The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received an application to expand the Acme Foundry Inc. industrial (foundry sand) landfill. The permit modification will increase that landfill's permitted disposal area from 3.7 acres to 7.5 acres. The expansion's effect will be to increase the site's disposal capacity from about 94,000 cubic yards to 196,000 cubic yards. The proposed landfill expansion would be constructed and operated in conformance with state solid waste regulations and accept only industrial waste as defined by Kansas Statutes. The proposed landfill expansion site is located on Highway 166 about 1.25 miles east of Coffeyville, Kansas in the NW¼ of Section 32, in Township 34 South, Range 17 East in Montgomery County.

The Montgomery County Commissioners have previously certified that the landfill is consistent with the county's solid waste management plan and local land use restrictions or zoning. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with the state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is providing public notice of the intent to approve the proposed landfill expansion. However, a final decision to approve the expansion has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. A copy of the administrative record which includes the permit application, engineering drawings, draft permit, and other information with respect to this permit action will be available for public review through July 16, during normal business hours, at the following locations:

Demonstration Application**

The State of Kansas, Department of Health & Environment (KDHE), hereby notifies the public that it intends to submit a Section 1115 demonstration proposal, "KanCare," to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). KDHE is providing this abbreviated notice in compliance with CMS requirements in 42 C.F.R. § 431.408(a)(2)(ii).

KanCare involves four major initiatives. First, KanCare will move virtually all Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) recipients into an integrated, whole-person-centered managed care model. Second, virtually all Medicaid and CHIP services, including long-term support services, will be covered through this managed care model. Services provided at the state-operated intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded will not be part of KanCare at this time. Third, KanCare will establish up to four uncompensated care cost pools that would permit direct payments from the State to hospitals based on the uncompensated cost of furnishing services to Medicaid and uninsured individuals (*i.e.*, individuals with no source of third party coverage for the inpatient and outpatient hospital services they receive). Fourth, KanCare will create programs to transition Kansans who are currently on Medicaid to private insurance coverage.

The goal of these initiatives is to improve Medicaid and CHIP health services and outcomes, as well as to curb the unsustainable growth in the cost of the programs.

Kansas hopes to pre-enroll Medicaid and CHIP beneficiaries in a KanCare plan starting this fall, with regular enrollment and demonstration launch to occur in January.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally regarding the adoption of the proposed regulations during the public hearing. In order to provide all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request an accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation to participate in the hearing should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the Board of Cosmetology at (785) 296-3155. The east entrance, "Jayhawk Walk," of the building is accessible. Handicapped parking is located directly outside the east entrance of the building, and on the southwest corner of Eighth and Jackson.

Summaries of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follow. (Note: Statements indicating that a regulation is "not anticipated to have any economic impact" are intended to indicate that no economic impact on the Board of Cosmetology, other state agencies, state employees, businesses, or the general public has been identified.)

Copies of the full text of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statements may be obtained at the

address above or by contacting kboc@kboc.ks.gov. The proposed regulations and economic impact statements are also available on the Board of Cosmetology website at [www.kansas.gov/kboc](http://www.kansas.gov/kboc).

**69-12-3. Expiration of licenses; renewals; reinstatements.** Amendments to this regulation allow tanning facility licenses to expire one year from the last day of the month of issuance. Currently all licenses expire annually on December 31. This change will stagger tanning facility renewals over the course of the year, creating a decreased need for temporary staff during the December renewal period. No other economic impact is anticipated.

**69-13-4. Refusal to allow inspection.** This is a new regulation that allows the board to take disciplinary action against individuals or licensees who attempt to refuse, impede, or interfere with inspections of cosmetology facilities and schools. This regulation may save board resources by allowing inspectors to carry out their duties without interference. Resources may be in the form of travel time, mileage, per diem costs and expenses. The board will adopt a standard disciplinary action policy, in the form of a fine, pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1908 and 65-1909. Revenues generated by the fine will go to the state general fund. The only additional economic impact will be on those individuals faced with disciplinary action.

**69-15-9. Renewal and reactivation of licenses.** Amendments to this regulation reflect the current agency policy, which allows body art practitioner licenses to expire one year from the date of issue. This portion of amendments simply clarifies current policy and is not anticipated to have any economic impact. Additional amendments allow body art facility licenses to be renewed during a 60-day grace period after expiration of the current facility license upon payment of the facility late fee (\$50.00). Collection of the facility late fee and the avoidance of submitting a new application will impact facility owners, board resources associated with compliance inspections, and revenues generated by application and renewal fees. No additional economic impact is anticipated.

**69-15-12. Continuing education for license renewal.** Language is being amended to clarify that five hours of continuing education for body art licensees are required for annual license renewal according to the specifications currently outlined in the regulation. This is a change from the previous requirement of 15 hours every three years. Any economic impact on licensees would be the result of previous failure to properly understand and comply with current continuing education requirements. No other economic impact is anticipated.

**69-15-13. Reporting continuing education.** Amendments to this regulation coincide with the language clarifications above. This change is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

**69-15-15. Permanent color technician, tattoo artist, and body piercing technician practice standards; restrictions.** Language is being added to clarify the length of time licensees are required to maintain client records: five years. Additional amendments exclude "diseases not transmitted by casual contact" in the regulation of licensees or consumers afflicted with or suffering from "infec-

tious or communicable diseases." Since these changes clarify current policy, they are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

**69-15-16. Facility standards.** Amendments to this regulation require body art facilities to maintain individual client records for a minimum of five years for all licensees providing services at that facility. This requirement is in addition to the client record documentation maintained by the licensee. There may be an economic impact on facilities in terms of documentation and storage for this amendment. All other amendments to this regulation are language changes or clarifications and do not make any substantive changes and are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

reply brief may be submitted by the appellant but is limited to new issues raised in the appellee's brief.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation to participate in the hearing should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by calling the Kansas Relay Center at 1-800-766-3777.

This regulation was approved on a temporary basis on June 1, 2012. A summary of the proposed regulation and the economic impact follows:

**K.A.R. 30-46-10.** The amendment removes references to specific abuse/neglect subsections of K.S.A. 38-2202 and does not include substantial changes to the current language. There is no economic impact as a result of these amendments.

## Article 46.—CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

**30-46-10. Definitions.** For the purpose of the child abuse and neglect registry, the following definitions shall apply.

(a) "Abuse" means "physical, mental or emotional abuse" or "sexual abuse," as these two terms are defined in K.S.A. 38-2202 and amendments thereto and as "sexual abuse" is further defined in this regulation, involving a child who resides in Kansas or is found in Kansas, regardless of where the act occurred. The term "abuse" shall include any act that occurred in Kansas, regardless of where the child is found or resides, and shall include any act, behavior, or omission that impairs or endangers a child's social or intellectual functioning.

The term "abuse" may include the following:

(1) Terrorizing a child, by creating a climate of fear or engaging in violent or threatening behavior toward the child or toward others in the child's presence that demonstrates a flagrant disregard for the child;

(2) emotionally abandoning a child, by being psychologically unavailable to the child, demonstrating no attachment to the child, or failing to provide adequate nurturance of the child; and

(3) corrupting a child, by teaching or rewarding the child for unlawful, antisocial, or sexually mature behavior.

(b) "Alleged perpetrator" means the person identified in the initial report or during the investigation as the person suspected of perpetrating an act of abuse or neglect.

(c) "Child" means anyone under the age of 18 or anyone under the age of 21 and in the custody of the secretary pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2255 and amendments thereto.

(d) "Child abuse and neglect registry" means the list of names for individuals identified by the department as substantiated perpetrators.

(e) "Child care facility" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 65-503 and amendments thereto.

(f) "Department" means the Kansas department of social and rehabilitation services.

(g) "Investigation" means the gathering and assessing of information to determine if a child has been harmed, as defined in K.S.A. 38-2202 and amendments thereto, as the result of abuse or neglect, to identify the individual or individuals responsible, and to determine if the individual or individuals identified should reside, work, or regularly volunteer in a child care facility.

(h) "Neglect" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 38-2202, and amendments thereto, involving a child who resides in Kansas or is found in Kansas, regardless of where the act or failure to act occurred. This term shall include any act or failure to act that occurred in Kansas, regardless of where the child is found or resides.

(i) "Sexual abuse" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 38-2202, and amendments thereto, and shall include contact solely between children only if the contact also in-

volves force, intimidation, difference in maturity, or coercion.

(j) "Substantiated perpetrator" and "perpetrator" mean a person who has been validated by the secretary or designee, using clear and convincing evidence, to have committed an act of abuse or neglect, regardless of where the person resides and who is prohibited from residing, working, or volunteering in a child care facility pursuant to K.S.A. 65-516, and amendments thereto. These terms shall replace the term "validated perpetrator."
