The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5310 program is to provide funds to support private nonprofit corporations and authorized governments to provide transportation services to meet the special needs of the elderly and persons with disabilities. Federal funding under this program is available for capital expenditures only. State funding is available for operating expenses up to maximum of \$4,000.00.

The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5311 program is to provide funds to support rural and nonurbanized (cities less than 50,000 population) public transportation projects.

The goal of the U.S.C. 49-5311 program is to provide services to the general public on an equal opportunity basis. Funds can be used for either operating or capital expenses.

The purpose of the U.S.C 49-5311(f) program is to support the connection between nonurbanized areas and the larger regional or national system of intercity bus and to support services to meet the intercity travel needs of residents in nonurbanized areas.

The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5316 Job Access \& Reverse Commute (JARC) program is to improve access to transportation services to employment and employment-related activities for welfare recipients and eligible low-income individuals and to transport residents of urbanized and nonurbanized areas to suburban employment opportunities.

The U.S.C. 49-5317 New Freedom formula grant program aims to provide additional tools to overcome existing barriers facing Americans with disabilities and seeks to reduce the barriers to transportation services and expand the transportation mobility options available to people with disabilities beyond the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.

The state funding for urban and rural public transportation for the state fiscal year 2012 is budgeted at $\$ 6$ million. With the challenging financial situation facing the state of Kansas, it is possible that state fund availability could be reduced, which may increase the requirement for local match.

Applications for the 5310, 5311, 5316 and 5317 funds must be local units of government, Indian Tribes, or private nonprofit organizations registered with the Kansas Secretary of State to do business in Kansas. In addition, all applicants must be an active member in good standing of their Coordinated Transit District (CTD) in order to receive funding. Those agencies applying for funds in the metropolitan areas of Kansas City, Wichita, Lawrence and Topeka need to contact their respective Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to ensure that their application request is included in the MPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

When downloading the applications from the Internet, potential applicants will need the appropriate application form, application instructions and vehicle cost estimates. The CTD and KDOT contact lists also are available on the Web site. Any potential applicants that do not have Internet access can request an application by contacting the KDOT Public Transit Office.

The application must indicate whether the request is for replacement vehicles, an expansion of services currently provided, a new start application, or if the application is for the funding of only operating assistance. "New Start" is defined as any proposed service that was not previously in existence. "Expansion" is defined as adding transit service to areas not already receiving services (for example: providing services to new locations or adding evening and weekend service).

KDOT has developed selection criteria to be used by the Kansas Coordinated Transit District Council (KCTDC) in evaluating the capital request applications. A copy of the selection criteria can be obtained from the KDOT Web site or by contacting KDOT. The applications
will be ranked by the KCTDC in February 2011. After the application ranking by the KCTDC, KDOT staff will use the selection criteria in their evaluation of the applications. It should be noted that all items on the application must be completed. Points will be deducted in the ranking process for missing or incomplete information.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health, Bureau of Local and Rural Health, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Friday, March 18, in the Flint Hills Conference Room (3A) of the Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider amendments to charitable health care provider regulations, K.A.R. 28-53-1, 28-53-2 and 28-53-4. A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact follows:

## Summary of Regulations:

K.A.R. 28-53-1. Proposed amendment clarifies and expands the definition of an entity eligible to become a "point of entry" to include an indigent health care clinic or a local health department and removes the eligibility of a charitable health care provider to serve as a "point of entry."
K.A.R. 28-53-2. Proposed amendment clarifies and expands language related to the termination of agreements with the secretary to include a point of entry.
K.A.R. 28-53-4. Proposed amendment clarifies the responsibility of the charitable health care provider to maintain required program records and reporting or ensure that the point of entry maintains records and reporting.

## Economic Impact:

Costs to persons affected by the regulations, the agency, or other governmental agencies or units: The amendments to these regulations will have no economic impact on any person, the agency, or other government agencies or units.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. ## Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Department of Revenue at 9 a.m. Monday, February 21, in the secretary's conference room, Room 230, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider the adoption of alcoholic beverage control regulations. Copies of these proposed regulations may be found at www.ksrevenue.org.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written comments from the public on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written public comments on the proposed regulations prior to the hearing to Kathleen Smith, Tax Specialist, Office of Policy and Research, Room 230, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612, or through e-mail at kathleen_smith@kdor.state.ks.us.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, either orally or in writing or both, concerning the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Kathleen Smith at (785) 296-3081 or TTY (785) 296-6461. Disabled parking is located in State Parking Lot No. 2, south of the Docking Building facing Harrison Street. The east entrance to the Docking Building is accessible.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impacts follow:

## Article 6.-CONTAINERS AND LABELS

Amendments to K.A.R. 14-6-1. This amendment adds flavored malt beverage packages and cereal malt beverage packages to the list of alcoholic beverage packages
that must be approved prior to sale. It also adds farm wineries and micro-breweries to the list of licensees required to register its brands and get label approval from the director. New section (b) provides reasons for which an original package may not be approved for sale in Kansas. Further changes include language and structural updates required by the Department of Administration and the Attorney General's Office that do not affect the meaning of the regulation or create additional requirements.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

## Article 10.-TRADE PRACTICES

Amendments to K.A.R. 14-10-5. This amendment provides definitions for terms used in the trade practice regulations. The definitions mirror those of the federal regulations addressing trade practices between industry members and retailers of alcoholic liquors. Other terms not necessary for this article of these regulations were removed.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-6. This regulation prohibits an industry member from inducing the purchases of a retailer by providing any equipment, fixtures, signs, supplies, money, services, or any thing of value. The regulation also provides that the use of interpretive memos from the federal alcohol and tobacco tax and trade bureau shall be considered good faith compliance.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.
Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-7. This regulation prohibits an industry member from indirectly inducing, through a third party, the purchases of a retailer.
Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-8. This regulation specifies what equipment may and may not be sold by an industry member to a retailer.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-9. This regulation prohibits an industry member from assisting a licensee in getting a license.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-10. This regulation specifies what an industry member may and may not provide in the way of advertising for a licensee.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Amendments to K.A.R. 14-10-11. This amendment allows any industry member to package nonalcoholic goods with original packages of liquor for sale to the consumer. Old subsection (b) is being removed because that
issue is dealt with in the federal regulations the department is adopting by reference to govern the trade practices between industry members and retailers of alcoholic liquor. Additional changes to language and structure that do not change the intent of the regulation or create additional requirements were made at the request of the Department of Administration and the Attorney General's Office.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.
Amendments to K.A.R. 14-10-12. This amendment requires both retailers and industry members to maintain records of all equipment, supplies, services, advertising material, outdoor signs, outdoor advertising specialty items, and product display items provided by the industry member to the retailer for at least three years or until one year after the item has been removed from the retail premises, whichever is longer.
Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other government agencies. Liquor licensees may incur minimal costs associated with acquiring and maintaining the required records.

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-13. This regulation specifies what an industry member may provide for product displays to a licensee.
Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-14. This regulation specifies what an industry member may provide as retail advertising specialties to a licensee.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Revocation of K.A.R. 14-10-15. This regulation specifies what an industry member may do in participating in retailer association activities.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Amendments to K.A.R. 14-10-16. This amendment authorizes an industry member to retrieve damaged liquor containers from a retailer and exchange the damaged liquor for undamaged product.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

Adoption of K.A.R. 14-10-17. Trade practices. This new regulation adopts many of the trade practice regulations promulgated by the federal alcohol and tobacco tax and trade bureau (TTB) as the trade practice regulations of Kansas.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other government agencies. Industry members may see cost savings due to streamlined practices since they now have only one rule to follow on many issues.

Adoption of K.A.R. 14-10-20. Outdoor advertising specialty items. This new regulation provides require-
(continued)
ments and procedures for an industry member who provides outdoor advertising specialty items to a liquor retailer. "Outdoor advertising specialty item" means any object intended to be displayed on, but not permanently attached to, the outside of the retailer's premises, bearing conspicuous and substantial permanently inscribed or affixed advertising material about a product or an industry member. The term includes banners, inflatable objects, vehicles, trailers, and tents.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other government agencies. Industry members may incur minimal costs (time and postage fees) through the notice requirement.

Adoption of K.A.R. 14-10-21. Items furnished by industry members; limits. This new regulation establishes a monetary limit on the amount of point-of-sale advertising materials an industry member may provide to any one retailer. It also prohibits an industry member and a retailer from exceeding the federal and state limits on items provided by industry members to retailers.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other government agencies. Industry members and retailers may incur costs through fines and penalties for violations of this regulation.

Adoption of K.A.R. 14-10-22. Display enhancers. This new regulation prohibits an industry member from furnishing display enhancers to retailers. Display enhancers are items used in the retailer's premise that draw the consumer's attention to a display of alcoholic liquor and does not meet the definition of product display or point-of-sale advertising materials. Display enhancers are items such as kayaks, canoes, grills, tents, gazebos, inflatable objects, televisions, furniture, etc. The regulation does allow retailers to provide their own display enhancers, with documentation showing the item was purchased or provided by the retailer.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other government agencies. Industry members and retailers may incur costs through fines and penalties for violations of this regulation.

Adoption of K.A.R. 14-10-23. Point-of-sale advertising material. This new regulation clarifies that an industry member may provide point-of-sale (POS) advertising materials to a retailer, in accordance with state and federal regulations. The regulation further lists items that are not considered POS, to limit the types of items provided to those intended to be allowed by federal regulations, and prohibits a retailer from accepting those items listed.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other gov-
ernment agencies. Industry members and retailers may incur costs through fines and penalties for violations of this regulation.

## Article 13.-RETAIL LIQUOR DEALER

Amendments to K.A.R. 14-13-12. This amendment prohibits a retailer from knowingly selling any package of alcoholic liquor that is not fit for sale to the general public. The amendment further allows a retailer to buy back beer sold to the holder of a temporary permit.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department, other government agencies, or private businesses or individuals.

## Article 14.-MANUFACTURERS; DISTRIBUTORS; NONBEVERAGE USERS; FARM WINERIES; MICROBREWERIES

Amendments to K.A.R. 14-14-6a. This regulation is being amended to apply only to the withdrawal of liquor inventory for sampling or product promotions. The sections dealing with educational or industry seminars was moved to a new regulation, K.A.R. 14-14-6b. The amendments include restrictions on the amount and purpose of the samples, as well as a requirement that the distributor maintain records of the liquor withdrawal.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other government agencies. Industry members may incur minimal costs for the creation and maintenance of the records required by this regulation. Additional costs could be accrued due to fines and penalties for violations of this regulation.

Adoption of K.A.R. 14-14-6b. Educational seminars. This new regulation clarifies that a distributor may conduct educational seminars for retailers and their employees and provides guidelines and restrictions for the conduct of those seminars. The regulation does allow retailers to provide their own display enhancers, with documentation showing the item was purchased or provided by the retailer.

Economic Impact: The Department of Revenue does not anticipate any impact on the department or other government agencies. Distributors may incur minimal costs for the creation and maintenance of the records required by this regulation. Additional costs could be accrued due to fines and penalties for violations of this regulation.
