The Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund announces the release of a request for proposals (RFP) through the Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) Program. The RFP opportunity is to assist communities to fund targeted direct-service strategies that will reduce the likelihood of abuse and neglect and increase the likelihood of children having safe, stable and nurturing relationships in their families and communities. Pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 16-207, the maximum effective rate of interest per annum for notes secured by all real estate mortgages and contracts for deed for real estate (except where the note or contract for deed permits adjustment of the interest rate, the term of the loan or the amortization schedule) executed during the period of June 1, 2013 through June 30, 2013, is 4.93 percent.

Effective July 1, 2013, the provisions of K.S.A. 16-207 are revised. The floating cap is removed on the interest rate charged for first real estate mortgage loans and contracts for deed to real estate, and the obligation is removed of the secretary of state to publish notice of the maximum effective rate of interest per annum for notes secured by all real estate mortgages and contracts for deed to real estate. The parties will be subject to continuing law which provides a rate that cannot exceed 15.0 percent per annum, unless otherwise specifically authorized by law.

The South Central Kansas Economic Development District (SCKEDD) in Wichita administers the federally funded Kansas Weatherization Assistance Program in a 13-county region in south central Kansas. SCKEDD is in the process of identifying all potential vendors and contractors for the upcoming 2013 Program Year.

Vendors are needed who supply the following materials: cellulose, mechanical fan kits that meet ASHRAE 62.2 requirements for weatherization, HVAC equipment and general construction materials.

A contractor is needed that is a licensed electrician capable of adding dedicated electrical circuits for furnaces and installing mechanical ventilation systems per ASH-RAE 62.2 standards. Fan kits will be provided by SCKEDD.

SCKEDD also is seeking one contractor that can perform weatherization work in the following counties with SCKEDD's estimated number of units in parenthesis: Barber (2), Chautauqua (1), Cowley (13), Elk (1), Harper (2), Kingman (3), McPherson (10), Pratt (3), Reno (23), Rice (3), Sedgwick (175), Stafford (1) and Sumner (8). Because SCKEDD employs weatherization crews, only the work that can't be performed in-house will be contracted out. Weatherization work includes performing air sealing, repairing broken windows, adding weather-strips to exterior doors, installing plastic vapor barriers in crawl spaces, insulating foundation walls and floors using fiberglass batting material, installing dense pack blown cellulose insulation in exterior walls, installing roof vents and insulating attics with blown cellulose. Mobile home weatherization work includes repairing duct work systems and installing blown fiberglass insulation into bellies, walls and roof cavities. Work will be performed on single-family dwellings and mobile homes. All weatherization contractors will be responsible for complying with the EPA's Renovation Repair and Painting (RRP) regulations as enforced by KDHE in Kansas. KDHE and Kansas weatherization requires all licensed firms to employ only certified renovators to perform weatherization work.

Contractor requirements include, but are not limited to:

- OSHA 10/30 certification
- Capability to be licensed in all municipalities served by SCKEDD weatherization
- RRP renovation firms licensed with KDHE
- All workers licensed as RRP renovators with KDHE
- All workers have completed LSWP training provided by the U.S. Department of Energy

Contracts will be offered until March 31, 2014, with an option to extend the contract for up to three additional one-year periods at the discretion of SCKEDD and the approval of the Kansas Housing Resources Corporation.

A mandatory bidder's conference will take place to answer all questions regarding the distributed bid packets. If you are unable to attend in person, teleconference ca-

pabilities will be provided. The bid sheets provided will require contractors and vendors to provide line-item prices by county for all items listed above. Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Waste Management (BWM), will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, August 6, in Room 530, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed new solid waste regulations K.A.R. 28-29-1600 through 28-29-1608 concerning land-spreading of drilling waste. In anticipation of increased horizontal drilling activity in Kansas, K.S.A. 65-3407c was amended to allow land-spreading of solid waste generated by drilling oil and gas wells with the approval of the Kansas Corporation Commission (KCC). A summary of the proposed regulations, environmental benefit and estimated economic impact follows.

Summary of Regulations:

K.A.R. 28-29-1600. Land-spreading; definitions and adoptions. This regulation defines terms that are used in K.A.R. 28-29-1601 through 28-29-1608 and adopts documents that are referenced in these regulations.

K.A.R. 28-29-1601. Land-spreading; general requirements. This regulation contains general information about the size of the disposal area, the time period, and the waste that will be covered by a single land-spreading application.

K.A.R. 28-29-1602. Land-spreading; application. This regulation describes in detail the certifications, maps, analyses and other information that must be included in a land-spreading application. The application fee is set in K.S.A. 65-3407c.

K.A.R. 28-29-1603. Land-spreading; sampling and analysis of soils. This regulation establishes the sampling procedures and the analytical requirements for determining the chloride concentration and the soil characteristics of the land-spreading site.

K.A.R. 28-29-1604. Land-spreading; conditions for **disposal.** Describes the criteria that must be met in order for the KCC to approve a land-spreading application. As required by K.S.A. 65-3407c(8), the regulation states that the application will not be approved if the water table is less than 10 feet below the surface, if there is documented groundwater contamination, or if less than three years have passed since the previous land-spreading occurred at the site. In addition, this regulation requires the following: the drilling mud must be water-based; the predicted radioactivity level from naturally occurring radioactive material (NORM) must be no more than 1.5 times the highest NORM level found in drilling waste samples collected from Kansas wells and no more than 370 Bq/kg (10 pCi/g); the chloride concentration in the soil must be less than 300 parts per million (ppm) if the disposal site has previously been used for land-spreading and less than 500 ppm if the disposal site has not previously been used for land-spreading; and the chloride concentration of any irrigation water must be less than 350 ppm. This regulation also establishes buffer zones and describes the topographic and soil profile criteria that must be met.

K.A.R. 28-29-1605. Land-spreading; sampling and analysis of drilling waste. This regulation establishes the sampling procedures and the analytical requirements for determining the chloride concentration of the drilling waste.

K.A.R. 28-29-1606. Land-spreading; determination of land-spreading rates. This regulation describes the procedures that must be followed to determine the amount of drilling waste that may be disposed of at a land-spreading site, based on the chloride concentrations of the soil and the drilling waste. The chloride concentration in the soil after land-spreading occurs must be no more than 900 ppm. The thickness of the drilling waste after it is spread may be no more than two inches.

K.A.R. 28-29-1607. Land-spreading; operating and management requirements. This regulation establishes the requirements for managing and land-spreading the drilling waste at the disposal site, including corrective measures, if required, and land restoration.

K.A.R. 28-29-1608. Land-spreading; reporting and record-keeping. This regulation describes what must be included in the land-spreading reports and which records must be kept by the operator.

Environmental Benefit:

Historically, drilling waste has been disposed of in onsite pits or hauled to landfills. But land-spreading of drilling waste can improve the tilth of certain soils and avoid some of the problems associated with disposal of drilling waste in pits. When land-spreading is chosen as an alternative to disposal in a landfill, haul distances may be shorter, resulting in reduced air emissions, fossil fuel consumption, and road damage. These proposed amendments will help ensure that land-spreading of drilling waste is conducted in a manner that is protective of human health and the environment.

Economic Impact:

Well operators are only required to comply with these regulations if they choose to dispose of drilling waste by land-spreading rather than disposing of it in an on-site pit or in an off-site permitted landfill. Since no one is required to choose land-spreading as a disposal method, there are no capital costs or annual costs associated with complying with these regulations. In many cases, the operator will save money by choosing this method.

KCC will be the lead agency for implementing and enforcing these regulations, with technical and/or enforcement support from KDHE as needed. No additional staff will be required to implement these regulations beyond staff added by KCC in response to the increase in horizontal drilling and hydraulic fracturing.

The time period between the publication of this notice and August 9 serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. During the hearing on August 6, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulations as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. Executive Order 13-01 Conditional and Temporary Relief from Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, severe storms accompanied by a series of major tornadoes beginning on May 18, 2013, produced an interruption of essential human services, and potential dangers to and loss of human life and will require public and private response to provide immediate emergency assistance and continuing emergency relief to individual persons and businesses in affected areas in Oklahoma, including in and around Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, a Declaration of Regional Emergency has been declared by the Field Administrator, Southern Service Center of the FMCSA, in accordance with Title 49 C.F.R 390.23, the requirements contained in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Title 49 C.F.R. Parts 390-399 were suspended through the duration of the motor carrier's assistance in the disaster relief efforts: and

WHEREAS, conditions exists which require the operation of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles for the purposes of providing direct assistance to supplement State and local efforts in the restoration of services and relief in the affected area(s) of the State of Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby ac-

knowledge a state of emergency exists in Oklahoma and declare it necessary to assist and expedite all disaster recovery efforts. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Oklahoma in this emergency situation, I hereby order the temporary suspension of the following as they apply to motor vehicles:

- 1. This declaration applies to motor carriers providing direct assistance to supplement State and local efforts in Oklahoma.
- 2. The registration and fuel tax permits as enforced by the Kansas Department of Revenue are temporarily suspended; and
- 3. Participating motor carriers must still obtain the requisite over-dimension/overweight permits as required by the Kansas Department of Transportation prior to operating; however the fees associated with these permits are temporarily waived. Additionally motor carriers and persons participating in restoration and recovery efforts will receive priority service.
- 4. The licensing, certification and permitting rules and regulations as required by the Kansas Corporation Commission are temporarily suspended; and
- 5. Participating motor carriers shall not operate during the period beginning 30 minutes after sunset and ending 30 minutes before sunrise, and shall comply with the flags, signs and lighting requirements applicable to overwidth vehicles as set forth in 8-1902; and
- 6. Participating motor carriers are not allowed to drive during inclement weather conditions. Oversize or overweight loads shall not be transported when visibility is less than one-half mile, or when conditions of moderate to heavy rain, sleet, snow, fog, or smoke exist, or when highway surfaces are slippery due to ice, packed snow.
- 7. Nothing contained in this declaration shall be constructed as an exemption from the controlled substances and alcohol use and testing requirements (49 CFR Part 382), the commercial driver's license requirements (49 CFR Part 383), the financial responsibility (insurance) requirements (49 CFR Part 387), or any other portion of the regulations not specifically defined.

FURTHER, I direct that this executive order shall become effective immediately and shall continue in effect until the expiration of the Declaration of Regional Emergency issued by the FMCSA expires as defined in 49 CFR 390.5, or 15 days (10:00 a.m. EDT, June 5, 2013) whichever is less.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 13-01 and shall become effective immediately.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 16.—FLEX ACCOUNT

- **5-16-1. Definitions.** The terms and definitions in this regulation shall apply to this article and to K.S.A. 82a-736, and amendments thereto, unless the context clearly requires otherwise. (a) "Subdivision or subdivisions of the place of use for the base water right" means one or more portions of the authorized place of use under the base water right that are identifiable and completely circumscribed by the boundaries of place of use for the base water right.
- (b) "Water conservation" means conservation by means of actual physical changes in a water distribution system or management practices that improve water use efficiency, which shall include one or more of the following:
- (1) Conversion from flood irrigation to center pivot irrigation with a nozzle package designed to improve water use efficiency;
 - (2) conversion to subsurface drip irrigation;
- (3) removal of an end gun, resulting in a significant reduction in the number of irrigated acres; or
- (4) enrollment of the base water right in the water right conservation program, the conservation reserve program, or any other multiyear water conservation program approved by the chief engineer. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 82a-736; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended Jan. 6, 2006; amended, T-5-8-29-11, Aug. 29, 2011; amended Dec. 16, 2011; amended June 21, 2013.)
- **5-16-2.** (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 82a-708a(d), as amended by L. 2002, Ch. 181, § 21; effective Oct. 11, 2002; revoked June 21, 2013.)
- **5-16-3.** Establishing a multiyear flex account. (a) A multiyear flex account shall be established by filing an application for a multiyear flex account and a term permit on a form prescribed by the chief engineer. Each application shall meet the following requirements:
- (1) Except as specified in subsection (e), a separate application shall be filed for each water right and each point of diversion for which the owner desires to establish a multiyear flex account. Each application shall be accompanied by the appropriate filing fee;
- (2) be date-stamped showing the date the application was filed with the chief engineer;
- (3) indicate the five consecutive calendar years that are to be designated as the multiyear flex account period; and
- (4) indicate whether the multiyear flex account period will commence with the year in which the application is made if filed before October 1, or with the next calendar year after the calendar year in which the application is filed.
- (b) Before any application to establish a multiyear flex account and a term permit will be accepted for filing, the

application shall be signed by at least one owner of the water right or an authorized agent of an owner of the water right.

- (c) Before the multiyear flex account can be established or the term permit approved, all of the water rights owners, or an authorized agent of the owners, shall verify upon oath or affirmation that the statements contained in the application are true and complete.
- (d) If one or more owners refuse to sign the application or if a written request is filed by one or more of the owners to withdraw their signatures from the application before the application is approved, the application shall be dismissed.
- (e) A single application to establish a multiyear flex account and apply for a term permit shall be filed in the following situations:
- (1) Multiple water rights authorize the diversion of water from a single point of diversion that diverts water to an identical place of use.
- (2) Multiple points of diversion are authorized by the chief engineer to divert water through a single water flowmeter before going to an identical place of use.
- (f) The multiyear flex account shall not be established and the term permit to exercise the multiyear flex account shall not be valid until both have been approved by the chief engineer. - **5-16-4.** Conditions on the term permit. (a) The place of use authorized by a term permit shall be identical to the place or places of use authorized by the base water right or rights or a subdivision or subdivisions of the place of use for the base water right.
- (b) The types of use authorized by a term permit shall be limited to the types of use authorized by the base water right or rights.
- (c) The rate of diversion authorized by a term permit shall not exceed the maximum instantaneous rate of diversion authorized by the base water right or rights. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 82a-736; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended June 21, 2013.)
- **5-16-5.** (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 82a-736, as amended by L. 2011, ch. 89, sec. 28; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended Jan. 6, 2006; amended, T-5-8-29-11, Aug. 29, 2011; amended Dec. 16, 2011; revoked June 21, 2013.)
- **5-16-6.** Multiyear flex accounts and term permits. (a) The duration of the multiyear flex account and term permit shall be five consecutive calendar years.
- (b) If water use records for a base water right are inadequate to accurately determine actual water use during any calendar year in the period used to determine the base average usage, then the actual water use for that calendar year shall be deemed to be zero.
- (c) There shall be no carryover of unused quantities of water from one multiyear flex account or term permit to another multiyear flex account or term permit.
- (d) No multiyear flex account shall be allowed if the multiyear flex account is inconsistent with the provisions

- of any intensive groundwater use control area created pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1036 through K.S.A. 82a-1040, and amendments thereto, or any local enhanced management area created pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1041, and amendments thereto.
- (e) Water flowmeters shall be required under all multiyear flex account term permits and shall meet all of the following requirements:
- (1) A water flowmeter meeting the requirements of the chief engineer shall be installed on each point of diversion authorized by the base water right.
- (2) Each water flowmeter and the measuring chamber shall be sealed to the diversion works in a manner to ensure that the flowmeter and the measuring chamber can not be removed and reinstalled without breaking the seal.
- (3) Each water flowmeter register shall be sealed in a manner to ensure that the register can not be manipulated without breaking the seal.
- (4) Each replacement of a water flowmeter during the duration of a multiyear flex account shall be equipped with an anti-reverse-flow mechanism.
- (f) Only an entire water right, or a portion of a water right that has been formally divided, may be deposited in a multiyear flex account. Nothing in this subsection shall prevent a multiyear flex account term permit from authorizing a subdivision of the place of use for the base water right as the place of use for the multiyear flex account.
- (g) All water diverted pursuant to a term permit and the base water rights associated with the term permit shall be counted against the quantity of water deposited in the multiyear flex account. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 82a-736; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended June 21, 2013.)
- **5-16-7.** Conditions under which a base water right may be exercised. Each term permit approved by the chief engineer pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-736, and amendments thereto, shall include the condition that if the term permit can no longer be exercised because of an order issued by the chief engineer, including an intensive groundwater use control area order, a minimum desirable streamflow order, or an order to administer water rights to prevent impairment, then any base water right may be exercised to the extent that all of the following conditions are met: (a) The base water right is in priority, including priority with respect to any established minimum desirable streamflow.
- (b) The annual quantity of water authorized by the base water right has not been diverted during that calendar year.
- (c) The five-year quantity authorized by the term permit has not been completely used.
- (d) The use of water under the base water right does not impair water rights senior to the base water right. (Authorized by K.S.A. 82a-706a; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 82a-736; effective Oct. 11, 2002; amended June 21, 2013.)
