Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1 p.m. Wednesday, November 16, in Room 510 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes to existing rules and regulations of the Board of Technical Professions.

This 60-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Board of Technical Professions, Suite 507, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612, or by email to jeanb@ksbtp.ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

K.A.R. 66-7-1. Applications. This existing regulation is being revised to clarify documentation required of an individual applying by reciprocity for a Kansas license to practice a technical profession.

K.A.R. 66-9-7. Educational standard acceptable to the board for reciprocity applicants. This existing regulation is being revised to allow an applicant for a license to practice architecture by reciprocity to meet the educational requirement for licensure by supplying a record certified by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

K.A.R. 66-10-1. Architectural experience of a character satisfactory to the board. This existing regulation is being

revised to reflect the current version of the "intern development program guidelines," published by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

K.A.R. 66-10-3. Architectural experience required of a reciprocity applicant. This existing regulation is being revised to allow an applicant for a license to practice architecture by reciprocity to submit a record certified by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and removes other, more restrictive, requirements.

K.A.R. 66-12-1. Minimum standards for the practice of land surveying. This existing regulation is being revised to reflect the current version of the "minimum standard detail requirements for ALTA/ACSM land title surveys."

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, on the 1st day of September, 2011, I declared a state of local emergency for Saline County, as a result of a train derailment near the Union Pacific Railroad Yard at 5th & Decatur Streets in Salina; and,

WHEREAS, this disaster has caused or threatens to cause an emergency as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f and which has or threatens to interrupt the delivery of essential services or essential supplies or otherwise immediately threatens physical harm or injury to persons, the public welfare and/or substantial damage to property; and

WHEREAS, conditions exists which require the operation of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles for the purposes of providing direct assistance to supplement State and local efforts in the restoration of services and relief in the affected area(s) of the State of Kansas.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby declare there is a state of local emergency existing in the above-listed counties, and as a result, it is necessary to expedite all efforts of restoration of services and relief. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Kansas in this emergency situation, I hereby order the following:

1. This declaration only applies to motor carriers responding to with equipment dedicated to resetting the derailed cars for Union Pacific Railroad.
2. In accordance with Title 49 C.F.R. § 390.23, the requirements contained in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Title 49 C.F.R. Parts 390-399 are hereby suspended through the duration of the motor carrier's assistance in the disaster relief effort not to exceed a period of five (5) days from the date of the initial declaration unless the order is rescinded or expanded by executive order or concurrent resolution of the legislature; and

Social and Rehabilitation Services**Request for Proposals**

The Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Division of Disability and Behavioral Health Services, Addiction and Prevention Services announces the release of a request for proposals to participate in a coalition mentoring initiative as part of the federally funded Strategic Prevention Framework State Incentive Grant (SPF SIG). Funded communities will be matched with a current SPF SIG grantee to conduct a needs assessment and implement low- or no-cost, evidence-based, environmental prevention strategies to prevent and reduce underage drinking. Community partnerships/coalitions are invited to compete for one of four mentoring grants that will be awarded to communities that meet criteria based on high prevalence of underage drinking.

A total of \$173,450 is available and it is expected that successful applicants will be awarded \$43,362 for a period of approximately eight months, with awards being initiated in November 2011 and concluding June 30, 2012. All strategies approved for funding through the SPF grant program must demonstrate evidence of effectiveness.

Eligible applicants and fiscal agents represent community partnerships/coalitions and may include either local units of government or not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organizations based in the targeted community. Community partnerships are considered for the purpose of this grant program as multi-disciplinary representatives of communities. Community partnerships/coalitions must target an entire geographic county.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region VII, have received a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) hazardous waste Part A and Part B permit renewal application from Nexeo Solutions, LLC (Nexeo), formerly Ashland Distribution, located at 5420 Speaker Road, Kansas City, Kansas. KDHE and the EPA are providing notice of their intent to renew a jointly issued RCRA hazardous waste storage permit to Nexeo, the owner and operator of the facility.

The facility was originally permitted to store hazardous wastes in 1988 and assigned the EPA identification number KSD057889313. The permit was renewed in 2000, and again the facility has submitted the necessary applications for the renewal of its permit to continue operating the hazardous waste storage facility.

In October 1985, the state of Kansas received final authorization from the EPA to implement its own hazardous waste management program in lieu of the federal program except for the portions covered by the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984. The KDHE portion of the permit (Part I) will be issued under the authority of K.S.A. 65-3430 et seq. and K.A.R. 28-31-4 through 28-31-279a, and the EPA portion of the permit (Part II) will be issued under the authority of sections 3001(g), 3001(h), 3002(b), 3004(d), 3004 (u) and (v), 3005 and 6001 of RCRA.

Part I of the permit will authorize Nexeo to receive and store hazardous waste in approved containers generated from on-site and off-site generators. A maximum of 9,240 gallons of containerized liquid and solid hazardous waste may be stored in the permitted storage area. The materials stored at the facility will include ignitable, corrosive, reactive, toxic and listed liquid or solid hazardous wastes. The container storage area complies with 40 CFR Part 264 Subparts I and CC, and Part 270 requirements for con-

tainer storage areas. Emergency equipment is available at the facility and appropriate warning signs are posted. The EPA portion (Part II) of the joint permit will address the requirements of HSWA.

A copy of the administrative record, which includes the draft permit, the permit application and all information pertaining to this permit action, was made available for public review from August 4 through September 18. With the publication of this notice, KDHE and the EPA are extending the public review period through November 2. The administrative record will continue to be available for public review during this extended review period, Monday through Friday, during normal business hours, at the following locations:

Anyone wishing to comment on the draft permit should submit written comments postmarked not later than November 2 to Mostafa Kamal (KDHE) or Patricia Murrow (EPA) at the above addresses.

A public hearing has not been scheduled; however, if written requests are received that indicate a significant degree of public interest in the draft permit a public hearing will be scheduled. After consideration of all comments received, the secretary of KDHE and the EPA director of the Air and Waste Management Division will make a final permit decision. Notice will be given to the applicant, to all persons who submitted written comments, to those who commented at the public hearing, and to those who requested notice of the final permit decision. If none of the comments received during the public comment period result in revisions to the draft permit, the permit will become effective immediately upon its issuance. If comments received during the public comment period result in revisions, the permit will become effective 30 days after service of notice of the final decision or at a later date, if a review is requested under 40 CFR 124.19.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Cessna Aircraft Company has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et seq. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Cessna Aircraft Company, One Cessna Boulevard, Independence, KS 67301, owns and operates an aircraft manufacturing facility located at the same address.

In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received before the close of business October 17.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Sharon Burrell, Bureau of Air, not later than the close of business October 17 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or

Article 301.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES

111-301-21. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort in Dodge City, Kansas, entitled "Live Poker - Bad Beat Jackpot" beginning on or after July 16, 2011.

The rules and regulations for the game of "Live Poker - Bad Beat Jackpot" are contained in K.A.R. 111-301-21 through 111-301-31, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-22. General provisions. (a) Boot Hill Casino & Resort may offer a payout for one or more pre-designated, high-value poker hands when such a hand is held by a player as a losing hand in a round of play (a "bad beat").

(b) A bad beat payout shall be made from a separate fund created from pot contributions required at live poker tables where a bad beat payout is offered.

(c) Boot Hill Casino & Resort shall affix a bad beat drop box to each live poker table participating in the bad beat promotion. This box shall be used solely for the collection of bad beat jackpot contributions.

(d) Boot Hill Casino & Resort shall post an initial contribution of \$1,000.00 to the bad beat primary jackpot fund.

(e) Boot Hill Casino & Resort shall extract a prescribed contribution to the bad beat jackpot from each pot at a participating poker table. Prior to distributing the pot to a winning patron and after the dealer has extracted the rake, the amount from each pot to be contributed to a bad beat jackpot fund shall be determined, segregated from the pot, and deposited into the bad beat drop box.

(f) The bad beat jackpot money will be collected at the end of each gaming day to coincide with the table games drop by the drop team. The bad beat jackpot boxes will be emptied into a locking bag and secured on the trolley cart with the table game drop boxes.

(g) Boot Hill Casino & Resort shall post at each live poker table that offers a bad beat payout a notice advising patrons of eligibility for such payout. In addition to displaying the current amount of any bad beat payout, Boot Hill Casino & Resort shall post its bad beat payout rules in a conspicuous location within its poker room which, at a minimum, shall address:

(1) The maximum amount that can be contributed from each pot and the method of calculation for any contributed amount;

(2) The minimum pot amount required for a contribution to a bad beat payout; and

(3) Qualifying bad beat requirements and payouts.

(h) Boot Hill Casino & Resort will conspicuously display the amount of the current primary jackpot and the secondary jackpot.

(i) The "Live Poker — Bad Beat Jackpot" shall not apply to any tournament games of any kind. Only live poker games where revenue is generated from extracting rakes from each pot will participate in the "Live Poker — Bad Beat Jackpot" promotion. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-23. Eligibility. (a) Employees of Boot Hill Casino & Resort and its affiliates are not eligible.

(b) All persons must be 21 years of age or older to be eligible.

(c) A patron must be present to win and must present identification and players club card to claim prizes.

(d) Participants grant Boot Hill Casino & Resort permission to use their name and/or photograph for promotional purposes without additional compensation.

(e) Prize is non-transferrable.

(f) All applicable taxes will be applied to all awarded prizes.

(g) Any claims for a prize arising out of fraud, misrepresentation, collusion or dishonesty shall not be paid or awarded. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-24. Qualification for jackpot. In order to trigger the progressive bad beat jackpot, a patron must have a "qualifying poker hand" as set forth in K.A.R. 111-301-25 and K.A.R. 111-301-26. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-25. Qualifying poker hands. (a) In order to trigger the progressive bad beat jackpot in Texas Hold 'Em, the second highest hand must consist of four-of-a-kind (quads) or better.

(b) Both the qualifying bad beat hand and the winning hand must be in action at the final showdown.

(c) Both the qualifying bad beat hand and the winning hand must use two (2) hole cards to create their 5-card hands.

(d) For a four-of-a-kind (quads), the player's hand must contain a pocket pair.

(e) A hand shall only qualify for the bad beat payout if the pot amount, including the house rake, is at least \$20.00. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-26. Additional rules for promotion play and verification. (a) A Boot Hill Casino & Resort pit manager or higher ranking casino employee must verify every qualifying poker hand before any prize money will be awarded. In the event that a qualifying hand is not verified before a new hand is dealt, then that hand shall be declared null and void for participation in this promotion. No new hand shall be dealt until the qualifying hand has been verified as set forth herein

(b) If a player has a qualifying hand, the dealer will immediately count down the deck to make sure the exact number of cards and the proper suits and rank are in compliance with a standard deck. Should there be a deviation from the standard deck, then that particular jackpot hand shall be declared null and void.

(c) If, upon inspection, markings on individual cards indicate to management that the deck in question has been compromised, then the jackpot hand shall be declared null and void.

(d) If, in Boot Hill Casino & Resort's judgment, there is communication among players, whether verbal or otherwise, indicating that one player already has a jackpot hand or is drawing to such a hand, or makes remarks or signs that lead other players to believe that this is the time to attempt to play for such a hand, the jackpot hand shall be declared null and void.

(e) All winners must provide valid identification as required by Boot Hill Casino & Resort.

(f) Winnings are non-transferable. Patrons may not substitute another person or another person's name to claim their winnings. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-27. Daily contributions. (a) A qualifying pot shall, including the house rake, consist of at least \$20.00.

(b) From each qualifying pot, after all rakes have been collected and before the pot is distributed, the dealer shall segregate \$1.00 worth of cheques for a pot between \$20.00 and \$39.00 or \$2.00 worth of cheques for a pot greater than or equal to \$40.00 and place them in the bad beat drop box. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-28. Jackpot funding. (a) Except for the initial funding of \$1,000.00 from Boot Hill Casino & Resort as provided in the general provisions, the bad beat jackpot shall be funded in its entirety by qualifying daily contributions.

(b) Beginning with the first bad beat contribution, two funds shall be established. A primary jackpot shall be awarded to a qualifying bad beat hand and all other qualifying players, while a secondary jackpot shall be funded

to serve as replenishment for the primary jackpot after it has been awarded.

(c) The initial contribution from Boot Hill Casino & Resort of \$1,000.00 shall be applied to the primary jackpot fund only.

(d) For each additional contribution to the bad beat jackpot, seventy percent (70%) of the contribution shall be applied to the primary jackpot fund, and thirty percent (30%) shall be applied to the secondary jackpot fund.

(e) When the qualifying hand has been verified and the primary jackpot has been awarded, the secondary jackpot will be established as the new primary jackpot, and the new secondary jackpot will be set at \$0.00. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-29. Prize distribution. (a) If the qualifications for the jackpot are met, the following percentages based on the primary jackpot amount will be awarded:

(1) The patron with the second highest hand shall receive fifty percent (50%) of the primary jackpot total.

(2) The patron with the highest hand shall receive twenty-five percent (25%) of the primary jackpot total.

(3) All other active players that were dealt into the hand that qualified for the bad beat jackpot shall split equally the remaining twenty-five percent (25%) of the primary jackpot total.

(b) Immediately upon verification of a qualifying bad beat hand, the floor supervisor or higher ranking casino employee shall adjust the signage for the primary and secondary bad beat jackpots. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-30. Counting of daily contributions. (a) At least once each gaming day, Boot Hill Casino & Resort shall count the accumulated contents of each bad beat drop box and report the totals to the revenue auditing department.

(b) It shall be the responsibility of Boot Hill Casino & Resort to account for, securely transport, and accurately count the accumulated contents of all bad beat drop boxes in identical fashion to counting daily poker revenue. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-301-31. Accounting. (a) The official record of the amount of daily contributions to the bad beat jackpot shall be maintained by the casino accounting and/or revenue audit department.

(b) The official record of the current jackpot totals will be maintained by the casino accounting and/or revenue audit department. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

Article 305.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES; THREE CARD POKER

111-305-2. Object of game. Three Card Poker is a game which the player may play against the dealer and/

(1) A player may compete solely against the dealer by placing an ante wager in an amount within the posted minimum and maximum wagers and then placing a play wager in an equal amount after reviewing his or her cards; or

(2) A player may compete solely against a posted payout ledger by placing a pair plus wager in any amount within the posted minimum and maximum wagers; or

(3) A player may compete against both the dealer and the posted scale of payouts by placing wagers in accordance with the requirements of (a)1 and 2 above.

(b) All wagers at three card poker shall be made by placing gaming chips or other authorized bet on the appropriate betting areas of the table layout. A verbal wager accompanied by cash is not permitted.

(c) Only players who are seated at a three card poker table may wager at the game. Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, that player must remain seated until the completion of the round of play or they may forfeit their wager.

(d) All ante wagers and pair plus wagers shall be placed prior to dealing any cards. No wager shall be made, increased, or withdrawn after the first card has been dealt. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-3-23-10, Feb. 17, 2010; amended, T-111-7-14-11, June 15, 2011.)

111-305-6. Play. (a) All play wagers shall be placed as provided below:

(1) Play-dealing. All ante wagers and pair plus wagers shall be placed prior to the first card being dealt.

(2) Each player and the dealer are dealt three cards face down.

(b) After the dealing above has been completed, each player shall examine his or her cards. Each player who wagers at three card poker shall be responsible for his or her own hand and no person other than the dealer and the player to whom the cards were dealt may touch the cards of that player.

(c) After examination of his or her cards, each player who has placed an ante wager shall have the option to either make a play wager in an amount equal to the player's ante wager or forfeit the ante wager and end his or her participation in the round of play. The dealer shall offer this option to each player, starting with the player farthest to the left of the dealer and moving clockwise around the table in order. If a player has placed an ante wager and a pair plus wager but does not make a play wager, the player shall forfeit both the ante wager and the pair plus wager. After each player has either placed a wager on the table in the play wager area or forfeited his or her wager and hand, the dealer shall collect all forfeited wagers and associated cards, placing them in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine. The dealer

shall then reveal the dealer's cards and place the cards so as to form the highest possible ranking hand.

(d) The dealer shall then settle the wagers remaining on the table by performing the procedure in (e) immediately below. The dealer's cards shall be placed in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine after all players' cards have been collected.

(e) The dealer shall, for each of the following procedures, start with the player farthest to the dealer's right and continue counterclockwise around the table until the procedure has been completed as to all players:

(1) Reveal the three card hand of each remaining player;

(2) Collect all losing wagers;

(3) Pay each winning wager in accordance with the payout odds listed below; and

(4) Collect all player hands and place them in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine.

(f) All cards collected by the dealer shall be picked up in order and placed in the discard rack or automatic shuffling machine in such a way that they can be readily arranged to reconstruct each hand in the event of a question or dispute.

(g) There are three payout types, as follows:

(1) A player in competition against the dealer shall be paid 1 to 1 on both the ante wager and the play wager if the player's hand is ranked higher than the dealer's hand; however, a player's hand must beat the dealer's qualifying hand of a queen or higher ranking card to win both wagers. If the dealer does not hold a hand with a "queen high or better" rank, the ante wager shall automatically be paid 1 to 1 and the play wager shall be returned to the player as a "draw."

(2) A player placing a pair plus wager, shall be paid in accordance with a posted pay table at no less than the following odds:

Pair	1 to 1
Flush	3 to 1
Straight	6 to 1
Three-of-a-kind	30 to 1
Straight flush	40 to 1

(3) A player placing an ante wager and a play wager shall be paid an ante bonus if the player's hand consists of one of the following:

Straight	pays	1 to 1
Three-of-a-kind	pays	4 to 1
Straight flush	pays	5 to 1

If the dealer's hand beats the player's hand, the player loses the ante and the play bets, but the player receives the ante bonus as specified above. The ante bonus is paid even if the player does not wager the pair plus wager.
