**Article 16.—LICENSES; SUSPENSION
 AND REVOCATION**

14-16-25. Imposition of penalties for violations.

(a) The director may revoke or suspend the license of any licensee for any violation of the liquor control act, the club and drinking establishment act, or any implementing regulation.

(b) In addition to or in lieu of any other civil or criminal penalty for any violation of the liquor control act, the club and drinking establishment act, or any implementing regulation, the director may order a civil fine not exceeding \$1,000 per violation.

(c) The director may order a penalty based upon the schedule specified in subsection (d). Penalties may vary from the schedule based on the presence of aggravating or mitigating circumstances.

(d) The department's "liquor fine and penalty schedule," dated July 16, 2012, is hereby adopted by reference. **Article 7.—INVESTIGATIVE, EXPERT OR
 OTHER SERVICES**

105-7-1. Funding approval; court order authorizing services. (a) Funding for the estimated cost of investigative, expert, and other services shall be approved by the board before any appointed attorney submits the order to the court for authorization of the services. Funding shall not be approved until the board signs a contract with the service provider for the approved cost as specified in the contract. The contract form provided by the board shall be used. Attorney time spent preparing a contract other than that approved by the board shall not be compensable.

The original contract signed by the service provider and the board shall be maintained by the board. A fully executed copy of this contract shall be returned to the attorney requesting defense services.

(b) Each court order authorizing investigative, expert, or other services for an indigent defendant shall be made on a form approved by the board and shall include an estimate of the cost of those services. Attorney time spent preparing an order form other than that approved by the board shall not be compensable.

(c) If the district court finds, on the record, that timely procurement of necessary services could not await prior authorization by the court, then funding for those necessary services already provided shall be approved by the board.

A copy of the court order shall be sent to the board promptly, after being signed by the judge. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4508, 22-4512a, and 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 22-4508, 22-4512a; effective May 1, 1984; amended Dec. 14, 2012.)

105-7-2. Claims. (a) Each claim for compensation for investigative, expert, or other services provided to an indigent defendant shall be submitted on a form approved by the board. Each claim shall be signed by the attorney requesting the service and the judge before transmittal to the board. Each claim for investigative, expert, or other services shall include the service provider's time sheet detailing time expended in the performance of these services and any compensation received for the same services from any other source.

(b) Claims for expert services rendered at the request of a public defender office shall be excluded from the provisions of K.A.R. 105-7-1. Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-287. 1593 KAPS lottery promotion. (a) During the term of this promotion, players at all KAPS stores in Kansas shall be able to enter all non-winning \$1 instant

scratch tickets purchased at all KAPS Kansas lottery retailers.

(b) The term of this promotion shall be from May 14, 2012, through the end of the business day on May 18, 2012.

(c) During the term of this promotion, drop boxes for the deposit of the non-winning \$1 instant scratch tickets shall be provided by the lottery and placed at all participating KAPS locations. The Kansas lottery shall retrieve all drop boxes at the end of the promotion.

(d) After the term of this promotion has ended, one entry and two alternate entries shall be drawn by the Kansas lottery pursuant to standard lottery drawing procedures for each of the KAPS locations.

(e) The winner from each store will win a Kansas lottery promotional goodie bag.

(f) The drawing is tentatively set to be held at the Kansas lottery Topeka office after the promotion deadline, on or about May 29, 2012. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

The drawing will be held at a time and location designated by the executive director of the Kansas lottery. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-3182 through 111-4-3187 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-4-3183. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) “Art in the Park Drawing” means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the time and date described in these rules in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in these rules.

(c) “Non-winning ticket” means any valid Kansas lottery “Art in the Park” instant game ticket not eligible to win an instant prize under the rules of the “Art in the Park” instant game.

(d) “Receptacle” or “drum” means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the “Art in the Park Drawing” entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) “Bare arm technique” means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer’s bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-4-3184. Prize. (a) The first winner drawn in the “Art in the Park Drawing” shall receive his or her choice of four original paintings of Kansas parks by artist Louis Copt, having an approximate value of \$11,607, including mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(b) The second winner drawn in the “Art in the Park Drawing” shall receive his or her choice of three remaining paintings of Kansas parks by artist Louis Copt, having an approximate value of \$11,607, including mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(c) The third winner drawn in the “Art in the Park Drawing” shall receive his or her choice of two remaining paintings of Kansas parks by artist Louis Copt, having an approximate value of \$11,607, including mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(d) The fourth winner drawn in the “Art in the Park Drawing” shall receive the remaining painting of Kansas parks by artist Louis Copt, having an approximate value of \$11,607, including mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(e) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(f) The Kansas lottery may, at its sole and absolute discretion, substitute a prize of approximate equal value. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-4-3185. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the “Art in the Park Drawing” to be conducted on or about October 26, 2012, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid “Art in the Park” Kansas instant lottery ticket;

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with “Art in the Park” game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the “Art in the Park Drawing” and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the “Art in the Park Drawing.”

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) Players may deposit entries for the “Art in the Park Drawing” at any Kansas lottery event or location at which the lottery has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries until approximately 5:00 p.m. on or about October 23, 2012.

(6) Entries other than those entered at Kansas lottery events or locations as identified in subsection (a)(5) shall be mailed with proper postage to “Art in the Park Drawing,” P. O. Box 3561, Topeka, Kansas 66601-3561. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, October 23, 2012. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the “Art in the Park Drawing” or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning “Art in the Park” tickets which are mailed to the “Art in the Park Drawing,” at the above-stated address with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, October 23, 2012, and non-winning “Art in the Park Game” tickets entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All tickets so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted.

(d) Eligible entrants in the “Art in the Park Drawing” must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing con-

(continued)

stitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for any lost, destroyed, mutilated, unreadable, or altered ticket entries into the "Art in the Park Drawing." Players enter this contest at their own risk. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-4-3186. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of the winners in the "Art in the Park Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Art in the Park Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office Box 3561, in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, October 23, 2012. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, October 23, 2012, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be placed in the drawing receptacle or drum along with all entries deposited into any other receptacle designated by the lottery.

(b) The drawing shall be held at a location determined by the executive director of the Kansas lottery and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the drawing on or about October 26, 2012, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove four entry tickets from the receptacle or drum. The four tickets drawn shall be marked in the order drawn, 1, 2, 3, and 4. The persons whose names appear on the entries drawn shall be the winners of the prizes identified in K.A.R. 111-4-3184(a), (b), (c), and (d), subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After the four prize entries have been drawn on or about October 26, 2012, and the entries have been verified as valid, six more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time, which entries drawn will serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, and 6A. The winners shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following mailing of a claim form to the winners to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. If the thirtieth day following the mailing of a claim form to any winner falls on a weekend or holiday, the thirtieth day shall be extended to the next business day. If a prize winner cannot be located or is declared ineligible, or fails to timely present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters, the prize will be awarded to the next succeeding winning ticket selected as a prize winner in the order drawn or to the next alternate ticket selected in the order drawn. The alternate winner process shall be repeated until the prizes

are properly claimed or until such time as no alternate winners remain, whichever occurs first.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Art in the Park Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the prize won. The prize winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned as set forth in these rules.

(g) If any entry drawn is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until the required number of apparently eligible selections is obtained.

(h) Only non-winning "Art in the Park" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Art in the Park" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on or about October 26, 2012, after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-4-3187. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Art in the Park Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-4-3188. "Pure Gold" instant ticket lottery game number 439. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Pure Gold" commencing on or after May 1, 2012. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-3188.

Article 301.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES

111-301-32. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort in Dodge City, Kansas, entitled "Let It Ride Bonus" beginning on or after May 1, 2012.

The rules and regulations for the game of "Let It Ride Bonus" are contained in K.A.R. 111-301-32 through 111-301-38, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-33. Object of game. Let It Ride Bonus is a five-card stud poker game in which each player seeks a hand that qualifies for a posted payout, which cards consist of a pair of 10s or higher ranking hand. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-34. Definitions. The following definitions, when used in the Southwest Kansas Lottery Gaming Zone, when pertaining to the game of "Let It Ride Bonus" shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Community cards" means the two cards that are dealt face down in the designated area in front of the dealer and, once revealed, shall be used by each player with his or her three cards to form a five card hand.

(b) "Hand" means the five (5) card hand formed for each player by combining the three (3) cards dealt to the player and the two (2) community cards.

(c) "Let It Ride" means when a player chooses not to take back either of the two wagers made during a round of play.

(d) "Rank" or "ranking" shall mean the relative position of a card or group of cards.

(e) "Round of play" or "round" means one complete cycle of play during which all players then playing at the table have been dealt a hand, have folded or wagered upon it, and have had their wagers paid or collected.

(f) "Stub" means the remaining portion of the deck after all cards in the round of play have been dealt.

(g) "Suit" shall mean one of the four categories of cards, i.e., diamond, spade, club, or heart. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-35. Let It Ride Bonus hand rankings. The rank of the cards used in Let It Ride Bonus for the determination of winning hands, in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be: ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an ace may be used to complete a "straight flush" or a "straight" formed with a 2, 3, 4, and 5. An ace may not be used, however, with any other sequence of cards to form a "straight".

(continued)

The permissible poker hands at the game of Let It Ride Bonus, in order of highest to lowest rank, are as follows:

(a) Royal flush - a hand consisting of ace, king, queen, jack, and 10 of the same suit.

(b) Straight flush - a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking except for a royal flush as defined above.

(c) Four-of-a-kind - a hand consisting of four cards of the same rank.

(d) Full house - a hand consisting of three of a kind and a pair.

(e) Flush - a hand consisting of five cards of the same suit, not in consecutive order.

(f) Straight - a hand consisting of five cards of consecutive rank that are not all in the same suit.

(g) Three-of-a-kind - a hand consisting of three cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(h) Two pair - a hand consisting of two pairs.

(i) One pair - a hand consisting of two cards of the same rank regardless of suit.

(j) High card - a hand that does not encompass any of the hands above. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-36. Wagers. (a) All wagers at Let It Ride Bonus Poker shall be made by placing gaming chips and, if applicable, a match play coupon on the appropriate betting areas of the table layout. A match play coupon is a coupon that may at the discretion of Boot Hill Casino & Resort be issued to a player and used by the player to equal the amount wagered by the player in gaming chips. A verbal wager accompanied by cash shall not be accepted.

(b) Only the dealer and players who are seated at the Let It Ride Bonus Poker table may touch the cards. Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, that player must remain seated until the completion of the round of play.

(c) All wagers at Let It Ride Bonus Poker shall be placed prior to the dealer dealing the first card. No wager at Let It Ride Bonus Poker shall be made, increased or withdrawn after the dealer has dealt the first card.

(d) Prior to the first card being dealt for each round of play, each player at the game of Let It Ride Bonus Poker shall be required to make three equal but separate wagers for each round of play. The wagers shall be identified as bet number 1, bet number 2, and bet number 3. Bet number 1 and bet number 2 may be removed by the player during the course of play as otherwise provided by the rules of play, with bet number 3 remaining until the final decision of a win or loss is made at the end of the round.

(e) Each winning wager on the bet numbers 1, 2, and 3 shall be paid from the following payout table:

(1) Royal Flush	500 to 1
(2) Straight Flush	200 to 1
(3) Four-of-a-Kind	50 to 1
(4) Full House	11 to 1
(5) Flush	8 to 1
(6) Straight	5 to 1
(7) Three-of-a-Kind	3 to 1

(9) Pair of 10's or higher ranking pair	1 to 1

(f) Notwithstanding the payout odds in subsection (e) above, the aggregate payout limit for one round of play shall be \$25,000 and shall be exclusive of a bonus payout.

(g) Each Player has the option of making a wager on the Let it Ride Bonus wager. The bonus wager is always treated as a side bet. Only players who place a wager in the primary game of Let It Ride shall be allowed to make a Let It Ride Bonus wager. Only one \$1.00 gaming chip may be wagered on the Let It Ride Bonus wager and will be placed in the appropriate betting circle marked on the layout. All bonus wagers must be placed before the first card is dealt.

(h) Let it Ride Bonus bet qualifying hands and the payout table are based on the \$1.00 bonus wager. All winning wagers for the Let It Ride Bonus wager shall be paid based upon the following payout table:

(1) Royal Flush	\$10,000
(2) Straight Flush	\$2,000
(3) Four-of-a-Kind	\$100
(4) Full House	\$75
(5) Flush	\$50
(6) Straight	\$25
(7) Three-of-a-Kind	\$8

(i) Each player also has the option of making a Three Card Bonus wager within the minimum and maximum wagers posted at the table. All such wagers shall be placed in the appropriate betting circle marked on the layout. Only the three cards dealt to the player are used to determine the outcome of the Three Card Bonus wager. All bonus wagers must be placed before the first card is dealt.

(j) All winning wagers for the Three Card Bonus wager shall be paid from the following payout table:

(1) Straight Flush	40 to 1
(2) Three-of-a-Kind	30 to 1
(3) Straight	6 to 1
(4) Flush	3 to 1
(5) One Pair	1 to 1

(k) The rank of the cards used in the Three Card Bonus, in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be: ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, and 2. All suits shall be considered equal in rank. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an ace may be used to complete a "straight flush" or a "straight" with a two and three.

(l) The permissible poker hands in the Three Card Bonus, in order of highest to lowest rank, shall be:

(1) "Straight flush" is a hand consisting of three cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking;

(2) "Three-of-a-kind" is a hand consisting of three cards of the same rank, regardless of suit;

(3) "Straight" is a hand consisting of three cards of consecutive rank, regardless of suit;

(4) "Flush" is a hand consisting of three cards of the same suit, regardless of rank;

(5) "Pair" is a hand consisting of two cards of the same rank, regardless of suit.

(m) After each round of play is complete, the dealer shall collect all losing wagers and pay off all winning wagers in accordance with the payout tables. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-37. Play. (a) All wagers must be placed prior to the first card being dealt. The starting position for the dealing of cards and the delivery of stacks of cards

for the game of Let It Ride Bonus Poker shall be determined in the following manner:

(b) The dealer shall deliver the first stack of cards to the player farthest to the dealer's left. As the remaining stacks are dispensed by the automated shuffling device, the dealer shall deliver a stack, in turn, to each of the other players, including the dealer, also known as the community cards, moving clockwise around the table. The dealer shall deliver each stack face down.

(c) After the players have examined their cards, the dealer shall, beginning from his or her left and moving clockwise, ask each player if he or she wishes to withdraw bet number 1 or let it ride.

(1) If a player chooses to let bet number 1 ride, that wager must remain until the end of the round of play.

(2) If a player chooses to withdraw bet number 1, the dealer shall move the gaming chip(s) toward the player who shall then immediately remove the gaming chip(s) from the betting area.

(d) After each player has made a decision regarding the bet number 1, the dealer shall then burn (discard) the bottom community card, the dealer shall then turn, face up, one of the two community cards.

(e) After the first community card is exposed, the dealer shall, beginning from the dealer's left and moving clockwise, ask each player if he or she wishes to withdraw bet number 2 or let it ride. The decision shall be made regardless of the decision made for bet number 1.

(1) If a player chooses to let bet number 2 ride, that wager must remain until the end of the round of play.

(2) If a player chooses to withdraw bet number 2, the dealer shall move the gaming chip(s) toward the player who shall then immediately remove the gaming chip(s) from the betting area.

(3) After each player makes his or her decision for bet number 2, the player shall place his or her cards under his or her third bet.

(f) The dealer shall then turn the remaining face down card, face up. This shall become the second community card.

(g) The two community cards shall be used by each player, in conjunction with his or her three cards to complete a five card hand.

(h) The dealer exposes players' hands from right to left. Winning hands shall be paid and losing hands and wagers shall be collected. The players' cards will then be placed immediately in the discard rack. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-38. Irregularities. (a) A card that is found face up in the shoe or the deck while the cards are being dealt shall void all hands and require a reshuffle.

(b) If any player is dealt an incorrect number of cards, all hands shall be void.

(c) If an automated card shuffling device is being used and the device jams, stops shuffling during a shuffle, or fails to complete a shuffle cycle, the cards shall be reshuffled.

(d) If an automated dealing shoe is being used and the device jams, stops dealing cards, or fails to deal all cards during a round of play, the round of play shall be void and the cards shall be removed from the device and reshuffled with any cards already dealt.

(e) Any automated card shuffling device or automated dealing shoe shall be removed from a gaming table before any other method of shuffling or dealing may be utilized at that table.

(f) If cards become soiled in the course of play and the dealer finds that a card is unsuitable for use, a table games floor supervisor or higher ranking casino official shall bring a substitute card from the card reserve in the pit stand and the unsuitable card shall be placed in a sealed envelope or container. The table games floor supervisor or higher ranking casino official will maintain the envelope in a secure place within the pit until collection by casino security personnel. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-39. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort in Dodge City, Kansas, entitled "21 + 3" beginning on or after May 1, 2012.

The rules and regulations for the game of "21 + 3" are contained in K.A.R. 111-301-39 through 111-301-44, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-40. Object of game. (a) The object of the game of "21 + 3" is for a player to beat the dealer's hand by accepting cards without exceeding the sum of 21 points.

(b) The game of "21 + 3" also offers an optional three-card poker wager. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-41. Definitions. The following definitions, when used in the Southwest Kansas Lottery Gaming Zone and when pertaining to the game of "21 + 3," shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) A "blackjack" shall mean an ace and any card having a point value of 10 dealt as the initial two cards to a player or a dealer, except that this shall not include an ace and a ten point value card dealt to a player who has split pairs.

(b) "Burned" shall mean to remove a card from play.

(c) "Dealer" shall mean the person responsible for dealing the cards at a Blackjack table.

(d) "Discard rack" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed after each round of decisions is rendered in a game.

(e) "Flush" shall mean three cards in the same suit.

(f) "Hard total" shall mean the total point count of a hand which contains no aces or which contains one or more aces that are each counted as having one point in value.

(g) "Push" or "tie" shall mean the player does not lose or win the hand played.

(h) "Shoe" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed to be held for dealing to the players and dealer.

(i) "Soft total" shall mean the total point count of a hand containing an ace when the ace is counted as having 11 points in value.

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(j) "Straight" shall mean three cards in consecutive rank order.

(k) "Straight flush" shall mean three cards in consecutive rank order that are all in the same suit.

(l) "Three-of-a-kind" shall mean three cards of the same rank. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-42. Characteristics of the game. (a) The "21 + 3" game shall be played with at least six decks of playing cards and all decks of cards shall be identical in appearance. Each deck of playing cards shall consist of 13 cards in the following order from lowest to highest rank: 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, jack, queen, king, and ace, in each of four suits (hearts, spades, diamonds, and clubs), for a total of 52 cards. The value of the cards contained in each deck shall be as follows:

(1) Any card from 2 to 10 shall have its face value;

(2) Any jack, queen or king shall have a value of 10; and,

(3) An ace shall have a value of 11, unless that value would give a player or the dealer a score in excess of 21, in which case it shall have a value of one.

(b) The game of 21 + 3 is played on a layout approved by the Kansas lottery that is similar to a blackjack layout with an additional betting area for the three-card poker wager. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-43. Wagers. (a) Prior to the first card being dealt for each round of play, each player at the game of "21 + 3" shall make a wager against the dealer which shall win if:

(1) The score of the player is 21 or less and the score of the dealer is in excess of 21;

(2) The score of the player exceeds that of the dealer without either score exceeding 21; or

(3) The player has achieved a score of 21 in two cards and the dealer has achieved a score of 21 in more than two cards.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in these rules a wager made in accordance with this section shall be void when the score of the player is the same as the dealer; provided, however, that a player's wager shall be lost when the dealer has a blackjack and the player has a score of 21 which is not a blackjack.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in these rules, no wager shall be made, increased or withdrawn after the first card of the respective round has been dealt.

(d) All wagers at blackjack shall be made by placing gaming chips on the appropriate areas of the "21 + 3" layout.

(e) After each round of play is complete, the dealer shall collect all losing wagers and pay off all winning wagers. All winning wagers made in accordance with these rules shall be paid at odds of one to one with the exception of a blackjack which shall be paid at odds of three to two.

(f) Once the first card of any hand has been removed from the shoe by the dealer, no player shall handle, remove or alter any wagers that have been made until a decision has been rendered and implemented with respect to that wager except as permitted by these rules.

(g) Once a wager on the insurance line, a wager to double down, or a wager to split pairs has been made and

confirmed by the dealer, no player shall handle, remove or alter such wagers until a decision has been rendered and implemented with respect to that wager except as permitted by these regulations.

(h) A double down wager shall win if the total of the player's cards exceeds the total of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total of twenty-one (21). A double down wager shall push if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are equal. A double down wager shall lose if the total of the player's cards exceeds twenty-one (21) or is less than the total of the dealer's cards. A double down wager shall be paid at the rate of one to one on both the original wager and the double down portion of the wager. A player may double down after splitting pairs.

(i) A split bet shall win if the total of the player's cards exceeds the total of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total of twenty-one (21). A split bet shall lose if the total of the player's cards exceeds twenty-one (21) or is less than the total of the dealer's cards. A split bet shall push if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are equal. A split bet shall be paid at the rate of one to one on both the original wager and the split wager.

(j) The following describes a list of the permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win or loss for three-card wagers:

(1) An optional three-card wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area on the table layout designated for the three-card wager. The player must make an original blackjack wager in order to place the three-card wager. The minimum and maximum three-card wager will be posted at the table. The three card wager cannot exceed the player's original blackjack wager.

(2) An additional three-card wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(3) A three-card wager will win if the dealer's card dealt face up and the player's original two cards combined equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush.

(4) A three-card wager will lose if the dealer's card dealt face up and the player's original two cards combined do not equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush.

(5) Winning three-card wagers will be paid out as follows:

(A) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's card dealt face up combined equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or a straight flush, the hand will be paid at the rate of 9 to 1.

(B) All three-card wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)

111-301-44. Play. (a) After the cards have been shuffled, the dealer shall offer the stack of cards to a player to be cut. The player may cut the cards by placing a cutting card provided by the dealer at a random place in the stack of cards.

(b) At the commencement of each round of play, the dealer shall, starting on the dealer's left and continuing around the table, deal the cards in the following order:

(1) One card face upwards to each box on the table layout in which a wager is contained;

(2) One card face down to the dealer;
(3) A second card face upwards to each box in which a wager is contained; and

(4) A second card face down to the dealer at which time the dealer's first card shall be turned face up and placed on top of the dealer's second card.

(c) After two cards have been dealt to each player and the appropriate number to the dealer, the dealer shall, beginning from his left, announce the score of each player's hand. The score is determined by adding the point total of all cards in the hand. As each player's score is announced, such player shall indicate whether the player wishes to double down, split pairs, stand or draw.

(d) As each player indicates the player's decision(s), the dealer shall deal face upwards whatever additional cards, if any, which are necessary to effectuate such decision.

(e) After the decision(s) of each player have been implemented and all additional cards have been dealt, the dealer shall turn the dealer's second card face upward. Any additional cards authorized to be dealt to the hand of the dealer shall be dealt face upwards after which the dealer shall announce the dealer's score.

(f) If the dealer has a blackjack, no additional cards shall be dealt and each player's wager shall be settled.

(g) Payment of blackjack shall be made as follows:

(1) If the first card dealt face up to the dealer is a 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, or 9 and a player has a blackjack, the dealer shall immediately announce and pay the blackjack at odds of 3 to 2 and shall remove that player's cards before any player receives a third card. If the first card dealt face up to the dealer is an ace, king, queen, jack or 10 and a player has a blackjack, the dealer shall announce the blackjack but shall make no payment nor remove any cards until all other cards are dealt to the players and the dealer receives the dealer's second card. If, in such circumstances, the dealer's second card does not give the dealer a blackjack, the player having a blackjack shall immediately be paid at odds of 3 to 2. If the dealer's second card gives the dealer a blackjack, the wager of the player having a blackjack shall be void and constitute a push.

(2) Whenever the first card dealt to the dealer is an ace, each player shall have the right to make an insurance bet which, except as otherwise provided herein, shall win if the dealer's second card is a king, queen, jack or 10 and shall lose if the dealer's second card is an ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, or 9. An insurance bet may be made by placing on the insurance line of the layout an amount not more than half the amount staked on the player's initial wager, except that a player may bet an amount in excess of half the initial wager to the next unit that can be wagered in chips, when because of the limitation of the value of chip denominations, half the initial wager cannot be bet. All winning insurance wagers shall be paid at odds of 2 to 1. All insurance wagers shall be collected or paid by the dealer immediately after the dealer draws the dealer's second card that is dealt face up or discloses the dealer's card that was dealt face down, and before the dealer draws any additional cards.

(3) Except for a blackjack, a player may elect to double down, which means to make an additional wager not in excess of the amount of the player's original wager on the first two cards dealt to the player on the condition that one and only one additional card shall be dealt to the hand on which the player has elected to double down. If

a dealer obtains a blackjack after a player doubles down, the dealer shall only collect the amount of the original wager of such player and shall not collect the additional amount wagered in doubling down. Upon a player's election to double down, the dealer shall deal the player's hand one additional card face upwards or sideways on the layout. In the alternative, if the one additional card is dealt face down, such card shall be turned face upward after the dealer has drawn additional cards to the dealer's hand and at such time as all players' wagers are to be settled at the conclusion of the round of play. A double down wager shall win if the score of the player's cards exceeds the score of the dealer's cards without exceeding a score of twenty-one (21). A double down wager shall push if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are equal in score. A double down wager shall lose if the score of the player's cards exceeds twenty-one (21) or is less than the score of the dealer's cards. A double down wager shall be paid at the rate of 1:1 on both the original wager and the double down portion of the wager.

(h) If the initial two cards dealt to a player are identical in rank, the player may elect to split the hand into two separate hands provided that the player makes a wager on the second hand so formed in an amount equal to the player's original wager. When a player splits pairs, the dealer shall deal a card to and complete the player's decisions with respect to the first incomplete hand on the dealer's left before proceeding to deal any cards to any other hand. After a second card is dealt to a split pair, the dealer shall announce the score of such hand and the player shall indicate the player's decision to stand or draw with respect thereto except that:

(1) A player may split pairs a maximum of three times to make a total of four hands; and,

(2) A player splitting aces shall only have one card dealt to each ace and may not elect to receive additional cards.

(i) A player may elect to draw one or more additional cards whenever the player's score is less than 21 except that:

(1) A player electing to double down shall draw one and only one additional card;

(2) A player splitting aces shall only have one card dealt to each ace and may not elect to receive additional cards.

(j) A dealer shall draw additional cards to his or her hand until he or she has:

(1) A hard total score of 17, 18, 19, 20 or 21, whichever comes first; or

(2) A soft total score of 18, 19, 20 or 21, whichever comes first.

A dealer shall draw no additional cards to his or her hand, regardless of the point count, if decisions have been made on all players' hands and the point count of the dealer's hand will have no effect on the outcome of the round of play. A split bet shall win if the score of the player's cards exceeds the total of the dealer's cards without exceeding a score of twenty-one (21). A split bet shall lose if the score of the player's cards exceeds twenty-one (21) or is less than the score of the dealer's cards. A split bet shall push if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are equal in score. A split bet shall be paid at the rate of 1:1 on both the original wager and the split wager.

(k) A card found turned face upwards in the shoe shall not be used in the game and shall be placed in the discard rack.

(continued)

(l) A card drawn in error without its face being exposed shall be used as though it were the next card from the shoe.

(m) If the dealer has a score of 17 and accidentally draws a card for the dealer, such card shall be burned (discarded).

(n) If the dealer misses dealing the dealer's first or second card to the dealer, the dealer shall continue dealing

the first two cards to each player, and then deal the appropriate number of cards to the dealer. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-16-12, April 11, 2012.)
