## SENATE BILL No. 272

An Act concerning water; relating to multi-year flex accounts; amending K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 82a-736 and repealing the existing section.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
Section 1. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 82a-736 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-736. (a) It is hereby recognized that an opportunity exists to improve water management by enabling multi-year flexibility in the use of water authorized to be diverted under a groundwater water right, provided, that such flexibility neither impairs existing water rights, nor increases the total amount of water diverted, so that such flexibility has no long-term negative effect on the source of supply. It is therefore declared necessary and advisable to permit the establishment of multi-year flex accounts for groundwater water rights, together with commensurate protections for existing water rights and their source of supply.
(a)(b) As used in this section:
(1) "Base water right" means a water right under which an applicant applies to the chief engineer to establish a multi-year flex account and where all of the following conditions exist:
(A) The authorized source of supply is groundwater; and
(B) the water right has not been the subject of a change approval to implement the provisions of K.A.R. 5-5-9(a)(2), K.A.R. 5-5-11(b)(2) or K.A.R. 5-511(b)(3), in effect upon the effective date of this act.
(2) "Multi-year flex account" means a term permit which suspends a base water right during its term, except when the term permit may be no longer
exercised because of an order of the chief engineer, and is subject to the terms and conditions as provided in subsection (e).
(1)(3) "Base average usage" means: (A) The average amount of water actually used diverted for a beneficial use under a groundwater the base water right during calendar years 2000 through 2009, excluding any amount used diverted in any such year in excess of the amount that exceeded the maximum annual quantity of water authorized by such the base water right; or (B) if the holder of a groundwater the base water right shows to the satisfaction of the chief engineer that the holder has im= plemented signifieant water conservation measures reduced water use under the base water right during calendar years 2000 through 2009, then the average amount of water actually used diverted for a beneficial use under such the base water right during the five calendar years immediately before the calendar year when such measure were implemented water conservation began, excluding any amount used in any such year in exees of that exceeded the amount authorized by such the base water right.
(2)(4) "Chief engineer" means the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the department of agriculture.
(5) "Flex account acreage" means the maximum number of acres lawfully irrigated during a calendar year when no term, condition or limitation of the base water right has been violated and either of the following conditions is met:
(A) The calendar year is 2000 through 2009; or
(B) if water conservation reduced water use under the base water right during calendar years 2000 through 2009, the calendar year is a year within the five calendar years immediately prior to the calendar year when water conservation began.
(6) "Net irrigation requirement" means the net irrigation requirement for $50 \%$ chance rainfall of the county that corresponds with the location of the authorized place of use of the base water right as provided in K.A.R. 5-5-12, on the effective date of this act.
(b)(c) (1) Any holder of a grounder base water right which that has not been deposited or placed in a safe deposit account in a chartered water bank may establish a multi-year flex account where the holder may deposit, in advance, the authorized quantity of water from such water right for any five consecutive calendar years, subject to all of the following:
$(1)(A)$ The water right must be vested or shall have been issued a certificate of appropriation;
(2)(B) the withdrawal of water pursuant to the water right shall be properly and adequately metered;
(3)(C) the water right shall notbe is not deemed abandoned and shall be in good standing, based on past water usage and is in compliance with the terms of the holder's permit and conditions of its certificate of appropriation, all applicable provisions of law and orders of the chief engineer; and
$(4)(D)$ the amount of water that shall be deposited in the multi-year flex account shall not exceed $90 \%$ of the amount of the holder's base average usage times five the greatest of the following:
(i) $500 \%$ of the base average usage;
(ii) $500 \%$ of the product of the annual net irrigation requirement multiplied by the flex account acreage, multiplied by 110\%, but not greater than five times the maximum annual quantity authorized by the base water right; or
(iii) if the authorized place of use is located wholly within the boundaries of a groundwater management district, an amount that shall not increase the long-term average use of the groundwater right as specified by rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to subsection (o) of K.S.A. 82a-1028, and amendments thereto; and
(E) notwithstanding any other provisions of this subsection, except when the base water right is suspended due to the issuance of a two-year term permit in a designated drought emergency area for 2011 and 2012, the quantity of water deposited into a multi-year flex account shall be reduced by the quantity of water used in excess of the maximum annual quantity of the base water right during 2011 if the application for a multi-year flex account is filed with the chief engineer on or before July 15, 2012.
(2) The provisions of K.A.R. 5-5-11 are limited to changes in annual authorized quantity and shall not apply to this subsection.
(e)(d) The chief engineer shall implement a program providing for the issuance of term permits to holders of groundwater water rights who have established flex accounts in accordance with this section. Such term permits shall authorize the use of water in a flex account at any time during the five consecutive calendar years for which the application for the term permit authorizing a multi-year flex account is made, without annual limits on such use.
(d)(e) Term permits provided for by this section shall be subject to the following:
(1) A separate term permit shall be required for each point of diversion authorized by the base water right.
(2) The quantity of water authorized for diversion shall be limited to the amount deposited pursuant to subsection (b)(4)(c)(1)(D).
(3) The rate of diversion for each point of diversion authorized under the term permit shall not exceed the rate of diversion for each point of diversion authorized under the base water right.
(3)(4) The authorized place of use for the term permit shall not be greater than that authorized by the existing groundwater right shall be the place of use or a subdivision of the place of use for the base water right.
(5) The point of diversion authorized by the term permit shall be specified by referencing one point of diversion authorized by the base water right at the time the multi-year flex account term permit application is filed with the chief engineer or at the time any approvals changing such referenced point of diversion of the base water right are approved during the multi-year flex account period. For a base water right with multiple points of diversion, each point of diversion authorized by a term permit shall receive a specific assignment of a maximum authorized quantity of water, assigned proportionately to the authorized annual quantities of the respective points of diversion under the base water right.
(4)(6) The chief engineer may establish, by rules and regulations, criteria for such term permits when the water right authorizes multiple points of diversion or multiple water rights authorize a single point of diversion or overlapping places of use.
(5)(7) Except as explicitly provided for by this section, such term permits shall be subject to all provisions of the Kansas water appropriation act, and rules and regulations adopted under such act, and nothing in this section shall authorize impairment of any vested right or prior appropriation right by the exercise of such term permit.
(e) Unless a term permit is issued pursuant to an applieation filed before November 1 of the year prior to the first year for which the applieation is made, the quantity of water used under the water right during the year in which the application for the term permit is filed shall be dedueted from the amount of water deposited into the aceount authorized by the term permit (f) An application for a multi-year flex account shall be filed with the chief engineer on or before October 1 of the first year of the multi-year flex account term for which the application is being made.
$(\mathrm{f})(\mathrm{g})$ All costs of administration of this section shall be paid from fees for term permits provided for by this section. Any appropriation or transfer from any fund other than the water appropriation certification fund for the purpose of paying such costs shall be repaid to the fund from which such appropriation or transfer is made. At the time of repayment, the secretary of agriculture shall certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount to be repaid and the fund to be repaid. Upon receipt of such certification, the director of accounts and reports shall promptly transfer the amount certified to the specified fund.
(h) The fee for a multi-year flex account term permit shall be the same as specified for other term permits in K.S.A. 82a-708c, and amendments thereto, except as follows:
(1) If the base water right is currently suspended due to the issuance of a two-year term permit in a designated drought emergency area for 2011 and 2012, then a holder of such term permit shall be subject to a $\$ 200$ application fee for a multi-year flex account term permit if the application is filed on or before July 15, 2012; or
(2) if water use under the authority of the base water right exceeded the maximum annual quantity authorized by the base water right during 2011 and the holder of the base water right files an application for approval of a multi-year flex account term permit on or before July 15, 2012, then the application fee shall be $\$ 600$.
(i) The chief engineer shall have full authority pursuant to K.S.A. 82a$706 c$, and amendments thereto, to require any additional measuring devices and any additional reporting of water use for term permits issued pursuant to this section. Failure to comply with any measuring or reporting requirement may result in a penalty, up to and including the revocation of the term permit and the suspension of the base water right for the duration of the term permit period.
$(g)(j)$ The chief engineer shall submit a written report on the implementation of this section to the house standing committee on environment agriculture and natural resources and the senate standing committee on natural resources on or before February 1 of each year.
$(\mathrm{h})(k)$ This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas water appropriation act.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 82a-736 is hereby repealed.
Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

(1) Evidence of satisfactory completion of at least 50 continuing education credit hours during the preceding year. At least 20 continuing education credit hours shall be acquired from category I if 50 hours are submitted with the renewal application;
(2) evidence of satisfactory completion of at least 100 continuing education credit hours during the preceding two-year period. At least 40 continuing education credit hours shall be acquired from category I if 100 continuing education credit hours are submitted with the renewal application; or
(3) evidence verifying satisfactory completion of continuing education credit hours equivalent, in number and category, to those hours required by paragraph (a)(1) or (2), issued by a national, state, or local organization with continuing education standards that are at least as stringent as the board's standards.
(b) A continuing education credit hour shall be 50 minutes of instruction or its equivalent. Meals and exhibit breaks shall not be included in the calculation of continuing education credit hours.
(c) Any applicant that does not meet the requirements for license renewal in subsection (a) may request an extension from the board. The request shall include a plan for completion of the continuing education requirements within the requested extension period. An extension of up to six months may be granted by the board if documented circumstances make it impossible or extremely difficult for the individual to reasonably obtain the required continuing education hours.
(d) Each physician assistant initially licensed within one year of a renewal registration date shall be exempt from the continuing education required by subsection (a) for that first renewal period.
(e) The categories of continuing education credit shall be the following:
(1) Category I: attendance at an educational presentation approved by the board. Courses accepted by the American academy of physician assistants shall be approved by the board; and
(2) category II: participating in or attending an educational activity that does not meet the criterion specified in paragraph (e)(1) but that is approved by the board. Category II continuing education may include self-study or group activities.
(f) Evidence of satisfactory completion of continuing education shall be submitted to the board as follows:
(1) Documented evidence of attendance at or participation in category I and II activities; and
(2) verification, on a form provided by the board, of self-study from reading professional literature or other

100-28a-10. Supervision and direction; adequacy. (a) Direction and supervision of the physician assistant shall be considered to be adequate if the responsible physician meets all of the following requirements:
(1) Engages in the practice of medicine and surgery in Kansas;
(2) verifies that the physician assistant has a current license issued by the board;
(3) at least annually, reviews, evaluates, and determines whether the physician assistant has performed patient services constituting the practice of medicine and surgery with professional competence and with reasonable skill and safety;
(4) at least annually, reviews any drug prescription protocol and determines if any modifications, restrictions, or terminations are required. Each modification, restriction, or termination shall be conveyed to the physician assistant and set forth in all copies of the drug prescription protocol required by K.A.R. 100-28a-9;
(5) reports to the board any knowledge of disciplinary hearings, formal hearings, public or private censure, or other disciplinary action taken against the physician assistant by any state's licensure or registration authority or any professional association. The responsible physician shall report this information to the board within 10 days of receiving notice of the information;
(6) reports to the board the termination of responsibility by the responsible physician or any litigation alleging conduct by the physician assistant that would constitute grounds for disciplinary action under the physician assistant licensure act. The responsible physician shall report this information to the board within 10 days of receiving notice of the information;
(7) reviews and authenticates each patient record of treatment provided by a physician assistant in an emergency situation if the treatment exceeded the authority granted to the physician assistant by the responsible physician in the responsible physician request form. The responsible physician shall perform the review and authentication of the patient record within 48 hours of the treatment;
(8) provides for a designated physician to provide supervision and direction on each occasion when the responsible physician is temporarily absent, is unable to be immediately contacted by telecommunication, or is otherwise unavailable at a time the physician assistant could
reasonably be expected to provide professional services; and
(9) delegates to the physician assistant only those acts that constitute the practice of medicine and surgery that the responsible physician believes or has reason to believe can be competently performed by the physician assistant, based upon the physician assistant's background, training, capabilities, skill, and experience.
(b) The responsible physician shall develop and implement a written method for evaluating whether the physician assistant has performed patient services constituting the practice of medicine and surgery with professional competence and with reasonable skill and safety, in accordance with the provisions of the responsible physician request form.
(1) During the first 90 days of the responsible physi-cian-physician assistant supervisory relationship, the responsible physician shall review and authenticate all medical records and charts of each patient evaluated or treated by the physician assistant within 14 days of the date the physician assistant evaluated or treated the patient. The responsible physician shall authenticate each record and chart by original signature or initials and shall record the date of the review. Electronically generated signatures shall be acceptable if reasonable measures have been taken to prevent unauthorized use of the electronically generated signature.
(2) After the first 90 days of the responsible physicianphysician assistant supervisory relationship, the responsible physician shall document the periodic review and evaluation of the physician assistant's performance required by paragraph (a)(3), which may include the review of patient records and charts. The written review and evaluation shall be signed by the responsible physician and the physician assistant. This documentation shall be kept on file at each practice location and shall be made available to the board upon request.
(c) Except as otherwise required by K.A.R. 100-28a-13, a responsible physician shall not be required to cosign orders or prescriptions written in a patient's medical record or chart by a physician assistant to whom the responsible physician has delegated the performance of services constituting the practice of medicine and surgery.
