The additional 12.05 acres of C\&D disposal area would add approximately 126,384 cubic yards of capacity or approximately 83.2 years of disposal at current disposal rates. The facility is located at 2460 E. Road 130, Scott City, 67871, in the Southwest Quarter of Section 28, Township 18 South, Range 32 West in Scott County, approximately 2 miles east of the junction of US-83 and 2 miles south of K-96 in Scott City. Existing solid waste management activities at this facility include construction and demolition (C\&D) landfill, white goods and scrap metal storage, waste tire storage, tree and brush burn pit, temporary storage of municipal solid waste in drop-off containers, and post-closure care of closed municipal solid waste landfill areas.
The Scott County Commission has certified that the application described herein is consistent with its solid waste management plan and compatible with surrounding land use. KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to issue a permit to Scott County to allow the facility modifications described herein. However, a final decision to issue the permit has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision.

A copy of the administrative record, which includes the Engineering Report and permit application, engineering drawings, draft permit and other information with respect to this permit action, will be available for public review November 19-December 22, during normal business hours, at the following locations:

## Request for Comments on Registration Exemptions for Investment Advisers to Private Funds

The Office of the Kansas Securities Commissioner (KSC) seeks public comment on potential regulatory changes contemplated by enactment of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 (the Act).

Among many other reforms, the Act requires advisers to private funds ( $\mathrm{a} / \mathrm{k} / \mathrm{a}$ hedge funds) with more than $\$ 150$ million in assets under management (AUM) to register with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). However, the Act left to the states the regulation of investment advisers to private funds with less than \$150 million in AUM. Without amendment to current Kansas regulations, these advisers must register with KSC on July 21, 2011, the effective date of the Act.

Though KSC takes very seriously its historical role in protecting small, retail investors from unethical practices and fraud, it understands that current law, with some exceptions, prevents small investor participation in private fund offerings. Further, the adviser regulatory regime designed to protect small investors may not adequately accommodate the legitimate, value-generating business models of private funds. Therefore, KSC is considering an exemption for private fund advisers that would maintain investor protections, reduce regulatory burden, and encourage capital formation and investment.

With respect to private fund advisers, the Act becomes effective July 21, 2011; however, submission of public comment at this early stage will assist KSC in creating sound, reasonable policy in a timely manner. Though KSC seeks comment with respect to the matters listed below, this request is not the final opportunity for public comment. After KSC drafts and publishes in the Kansas Register a proposed rule, the public will have additional opportunity for comment.

KSC appreciates public comment on one or all of the following, as the commentator's knowledge, expertise and experience permit:

1. What is the extent of private fund activity in Kansas currently, with funds of any size and both within and outside of banks, and what types of investment strategies do they typically pursue?
2. Should KSC adopt the same or different rules with regard to advisers to funds formed pursuant to Section 3(c)(1) of the Investment Company Act of 1940
(ICA) and those formed pursuant to Section 3(c)(7) of the ICA? What are the consumer protection consequences of regulating advisers to these funds in the same manner?
3. The Act exempts from SEC registration advisers to a "venture capital fund," though it does require these advisers to follow SEC recordkeeping and reporting requirements. Though the SEC is yet to define "venture capital fund," what policy changes, if any, should KSC consider with regard to registration or regulation of advisers to venture capital funds?
4. Should KSC adopt rules or provide exemptions with regard to advisers to funds formed pursuant to Section 3(c)(5) of the ICA?
5. Requiring advisers to private funds to provide yearly audited financial statements of the fund to investors reduces the possibility of fraud. What are the advantages and disadvantages of requiring a private fund adviser, as a condition of their registration exemption, to provide to investors the private fund's yearly audited financial statements?
6. Should KSC apply current adviser bonding requirements to advisers to private funds?
7. What are the typical qualifications of advisers to Kansas-based private funds? Should KSC require certain minimal examinations and expertise for private fund advisers?
8. Recent changes to financial institution affiliate transaction rules prohibit banks from certain private fund transactions and management arrangements. Will banks with these types of operations spin off their advisory personnel, and if so, to what extent are the needs of these fund advisers different than that of other private fund advisers?
9. Government funds available for borrowing by Small Business Investment Companies (SBICs) are subject to unpredictable congressional appropriation and increasing regulatory scrutiny. Might some SBICs choose to forgo SBIC regulation and convert to a state-sponsored regime if one were available? If so, what characteristics of a state-sponsored regime might be attractive to an SBIC?
10. What other factors should KSC consider in drafting exemptions or rules for advisers to private funds under state jurisdiction, or generally in response to the Act to enhance and improve capital formation and the Kansas economy?

## Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, January 18, at the Office of the Securities Commissioner, 109 S.W. 9th, Suite 600, Topeka, to consider the amendment of K.A.R. 81-2-1, 81-3-6 and 81-14-5. The regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis.
K.A.R. 81-3-6 sets forth a list of dishonest and unethical practices that constitute grounds for discipline against a broker-dealer or agent. Similarly, K.A.R. 81-14-5 sets forth the dishonest and unethical practices for investment advisers and investment adviser representatives. The proposed amendments would make it unethical for a bro-ker-dealer, agent, investment adviser or investment adviser representative to violate the requirements of existing federal law while obtaining benefits for clients from the Department of Veterans Affairs. The amendments to K.A.R. 81-2-1 provide for adoption of the federal statutes and regulations by reference.

The amendments are not expected to result in increased costs to registrants because any person who provides services to veterans is already required to comply with the rules of the Department of Veterans Affairs. However, a violation of the federal rules will now constitute an unethical practice under state law and may result in statelevel sanctions against a registrant. Costs associated with record-keeping are expected to be minimal because the amendments merely require retention of records that are already mandated by the Department of Veterans Affairs. The proposed amendments are not expected to have a significant economic impact upon the Office of the Securities Commissioner because compliance will be monitored in conjunction with regular examinations of registrants, and violations will be resolved like other deficiencies discovered during the course of the examinations. The amendments will have no known economic impact on the investing public, small employers (other than broker-dealers and investment advisers), or any other governmental agency or entity.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing by addressing them to the Kansas Securities Commissioner, 109 S.W. 9th, Suite 600, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation. Following the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commissioner as a basis for making changes to the proposed regulations.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for ac-
commodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Michelle Lancaster at (785) 296-5215 or the Kansas Relay Center at (800) 766-3777. ## Article 4.-MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

28-4-503. Timing of specimen collections. (a) The initial specimen from each infant born in an institution shall be obtained as follows:
(1) Before discharge but no later than at 72 hours of age;
(2) before any transfer of the infant from the institution of birth to another institution; and
(3) before any blood transfusion.
(b) The initial specimen from each infant born outside of an institution shall be obtained as follows:
(1) No later than at 72 hours of age; and
(2) before any blood transfusion.
(c) A repeat specimen shall be obtained from each infant born in an institution or outside of an institution under any of the following conditions:
(1) The specimen is unsatisfactory as specified in K.A.R. 28-4-505.
(2) Follow-up recommendations have been issued by the department.
(3) The infant is less than 24 hours old when the initial specimen is taken. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-101 and K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-180; implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-180 and K.S.A. 65-181; effective, T-87-48, Dec. 19, 1986; effective May 1, 1987; amended April 14, 2000; amended Dec. 3, 2010.)

28-4-505. Unsatisfactory specimens. (a) Each unsatisfactory specimen shall be retained by the department. The sending agency or facility shall be notified that the specimen is unsatisfactory. The physician or birth attendant shall be notified that the specimen is unsatisfactory with a request to submit another specimen.
(b) A specimen shall be labeled unsatisfactory if one of the following criteria is met:
(1) Identifying information is missing.
(2) More than 10 days have elapsed since the date of collection.
(3) The specimen is of unacceptable quality or quantity for analysis. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-101 and K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-180; implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65180 and K.S.A. 65-181; effective, T-87-48, Dec. 19, 1986; effective May 1, 1987; amended April 14, 2000; amended Dec. 3, 2010.)

28-4-514. MSUD and PKU; financial assistance availability for certain related expenses. (a)(1) The following factors shall be used to determine each family's eligibility for financial assistance for necessary treatment products or medically necessary food treatment products, or both:
(A) Applicable income; and
(B) cash assets in excess of 15 percent of the applicable income.
(2) If a family seeking financial assistance under this regulation has more than one family member with MSUD or PKU, the family shall be considered eligible for financial assistance at a level that is 100 percent less than the eligibility level for a family with one family member.
(b) Each individual who applies for or who receives financial assistance under this regulation shall also meet the requirements in K.A.R. 28-4-401.
(c) The following eligibility requirements shall apply to each family:
(1) Each family with applicable income and cash assets less than or equal to 185 percent of the federal poverty level shall be eligible to receive 100 percent of the cost of necessary treatment products. This family shall be eligible each year for up to $\$ 1,000$ of medically necessary food treatment products for family members who are 18 years of age and younger.
(2) Each family with applicable income and cash assets more than 185 percent but not more than 285 percent of the federal poverty level shall be eligible to receive 50 percent of the cost of necessary treatment products.
(3) Each family with applicable income and cash assets more than 285 percent but not more than 385 percent of the federal poverty level shall be eligible to receive 25 percent of the cost of necessary treatment products.
(4) No family with applicable income and cash assets over 385 percent of the federal poverty level shall be eligible to receive any of the cost of necessary treatment products.
(d) If a family's health insurance covers a portion of the cost of necessary treatment products, the family's financial responsibility for this cost shall be determined pursuant to subsection (c).
(e) If the department orders any necessary treatment products for a family that is responsible for part of the cost, that family shall receive a statement indicating the amount to be reimbursed to the department. If reimbursement is not received from the family within 60 days of the statement date, the placement of any future orders for necessary treatment products for that family shall no longer be processed by the department. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-101 and K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-180; implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-180; effective, T-28-7-5-06, July 5, 2006; effective Oct. 20, 2006; amended Dec. 3, 2010.)

28-4-520. Definitions. In addition to the definitions in K.S.A. 65-1,241 and amendments thereto, each of the
following terms shall have the meaning assigned in this regulation:
(a) "Abnormal condition" means any condition established at conception or acquired in utero that results in a morphologic, metabolic, functional, or behavioral disorder requiring medical or other intervention.
(b) "Birth defects information system" means the Kansas birth defects reporting system, which collects, maintains, analyzes, and disseminates information regarding abnormal conditions, birth defects, and congenital anomalies of each stillbirth and of each child from birth to five years of age with a birth defect.
(c) "Congenital anomaly" means an error of morphogenesis that is established at conception or acquired during intrauterine life, which is also referred to as a birth defect.
(d) "ICD-9-CM" means the clinical modification of the "international classification of diseases," ninth revision, published by Ingenix inc., which is used to code and classify morbidity data from inpatient and outpatient records, physician offices, and most surveys from the national center for health statistics. The following portions of volume one of this document are hereby adopted by reference:
(1) "Genetic and metabolic conditions," codes 243 through 279.2 on pages 49 through 60;
(2) "sickle cell anemia and other hemoglobinopathies," codes 282.4 through 282.7 on pages 61 and 62;
(3) "congenital anomalies," codes 740 through 759 on pages 227 through 240; and
(4) "fetal alcohol syndrome," code 760.71 on page 241.
(e) "Primary diagnosis" means the principal disease or condition assigned to an infant by a licensed physician based on the history of the disease process, signs and symptoms, laboratory data, and special tests. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-1,245; effective Dec. 3, 2010.)

28-4-521. Reporting abnormal conditions and congenital anomalies. (a) Reporting requirements. Each physician, hospital, and freestanding birthing center shall report to the birth defects information system, pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1,241 and amendments thereto, the abnormal conditions and congenital anomalies listed in the portions of ICD-9-CM adopted by reference in K.A.R. 28-4-520.
(b) Method of reporting. Each abnormal condition and congenital anomaly that is required to be reported under this regulation shall be reported to the birth defects information system on a form approved by the secretary.
(c) Removal of reported information. Any parent or legal guardian may request the removal of reported information from the birth defects information system by using the removal form in accordance with K.S.A. 65-1,244, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-1,245; implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 65-1,241, 65-1,244, and 65-1,245; effective Dec. 3, 2010.)
