#### **Public Notice**

The following ICFsMR cost center limits are being set forth for public comment. Comments should be sent to Pamela Keller, Program Administrator, Community Supports and Services, 9th Floor East, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612. The comment period will expire 30 days from the publication of this notice.

K.A.R. 30-10-214 provides for the annual review and adjustment of Class II ICFsMR cost center limits, approved by the secretary of SRS or designee, based on current cost information supplied by the enrolled, licensed providers of ICF-MR services, and formula set forth in the Kansas State Medicaid Plan (Attachment 4.19-D, Part II, Subpart O, page 1). The formula is as follows: Total allowable costs, including an inflation factor, are compared to the amount to be reimbursed under the current limits. The formula threshold requires that 60 percent of all ICFsMR are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs. If less than 60 percent of the facilities are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs, then the cost center limits are adjusted until the threshold is met. The inflation factor is based on the Global Insight Health-Care Cost Review (formerly Data Resources, Inc. (DRI) -WEFA), National Skilled Nursing Facility Total Market Basket Index.

To determine where to make the adjustments, two major cost centers are analyzed according to the following prescription:

- · Administrative costs are based on facility size.
- Habilitation costs are based on facility size and level of care (LOC).

Per state plan, using cost report data from periods ending in 2009, the preliminary cost analysis indicated that adjustments were not required. The cost analysis for 2012 showed that 62.1 percent of the Class II ICFsMR were being reimbursed 90 percent or more of their allowable costs.

#### Recommendations

Based on cost report analysis and available funding, cost cent limits for Class II ICFsMR are as follows:

Administrative per diem limits are based on the size of the facility, using the same classes as referred to above.

#### **Fiscal Impact**

Due to the increase in limits and changes to inflation factors, the estimated annual cost increase is \$243,180.

# Federal Emergency Management Agency Public Notice 4035-DR-KS

The Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), hereby gives notice to the public of its intent to reimburse state and local governments and agencies, and eligible private nonprofit organizations, for eligible costs incurred to repair and/or replace facilities damaged by flooding occurring from June 1 to August 1, 2011. This notice applies to the Public Assistance (PA) and Hazard Mitigation Grant (HMGP) programs implemented under the authority of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 USC §§ 5121-5206, as amended.

Under a major disaster declaration (FEMA-4010-DR-KS) signed by the President on September 23, 2011, the following counties in the state of Kansas have been designated for PA: Atchison, Doniphan, Wyandotte and Leavenworth.

This public notice concerns public assistance activities that may affect historic properties, activities that are located in or affect wetland areas or the 100-year floodplain (areas determined to have a 1 percent probability of flooding in any given year), and critical actions within the 500-year floodplain. Such activities may adversely affect the historic property, floodplain or wetland, or may result in continuing vulnerability to flood damage.

Such activities may include restoring facilities located in a floodplain with eligible damage to pre-disaster condition. Examples of such activities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Non-emergency debris removal and disposal;
- Non-emergency protective measures;
- Repair/replacement of roads, including streets, culverts and bridges;
- Repair/replacement of public dams, reservoirs and channels;
- Repair/replacement of public buildings and related equipment;
- 6. Repair/replacement of public water control facilities, pipes and distribution systems;
- Repair/replacement of public utilities, including sewage treatment plants, sewers and electrical power distribution systems; and
- 8. Repair/replacement of eligible private, nonprofit facilities (hospitals, educational centers, emergency and custodial care services, etc.).

The President's Executive Order 11988, Floodplain Management, and Executive Order 11990, Protection of Wetlands, require that all federal actions in or affecting the 100-year floodplain or wetland areas be reviewed for opportunities to move the facility out of the floodplain or wetland and to reduce the risk of future damage or loss from flooding and minimize harm to wetlands. However, FEMA has determined that in certain situations, there are no alternatives to restoring an eligible facility located in the floodplain to its pre-disaster condition. These situations meet all of the following criteria:

1. The FEMA estimated cost of repairs is less than 50 percent of the estimated cost to replace the facility and the replacement cost of the facility is less than \$100,000.

- 2. The facility is not located in a floodway or coastal high hazard area.
- 3. The facility has not sustained structural damage in a previous presidentially declared flood disaster or emergency.
- 4. The facility is not defined as critical (e.g., hospital, generating plant, contains dangerous materials, emergency operation center, etc.).

FEMA will provide assistance to restore the facilities described above to their pre-disaster condition except when measures to mitigate the effects of future flooding may be incorporated into the restoration work. For example, insufficient waterway openings under culverts and bridges may cause water backup to wash out the structures. The water backup could wash out the facility and could damage other facilities in the area. Increasing the size of the waterway opening would mitigate, or lessen, the potential for this damage. Additional examples of mitigation measures include providing erosion protection at bridge abutments or levees, and extending entrance tubes on sewage lift stations.

Disaster assistance projects to restore facilities, which do not meet the criteria listed above, must undergo a detailed review. The review will include a study to determine if the facility can be moved out of the floodplain. The public is invited to participate in the review. The public may identify alternatives for restoring the facility and may participate in analyzing the impact of the alternatives on the facility and the floodplain. An address and phone number for obtaining information about specific assistance projects is provided at the end of this notice. The final determination regarding the restoration of these facilities in a floodplain will be announced in future public notices.

Due to the urgent need for and/or use of the certain facilities in a floodplain, actions to restore the facility may have started before the federal inspector visits the site. Some of these facilities may meet the criteria for a detailed review to determine if they should be relocated. Generally, facilities may be restored in their original location where at least one of the following conditions applies:

- 1. The facility, such as a flood control device or bridge, is functionally dependent on its floodplain location.
- 2. The facility, such as a park or other open-use space, already represents sound floodplain management and, therefore, there is no need to change it.
- 3. The facility, such as a road or a utility, is an integral part of a larger network that could not be relocated economically.
- Emergency action is needed to address a threat to public health and safety.

The effects of not relocating the facilities will be examined. In each case, the examination must show an overriding public need for the facility at its original location that clearly outweighed the requirements in the Executive Order to relocate the facility out of the floodplain. FEMA also will consult state and local officials to make certain that no actions taken will violate either state or local floodplain protection standards. The restoration of these facilities also may incorporate certain measures designed to mitigate the effects of future flooding. This

will be the only notice to the public concerning these facilities.

FEMA also intends to provide Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMPG) funding under Section 404 of the Stafford Act to the state of Kansas for the purposes of mitigating future disaster damages. Hazard mitigation projects may involve the construction of a new facility (e.g., retention pond or debris dam), modification of an existing undamaged facility (e.g., improving waterway openings of bridges or culverts), and the relocation of facilities out of the floodplain. Subsequent notices will provide more specific information as project proposals are developed.

### Executive Order 11-36 for Local Emergencies Conditional and Temporary Relief from Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, on the 29th day of September, 2011, I declared a state of local emergency for Shawnee County, as a result of a train derailment near the Union Pacific Rail Yard at 9th and Norris Streets in Topeka; and

WHEREAS, this disaster has caused or threatens to cause an emergency as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f and which has or threatens to interrupt the delivery of essential services or essential supplies or otherwise immediately threatens physical harm or injury to persons, the public welfare and/or substantial damage to property; and

WHEREAS, conditions exists which require the operation of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles for the purposes of providing direct assistance to supplement State and local efforts in the restoration of

services and relief in the affected area(s) of the State of Kansas.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby declare there is a state of local emergency existing in the above-listed counties, and as a result, it is necessary to expedite all efforts of restoration of services and relief. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Kansas in this emergency situation, I hereby order the following:

- 1. This declaration only applies to motor carriers responding to with equipment dedicated to resetting the derailed cars for Union Pacific Railroad.
- 2. In accordance with Title 49 C.F.R. § 390.23, the requirements contained in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Title 49 C.F.R. Parts 390-399 are hereby suspended through the duration of the motor carrier's assistance in the disaster relief effort not to exceed a period of five (5) days from the date of the initial declaration unless the order is rescinded or expanded by executive order or concurrent resolution of the legislature; and
- 3. All other applicable state and federal regulations shall apply to include but not limited to: Title 49 C.F.R. Part 382, Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing; the Kansas Motor Vehicle Driver's License Act, K.S.A. 8-234 et seq. and Title 49 C.F.R. Part 383 Commercial Driver's License Standards as adopted by the Kansas Uniform Commercial Drivers' License Act, K.S.A. 8-2,125 et seq., the federal Minimum Levels of Financial Responsibility (insurance requirements) Title 49 C.F.R. Part 387 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3n and state insurance requirements as provided in K.A.R. 82-4-23; and, adherence to the regulations governing the Transportation of Hazardous Materials as provided Title 49 C.F.R. 397 and adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3k and Parts: 107, 171-173, 177, 178 and 180 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-20; and
- 4. The registration and fuel tax permits as enforced by the Kansas Department of Revenue are temporarily suspended; and
- 5. The licensing, certification and permitting rules and regulations as required by the Kansas Corporation Commission are temporarily suspended; and
- 6. Participating motor carriers must still obtain the requisite over dimension/overweight permits as required by the Kansas Department of Transportation prior to operating; however, the fees associated with these permits are temporarily waived. Additionally, motor carriers and persons participating in restoration and recovery efforts will receive priority service and may operate during low visibility, night, holiday and curfew hours if the carriers and/or driver use clearance lights and/or escort vehicles.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 11-36 and shall become effective immediately.

#### Executive Order 11-37

WHEREAS, the Director of the Kansas Water Office has informed me, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2608, of the drought conditions within the state; and

- 1. Declare a Drought Watch, Drought Warning or Drought Emergency for the counties below replacing Executive Order 11-18;
- 2. And authorize and direct all agencies under the jurisdiction of the Governor to implement the appropriate Watch, Warning or Emergency level drought response actions assigned to them in the Operations Plan of the Governor's Drought Response Team.

#### Executive Order 11-38 for <u>Regional</u> Emergencies Conditional and Temporary Relief from Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, drought conditions exist which require the operation of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles for the purposes of providing direct assistance to Nebraska, Oklahoma and Texas and local efforts in the relief in the of State of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, this disaster has caused or threatens to cause an emergency as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f and which has or threatens to interrupt the delivery of essential services or essential supplies or otherwise immediately threatens physical harm or injury to persons, the public welfare and/or substantial damage to property; and

WHEREAS, the conditions have not abated.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby acknowledge a state of emergency exists in the states of Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, and declare it necessary to assist and expedite all disaster recovery efforts. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas and Kansas in this extreme situation, I hereby order the following:

- This declaration only applies to motor carriers hauling hay to livestock in any drought stricken areas; and
- 2. In accordance with Title 49 C.F.R. § 390.23, the requirements contained in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Title 49 C.F.R. Parts 390-399 are hereby suspended through the duration of the motor carrier's assistance in the disaster relief effort not to exceed a period of thirty (30) days from the date of the initial declaration unless the order is rescinded or expanded by executive order or concurrent resolution of the legislature; and
- 3. All other applicable state and federal regulations shall apply to include but not limited to: Title 49 C.F.R. Part 382, Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing; the Kansas Motor Vehicle Driver's License Act, K.S.A. 8-234 et seq. and Title 49 C.F.R. Part 383 Commercial Driver's License Standards as adopted by the Kansas Uniform Commercial Drivers' License Act, K.S.A. 8-2,125 et seq., the federal Minimum Levels of Financial Responsibility (insurance requirements) Title 49 C.F.R. Part 387 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3n and state insurance requirements as provided in K.A.R. 82-4-23; and, adherence to the regulations governing the Transportation of Hazardous Materials as provided Title 49 C.F.R. 397 and adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3k and Parts: 107, 171-173, 177, 178 and 180 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-20; and
- 4. The registration and fuel tax permits as enforced by the Kansas Department of Revenue are temporarily suspended for the subject motor carriers; and

- 5. The licensing, certification and permitting rules and regulations as required by the Kansas Corporation Commission are temporarily suspended for the subject motor carriers; and
- 6. Participating motor carriers are not required to obtain an over-dimensional permit from the Kansas Department of Transportation; and
- Participating motor carriers will be allowed to travel during nighttime hours if the over-dimensional load is marked with clearance lights and/or escort vehicles are used; and
- 8. Participating motor carriers are limited to a load that does not exceed 12 feet in width and does not exceed a height of 14 feet, six inches.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 11-37 and shall become effective immediately.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health, Bureau of Environmental Health, will conduct a public hearing at 1 p.m. Wednesday, December 21, in the Azure Conference Room of the Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed new regulations K.A.R. 28-35-600, 28-35-601, 28-35-602, 28-35-603, 28-35-604, 28-35-605, 28-35-606, 28-35-607, 28-35-608 and 28-35-609, relating to radon measurement, mitigation and laboratory analysis. A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact follows:

#### **Summary of Regulations:**

**28-35-600.** Defines specific terms used throughout the regulations.

**28-35-601.** Specifies general requirements applicable to all persons for certification for radon measurement, mitigation or laboratory services; establishes grounds for denying a certification; sets the term of certification at 24 months; establishes procedures for seeking relief from the regulations.

**28-35-602.** Establishes the fees for initial and renewal certification as well as late fees and fees for returned checks or insufficient funds; certification fees are nonrefundable.

28-35-603, 28-35-604, 28-35-605. Establish the requirements for initial certification and renewal and continuing education for radon measurement technicians and radon mitigation technicians.

28-35-606, 28-35-607. Establish the requirements for radon measurement businesses and radon mitigation businesses; require businesses to employ or retain either a certified radon measurement technician or certified mit-

igation technician as a consultant; require that services businesses provide be directly supervised by a certified person.

**28-35-608.** Provides for the reciprocal recognition of another state or federal certification provided the department finds the certification requirements are at least as stringent as those of the Kansas Radon Certification Law.

28-35-609. Specifies the requirements for renewing 24-month certifications for radon measurement technicians, radon mitigation technicians, and radon measurement laboratories.

#### **Economic Impact:**

Cost to certified individuals: The application fees listed in K.A.R. 28-35-602 for radon measurement technicians, radon mitigation technicians, and radon measurement laboratories will result in a minor cost impact to these individuals at 24-month intervals.

Cost to the agency: There is no estimated increase in costs to the agency.

Cost to other governmental agencies or units: There is no known additional cost.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed new regulations. At any time during the public comment period any interested parties may submit written comments to Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Environmental Health, Kansas Radon Program, 1000 S.W. #### **Article 27.—LODGING ESTABLISHMENTS**

- **4-27-1.** Lodging establishment application fees. The application fee for each lodging establishment doing business in Kansas shall be based on the number of rooms as follows: (a) 1 room through 29 rooms: \$100; and
- (b) 30 rooms or more: \$200. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 36-506; implementing K.S.A 2010 Supp. 36-502, as amended by 2011 HB 2282, sec. 2; effective June 4, 2010; amended, T-4-6-30-11, July 1, 2011; amended Oct. 28, 2011.)

#### Article 28.—FOOD SAFETY

- **4-28-7. Fees; food service establishment.** (a) Each person operating or intending to operate a food service establishment shall submit an application on a form supplied by the department with the following fees:
  - (1) The application fee shall be \$200.
- (2) Except as specified in paragraph (3) of this subsection, the license fee shall be \$200.
- (3) The license fee shall be \$130 for the following types of food service establishments:
- (A) Each senior satellite site that serves the elderly, with no on-site food preparation; and
- (B) each school satellite site that serves children, with no on-site food preparation.
- (b) Each license shall expire on December 31 in the year for which the license is issued.
- (c) Each license shall require annual renewal by the licensee's submission of an application for renewal, on a form supplied by the department, and the license fee specified in paragraph (a)(2), (a)(3)(A), or (a)(3)(B), as applicable.
- (d) License renewal applications received by the department after the following January 31 shall not be processed. For each such application, the applicant shall submit an application for license with the applicable license fee and the license application fee. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 36-503; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 36-503 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-582; effective Feb. 18, 2005; amended, T-4-6-30-11, July 1, 2011; amended Oct. 28, 2011.)

# Permanent Administrative Regulations

#### **Article 12.—INCOME TAX**

**92-12-66a.** Abatement of final tax liabilities. (a) General. The authority of the secretary to abate all or part of a final tax liability shall be exercised only in cases in which there is serious doubt as to either the collectability of the tax due or the accuracy of the final tax liability and the abatement is in the best interest of the state. This authority shall be exercised to effect the collection of taxes with the least possible loss or cost to the state and with fairness to the taxpayer. The determination of whether to abate all or part of a final tax liability shall be wholly discretionary.

- (b) Definitions.
- (1) "Assets" means the taxpayer's real and personal property, tangible and intangible.
- (2) "Collectability" means the ability of the department of revenue to collect, and the ability of the taxpayer to pay, the tax liability.
- (3) "Concealment of assets" means a placement of assets beyond the reach of the department of revenue, or a failure to disclose information relating to assets, that deceives the department with respect to the existence of the assets, whether accomplished by act, misrepresentation, silence, or suppression of the truth.
- (4) "Final tax liability" means a tax liability that was established by the department to which the taxpayer has no further direct appeal rights.
- (5) "Order denying abatement" means an order issued by the secretary that rejects a petition for abatement and refuses to abate any part of a final tax liability.
- (6) "Order of abatement" means an order issued by the secretary that abates all or part of a final tax liability and states the reasons that this action was taken.
- (7) "Parties" means either the person who requests an abatement of a final tax liability or the person's authorized representative, and either the secretary of revenue or the secretary's designee.
- (8) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department of revenue or the designee of the secretary.
- (9) "Serious doubt as to collectability" means the doubt that exists when a reasonable person, viewing the controlling circumstances objectively, would conclude that the likelihood of recovering the tax liability is less than probable.
- (10) "Serious doubt as to liability" means the doubt that exists when a reasonable person, viewing the controlling circumstances objectively, would conclude that it is probable that the final tax liability previously established by the department is greater than the actual tax liability imposed by the Kansas tax imposition statutes.
- (11) "Tax" means the particular tax owed by the tax-payer and shall include any related interest and penalty.
  - (c) Factors affecting abatement.
- (1) No final tax liability shall be abated on the ground of serious doubt as to liability if the taxpayer's liability

for the tax has been established on the merits by a court judgment or decision of the court of tax appeals. No final tax liability shall be abated on the ground of serious doubt as to liability if the taxpayer has filed tax returns, absent a showing of the reporting errors on the returns.

- (2) No tax liability shall be abated by the secretary if the taxpayer has acted with intent to defraud or to delay collection of tax. Frivolous petitions and petitions submitted only to delay collection of a tax shall be immediately rejected.
  - (d) Procedures.
- (1) Each petition for abatement shall be captioned "petition for abatement of a final tax liability" and shall be submitted to the secretary. The petition shall be signed by the petitioner and the taxpayer, if available, under the penalties of perjury and shall include the following:
- (A) The reasons why all or part of the final tax liability should be abated;
  - (B) the facts that support the abatement; and
- (C) a waiver of the taxpayer's right of confidentiality under the confidentiality provisions of chapter 79 of the Kansas statutes annotated and amendments thereto, conditioned upon the secretary's abatement of all or part of the final tax liability.
- (2) If a petition alleges serious doubt as to collectability, the taxpayer shall submit a statement of financial condition that lists assets and liabilities, accompanied by an affidavit signed by the preparer under the penalties of perjury, attesting that the financial statement is true and accurate to the best of the preparer's knowledge.
- (3) After a petition has been submitted, the taxpayer shall provide any additional verified documentation that is requested by the secretary. The petitioner or taxpayer may be required by the secretary to appear before the secretary and testify under oath concerning a requested abatement.
- (4) A petition for abatement may be withdrawn by the taxpayer at any time before its acceptance. When a petition is denied, the taxpayer shall be notified in writing by the secretary within 30 days of the decision to deny.
- (5) An order of abatement that abates all or part of a final tax liability may be issued by the secretary. The order may direct any remaining liability to be paid within 30 days. Each order of abatement shall set forth the reasons that the petition for abatement was granted and all relevant information, including the following:
  - (A) The names of all parties;
- (B) the amount and type of tax, interest, and penalties that were abated;
- (C) the amount of tax, penalty, and interest that remain to be paid on the date of the order; and
  - (D) the amount that has been paid, if any.
- (6) The submission of a petition for abatement shall not prevent the collection of any tax.
- (e) Effect of an order of abatement. Each order of abatement shall relate to the entire liability of the taxpayer with respect to which the order is made and shall conclusively settle the amount of liability. Once an order of abatement is issued, matters covered by the order shall not be reopened by court action or otherwise, except for one of the following reasons:

(continued)

- (1) Falsification of statements or concealment of assets by the taxpayer;
- (2) mutual mistake of a material fact sufficient to cause a contract to be reformed or set aside; or
- (3) serious doubt as to collectability arising after an abatement order is issued that is based on serious doubt as to liability.
- (f) Effect of waiver of confidentiality. The issuance of an order of abatement for \$5,000 or more shall make all reports of the abatement proceeding available for public inspection upon written request, in accordance with K.S.A. 79-3233b, and amendments thereto, and the tax-payer's express waiver of the right to confidentiality under the confidentiality provisions of chapter 79 of the Kansas statutes annotated, and amendments thereto.
- (g) Annual report. On or before the last day of September of each year, a summary of each petition of abatement that was granted during the preceding state fiscal year that reduced a final tax liability by \$5,000 or more shall be prepared for filing with the secretary of state, the division of post audit of the legislature, and the attorney general. Each summary shall include the following:
  - (1) The name of the taxpayer;
- (2) a summary of the issues and the reasons for the abatement; and

# Article 22.—STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM

- **110-22-1. Definitions.** As used in these regulations and for purposes of administering the act, the following terms shall have the meanings specified in this regulation: (a) "Act" means the rural opportunity zone act, L. 2011, ch. 22 and amendments thereto.
- (b) "County" means a county listed as a "rural opportunity zone" in L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 1(b), and amendments thereto.
- (c) "Department" means the Kansas department of commerce.
- (d) "Domicile" means the physical location where an individual intends to permanently reside. The following factors may be considered in determining whether or not an individual meets the eligibility requirements of the act, although none of these factors by itself shall be a determinant of domicile:
  - (1) Acceptance or an offer of permanent employment;
- (2) admission to a licensed practicing profession in Kansas;

(3) registration of a vehicle in a county designated by the act;

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- (4) the location at which the individual votes or is registered to vote;
  - (5) a Kansas driver's license; and
- (6) lease of living quarters or ownership of a home in a county designated by the act.
- (e) "Eligible participant" means an individual who has met all eligibility requirements of the act.
- (f) "Participating county" means a county, as defined in this regulation, that has enacted a resolution to participate in the student loan repayment program as specified in L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3, and amendments thereto.
- (g) "Student loan repayment program" means the program specified in L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-5002r; implementing L. 2011, ch. 22, secs. 1 and 3; effective, T-110-7-5-11, July 5, 2011; effective Oct. 28, 2011.)
- **110-22-2.** Application for student loan repayment program. (a) Each applicant shall submit the application and any supporting documentation to the secretary to determine eligibility for the student loan repayment program.
- (b) Each application shall contain the following for each applicant:
  - (1) Name;
  - (2) telephone and electronic mail address;
- (3) current address and, if different, intended address;
  - (4) social security number;
- (5) county of current residence or future intended domicile;
- (6) list of all addresses where the applicant has resided during the five years immediately preceding the date of application;
- (7) list of previous employers' names and addresses for the five years immediately preceding the date of application;
- (8) prospective employer's name, address, and county;
  - (9) if applicable, proof of degree earned;
  - (10) anticipated date for moving to the county;
- (11) a short description of why the individual intends to move to the county;
- (12) if applicable, proof of a Kansas professional license;
- (13) if applicable, the balance of each student loan on the date of submission of the application and the name and address of each loan institution; and
- (14) any other relevant information that the secretary deems necessary.
- (c) Notification that the applicant has applied for the student loan repayment program shall be electronically forwarded by the department to the county designated in that application.
- (d) The county may, within 15 days of the department's electronic notification, provide any supplementary information regarding the applicant to the department for consideration. (Authorized by L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-5002r; implementing L.

- **110-22-3. Determination of eligibility.** (a) A preliminary determination of whether each applicant is eligible to participate in student loan repayment program shall be made by the secretary.
- (b) For each preliminary determination of eligibility, the applicant and the county shall be notified by the department.
- (c) If the applicant is initially approved as eligible, the applicant and the county shall be provided by the secretary with a preliminary determination setting forth the conditions for final program eligibility.
- (d) Final program eligibility shall be conditioned upon applicant's submission of all requested documentation to the department, including the following:
  - (1) Student loan documents;
- (2) transcript for an associate, bachelor's, or postgraduate degree; and
- (3) proof of having established domicile in the participating county.
- (e) If the applicant meets the requirements for preliminary determination, a determination of final eligibility for the resident individual to participate in the student loan repayment program shall be issued by the secretary.
- (f) Any applicant or county may appeal a preliminary or final determination of eligibility by the secretary as specified in these regulations. (Authorized by L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-5002r; implementing L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3; effective, T-110-7-5-11, July 5, 2011; effective Oct. 28, 2011.)
- **110-22-4.** Appeal process. (a) If an application for preliminary determination is not approved or if final eligibility determination is denied, each reason for the denial shall be provided in writing to the applicant by the secretary. The applicant may ask for reconsideration of either the preliminary determination or final eligibility determination within 30 calendar days after the date of the decision. If the applicant does not ask for reconsideration within 30 calendar days of the date of the decision, the decision shall become a final agency action. The county shall be notified of any application denied by the secretary.
- (b) The county may ask for reconsideration of the decision of the secretary within 30 calendar days after the date of either the preliminary determination or final eligibility determination. If the county does not ask for reconsideration within 30 calendar days of the date of the secretary's decision, the decision shall become a final agency action.
- (c) Each decision on reconsideration shall be the final agency action and shall be subject to review under the Kansas judicial review act, K.S.A. 77-601 et seq. and amendments thereto. (Authorized by L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-5002r; implementing L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3; effective, T-110-7-5-11, July 5, 2011; effective Oct. 28, 2011.)
- **110-22-5.** Resolution by county; intent to participate in student loan repayment program. (a) As required by the act, each county intending to participate in the

- student loan repayment program shall provide the department with a copy of the county resolution. The county resolution shall contain the following statements:
- (1) The county is listed as a rural opportunity zone, as defined by L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 1 and amendments thereto.
- (2) The county is obligated to participate in the student loan repayment program for an enrollment period of five years.
- (3) The county obligation to each eligible participant is for a repayment period of five years.
- (4) The county agrees to pay, with the state of Kansas, equal shares of the outstanding student loan balance of any eligible participant.
- (5) The student loan balance for each eligible participant, in an amount not to exceed \$15,000, will be repaid jointly by the county and the state of Kansas for a period of five years.
- (6) The county will allocate monies for the purpose of matching payments from the state of Kansas to eligible participants.
- (7) The county will revise its student loan repayment budget on an annual basis and inform the department of any changes to the annual allocation.
- (b) Each resolution shall be published once in the official county newspaper and shall be in effect from the date of its publication. (Authorized by L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-5002r; implementing L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3; effective, T-110-7-5-11, July 5, 2011; effective Oct. 28, 2011.)
- **110-22-6.** Repayment of outstanding student loan balance. (a) Each participating county shall transmit funds to the department for repayment of the student loan within 30 calendar days after the end of each calendar year. Each participating county and each eligible participant shall be notified by the department of receipt of the funds.
- (b) The following shall be performed by the department:
- (1) Transmission of the state funds and participating county funds to the lending institution for repayment of each eligible participant's student loan;
- (2) payment to the lending institution of the student loan repayment funds, which shall be within 30 calendar days of receipt of funds from the participating county; and
- (3) notification to each participating county and eligible participant of the transmitted student loan payment.
- (c) Repayment of student loan funds may be made directly to the eligible participant if both of the following conditions are met:
- (1) The student loan has been paid in full during the preceding 12 months.
- (2) The eligible participant has no other student loan debt. (Authorized by L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3 and K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-5002r; implementing L. 2011, ch. 22, sec. 3; effective Oct. 28, 2011.)
