round but retains the right to act if another player initiates the betting.

(j) "Collection" means another name for the rake collected by the house, which may be a specified amount charged to each player or as a percentage of the pot for each hand.

(k) "Community cards" means cards which are dealt face upward and which can be used by all players to form their best hand.

(l) "Cut" means to divide a deck of playing cards into two parts in order to change the order of the cards without revealing the identity of any cards in the deck.

(m) "Deck" means a standard collection of 52 playing cards with the following 13 cards in each of four suits: 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, jack, queen, king, and ace.

(n) "Face card" is a king, queen, or jack.

(o) "Flop" means the first three community cards dealt during a hand.

(p) "Fold" means the withdrawal of a player from a round of play by discarding his hand of cards during a betting round and refusing to equal a wager.

(q) "Forced bet" means a wager, which is required to start the wagering on the first betting round.

(r) "Half-kill" means in the game of Omaha high-low split eight or better poker when one player wins an entire qualifying pot, the betting limits are increased by one-half the posted table wagering limits for the next hand and remain in effect until a pot is split between one player winning the high hand and another player winning the low hand.

(s) "Hand" means one of two things, depending upon the context in which the term is used:

(1) the cards available to a player to use; or

(2) a complete round of play from the first ante or blind bet until the pot is awarded to a player.

(t) "Hole cards" means any cards dealt to a player face down, which are also "pocket cards," "in the hole," or "in the pocket."

(u) "Kill" means in the game of Omaha high-low split eight or better poker when one player wins an entire qualifying pot, the betting limits are twice the posted table wagering limits for the next hand and remain in effect until a pot is split between one player winning the high hand and another player winning the low hand.

(v) "Opening bet" means the first bet by each player in a round of play.

(w) "Pot" or "kitty" means the amount that is awarded to the winning player or players at the conclusion of a round of play and is equal to the total amount wagered by the players during the round of play minus any rake.

(x) "Raise" means a bet in an amount greater than the immediately preceding bet in that betting round.

(y) "Rake" means the amount of gaming chips collected on each hand by the dealer representing the predetermined amount to be included in net gaming revenue.

(z) "Round of plays" means the process by which cards are dealt, bets are placed and the winner of the pot is determined and paid in accordance with the rules of this game.

(continued)

(aa) "Suit" means one of the following four categories of cards: diamonds, spades, clubs, or hearts.

(bb) "Table stakes" means the gaming chips on the table, which are in play. A player may not add or subtract from his or her gaming chips at any time during a betting round of play.

(cc) "Up-cards" means any card dealt face up to a player or as community cards. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)

111-308-4. Omaha Poker hand rankings. (a) The rank of the cards used in Omaha for the determination of winning hands, in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be: ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2. All suits shall be considered equal in rank. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an ace may be used to complete a "straight flush" or a "straight" formed with a 2, 3, 4, and 5.

(b) The permissible poker hands in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be:

(1) "Royal flush" is a hand consisting of an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 of the same suit;

(2) "Straight flush" is a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, with king, queen, jack, 10, and 9 being the highest ranking straight flush and ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 being the lowest ranking straight flush;

(3) "Four-of-a-kind" is a hand consisting of four cards of the same rank regardless of suit, with four aces being the highest ranking four-of-a-kind and four 2s being the lowest ranking four-of-a-kind;

(4) "Full house" is a hand consisting of "three-of-a-kind" and a "pair," with the three aces and two kings being the highest ranking full house and three twos, two 3s being the lowest ranking full house;

(5) "Flush" is a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit;

(6) "Straight" is a hand consisting of five cards of consecutive rank, regardless of suit with an ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 being the highest ranking straight and an ace, 2, 3, 4, and 5 being the lowest ranking straight, provided that an ace may not be combined with any other sequence of cards for purposes of determining a winning hand, (for example, queen, king, ace, 2, 3);

(7) "Three-of-a-kind" is a hand consisting of three cards of the same rank regardless of suit, with three aces being the highest ranking three-of-a-kind and three 2s being the lowest ranking three-of-a-kind;

(8) "Two pairs" is a hand consisting of two "pairs," with two aces and two kings being the highest ranking two pair and two 3s and two 2s being the lowest ranking two pair; and

(9) "One pair" is a hand consisting of two cards of the same rank, regardless of suit with two aces being the highest ranking pair and two 2s being the lowest ranking pair;

(10) "High hand" is, when comparing two hands that are of otherwise identical poker rank, the hand with the highest-ranking card.

(c) When comparing two hands, if none of the above poker rankings are contained in a ranking hand, the hand

with the highest-ranking card shall be considered the higher hand.

(d) If, after all five cards are compared and the hands are identical, they shall be considered a tie and the pot split equally among those players that are tied. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)

111-308-5. Wagers. (a) Only players who are seated at the poker table shall be permitted to receive cards and participate in each betting round.

(b) Depending upon the predetermined option for the poker game being dealt, a player may be required to:

(1) Place a predetermined ante prior to receiving any cards; or

(2) Place a predetermined blind bet prior to receiving any cards.

(c) A player may only participate in the wagering during a round of play with the table stakes gaming chips, which were already placed on the poker table in front of that player when the round of play commenced.

(d) A player may only add to his gaming chips between rounds of play and may not remove any of his gaming chips from the poker table at any time during ongoing play.

(e) A player who depletes his funds on the poker table prior to the completion of a round of play shall be deemed to be "all-in."

(f) An "all-in" player shall retain financial interest in the outcome of the round of play, but shall only be eligible to win the amount of the pot to which he contributed.

(g) An "all-in" player shall continue to receive any cards to which he would normally be entitled.

(h) Betting shall continue unimpeded among the other players by generating a separate secondary pot that only those active players shall be eligible to win.

(i) A verbal statement of "fold," "check," "call," "raise," or an announcement of a specific size wager by a player, assuming it is within the rules herein and the minimum and maximum wager limits for the poker table, shall be binding on the player if it is that player's turn to act.

(j) A player who announces a bet or raise of a certain amount but places a different amount of gaming chips in the pot shall be required to correct his or her bet or raise to the announced amount in accordance with the instructions of the dealer.

(k) A player shall be considered to have placed a wager if the player:

(1) Pushes gaming chips forward to indicate the intent of placing a wager;

(2) Releases gaming chips into the pot; or

(3) Releases gaming chips at a sufficient distance from the player and towards the pot to make it obvious that it is intended as a wager.

(l) A player shall not be permitted to make a wager and thereafter attempt to increase the amount of that wager.

(m) If the player wishes to add additional gaming chips to a wager, the player must indicate at the time the wager is being made that the wager is not yet complete.

(n) A player who puts the proper amount of gaming chips into the pot to call a wager, without indicating his or her intention to raise, may not thereafter raise the previous wager.

(o) No player may touch any of the gaming chips once placed into the pot until a decision on the hand has been made.

(p) Unless a raise has been verbally announced by that player, a player who puts into the pot a single gaming chip that is larger than required is assumed to have only called the preceding wager and to be awaiting change from the dealer.

(q) Unless specifically posted at the gaming table to the contrary, a player shall be permitted to raise after he has previously checked in a betting round. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)

111-308-6. Play. (a) Prior to dealing the cards, the player in the first playing position clockwise from the player who has the dealer button must post a small blind bet and the player to the immediate left of the player posting a small blind bet must post a big blind bet. This constitutes the initial betting action.

(b) The dealer must deal four cards one at a time face down to each player. The first player to receive a card is the player in the first player position clockwise from the player assigned the button. The last player to receive cards is the player assigned the button.

(c) After each player receives four cards there is a first round of betting. The player to the left of the player placing the big blind bet may call, raise, or fold and each player following in order shall have the same option to call, raise, or fold.

(d) After the first round of betting is complete the dealer will burn one card and deal three community cards from the deck. Each card will be dealt face up and placed in the center of the table. Community cards are common to the hand of every active player in the hand. Community cards are also known as the "flop."

(e) Following the flop, a second round of betting occurs. The player in the first position clockwise from the player assigned the button shall either check or bet and each player following in order shall call, raise, or fold.

(f) The dealer will burn another card on top of the first burn card. Following the burn card, the dealer then deals another community card face up in the center of the table.

(g) A third round of betting occurs. The player in the first position clockwise from the player assigned the button shall either check or bet and each player following in order shall call, raise, or fold.

(h) Following the third round of betting dealer will burn a third card. The dealer then deals the fifth and final community card and places it face up in the center of table and the final betting round is conducted. The player in the first position clockwise from the player assigned the button shall either check or bet and each player following in order shall call, raise, or fold.

(i) Upon the completion of the final betting round, the cards belonging to each active player are turned face-up and the highest ranking five-card poker hand using two

of the player's cards and three of the community cards wins the pot, unless there is a tie, in which case the pot is split equally between the active players holding tied hands. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)

111-308-7. High/Low Deviation. The following deviation to Omaha Poker is an option that can be played. All Omaha Poker rules shall be followed with the exception of how the player can win the pot or a portion of the pot. This option shall be known as Omaha high-low split eight or better poker.

(a) In Omaha high-low split eight or better poker, the player with the highest ranking five card high hand and the player with the lowest ranking five card low poker hand, subject to the provisions of (b) below, who shall divide the pot equally.

(1) If a pot cannot be divided equally, the excess amount, which shall not exceed \$1.00, shall be given to the player with the highest ranking high hand.

(2) If a tie exists between two or more players for the highest ranking high hand, the high hand share of the pot shall be divided equally among the tied players. If the high hand share of the pot cannot be divided equally among the tied players, the excess, which shall not exceed \$1.00, shall be given to the player with the highest ranking high poker card by suit.

(3) If a tie exists between two or more players for the highest ranking low hand, the low hand share of the pot shall be divided equally among the tied players. If the low hand share of the pot cannot be divided equally among the tied players, the excess, which shall not exceed \$1.00, shall be given to the player with the lowest ranking low poker card by suit.

(4) For purposes of this subsection, the cards shall be ranked by suit with the highest to lowest ranked suit in order as follows: spades, hearts, diamonds and clubs.

(b) In Omaha Poker high-low split eight or better poker, a winning low hand may not contain any pairs or a nine, 10, jack, queen or king. This defines the qualifying clause known as "eight or better." In the event that none of the hands of the remaining players satisfies this requirement, the entire pot shall be awarded to the player with the highest ranking high hand.

(c) The following rules shall only apply in omaha high-low split eight or better poker:

(1) A player may form two different hands of five cards each, enabling that player to contend for both the high hand and low hand share of the pot;

(2) A player may use the same five card grouping to make a high hand and a low hand; and

(3) An ace may be used concurrently as a low card to satisfy a low hand and as a high card to satisfy a high hand.

(d) In Omaha high-low split eight or better poker, an optional kill or half-kill may be offered. A kill button, indicating the kill or half-kill is in effect, shall be placed in front of the player who wins the entire pot in the hand, provided that the amount of the pot is an established dollar amount or multiple of the minimum permissible wa-

ger for the hand, as determined by the lottery gaming facility manager and approved by the executive director. In the succeeding hand, the player shall be required to place no more than one blind bet in the amount of the increased permissible minimum wager for the hand, notwithstanding that the player may be required to place a blind bet to initiate the first round of betting.

(e) Any other player required to place a blind bet to initiate the first round of betting shall be required to place a blind bet in accordance with the posted table requirements. If, in the succeeding hand, a qualifying pot is not split between one player winning the high hand and another player winning the low hand, the kill button shall

be moved in front of the player who wins the entire pot for that hand. The kill or half-kill shall remain in effect until a pot does not qualify in amount or a pot is split between a player winning the high hand and a player winning the low hand. Once a pot does not qualify in amount or is split between two players, the dealer shall collect the kill button. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-26-10, July 14, 2010.)
