Public Notice

The state of Kansas Medicaid is proposing a state plan change to be effective January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2014, for payment rates to primary care physicians for furnishing primary care services. Payment rates must be not less than 100 percent of Medicare (if greater, the Medicare payment rate in effect in 2009 is to be used). Primary care physicians are defined as physicians with a primary specialty designation of family medicine, general internal medicine or pediatric medicine. Primary care services include those in the Evaluation and Management category under the Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) used by Medicare (99201 - 99499), and services related to immunization and administration for vaccines and toxoids (90465, 90466, 90467, 90471, 90472, 90473 and 90474). Medicaid managed care plans must make payments to physicians consistent with these minimum payment rates, regardless of the manner in which payments are made by the plans, including capitation or partial capitation payments. This provision is mandated by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
The Division of Health Care Finance anticipates a fiscal impact of \$6,900,000 for FFY 2013 and \$9,200,000 for FFY 2014.

The purpose of the proposed program is to assist the state's housing by providing gap funding for rehabilitation, reconstruction or infrastructure activities. The Department of Commerce is proposing to reallocate deobligated and unobligated funds of up to $\$ 1.5$ million for a pilot housing project. The maximum grant award would be $\$ 500,000$ and projects will be accepted until the funds are depleted. Applications would be taken on an openwindow basis. Projects must have a business connection and address a minimum of four units.

An applicant will complete the Housing Assessment Tool (HAT) and submit a brief pre-application for review by a committee. Regular CDBG rules, including procurement, will apply to these pilot projects. To qualify for funding, the projects would have to meet the "low-tomoderate income" national objective under the Housing \& Community Development Act.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Natural Gas Pipeline Company of America, LLC has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

The written request must be submitted to Sharon Burrell, Bureau of Air, not later than the close of business August 13 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45 -day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60 -day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Monday, September 10, in Room 203 at the Jayhawk Walk building, 720 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Office of the Attorney General on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Victim Services Division, Office of the Attorney General, 120 S.W. 10th Ave., 2nd Floor, Topeka, 66612, or by email to Michelle.McCormick@ksag.org. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally regarding the adoption of the proposed regulations during the public hearing. In order to provide all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. The following proposed regulations provide the detailed information on program requirements for batterer intervention programs (BIPs) and the certification process granted in 2012 Senate Bill 304. The proposed regulations also fulfill the statutory obligation for the Office of the Attorney General to promulgate rules and regulations regarding the domestic violence offender assessment, as required in K.S.A 2011 Supp. 75-755. Please see the summary of each proposed regulation below.
K.A.R. 16-12-1. Scope. This is a new regulation that describes the purpose of the article as setting the minimum standards for batterer intervention programs (also known as domestic violence or abuse intervention, or domestic violence educational programs).
K.A.R. 16-12-2. Definitions. This is a new regulation that defines terms used in the article not defined in the act, including: continuing education, controlled substance, remedial or other requirements, supervisee, and unprofessional conduct, as it pertains to the provision of batterer intervention services.
K.A.R. 16-12-3. Continuing education. This is a new regulation that outlines the specific requirements and standards for acceptable continuing education credits for batterer intervention applicants and programs.
K.A.R. 16-12-4. Program requirements. This is a new regulation that adopts by reference the "Essential Elements and Standards of Batterer Intervention Programs in Kansas" where minimum program elements are described. In addition, the regulation establishes the requirement for certified batterer intervention programs to submit a statistical report to the Office of the Attorney General.
K.A.R. 16-12-5. Domestic violence offender assessment. This is a new regulation that adopts by reference the Kansas Domestic Violence Offender Assessment (KDVOA). This regulation also describes the requirement for licensure by the Behavioral Science Regulatory Board, as required by the Act.
K.A.R. 16-12-6. Temporary permit; application. This is a new regulation that describes the process by which an applicant applies to be granted a temporary permit to act as a certified batterer intervention program by the Office of the Attorney General.
K.A.R. 16-12-7. Initial certification; application. This is a new regulation that describes the process by which an applicant applies for initial certification by the Office of the Attorney General.
K.A.R. 16-12-8. Renewal certification; application. This is a new regulation that describes the process by which an applicant applies for renewal certification by the Office of the Attorney General.
K.A.R. 16-12-9. Certification reinstatement; application. This is a new regulation that describes the process by which an applicant applies for reinstatement certification by the Office of the Attorney General.
K.A.R. 16-12-10. Evaluating and monitoring certified batterer intervention programs. This is a new regulation that describes the process that will be used by the Office of the Attorney General to evaluate and monitor these programs.

## Summary of the economic impact of the proposed regulations

The Office of the Attorney General has created the Batterer Intervention Program (BIP) Unit to coordinate the activities as necessary to fulfill the statutory responsibilities assigned. Staff time is spent providing capacity building training and technical assistance, as well as monitoring programs for compliance with the Essential Elements and Standards, as adopted by reference in the proposed regulations. Monitoring the programs requires two initial site visits, reviewing applications and supporting documentation, contacting collateral sources of information, and biannual renewals of this process. Training and technical assistance practices include providing an average 20 trainings per year and technical assistance as requested. These functions and activities of the BIP Unit cost an estimated $\$ 80,000-\$ 100,000$ annually, including salary, supplies, equipment and travel expenses. Currently, these costs are funded through the procurement of federal grant dollars by the Office of the Attorney General.

BIP costs, including the cost of the KDVOA, are paid for by the participant of the program, unless otherwise specified by the courts or Kansas Department of Corrections, per the legislation. The actual cost of each group session and the assessment is set by the provider of batterer intervention services. Any difficulties in paying this cost will likely be negotiated between the offender and the agency providing the service.

The programs providing this service typically include mental health centers, nonprofit agencies and licensed professionals in private practice. These providers could see a potential increase in revenue if the number of cases designated domestic violence increase resulting in an increase in referrals for services. There also could be costs to these providers in order to obtain the required continuing education training. These costs could include training registration fees and travel expenses. Additionally, programs will be required to pay an application fee to the Office of the Attorney General, as described in 2012 SB 304.

## Permanent Administrative Regulations

## Article 25.—REDUCED CIGARETTE IGNITION PROPENSITY

22-25-1. Definitions. (a) "ASTM" shall mean the American society for testing and materials or its successor organization.
(b) "Attorney general" shall mean the attorney general of the state of Kansas.
(c) "Consumer testing" shall mean an assessment of cigarettes that is conducted by, or under the control and direction of, a manufacturer for the purpose of evaluating consumer acceptance of the cigarettes, utilizing only the quantity of cigarettes that is reasonably necessary for the testing. Consumer testing shall not be construed as the "sale" of cigarettes for the purposes of this article.
(d) "Person" shall mean an individual, partnership, corporation, or other association.
(e) "Sale" shall mean any transfer of title or possession, or both, or exchange or barter, conditional or otherwise, in any manner or by any means or any agreement. In addition to cash and credit sales, the giving of cigarettes as samples, prizes, or gifts and the exchanging of cigarettes for any consideration other than money shall be considered sales of cigarettes.
(f) "State fire marshal" shall mean the fire marshal of the state of Kansas.
(g) "UPC symbol" shall mean the symbol signifying the universal product code. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 31-611; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 31-602; effective July 27, 2012.)

22-25-2. Certification forms and requirements; recertification. (a) Certification forms may be requested from the state fire marshal's office.
(b) If any certification form, including all required documentation, is incomplete, the state fire marshal or designee shall notify the manufacturer in writing that the submission is incomplete. All missing information and documentation shall be submitted to the state fire marshal's office within 30 days of notification. If the submission is still incomplete after 30 days, the fees shall not be refunded or considered part of that submission or any other request.
(c) Each cigarette shall be retested in accordance with K.S.A. 31-603, and amendments thereto, within one year before the submission of an application for recertification as required by K.S.A. 31-604, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 31-611; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 31-604; effective July 27, 2012.)

## Article 1.-CERTIFICATE REGULATIONS

91-1-209. Additional endorsements. (a) Any person who holds a currently valid teaching, school service, or school leadership license may add additional endorsements to that license by submitting to the state board the following:
(1) Verification from an accredited institution by a unit head or designee of completion of an approved content area program;
(2) verification of successful completion of the appropriate endorsement content assessment prescribed by the state board;
(3) an application for an added endorsement; and
(4) the application fee.
(b)(1) Any person who holds a currently valid teaching license with a science endorsement at the early adolescence through late adolescence and adulthood level may add an additional science endorsement for that level by submitting to the state board the following:
(A) Verification of successful completion of the appropriate science endorsement content assessment prescribed by the state board;
(B) an application for an added endorsement; and
(C) the application fee.
(2) This subsection shall remain in force and effect only through June 30, 2012.
(c)(1) Any person who holds a currently valid teaching license at any level may add a content area endorsement for the late childhood through early adolescence level by submitting to the state board the following:
(A) Verification from an accredited institution by a unit head or designee of completion of 15 semester credit
hours in the content area for which endorsement is sought;
(B) verification of one of the following:
(i) A pedagogy course for the late childhood through early adolescence level; or
(ii) recent accredited experience of one year or more in one of the grades 5 through 8 ;
(C) verification of successful completion of the appropriate content assessment prescribed by the state board;
(D) an application for an added endorsement; and
(E) the application fee.
(2) Teaching endorsements for adaptive, functional, gifted, deaf or hard-of-hearing, and visually impaired shall not be available under this subsection.
(3) This subsection shall remain in force and effect only through June 30, 2012.
(d)(1) Any person who holds a currently valid teaching license with a content area endorsement at the early adolescence through late adolescence and adulthood level may add an additional content area endorsement for that level by submitting to the state board the following:
(A) Verification from an accredited institution by a unit head or designee of completion of 50 percent or more of an approved content area program, including the content methods course;
(B) verification of successful completion of the appropriate endorsement content assessment prescribed by the state board;
(C) an application for an added endorsement; and
(D) the application fee.
(2) Any person who holds a currently valid teaching license with a content area endorsement at the late childhood through early adolescence level may add the same content area endorsement at the early adolescence through late adolescence and adulthood level by submitting to the state board verification of meeting the requirements specified in paragraph (d)(1).
(3) Teaching endorsements for adaptive, functional, gifted, deaf or hard-of-hearing, and visually impaired shall not be available under this subsection.
(4) This subsection shall remain in force and effect only through June 30, 2012.
(e) (1) Any person who holds a valid out-of-state teaching license with an additional endorsement that was earned by completion of coursework specified by the other state may add that endorsement to the person's Kansas license by submitting to the state board the following:
(A) A copy of the out-of-state license showing the endorsement;
(B) verification that the person completed the specified coursework;
(C) verification of successful completion of the appropriate endorsement content assessment prescribed by the state board or evidence of successful completion of an endorsement content assessment in the state in which the applicant holds a license;
(D) an application for an added endorsement; and
(E) the licensure fee.
(2) This subsection shall remain in force and effect only through June 30, 2012.
(f)(1) Except as prescribed in paragraph (f)(2), any person who holds a valid teaching license may add an additional teaching endorsement by submitting to the state board the following:
(A) Verification of successful completion of the endorsement content assessment prescribed by the state board;
(B) an application for an added endorsement; and
(C) the application fee.
(2) Teaching endorsements for early childhood, early childhood unified, early childhood through late child-
hood generalist, adaptive, functional, gifted, deaf or hard-of-hearing, or visually impaired shall not be available under paragraph (f)(1).
