Reconstruction of the upstream wave erosion berm, removal of existing principal spillway works, install 48-inch reinforced concrete riser, install 50 feet PVC pipe 4-inch diameter drawdown, 167 cubic yards excavation, 1,500 cubic yards earthfill, 980 feet of new fence, and 0.4 acre of seeding and mulching.

The fee schedule establishes the maximum fees for medical, surgical, hospital, dental, nursing, vocational rehabilitation or any other treatment or services provided or ordered by health care providers and ren-

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a proposed Kansas Water Pollution Control Permit, A-LAMP-B005, for Brad Klaassen's facility, located near Canton, Kansas. The proposed permit is for a new facility with the maximum capacity for 999 head (999 animal units) of cattle weighing greater than 700 pounds. The proposed facility consists of approximately 7.1 acres of open lot pens and 1.7 acres of feed storage area. Surface runoff will flow across proposed vegetated buffer areas. The facility is located in the NW/4 of Section 1, Township 20 South, Range 1 West in McPherson County, Kansas. A notice in the Kansas Register dated June 27, 2013, informed the public of the availability of the proposed water pollution control permit for Brad Klaassen.

In conformance with K.A.R. 28-16-61, a public hearing on the proposed permit has been scheduled at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, September 12, at the Canton Community Center Building, 100 W. McPherson, Canton.

The requested modification to expand the landfill would increase its permitted disposal area from 8.5 to 13.7 acres and increase its permitted disposal volume from 324,000 cubic yards to 604,000 cubic yards. The proposed landfill expansion would be constructed and operated in conformance with state solid waste regulations and accept only waste tires as defined by Kansas statutes. 99-25-1. Adoption by reference, exceptions; availability of copies. (a) The document titled "specifications, tolerances, and other technical requirements for weighing and measuring devices, as adopted by the 96th national conference on weights and measures 2011," published by the national institute of standards and technology (NIST), Gaithersburg, MD, as the 2012 edition of NIST handbook 44, is hereby adopted by reference, with the following exceptions:

- (1) Section 3.31.UR.2.2;

- (b) The adopted portions of NIST handbook 44 shall apply to commercial, data-gathering, and weighing and measuring devices in the state.

- **99-25-9.** Adoption by reference. Except as specified in subsection (c), the following uniform regulations published by the national institute of standards and technology (NIST), Gaithersburg, MD, in the 2012 edition of NIST handbook 130, titled "uniform laws and regulations in the areas of legal metrology and engine fuel quality, as adopted by the 96th national conference on weights and measures 2011," are hereby adopted by reference and shall apply to weighing and measuring devices in the state: (a) "Uniform packaging and labeling regulation";
- (b) "uniform regulation for the method of sale of commodities"; and
- (c) "uniform engine fuels and automotive lubricants regulation," except for the following sections:
 - (1) 2.1.2, which caps ethanol at 10 percent;
- (2) 2.15, which pertains to the testing standard for B100 biodiesel:
- (3) 2.16, which pertains to the testing standard for biodiesel blends; and

- (1) The minimum octane of the product as determined by the (R+M)/2 method;
- (2) for diesel fuel, the grade, minimum flash point, and American petroleum institute gravity of the product;
 - (3) the terminal of origin of the product;
 - (4) the destination of the product;

- (5) the name of the wholesaler, if different from the distributor or point of origin;
 - (6) the quantity of each type of product delivered;
- (7) the percentage of ethanol if more than one percent; and
- (8) the percentage of biodiesel fuel if more than one percent.
- (b) The information required in subsection (a) shall be provided to the purchaser in writing.

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

- **111-4-3272.** "Bonus Crossword" instant ticket lottery game number 550. (a) The Kansas lottery may conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Bonus Crossword." The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-3272.
- (b) The "play symbols" for this game are as follows: A B C D E F G H I J K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z. There are no "play symbol captions" in this game.
- (c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 18 play spots within the "YOUR LETTERS" play area, in each of two play spots within the "BONUS" play area, and a variable number of times within the crossword puzzle grid.
- (d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149.
- (e) The price of instant tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$2.00 each.
- (f) "Bonus Crossword" consists of three play areas. In the upper part of the ticket there is a crossword puzzle grid that contains 11 spaces (height) by 11 spaces (width) covered by transparent latex. In the "YOUR LETTERS" play area, located in the lower part of the ticket, there are 18 letters located under opaque latex. To the right of the "YOUR LETTERS" play area is the "BONUS" play area in which there are two letters covered by opaque latex. Imaged around each of the 18 "YOUR LETTERS" and two "BONUS" letters there will be a four-sided box composed of solid lines. A player will remove the latex from the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BONUS" play areas one letter at a time, and then for each matching letter in the crossword puzzle grid scratch off the transparent latex. Each letter revealed in the "YOUR LETTERS" and "BO-NUS" play areas may be used an unlimited number of times in the crossword puzzle grid. If a player reveals at least three complete words in the crossword puzzle grid,

- the player wins the corresponding prize in the prize legend. The prize legend on the front of the ticket indicates prizes won for number of words revealed.
- (g) To qualify as a complete word to win a prize in this game, the words revealed must meet the following requirements:
 - (1) must contain at least three letters;
- (2) cannot be formed diagonally, run right to left or from bottom to top;
- (3) must appear in an unbroken horizontal or vertical string of letters in the "crossword" puzzle;
- (4) an unbroken string of letters cannot be interrupted by a black space and must contain every single letter square between two black spaces;
- (5) every single letter in the unbroken string must be revealed in "YOUR LETTERS," or "BONUS" areas and be included to form a word; and
- (6) the three small letters outside the squares in the "YOUR LETTERS" area are for validation purposes and cannot be used to play "Bonus Crossword."

- (A) Wager placed by a player prior to receiving his or her initial two cards in the area designated for the ante.
 - (B) Winning ante wagers will be paid 1 to 1.
- (C) The ante wager will win if the dealer's hand contains a pair or higher and the player's hand consists of any combination of cards ranking higher than the dealer's hand.
 - (D) The ante wager will lose if:
 - (i) The player forfeits, or
- (ii) The dealer's hand contains a pair or higher and the player's hand consists of any combination of cards ranking lower than the dealer's hand.
 - (E) The ante wager will push or tie if:
- (i) The dealer's hand does not contain a pair or higher, or
 - (ii) The player's hand is equivalent to the dealer's hand.
- (F) An additional ante wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.
 - (2) Blind wager:
- (A) Wager placed by a player prior to receiving his initial two cards in area designated for the blind. The blind wager must be equal to the ante wager.
 - (B) Winning blind wagers will be paid as follows:
 - (i) Royal flush, 500 to 1;
 - (ii) Straight flush, 50 to 1;
 - (iii) Four-of-a-kind, 10 to 1;
 - (iv) Full house, 3 to 1;
 - (v) Flush, 3 to 2;
 - (vi) Straight, 1 to 1.
- (C) The blind wager will win if the player's hand consists of any combination of cards ranking higher than the dealer's hand and consists of a straight or higher.
 - (D) The blind wager will lose if:
 - (i) The player forfeits (folds), or
- (ii) The player's hand consists of any combination of cards ranking lower than the dealer's hand.
 - (E) The blind wager will push or tie if:
- (i) The player's hand is equivalent to the dealer's hand, or
- (ii) The player's hand beats the dealer's hand but does not consist of a straight or higher.
- (G) An additional blind wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.
 - (3) Play wager:
- (A) An additional optional wager placed by a player in area designated for the play. A player must have an ante wager and a blind wager to place a play wager. The amount of the play wager must be three or four times the ante if betting before the flop (the first three community cards) is exposed. The amount of the play wager must be two times the ante if betting after the flop but before the remaining community cards are exposed. The amount of the play wager must be one times the ante if betting after all community cards have been exposed.
 - (B) Winning play wagers will be paid 1 to 1.
- (C) The play wager will win if the player's hand consists of any combination of cards ranking higher than the dealer's hand.
- (D) The play wager will lose if the player's hand consists of a combination of cards ranking lower than the dealer's hand.

- (E) The play wager will tie or push if the player's hand consists of a combination of cards equivalent to the dealer's hand.
- (F) An additional play wager may be made as a tip for the dealer if the dealer has an ante wager and a blind wager.
 - (4) Trips wager:
- (A) An optional wager placed by a player prior to the player receiving his initial two cards in an area designated for the trips. In order to place a trips wager, a player must also have placed an ante wager and a blind wager.
 - (B) Winning trips wagers will be paid as follows:
 - (i) Royal flush, 50 to 1;
 - (ii) Straight flush, 40 to 1;
 - (iii) Four-of-a-kind, 30 to 1;
 - (iv) Full house, 8 to 1;
 - (v) Flush, 7 to 1;
 - (vi) Straight, 4 to 1;
 - (vii) Three-of-a-kind, 3 to 1.
- (C) The trips wagers will lose if the player's best five card poker hand is any combination of cards not listed above.
- (D) An additional trips wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.
 - (5) Progressive wager:
- (A) Players may participate in the optional progressive jackpot by placing a \$1 chip in the designated area. The progressive bet is considered a side wager and the dealer's hand has no bearing on the progressive bet's outcome. The player must have an ante wager to make a progressive bet.
- (B) The progressive jackpot will be comprised of a base amount of \$10,000.
- (C) The amount of the progressive jackpot will be displayed in a manner visible to players.
- (D) Winning progressive bets will be paid at the rate of:
- (i) If the player's hand consists of three-of-a-kind, 9 to 1.
 - (ii) If the players hand consists of a straight, 30 to 1.
 - (iii) If the player's hand consists of a flush, 40 to 1.
- (iv) If the player's hand consists of a full house, 50 to 1;
- (v) If the player's hand consists of four-of-a-kind, 300 to 1;
- (vi) If the player's hand consists of a straight flush, 10% of the progressive jackpot;
- (vii) If the player's hand consists of a royal flush, 100% of the progressive jackpot.
- (E) A progressive bet will win if the player's hand consists of a three-of-a-kind, straight, flush, full house, four-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a royal flush.
- (6) Winning progressive bets will be paid in the following manner:
- (A) If the winning hand consists of a three-of-a-kind, straight, flush, full house, or four-of-a-kind, the dealer will make the appropriate payout.
- (B) If the winning hand consists of a straight flush or a royal flush, the table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official will verify the winning hand and will verify the progressive bet was made. The table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official will notify the

- table games pit manager. Surveillance will also be notified to verify the winning hand. Upon completion of the notifications and verification of the winning hand as set forth herein, the table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official shall direct the appropriate payout to be made to the player holding the winning hand.
- (i) The dealer will verify the deck of cards by counting down and sorting the remaining cards by suit.
- (ii) Once the jackpot has been deducted from the progressive jackpot for the winning hand of a straight flush or royal flush, new cards will be placed on the table and play will resume.

 - (iii) Four-of-a-kind, 40 to 1;
 - (iv) Full house, 10 to 1;
 - (v) Flush, 6 to 1;
 - (vi) Straight, 4 to 1;
 - (vii) Three-of-a-kind, 3 to 1;
 - (viii) Two pair, 2 to 1;
 - (ix) Pair of jacks or higher ranking hand, 1 to 1.
- (C) The fifth street wager will win if the player's five card hand contains a pair of jacks or higher ranking hand.

- (E) The fifth street wager will push (tie) if the player's five card hand contains a pair of 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s or 10s.
- (F) An additional fifth street wager may be made as a tip for the dealer if the dealer has an ante wager.
 - (5) Progressive:
- (A) Players may participate in the optional progressive jackpot by placing a \$1 chip in the designated area. The player must have an ante wager to make a progressive bet.
- (B) The progressive jackpot will be comprised of a base amount of \$10,000.
- (C) The amount of the progressive jackpot will be displayed in a manner visible to patrons.
- (Ď) Winning progressive bets will be paid at the rate of:
- (i) If the player's hand consists of a three of a kind, 9 for 1.
 - (ii) If the players hand consists of a straight, 30 for 1.
 - (iii) If the player's hand consists of a flush, 40 for 1.
- (iv) If the player's hand consists of a full house, 50 for 1.

- (iv) In the event of multiple winning progressive hands consisting of Straight Flush or Royal Flush, the jackpot will be determined by whoever received their hand first according to the time on surveillance video at the lottery gaming facility.
- (C) A progressive bet will lose if the player's hand consists of any combination of cards other than a three-of-a-kind, straight, flush, full house, four-of-a-kind, straight flush, or a royal flush.
 - (7) Envy bonus:
- (A) Players who wager \$1 on the progressive bet qualify for the envy bonus.
- (i) Only the seated player for a position qualifies for the envy bonus.
- (ii) If two players have an envy bonus jackpot, the players are paid on both hands.
- (iii) The position which contains the qualifying envy bonus hand (royal flush or straight flush) cannot win the envy bonus.
 - (B) The envy bonus payouts are as follows:
 - (i) Royal flush, \$1,000;
- (ii) Straight flush, \$300. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-5-31-13, May 15, 2013.)
- **111-401-95.** Wagers and payout odds. (a) Minimum and maximum wagers will be posted on a sign at each table.
- (b) Maximum table payouts, if any, will be posted at each table and will not be less than the maximum bet times the maximum odds.
- (c) If a player has been permitted to wager less than the table minimum, the dealer will take or pay the amount actually wagered. - (D) Winning progressive bets will be paid at the rate
- (i) If the player's hand consists of a three of a kind, 9 for 1.

- (B) An additional ante bet may be made as a tip for the dealer.
 - (C) Payout odds on winning ante bets will be:
- (i) If the player decides to continue by adding an additional play bet in an amount equal to the original ante bet, winning ante bets will be paid odds at the rate of 1
- (ii) A bonus payout will be paid if the player's hand consists of a three card straight, 1 to 1; if the player's hand

 - (C) Payout odds on a winning play bet will be 1 to 1.
- (D) Play bets will win if the dealer's hand consists of at least a queen high or better and the player's hand consists of a combination of cards ranking higher than the dealer's hand.
- (E) Play bets will lose if the dealer's hand consists of at least a queen high or better and the player's hand consists of a combination of cards ranking lower than the dealer's hand.
 - (F) Play bets will tie or push if:
- (i) The dealer's hand consists of a combination of cards ranking lower than at least a queen high, or
- (ii) The dealer's hand consists of a combination of cards equivalent to the player's cards.
 - (4) Progressive wager:
- (A) Players may participate in the optional progressive jackpot by placing a \$1 chip in the designated area. The progressive bet is considered a side wager and the dealer's hand has no bearing on the progressive bet's outcome. The player must have an ante wager and/or a pair plus wager to make a progressive bet.
- (B) The progressive jackpot will be comprised of a base amount of \$1,000.
- (C) The amount of the progressive jackpot will be displayed in a manner visible to players.
- (D) Winning progressive bets will be paid at the rate of:
- (i) If the players hand consists of three-of-a-kind, 90 to 1.
- (ii) If the player's hand consists of a straight flush, 100 to 1.
- (iii) If the player's hand consists of an ace, king, queen suited hearts/diamonds/clubs, 500 to 1;

- (i) Only the seated player for a position qualifies for the envy bonus.

- (iv) The position which contains the qualifying envy bonus hand cannot win the envy bonus.
 - (B) The envy bonus payouts are as follows:
 - (i) Ace, king queen of spades, \$100;
- (ii) Ace, king queen suited (in the same suit) in hearts, diamonds, or clubs, \$25. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-5-31-13, May 15, 2013.)

Article 501.—SOUTH CENTRAL GAMING ZONE

111-501-44. Rules of the game and bet definitions. (a) The stickperson, boxperson, table games super-

- visor or a higher-ranking casino employee shall have the authority to invalidate a roll of the dice by calling "no roll" for any of the following reasons:
- (1) If the wrong player picks up the dice and throws or rolls them.
- (2) If the dice do not hit the end of the table opposite the shooter.
- (3) The dice do not leave the shooter's hand simultaneously.
- (4) Either or both of the dice come to rest on the chips constituting the craps bank (the chips in front of the boxperson).
- (5) Either or both of the dice come to rest in the dice bowl in front of the stickperson or on one of the rails surrounding the table.
 - (6) Either or both of the dice go off the table.
 - (7) Whenever one die comes to rest on top of the other.
- (8) The shooter does not have either a pass or don't pass bet.
- (9) Either or both of the dice do not move with forward motion.
- (10) If the player shooting the dice removes either one or both dice from the view of the boxperson or table games supervisor or higher-ranking casino official immediately before he shoots them.
- (11) If the player attempts to deface the dice purposely or unintentionally immediately before the player shoots the dice.
- (b) Whenever new dice are put into the game or existing dice are returned to the game, they shall be inspected by the boxperson before being put into the dice bowl.
 - (c) Permissible wagers shall be as follows:
- (1) "Pass bet" shall mean a wager placed on the pass line of the layout immediately prior to the come-out roll.
- (2) The "pass bet" shall win if, on the come-out roll a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a total of 7 appears.
- (3) The "pass bet" shall lose if, on the come-out roll a total of 2, 3 or 12 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is thrown again.
- (4) "Don't pass bet" shall mean a wager placed on the don't pass line of the layout immediately prior to the come-out roll.
- (5) The "don't pass bet" shall win if, on the come-out roll a total of 2 or 3 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is again thrown.
- (6) The "don't pass bet" shall lose if, on the come-out roll a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a 7 appears.
- (7) The "don't pass bet" shall be void if, on the comeout roll a total of 12 is thrown.
- (8) "Come bet" shall mean a wager placed on the come line of the layout at any time after the come-out roll.
- (9) The "come bet" shall win if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a 7 appears.

- (10) The "come bet" shall lose if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 2, 3, or 12 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is again thrown.
- (11) "Don't come bet" shall mean a wager placed on the "don't come" area of the layout at any time after the come-out roll.
- (12) The "don't come bet" shall win if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 2 or 3 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is again thrown.
- (13) The "don't come bet" shall lose if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a 7 appears.
- (14) The "don't come bet" shall be void if, on the roll following placement of such bet a total of 12 is thrown.
- (15) "Place bet to win" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time on any of the numbers 4,5,6,8,9 or 10 which shall win if the number on which wager was placed is thrown before a 7 and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before such number. All place bets shall be active on any roll, except the come-out roll, unless called "on" by the player and confirmed by the dealer through placement of an "on" button on top of such player's wager.
- (16)"Buy bets" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, on the 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10. A buy bet shall win if the particular number is thrown before a 7 is thrown and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before that number is thrown. In addition to the payout odds set forth in these rules for place bets on 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10, the player may also be offered the option of receiving true odds on these bets in return for the player paying at the time of making the bet an amount not to exceed five percent of such wager.
- (17)"Lay bets" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, against any of the numbers 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10. A lay bet shall win if a 7 is thrown before the particular number against which the wager is placed and shall lose if a particular number against which the wager is placed is thrown before a 7 is thrown. The player may also be offered true odds on these bets, for which the player may be charged a fee not to exceed five percent on the amount to be won.
- (18)"Four the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 4 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 2 appearing on each die, before a 4 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).
- (19)"Six the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 6 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 3 appearing on each die before 6 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).
- (20) "Eight the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 8 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 4 appearing on each die before 8 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).

- (21) "Ten the hardway" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 10 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 5 appearing on each die before 10 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).
- (22) "Field bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if any of the totals of 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bets and shall lose if a total of 5, 6, 7, or 8 is thrown on such a roll.
- (23) "Any seven" or "big red" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 7 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such a bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.
- (24) "Any craps" shall mean a one roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 2, 3, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.
- (25) "Two Craps," "aces," or "low" shall mean a oneroll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 2 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.
- (26) "Three Craps" or "ace-deuce" shall mean a oneroll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 3 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.
- (27) "Twelve Craps," "high," or "boxcars" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.
- (28) "Eleven" or "yo" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 11 is thrown on the next roll and shall lose if any other total is thrown.
- (29) "Horn bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 2, 3, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.
- (30) "Horn high bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if any one of the totals 2, 3, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose, if any other total is thrown. A horn high bet will be placed in units of five, with four units wagered as a horn bet and an additional unit wagered on one of the totals 2, 3, 11, or 12.
- (31) "World bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if any one of the totals 2, 3, 7, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown. A world bet shall be placed on the lower line of the any seven wager area in units of five with one unit wagered on each of the totals 2, 3, 7, 11, or 12.
- (32) "3 way craps" shall mean a one-roll wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win, if any one of the following totals 2, 3, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following the placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown. A "3 way craps" bet will

- be placed with one unit wagered on each of the totals 2, 3, or 12. The dealer shall place such a wager touching the "C" of the any craps wager area and the horn or horn high wagering area.
- (33) "Hop bet" means a one-roll wager that may be made at any time on a specific combination designated by the player which will win if the combination is thrown on a roll immediately following placement of such bet and will lose if any other combination is thrown.
- (34) "Big six" or "big 6" means a wager placed in the area of the layout marked "big six" or "big 6," which shall win if a total of 6 is thrown before a 7 and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before a 6.
- (35) "Big eight" or "big 8" means a wager placed on the area of the layout marked "big eight" or "big 8" and shall win if a total of eight is thrown before a 7, and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before an 8.
- (36) "Split bet" means a one-roll wager that is placed on the line or area between two proposition bets. One half of the split bet is being bet on each side. Both bets will be left up and a net payoff is made to the player.
- (37) "Craps-eleven" or "C and E" means a one-roll split bet on any craps and eleven.
- (38) "High-low" means a one-roll split bet aces (2) and twelve (12).
- (39) "Ace deuce any craps" means a one-roll bet which is unique because if ace deuce (3) rolls, both sides of the bet win.
- (40) "Put bets" are bets that are made directly on any number at any time, including the point, after the comeout roll has already been made. Put bets are allowed full odds as well. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-22-11, Oct. 12, 2011; amended, T-111-5-31-13, May 15, 2013.)
- **111-501-45.** Making and removal of wagers. (a) All wagers at craps shall be made by placing gaming chips on the appropriate areas of the craps layout.
 - (b) Wagers shall be made before the dice are thrown.
- (c) Wagers may be made by a player or may be made by verbal confirmation of a desired bet communicated to the dealer by the player with subsequent placement of said bet on the appropriate portion of the layout by the dealer.
- (d) A wager made on any bet may be removed or reduced at any time prior to a roll that decided the outcome of such wager except that a pass line bet and a come bet shall not be removed or reduced after a come-out point or some point is established with respect to such bet. Pass line and come bets are always active.
- (e) A don't come bet and a don't pass bet may be removed or reduced at any time but may not be replaced or increased after such removal or reduction until a new come-out roll.
- (f) All place bets, come odds and hardways shall be inactive on any come-out roll unless requested "on" by the player and confirmed by the dealer through placement of an "on" button on top of the wager. All other wagers shall be considered active unless a player requests to have his bets inactive. The dealer through placement of an "off" button must confirm this.

- (g) Minimum and maximum table limits will be posted.
- (h) If a player wagers less than the table minimum bet and the dealer does not notice it, the dealer shall take or pay the amount actually bet and instruct the player of the minimum amount that must be wagered on subsequent bets.
- (i) If in error a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the dealer shall remove the excess and return it to the player, pay the bet at the correct odds, and inform the player of the permissible amount that can be wagered on subsequent bets.
- (j) In the event of a dealer placing a bet for a player, chips shall not be taken from the player's hands or from the rack in front of the player. All chips for the bet shall be set down on the layout by the player and the dealer shall clarify the purpose of the chips before picking them up.

(l) A horn bet shall be paid as if it were four separate wagers on 2,3,11, and 12.

- (m) All charges for vigorish that are less than one dollar amounts, will be rounded down to the nearest dollar fig-
- (n) For lay bets against a 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10, a player shall receive true odds on these bets in return for the player paying at the time of making the bet a percentage of the amount the player could win on such bet, which in no event shall exceed five percent of such amount.
- (o) A lay bet against a number shall win if a seven rolls before the number is rolled.
- (p) A lay bet against a number shall lose if the number rolls before a seven is rolled.
- (q) A player may remove the player's lay bet at any time before the number or seven is rolled. If the player removes the lay bet, the amount of the vigorish will also be returned.
 - (r) Lay bets pay at the following odds:

Odds
1 to 2
2 to 3
5 to 6

- (s) Players may take odds on their pass and come bets as follows:
- (1) On a pass line point/come bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to 3 times the pass line bet.
- (2) On a pass line point/come bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to 4 times the pass line bet.
- (3) On a pass line point/come bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to 5 times the pass line bet.
- (t) Players may take odds on their put bets. Put bets are made the same way as pass line and come bets, except that put bets are placed directly on the number without going through the pass or come, as follows:
- (1) On a put bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to three times the pass line bet.
- (2) On a put bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to four times the pass line bet.
- (3) On a put bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to five times the pass line bet.
- (u) Players may lay odds on their don't pass and don't come bets up to:
- (1) 4 and 10 can lay to win 3 times the don't pass/don't come bet.
- (2) 5 and 9 can lay to win 4 times the don't pass/don't come bet.
- (3) 6 and 8 can lay to win 5 times the don't pass/don't come bet.
- (v) Minimum and maximum odds will be posted at each table. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-22-11, Oct. 12, 2011; amended, T-111-5-31-13, May 15, 2013.)
