Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

The Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board will conduct a public hearing from 10 to 11 a.m. Wednesday, May 23, in the board's conference room at 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider adopting proposed amendments to a permanent rule and regulation for professional counseling.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for purposes of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Tom Hawk, Executive Director, Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603-3817. Email comments may be directed to tom.hawk@bsrb.state.ks.us. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally at the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and

may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Leslie Allen, assistant director, at (785) 296-3240, or the Kansas Relay Center at 1-800-766-3777. There is designated accessible parking on Kansas Avenue, and the front entrance of the board office is accessible.

Copies of the full text of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the board office or from the board's website at www.ksbsrb.org (under the proposed regulation). The following is a summary of the proposed amendments and economic impact statement. The board does not have a less costly or less intrusive method for achieving the stated purpose of this regulation.

K.A.R. 102-3-5a contains the examination requirements for licensure as a professional counselor. The amendment changes when an applicant may be authorized to sit for the examination.

Economic Impact: There would be no economic impact to the licensees of the Kansas Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, the public or any other entity.

The Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking a qualified consulting engineering firm, prequalified in Category 211 — Highway Design-Major Facility, for reconstruction of the US-83 project as listed below. The scope of the services is to prepare a set of plans for the design of the reconstruction of US-83 from the Thomas/Sheridan county line, east to the junction of US-83/K-23, including the full depth pavement replacement/curb and gutter section through the city of Selden. Current plans are at "Plans to M&R" stage.

The Consultant Shortlist Committee will select three to five of the most highly qualified firms expressing interest and schedule an individual interview. The consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the project at the interview and will be expected to discuss their approach to this project in detail and the personnel to be assigned to this project. The Consultant Selection Committee, appointed by the Secretary of Transportation, will conduct the discussions with the firms invited to the individual interview confer-

ences. The committee will select one firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project. After the selection, the firm(s) not selected will be notified of the outcome.

It is KDOT's policy to use the following criteria as the basis for selection of the consulting engineering firm:

1. Size and professional qualifications.
2. Experience of staff.
3. Location of firm with respect to project(s).
4. Work load of firm.
5. Firm's performance record.

The firm's accounting systems must have the following capabilities before the firm may be awarded a contract.

- Valid, reliable and current costs must be available within the system to support cost and pricing data.
- Capability to provide a means of measuring the reasonableness of incurred costs.
- Capability to identify and accumulate allowable costs by contract or project records that will reconcile with the general ledger.
- Ability to provide supporting documentation of actual expenditures for each billing, based on costs.

The requested modification to expand the landfill would increase the permitted disposal volume from 125,000 cubic yards to 256,000 cubic yards while maintaining the landfill's 12.6-acre disposal area. The proposed landfill expansion would be constructed and operated in conformance with state solid waste regulations and accept only construction and demolition waste as defined by Kansas statutes. The proposed landfill expansion site is located at 2286 Noble Road, northeast of Fort Scott in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 17, Township 25 South, Range 25 East in Bourbon County.

The Bourbon County Commission previously certified that the landfill is consistent with the county's solid waste management plan and local land use restrictions or zoning. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is providing public notice of the intent to approve the proposed landfill expansion. However, a final decision to approve the expansion has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

25th ANNIVERSARY CRUISE DRAWING

111-4-3144. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled “25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing,” and will accept entries on and after the day Kansas lottery “25th Anniversary Cruise” instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public and ending on or about Saturday, June 9, 2012, as specified in these rules. The drawing will be held at a time and location designated by the executive director of the Kansas lottery. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-3144 through 111-4-3149 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-4-3145. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and

lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas Lottery at the 2012 Wichita River Festival in Wichita, Kansas, at the time described in these rules in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in these rules.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas "25th Anniversary Cruise" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win an instant prize under the rules of the "25th Anniversary Cruise" instant game, and for purposes of this drawing only, tickets entitled to a free admission button prize for the 2012 Wichita River Festival shall also be considered "non-winning tickets."

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-4-3146. Prize. (a) Four grand prize packages will be given away at the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing," which will be conducted on or about June 9, 2012. Each grand prize winner shall receive a cruise package for eight days and seven nights in an ocean view balcony stateroom on Royal Caribbean International, including first class round trip airfare from Kansas City, Missouri, to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, round trip ground transfers to and from the airport to the ship, \$1,000 in ship's credit for entertainment and excursions, \$500 cash, a hotel room the night before departure, a luggage set, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes and any other applicable taxes and fees. Each prize package has an approximate value of \$19,571.43.

(b) The winner of a grand prize package in the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" must complete the cruise trip no later than two years after the Kansas lottery's launch date of the "25th Anniversary Cruise" instant game ticket number 426 or no later than one year from the date the grand prize in the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" is claimed, whichever occurs first.

(c) The prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(d) The Kansas lottery may, at its discretion, substitute a prize of approximate equal value. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-4-3147. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" to be conducted on or about June 9, 2012, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "25th Anniversary Cruise" Kansas instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "25th Anniversary Cruise" game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules, except that any ticket winning a free admission button for the 2012 Wichita River Festival may instead be used to enter the drawing, and if so utilized, shall be considered a "non-winning ticket" for purposes of entry into the drawing.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) A receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the Kansas lottery selling location at the Wichita River Festival until approximately 6:00 p.m. on or about June 9, 2012.

(6) Players may also deposit entries for the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" at any Kansas lottery event at which the lottery has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries until 5:00 p.m. on June 5, 2012.

(7) Entries other than those entered at the Wichita River Festival shall be mailed with proper postage to "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing," P. O. Box 19226, Topeka, Kansas 66619-0226. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 5, 2012. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(8) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(9) The drawing will be conducted after the selling receptacle or drum closes at the time identified in subsection (a)(5) on or about Saturday, June 9, 2012.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning "25th Anniversary Cruise" tickets which are mailed to the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing," at the above-stated address with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, June 5, 2012, and non-winning "25th Anniversary Cruise" tickets entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery or at the Wichita River Festival as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All tickets so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for any lost, destroyed, or altered non-winning ticket entries into the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing." (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-4-3148. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of the winners in the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office Box 19226, in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 5, 2012. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 5, 2012, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. (d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. The persons whose names appear on the entry drawn shall be the winner of a grand prize identified in these rules, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) The process in subsection (d) above shall be repeated three more times, until a total of four entries have been selected as grand prize winners.

(f) After the grand prize entries have been drawn on or about June 9, 2012, and the entries have been verified as valid, 15 more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time, which will serve as alternate entries for the grand prize. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, 10A, 11A, 12A, 13A, 14A, and 15A. The winners shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following mailing of a claim form to the winners to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If the thirtieth day following the mailing of a claim form to any winner falls on a weekend or holiday, the thirtieth day shall be extended to the next business day. If a grand prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the grand prize will be awarded to the first alternate entry drawn. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. If a winner or an alternate winner for a grand prize cannot be located, is declared ineligible, or fails to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters as required herein, the alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prize is properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(g) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in subsection (f) herein.

(h) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(i) Only non-winning "25th Anniversary Cruise Riches" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(j) All "25th Anniversary Cruise" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on or about June 9, 2012, after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-4-3149. Certification of drawing. (a) The "25th Anniversary Cruise Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-4-3150. "Bonus Crossword" instant ticket lottery game number 423. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Bonus Crossword" commencing on or after January 1, 2012. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-3150.

(b) The "play symbols" for this game are as follows: A - B - C - D - E - F - G - H - I - J - K - L - M - N - O - P - Q - R - S - T - U - V - W - X - Y - Z. There are no "play symbol captions" in this game.

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 18 play spots within the "YOUR LETTERS" play area, in each of two play spots within the "BONUS" play area, and a variable number of times within the crossword puzzle grid.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149.

(e) The price of instant tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$2.00 each.

(f) "Bonus Crossword" consists of three play areas. In the upper part of the ticket there is a crossword puzzle grid that contains 11 spaces (height) by 11 spaces (width) covered by transparent latex. In the "YOUR LETTERS"

play area, located in the lower part of the ticket, there are 18 letters located under opaque latex. To the right of the "YOUR LETTERS" play area is the "BONUS" play area in which there are two letters covered by opaque latex. Imaged around each of the 18 "YOUR LETTERS" and two "BONUS" letters there will be a four-sided box composed of solid lines. A player will remove the latex from the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas one letter at a time, and then for each matching letter in the crossword puzzle grid scratch off the transparent latex. Each letter revealed in the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas may be used an unlimited number of times in the crossword puzzle grid. If a player reveals at least three complete words in the crossword puzzle grid, the player wins the corresponding prize in the prize legend. The prize legend on the front of the ticket indicates prizes won for number of words revealed, as is also set forth in subsection (k) hereinafter.

(g) To qualify as a complete word to win a prize in this game, the words revealed must meet the following requirements:

- (1) must contain at least three letters;

- (5) every single letter in the unbroken string must be revealed in "YOUR LETTERS," or "BONUS" areas and be included to form a word; and

Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ON-LINE GAMES AND DRAWINGS

111-5-23. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Powerball" game:

(a) "Computer pick" means the random selection of two-digit numbers by the computer system, which appear on a ticket and are played by a player in the game.

(b) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(c) "Game board" or "boards" means that area of the play slip which contains two sets of numbered squares to be marked by the player, the first set containing 59 squares, number one through 59, and the second set containing 35 squares, number one through 35.

(d) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the combination a person has selected.

(e) "MUSL" means the Multi-State Lottery Association, a government-benefit association wholly owned and operated by the party lotteries.

(continued)

(f) "MUSL Board" means the governing body of the MUSL which is comprised of the chief executive officer of each party lottery.

(g) "Power play" or "multiplier option" means the "Powerball" game option whereby a player may elect to pay an additional \$1 per play at the time of ticket purchase which will have the effect of multiplying any prize won on the play, except the grand prize.

(h) "On-line lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(i) "Party Lottery" means a state lottery or lottery of a political subdivision or entity which has joined the MUSL and, in the context of these Powerball product group rules, which has joined in selling the Powerball game.

(j) "Product group" means the group of lotteries which has joined together to offer a product pursuant to the terms of the multi-state lottery agreement and the group's own rules.

(k) "Play" means the six numbers, the first five from a field of 59 numbers and the last one from a field of 35 numbers, that appear on a ticket as a single lettered selection and are to be played by a player in the game.

(l) "Play slip" means a card used in marking a player's game plays and containing one or more boards and if the multiplier option is available for play, the play slip shall include a box to mark if the option is chosen.

(m) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(n) "Set Prize" means all other prizes except the grand prize that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment and, except in rare instances, outlined in these rules, will be equal to the prize amount established by the MUSL Board for the prize level.

(o) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(p) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(q) "Winning numbers" means the six numbers, the first five from a field of 59 numbers and the last one from a field of 35 numbers, randomly selected at each drawing which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on a game ticket.

111-5-24. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) "Powerball" is a five out of 59 plus one out of 35 on-

line lottery game which pays the grand prize, at the election of the player made in accordance with the rules or by a default election made in accordance with these rules at the time of play purchase, either on an annuitized pari-mutuel basis, or as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for this prize on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a set cash basis. To play "Powerball" a player shall select five different numbers from one to 59 and one additional number from one to 35 for input into a terminal. The additional number may be the same as one of the first five numbers selected by the player.

(b) A "Powerball" game ticket shall sell for two dollars.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer. The player may select a set of five numbers and one additional number by:

(1) communicating the six numbers to the retailer;

(2) marking six numbered squares in any one game board on a play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or

(3) requesting a "computer pick" or "quick pick" from the retailer.

If available at the time, a player may choose the multiplier option by marking the appropriate box on the play slip or by communicating to the retailer the desire to play the multiplier option. If the multiplier option is chosen, it shall apply to all boards played on that play slip. For each board upon which the multiplier option is chosen, the player shall pay one additional dollar. The retailer shall then issue a ticket from the terminal containing the selected set or sets of numbers, each of which constitutes a game play, and if applicable, whether or not the multiplier option has been chosen for all plays on that play slip.

(e) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent. A play slip shall have no pecuniary or prize value and shall not be used as evidence of a ticket purchase or of numbers selected.

(f) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error.

(g) Ticket sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time on Wednesdays and Saturdays and will resume at approximately 9:05 p.m.

(h) Drawings will be conducted twice weekly, on Wednesdays and Saturdays at approximately 9:58 p.m. central time (CT), after the game is closed at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time (CT) and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(i) Each player shall be responsible for verifying the accuracy of the game play or plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the on-line retailer who is deemed to

be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

111-5-25. Prize pool; reserve account. (a) The prize pool for all prize categories shall consist of up to 50.0% of each drawing period's sales, including tax, after the prize reserve accounts are funded to the amounts set by the product group. Any amount remaining in the prize pool at the end of this game shall be returned to all lotteries participating in the prize pool after the end of all claim periods of all selling lotteries, carried forward to a replacement game, or expended in a manner as directed by the product group.

(b) Up to two percent of sales shall be placed in trust in one or more prize reserve accounts until the prize reserve accounts reach the amount designated by the MUSL board. When the prize reserve accounts exceed the designated amount, the excess shall become part of the prize pool. Any amount remaining in prize reserve accounts at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement prize reserve account or expended in a manner as directed by the product group in accordance with state law.

111-5-26. Expected prize payout pari-mutuel prizes. (a) The grand prize shall be determined on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes awarded shall be paid as set cash prizes with the following expected approximate prize payout percentages:

(b) The prize money allocated to the grand prize category shall be divided equally by the number of game boards winning the grand prize.

(c) The prize pool percentage allocated to the set prizes (the cash prizes of \$1,000,000 or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw. If the total of the set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the set prizes, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order: (1) the amount allocated to the set prizes and carried forward from previous draws, if any; (2) an amount from the prize reserve account, if available, not to exceed forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) per drawing. If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded, then the highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all set prize levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance, the party lotteries and the licensed lotteries shall independently determine their pari-mutuel low-tier prize amounts and the Powerball group shall determine the amount to be paid as the prize for each low-tier prize level.

111-5-28. Prize payments; annuitized and cash prizes. (a) Grand prizes shall be paid, at the election of the player made no later than 60 days after the player becomes entitled to a prize with either a per winner annuity or cash payment. If the payment election is not made at the time of purchase and is not made by the player within 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, then the prize shall be paid as an annuity prize. An election for an annuity payment made by a player before ticket purchase or by system default or design may be changed to a cash payment at the election of the player until the expiration of 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. The election to take the cash payment may be made at the time of the prize claim or within 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. An election made after the winner becomes entitled to the prize is final and cannot be revoked, withdrawn or otherwise changed. Shares of the grand prize shall be determined by dividing the cash available in the grand prize pool equally among all winners of the grand prize. Winner(s) who elected a cash payment shall be paid their share(s) in a single cash payment. The annuitized option prize shall be determined by multiplying a winner's share of the grand prize pool by the MUSL annuity factor. The MUSL annuity factor is determined by the best total securities price obtained through a competitive bid of qualified, pre-approved brokers made after it is determined that the prize is to be paid as an annuity prize or after the expiration of 60 days after the winner becomes entitled to the prize. Neither MUSL nor the party lotteries shall be responsible or liable for changes in the advertised or estimated annuity prize amount and the actual amount purchased after the prize payment method is actually known to MUSL. In certain instances announced by the product group, the grand prize shall be a guaranteed amount and shall be determined pursuant to subsection (f) of K.A.R. 111-5-28. If individual shares of the cash held to fund an annuity are less than \$250,000, the product group, in its sole discretion, may elect to pay the winners their share of the cash held in the grand prize pool of the annuity. All annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in 30 equal payments with the initial payment being made in cash, to be followed by 29 payments funded by the annuity. All annuitized prizes shall be paid annually in thirty (30) graduated payments (increasing each year) by a rate as determined by the product group. Prize pay-

ments may be rounded down to the nearest one-thousand dollars (\$1,000). Annual payments after the initial payment shall be made by the lottery on the anniversary date, or if such date falls on a non-business day, then on the first business day following the anniversary date of the selection of the jackpot winning numbers. Funds for the initial payment of an annuitized prize shall be made available by MUSL for payment by a party lottery by the fifteenth calendar day following the drawing or the next banking day if the fifteenth day is a non-business day. A state may elect to make the initial payment from its own funds after validation, with notice to MUSL.

(b) In the event of the death of a lottery winner during the annuity payment period, the product group, in its sole discretion, upon the petition of the estate of the lottery winner to the Kansas lottery, may accelerate the payment of all of the remaining lottery proceeds to the estate. If the product group makes such a determination, then securities and/or cash held to fund the deceased lottery winner's annuitized prize may be distributed to the estate. The identification of the securities to fund the annuitized prize shall be at the sole discretion of the product group.

(c) All low tier cash prizes, which are all prizes except the grand prize, shall be paid in cash through the party lottery which sold the winning ticket(s). A party lottery may begin paying low-tier cash prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

(d) Annuitized payments of the grand prize or a share of the grand prize may be rounded to facilitate the purchase of an appropriate funding mechanism. Breakage on an annuitized grand prize win shall be added to the first cash payment to the winner or winners. Prizes other than the grand prize, which, under these rules, may become single-payment, pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next drawing.

(e) If the grand prize is not won in a drawing, the prize money allocated for the grand prize shall roll over and be added to the grand prize pool for the following drawing.

(f) The product group may offer guaranteed minimum grand prize amounts or minimum increases in the grand prize amount between drawings or make other changes in the allocation of prize money where the product group finds that it would be in the best interest of the game. If a minimum grand prize amount or a minimum increase in the grand prize amount between drawings is offered by the product group, then the grand prize shares shall be determined as follows. If there are multiple grand prize winners during a single drawing, each selecting the annuitized option prize, then a winner's share of the guaranteed annuitized grand prize shall be determined by dividing the guaranteed annuitized grand prize by the number of winners. If there are multiple grand prize winners during a single drawing and at least one of the grand prize winners has elected the annuitized option prize, then the best bid submitted by MUSL's pre-approved qualified brokers shall determine the cash pool needed to fund the guaranteed annuitized grand prize. If no winner of the grand prize during a single drawing has elected

the annuitized option prize, then the amount of cash in the grand prize pool shall be an amount equal to the guaranteed annuitized amount divided by the average annuity factor of the most recent three best quotes provided by MUSL's pre-approved qualified brokers submitting quotes. In no case shall quotes be used which are more than two weeks old and if less than three quotes are submitted, then MUSL shall use the average of all quotes submitted. Changes in the allocation of prize money shall be designed to retain approximately the same prize allocation percentages, over a year's time, set out in these rules. Minimum guaranteed prizes or increases may be waived if the alternate funding mechanism set out in K.A.R. 111-5-26 becomes necessary.

(g) The holder of a winning ticket may win only one prize per board in connection with the winning numbers drawn, and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category.

(h) All prizes must be claimed within 365 days of the day of the drawing in which the prize was won.

(i) These amendments shall take effect January 15, 2012. 111-5-31. Ticket responsibility. (a) Until such time as a signature, mark or name is placed on the back of a ticket in the area designated for a signature, mark or name, a ticket shall be owned by the holder of the ticket. When a signature, mark or name is placed on a ticket in the place designated, the person whose signature, mark or name appears in that area shall be the owner of the ticket and shall be entitled to any prize attributable thereto.

(b) If the signature of more than one person appears on the back of the ticket in the designated place, the lottery shall make payment to the person presenting the ticket whose signature appears on both the ticket and the winner claim form. If all persons whose signatures appear in the appropriate space cannot identify one person to whom payment should be made, the lottery shall keep the prize until a determination of entitlement is made by the parties. In no event shall more than one person be entitled to a particular prize.

(c) It shall be the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game play or plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the online agent who is acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(d) The product group, the MUSL and Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for lost, damaged, destroyed, or stolen tickets. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-3-5-92, Feb. 21, 1992; amended, T-

111-10-27-97, Sept. 12, 1997; amended, T-111-4-2-99, March 19, 1999; amended, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-5-194. Mega Millions Megaplier promotion. (a) The Mega Millions Megaplier promotion is a limited extension of the Mega Millions game and is conducted in accordance with the Mega Millions game rules and other lottery rules applicable to the Mega Millions game except as may be amended herein. The promotion will begin on January 31, 2010, which is the day Mega Millions tickets are first offered for sale by the Kansas lottery. The promotion will continue until it is discontinued by the Kansas lottery. The promotion will offer to the owners of a qualifying play a chance to multiply the amount of any of the eight lump sum set prizes (the lump sum prizes normally paying \$2 to \$250,000) won in a drawing held during the promotion. The grand prize is not a set prize and will not be multiplied.

(b) A qualifying play is any single Mega Millions play for which the player pays an extra dollar for the megaplier option play and which is recorded at the Kansas Lottery's central computer as a qualifying play.

(c) A qualifying play which wins one of eight lowest lump sum set prizes will be multiplied by the number selected, either two, three, or four (2, 3, or 4), in a separate random megaplier drawing announced in a manner approved by the product group.

(d) MUSL will either itself conduct, or authorize a United States lottery to conduct on its behalf, a separate random megaplier drawing. Before each Mega Millions drawing, a single number (2, 3, or 4) shall be drawn. The Mega Millions group may change one or more of these multiplier numbers for special promotions from time to time.

(e) The prize pool for all prize categories offered by the party lotteries shall consist of up to fifty percent (50%) of each drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily-mandated tax of a party lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket, after the Mega Millions prize reserve accounts are funded to the amounts set by the product group. Any amount remaining in the prize pool at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement game or expended in a manner as directed by the product group in accordance with jurisdiction law.

(f) Any amount not used to pay for multiplied prizes may be collected and placed in the rollover account or in trust in one or more prize reserve accounts until the prize reserve accounts reach the amounts designated by the product group.

(g) Except as provided in these rules, all prizes awarded shall be paid as lump sum set prizes. Instead of the Mega Millions set prize amounts, qualifying megaplier plays will pay the amounts shown below when matched with the megaplier number drawn:

In certain rare instances, the Mega Millions set prize amount may be less than the amount shown. In such case, the seven lowest megaplier prizes will be a multiple of the changed Mega Millions prize amount announced after the draw. For example, if the match 4+1 Mega Millions set prize amount of \$10,000 becomes \$5,000 under the rules of the Mega Millions game, then a megaplier player winning that prize amount with a 4X multiplier would win \$20,000 (\$5,000 x 4). The match 5+0 prize with the megaplier option, which normally pays \$1 million, will be reduced by the same percentage as the Match 5+0 \$250,000 prize is reduced.

(h) The following table sets forth the probability of the various megaplier numbers being drawn during a single Mega Millions drawing. The group may elect to run limited promotions that may increase the multiplier numbers.

Megaplier	Probability of Prize Increase
4X - Prize won times 4	12 in 21
3X - Prize won times 3	7 in 21
2X - Prize won times 2	2 in 21

Note: Megaplier does not apply to the Mega Millions grand prize.

(i) The prize pool percentage allocated to the megaplier set prizes shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw or may be held in a prize reserve account.

(j) If the total of the original Mega Millions set prizes and the multiplied megaplier set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pools allocated to the set prizes, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes (including the multiplied set prizes) awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

(1) the amount allocated to the set prizes and carried forward from previous draws, if any;

(2) an amount from the Mega Millions reserve accounts not to exceed the lesser of 300% of draw sales or 50% of draw sales plus \$50 million.

If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded (including multiplied prizes), then the prize levels two through five shall become a pari-mutuel prize, as set out in K.A.R. 111-4-184(d). The Mega Millions and megaplier prize pools shall be combined in the rare instance when the set prizes, pursuant to the rules, are paid on a pari-mutuel basis, so that the multipliers, as provided for in the rules, will remain in effect for all prize levels.

(k) All megaplier prizes shall be paid in one lump sum through the party lottery that sold the winning ticket(s). A party lottery may begin paying megaplier prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

(l) Prizes, which under these rules, may become pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting

from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next drawing.

(m) The announced match 5+0 prize, for players selecting the megaplier option, shall be multiplied by four (4) unless a higher limited promotional multiplier is announced by the group.

(n) These amendments shall take effect with the drawing conducted on January 15, 2012. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-29-10, Jan. 20, 2010; amended, T-111-9-1-10, Aug. 18, 2010; amended, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)

111-5-200. Powerball Power Play promotion.

(a) The Kansas Lottery shall offer players the opportunity to participate in the Powerball Power Play promotion, with changes effective in these rules beginning January 15, 2012. The Power Play promotion shall offer a Powerball player a chance to increase the amount of any of the eight lump sum set prizes (the lump sum prizes normally paying \$4 to \$1,000,000) won in a drawing held during the promotion. The grand prize jackpot is not a set prize and will not be increased.

(b) A qualifying play is any single Powerball play for which the player pays an extra one dollar for the Power Play option play and which is recorded in the Kansas Lottery's central computer as a qualifying play.

(c) Except as provided in these rules, a qualifying play which wins one of the eight lowest lump sum set prizes (excluding the jackpot) shall be paid as follows:

Article 9.—PULL-TAB GAMES

111-9-177. "Red Hot Cash" pull tab ticket lottery game number 425.

(a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a pull tab lottery game entitled "Red Hot Cash" commencing on or after January 1, 2012. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-8-1 *et seq.* and K.A.R. 111-9-177.

(b) The price of pull tab tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$2.00 each.

(c) Approximately 600,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this pull tab game that shall be packaged in packs of 150 tickets each. The ticket numbers in each pack in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

(d) The play symbols for this game are as follows:

- Symbol of a hot pepper
- Symbol of a flaming dollar sign (\$)
- Symbol of the sun
- Symbol of a stack of money

- Symbol of a slice of pizza
- Symbol of a fan
- Symbol of a thermostat
- Symbol of a bottle of hot sauce

(e) For this game, three play symbols shall appear under each of eight tabs on the back of each ticket. On the front of each ticket shall appear a legend of all winning combinations using the play symbols for this game along with the corresponding prize amount for each combination, as follows: three bottles of hot sauce symbols equal \$2.00; three thermostat symbols equal \$5.00; three fan symbols equal \$10.00; three slices of pizza symbols equal \$25.00; three stacks of money symbols equal \$50.00; three sun symbols equal \$100.00; three flaming dollar sign (\$) symbols equal \$250.00; three hot pepper symbols equal \$2,500.00.

(f) All tabs on the back of each ticket are to be pulled open. For each combination of three play symbols matching the legend on the front of the ticket, the player wins the prize amount corresponding to each combination as shown in (e) above. All winning combinations shall be within a single window in a horizontal line.

(g) The number and value of prizes in this game and winning combinations shall be as follows: (See corresponding play symbol values in subsection (e) above.)

Article 201.—GENERIC RULES FOR LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES

111-201-14. Internal controls. (a) No lottery gaming facility manager shall place or permit operation of lottery facility games at a lottery gaming facility unless the following criteria are met:

(1) The lottery gaming facility manager has submitted to the executive director policies and procedures establishing a system of internal controls at the lottery gaming facility to ensure the safe handling and movement of money and money equivalents and the maintenance of timely and accurate accounting information and data; and

(2) the policies and procedures establishing a system of internal controls and amendments thereto are approved by the executive director or his or her designee in writing.

(b) The policies and procedures establishing a system of internal controls submitted by a lottery gaming facility manager shall provide reasonable assurance that each of the following conditions will be met:

(1) Financial records and reporting will be accurate, reliable and prepared on a timely basis;

(2) potential for error and fraud is minimized;

(3) money and money equivalents will be safeguarded;

(4) access to gaming machines, currency, coins, and tokens is restricted;

(5) each job function has a proper segregation of duties;

(6) all assets are safeguarded;

(7) financial transactions will comply with applicable laws and regulations;

(8) all promotional credits are documented, and the value attributed to such promotional credits recorded in the financial records maintained by the lottery gaming facility manager;

(9) all prizes are documented, and the value attributed to any non-cash prize is recorded in the financial records maintained by the lottery gaming facility manager; and

(10) efficient operations will be promoted.

(c) Each lottery gaming facility manager shall ensure that its operations are conducted in accordance with the policies and procedures establishing the system of internal controls approved by the executive director. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-24-09, Dec. 3, 2009; amended, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011.)
