be payable solely from amounts received from the respective borrower, the obligation of which will be sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bond when it becomes due.

All individuals who appear at the hearing will be given an opportunity to express their views concerning the proposal to issue the bond to finance the project, and all written comments previously filed with the KDFA at its offices at 555 S. Grant funds are available from the federal Sexual Assault Services Grant Program (SASP) for calendar year 2014. The purpose of SASP is to provide intervention, advocacy, accompaniment (e.g., accompanying victims to court, medical facilities, police departments, etc.), support services and related assistance for adult, youth and child victims of sexual assault, family and household members of victims, and those collaterally affected by sexual assault. This grant program recognizes the need to increase focus on sexual assault to help address the lack of available direct intervention and related assistance services and the unique aspects of sexual assault trauma. Women and men of all ages, as well as children, can be victims of sexual assault.

There is approximately \$249,400 available for grant awards. Available grant funds may be awarded to non-profit, community or faith-based organizations whose primary purpose is providing rape and sexual assault services. Priority will be given to applicants who are rape/sexual assault crisis centers providing direct intervention and related assistance to victims/survivors, and to dual programs that provide sexual assault and domestic violence services to enhance the provision of sexual assault-related direct intervention and related assistance services.

Staggered registration system.** (a) All motorized bicycles, motor vehicles, and recreational vehicles, other than apportioned registered vehicles, mobile homes, trailers, antique vehicles, trucks or truck tractors registered for a gross weight of greater than 12,000 pounds, and commercial motor vehicles as described in

K.S.A. 8-143m and amendments thereto, shall be registered annually under a staggered registration system during one of 11 registration periods. The month of expiration of the registration shall be embossed upon the number plate issued at the time of registration or shall be represented by a decal attached to the number plate in a location designated by the director.

(b) At the time of registration, the owner shall pay a prorated registration fee equal to 1/12 of the annual registration fee multiplied by the number of months remaining in the registration period, including the month of expiration. Each registration period shall expire on the last day of the month as prescribed for the alpha letter designation on the plate or decal affixed to the plate, as determined by the first letter of the owner’s surname in accordance with the following table:

**Article 5.—MULTI-STATE ONLINE GAMES AND DRAWINGS**

**111-5-181. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the Kansas lottery’s “Mega Millions” game unless the context requires a different meaning or is otherwise inconsistent with the intention of other rules adopted by the Kansas lottery.

(a) “Agent” or “retailer” means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell Kansas lottery tickets.

(b) “Drawing” means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(c) “Computer pick” means the random selection of two-digit numbers by the computer system, which appear on a ticket and are played by a player in the game.

(d) “Finance and Audit Committee” shall mean the committee established by the Multi-State Lottery Association Agreement (MUSL).

(e) “Game board” or “boards” means that area of the play slip, also known as a “panel,” which contains two sets of numbered squares to be marked by the player, the first set containing seventy-five (75) squares, number one (1) through seventy-five (75) and the second set containing fifteen (15) squares, number one (1) through fifteen (15).

(f) “Game ticket” or “ticket” means an acceptable evidence of play, which is a ticket produced by a terminal which meets the specifications defined in these rules.

(g) “Jackpot” or “Grand Prize” means the top prize of the Mega Millions game. The annuity grand prize is an amount that would be paid in thirty (30) annual installments with annual installments increasing on a graduated basis.

(h) “Mega Millions Finance Committee” means a committee of the Mega Millions lotteries which determines the grand prize jackpot amount (cash and annuity).

(i) “Mega Millions Lottery or Lotteries” means those lotteries which have joined under the Mega Millions lottery agreement; the group of lotteries that has reached a cross-selling agreement with the MUSL product group for the selling of the Mega Millions game.

(j) “MUSL” means the Multi-State Lottery Association, a government-benefit association wholly owned and operated by the party lotteries.

(k) “MUSL Board” means the governing body of the MUSL which is comprised of the chief executive officer of each party lottery.

(l) “On-Line Lottery Game” means a lottery game wherein a player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(m) “Participating Lottery” or “Selling Lottery” means a state lottery which is participating in selling the Mega Millions game.

(n) “Party lottery” means a state lottery which has joined the MUSL and, in the context of the product group rules, which has joined in selling the games offered by the MUSL Mega Millions product group.

(o) “Play” or “bet” means the six (6) numbers, the first five (5) from a field of seventy-five (75) numbers and the last one (1) from a field of fifteen (15) numbers, that appear on a ticket as a single-lettered selection and are to be played by a player in the game.

(p) “Product Group” means the group of lotteries which has joined together to offer the Mega Millions lottery game product pursuant to the terms of its cross-selling agreement with the Mega Millions lotteries, the Multi-State Lottery Agreement, and the group’s own rules.

(q) “Play slip” or “bet slip” means a card used in marking a player’s game plays and containing one or more boards.

(r) “Set Prize” means all other prizes except the grand prize that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment and, except in instances outlined in these rules, will be equal to the prize amount established by the MUSL board for the prize level.

(continued)

(q) "Terminal" means a device authorized by the Kansas lottery to function in an on-line interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets, and transmitting reports.

(r) "Ticketless transaction" shall include plays sold through non-standard terminals.

(s) "Winning numbers" means the six (6) numbers, the first five (5) from a field of seventy-five (75) numbers and the last one (1) from a field of fifteen (15) numbers, randomly selected at each drawing, which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on a game ticket.

(t) These amendments shall take effect October 22, 2013. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-29-10, Jan. 20, 2010; amended, T-111-9-1-10, Aug. 18, 2010; amended, T-111-10-11-13, Aug. 14, 2013.)

**111-5-182. Game description; retail sale of tickets.**

(a) "Mega Millions" is a five (5) out of seventy-five (75) plus one (1) out of fifteen (15) on-line lottery game, drawn on the day(s), time(s), and location(s) as determined by the Mega Millions lotteries, and which pays the grand prize, at the election of the player, made in accordance with these rules or by a default election made in accordance with these rules, either on an annual pari-mutuel basis or as a cash value option using a rate determined by the Mega Millions finance committee on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes are paid on a set cash basis.

(b) To play Mega Millions, a player shall select five (5) different numbers, from one (1) through seventy-five (75) and one (1) additional number from one (1) through fifteen (15), for input into a terminal. The additional number may be the same as one of the first five numbers selected by the player.

(c) A "Mega Millions" game ticket shall sell for one dollar.

(d) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(e) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer. The player may select a set of five numbers and one additional number by:

(1) communicating the six numbers to the retailer;

(2) marking six numbered squares in any one game board on a play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or

(3) requesting a "computer pick" or "quick pick" from the retailer.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent. A play slip shall have no pecuniary nor prize value and shall not be used as evidence of a ticket purchase or of numbers selected. A terminal produced paper receipt has no pecuniary nor prize value and shall not constitute evidence of ticket purchase or of numbers selected.

(g) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that

are printed in error. No ticket which can be used to claim a prize shall be returned to the Kansas lottery for credit. Tickets accepted by retailers as returned tickets and which cannot be re-sold shall be deemed owned by the bearer thereof.

(h) Ticket sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time on Tuesdays and Fridays and will resume at approximately 9:05 p.m. on those same days.

(i) Drawings will be conducted twice weekly, on Tuesdays and Fridays at approximately 10:00 p.m. central time (CT), after the game is closed at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time (CT) and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(j) It shall be the sole responsibility of each player to verify the accuracy of the game play or plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the lottery retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8718; effective, T-111-1-29-10, Jan. 20, 2010; amended, T-111-10-11-13, Aug. 14, 2013.)

**111-5-183. Prize pool; reserve account.** (a) The prize pool for all prize categories shall consist of up to 55.0% of each drawing period's sales, including any specific statutorily-mandated tax to be included in the price of a lottery ticket, after the prize reserve accounts are funded to the amounts set by the product group, but may be higher or lower based upon the number of winners at each prize level, as well as the funding required to meet a guaranteed annuity grand prize. Any amount remaining in the prize pool or reserves at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement game or expended in a manner as directed by the product group.

(b) An amount up to one percent (5%) of the Kansas lottery's Mega Million sales shall be added to the Kansas lottery's grand prize pool contribution and placed in trust in one or more prize pool accounts and prize reserve accounts held by the product group at any time that the prize pool accounts and Kansas lottery's share of the prize reserve account(s) is below the amounts designated by the product group. The product group, with approval of the finance and audit committee, may establish a maximum balance for the prize reserve account(s). The product group may determine to expend all or a portion of the funds in the prize pool accounts (except the grand prize pool account) and the prize reserve accounts for the purpose of indemnifying the Kansas lottery in the payment of prizes, subject to the approval of the board, and for the payment of prizes or special prizes in the game, subject to the approval of the finance and audit committee. The prize reserve shares of the Kansas lottery may be adjusted with refunds to the Kansas lottery from the prize reserve account as may be needed to maintain the approved maximum balance and shares of the party lotteries. Any amount remaining in the prize pool accounts or prize reserve account at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement game or expended in a manner as directed by the members of the product group in accordance with Kansas law. (Authorized by K.S.A.

**111-5-184. Expected prize payout pari-mutuel prizes.** (a) The grand prize shall be determined on a pari-mutuel basis. Except as provided in these rules, all other prizes awarded shall be paid as set cash prizes with the following expected approximate prize payout percentages, which does not include an additional amount held in prize reserves:

(b) The prize money allocated to the grand prize category shall be divided equally by the number of plays winning the grand prize.

(c) The prize pool percentage allocated to the set prizes (the cash prizes of \$1,000,000 or less) shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw.

(d) Except as required by K.A.R. 111-5-186(a), the official advertised grand prize annuity amount is subject to change based on sales forecasts and/or actual sales. Pari-mutuel prizes shall be determined as follows except as provided in subsection (d)(3):

(1) If the total of the set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the set prizes, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes, including Megaplier prizes, awarded shall be drawn from the following sources in the following order:

(A) the amount allocated to the set prizes and carried forward from previous draws, if any;

(B) an amount from the prize reserve account, if available, not to exceed forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) per drawing.

(2) If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded, including Megaplier prizes, then the highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize shall become a pari-mutuel prize.

This procedure shall continue down through all set prize levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels.

(3) By agreement with the Mega Millions lotteries, the Mega Millions lotteries shall independently calculate their set pari-mutuel prize amounts. The party lotteries and the Mega Millions lotteries shall then agree to set the pari-mutuel prize amount for all lotteries selling the game at the lesser of the independently-calculated prize amounts.

(e) Subject to the laws and rules governing each participating lottery, the number of prize categories and the allocation of the prize fund among the prize categories may be changed at the discretion of the Mega Millions lotteries, for promotional purposes. Such change shall be announced by Mega Millions lotteries.

(f) These amendments shall take effect October 22, 2013. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-29-10, Jan. 20, 2010; amended, T-111-9-1-10, Aug. 18, 2010; amended, T-111-10-11-13, Aug. 14, 2013.)

**111-5-185. Probability of winning.** (a) The following table sets forth the approximate probability of winning and the probable distribution of winners in and among each prize category based upon the total number of possible combinations in Mega Millions.

**111-5-186. Prize payments; annuitized and cash prizes.** (a) The prize money allocated from the current Mega Millions prize pool for the grand prize, plus any previous portions of prize money allocated to the grand prize category in which no matching tickets were sold, will be divided equally among all jackpot prize-winning plays in all participating lotteries. The annuity grand prize amount will be paid in thirty (30) graduated annual installments. Grand prizes won shall be funded by the selling lotteries in accordance with the formula set by the Mega Millions lotteries. The Mega Millions lotteries may set a minimum guaranteed annuity grand prize amount that shall be advertised by the selling lotteries as the starting guaranteed annuity grand prize amount. The Mega

(continued)

Millions lotteries may set a minimum guaranteed annuity grand prize amount, which shall be advertised by the Kansas lottery as the starting guaranteed annuity grand prize amount.

(b) If in any Mega Millions drawing there are no Mega Millions plays which qualify for the grand prize category, the portion of the prize fund allocated to such grand prize category shall remain in the jackpot prize category and be added to the amount allocated for the grand prize category in the next consecutive Mega Millions drawing.

(c) Grand prizes shall be paid, at the election of the player made no later than 60 days after the player becomes entitled to a prize, with either a per winner annuity or cash payment. If the payment election is not made by the player within 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize, then the prize shall be paid as an annuity prize. The election to take the cash payment may be made within 60 days after the player becomes entitled to the prize. An election made after the winner becomes entitled to the prize is final and cannot be revoked, withdrawn, or otherwise changed.

(d) In the event of a prize winner who selects the cash value option, the prize winner's share will be paid in a single payment upon completion of internal validation procedures. The cash option amount shall be determined by the product group.

(e) Annual payment option jackpot prizes shall be paid in thirty (30) annual installments upon completion of internal validation procedures. The initial payment shall be paid upon completion of internal validation procedures. The subsequent twenty-nine (29) payments shall be paid and graduated annually to coincide with the month of the Federal auction date at which the bonds were purchased to fund the annuity, with graduated annual installments defined in the Mega Millions lotteries' finance and operations procedures. Payments shall escalate by a factor of five percent (5%) annually, and annual payments shall be rounded down to the nearest rounded one thousand dollar (\$1,000) increment. All such payments shall be made within seven days of the anniversary of the annual auction date.

(f) If individual shares of the cash held to fund an annuity are less than \$250,000, the product group, in its sole discretion, may elect to pay the winners their share of the cash held in the grand prize pool.

(g) Funds for the initial payment of an annuitized prize or the lump sum cash prize shall be made available by MUSL for payment by the party lottery on a schedule approved by the product group. If necessary, when the due date for the payment of a prize occurs before the receipt of funds in the prize pool trust is sufficient to pay the prize, the transfer of funds for the payment of the full lump sum cash amount may be delayed pending receipt of funds from the party lotteries or other lotteries participating in the Mega Millions game.

(h) In the event of the death of a lottery winner sold during the annuity payment period, the MUSL finance and audit committee, in its sole discretion excepting a discretionary review by the product group, upon the petition of the estate of the lottery winner (the "estate") to the Kansas lottery, and subject to federal, state, district, or territorial applicable laws, may accelerate the payment

of all of the remaining lottery proceeds to the estate. If such a determination is made, then securities and/or cash held to fund the deceased lottery winner's annuitized prize may be distributed to the estate. The identification of the securities to fund the annuitized prize shall be at the sole discretion of the finance and audit committee or the product group.

(i) All low-tier cash prizes (all prizes except the grand prize) shall be paid in cash or the equivalent. The Kansas lottery may begin paying low-tier cash prizes after receiving authorization to pay from the MUSL central office.

(j) Annuitized payments of the grand prize or a share of the grand prize may be rounded to facilitate the purchase of an appropriate funding mechanism. Breakage on an annuitized grand prize win shall be added to the first cash payment to the winner or winners. Prizes other than the grand prize, which, under these rules, may become single-payment, pari-mutuel prizes, may be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. Breakage resulting from rounding these prizes shall be carried forward to the prize pool for the next drawing.

(k) If the grand prize is not won in a drawing, the prize money allocated for the grand prize shall roll over and be added to the grand prize pool for the following drawing.

(l) The holder of a winning ticket may win only one prize per play in connection with the winning numbers drawn, and shall be entitled only to the prize won by those numbers in the highest matching prize category.

(m) Prize claims must be claimed within 365 days of the day of the drawing in which the prize was won.

#### **111-5-194. Mega Millions Megaplier promotion.**

(a) The Mega Millions Megaplier promotion is a limited extension of the Mega Millions game and is conducted in accordance with the Mega Millions game rules and other lottery rules applicable to the Mega Millions game except as may be amended herein. The promotion will begin on January 31, 2010, which is the day Mega Millions tickets are first offered for sale by the Kansas lottery. The promotion will continue until it is discontinued by the Kansas lottery. The promotion will offer to the owners of a qualifying play a chance to multiply the amount of any of the lump sum set prizes (the lump sum prizes normally paying \$1 to \$1,000,000) won in a drawing held during the promotion. The grand prize is not a set prize and will not be multiplied.

(b) A qualifying play is any single Mega Millions play for which the player pays an extra dollar for the megaplier option play and which is recorded at the Kansas Lottery's central computer as a qualifying play.

(c) A qualifying play which wins a lump sum set prize will be multiplied by the number selected, either two, three, four, or five (2, 3, 4, or 5), in a separate random megaplier drawing announced in a manner approved by the product group.

(d) MUSL will either itself conduct, or authorize a United States lottery to conduct on its behalf, a separate random megaplier drawing. Before each Mega Millions drawing, a single number (2, 3, 4, or 5) shall be drawn. The Mega Millions group may change one or more of these multiplier numbers for special promotions from time to time. In the event the multiplier drawing does not occur prior to the Mega Millions drawing, the multiplier number will be a five (5), which shall solely be determined by the lottery authorized to conduct the “Megaplier” drawing.

(e) The prize pool for all prize categories offered by the party lotteries shall consist of up to fifty-five percent (55%) of each drawing period’s sales, including any specific statutorily-mandated tax of a party lottery to be included in the price of a lottery ticket, after the Mega Millions prize reserve accounts are funded to the amounts set by the product group.

(f) Any amount not used to pay for multiplied prizes may be collected and placed in the Megaplier prize pool until the prize pool account reaches the amounts designated by the product group. Any amount remaining in the Megaplier prize pool account at the end of this game shall be carried forward to a replacement game or expended in a manner as directed by the members of the product group in accordance with Kansas law.

(g) Except as provided in these rules, all prizes awarded shall be paid as lump sum set prizes. Instead of the Mega Millions set prize amounts, qualifying megaplier plays will pay the amounts shown below when matched with the megaplier number drawn:

In certain rare instances, the Mega Millions set prize amount may be less than the amount shown. In such case, the megaplier prizes will be a multiple of the changed Mega Millions prize amount announced after the draw. For example, if the match 4+1 Mega Millions set prize amount of \$5,000 becomes \$2,000 under the rules of the Mega Millions game, then a megaplier player winning that prize amount with a 4X multiplier would win \$8,000 (\$2,000 x 4).

(h) The following table sets forth the probability of the various megaplier numbers being drawn during a single Mega Millions drawing. The group may elect to run limited promotions that may modify the multiplier features.

Note: Megaplier does not apply to the Mega Millions grand prize.

(i) The prize pool percentage allocated to the megaplier set prizes shall be carried forward to subsequent draws if all or a portion of it is not needed to pay the set prizes awarded in the current draw or may be held in a prize reserve account.

(j) Pari-mutuel prizes for all prize amounts shall be paid, except as otherwise provided for in subsection (j)(3), as follows:

(1) If the total of the original Mega Millions set prizes and the Megaplier prize amounts awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pools allocated to the set prizes, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes (including the Megaplier prize amounts) awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order:

(A) the amount allocated to the set prizes (including Megaplier prize amounts) and carried forward from previous draws, if any;

(B) an amount from the Mega Millions prize reserve account, if available in the account, not to exceed forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) per drawing.

(2) If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded (including Megaplier prize amounts), then the highest set prize (including the Megaplier prize amounts) shall become a pari-mutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a pari-mutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize, including the Megaplier prize amount, shall become a pari-mutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all set prize levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become pari-mutuel prize levels. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Mega Millions and Megaplier prizes will be reduced by the same percentage.

(3) By agreement with the Mega Millions lotteries, the Mega Millions lotteries shall independently calculate their set pari-mutuel prize amounts, including the Megaplier prize amounts. The party lotteries and the Mega Millions lotteries shall then agree to set the pari-mutuel prize amounts for all lotteries selling the game at the lesser of the independently-calculated prize amounts.

(k) These amendments shall take effect with the drawing conducted on October 22, 2013. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-29-10, Jan. 20, 2010; T-111-9-1-10, Aug. 18, 2010; amended, 111-2-9-12, Dec. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-11-13, Aug. 14, 2013.)

**Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES**

**111-17-10. The Walking Dead second-chance drawings.** (a) The Kansas lottery may conduct a series of three second-chance online drawings entitled “The Walking Dead Drawings.” The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the first drawing through the Kansas Lottery website (website) starting at midnight, September 25, 2013, and ending at noon on December 10, 2013. Draw-

ings will be announced with at least 24 hours advanced notice via the lottery's website, and other social media forums such as Facebook and Twitter. The first drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on December 13, 2013. The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the second drawing through the website starting at midnight, September 25, 2013, and ending at noon on January 7, 2014. The second drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on January 10, 2014. The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the third drawing through the website starting at midnight, September 25, 2013, and ending at noon on February 11, 2014. The third drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on February 14, 2014.

(b) The specific non-winning ticket eligible for entry into this second-chance online event drawings shall be the \$2, "The Walking Dead," game number 454.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall award five grand prizes and five secondary prizes in each second-chance drawing. Each grand prize shall consist of a 32 inch television, a blu ray player, and the first three seasons on blu ray discs of "The Walking Dead" television series shows. Each secondary prize shall consist of the first three seasons on blu ray discs of "The Walking Dead" television series shows.

(d) There will be three drawings conducted on the dates indicated in subsection (a) above to select winners of the grand prizes and secondary prizes. Each drawing shall select 30 entrants. The first five entrants drawn (identified as numbers 1 through 5) in each drawing shall be awarded a grand prize identified in subsection (c). The next five entrants drawn (identified as numbers 6 through 10) shall be awarded a secondary prize identified in subsection (c). The next 20 entrants drawn in this drawing (identified as numbers 11 through 30) will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn. An alternate winner will be awarded the first available unclaimed prize.

(e) A winner of a grand prize or a secondary prize shall be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. The winner shall be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(f) A winner shall be sent a claim form via U. S. mail at the time email notification is sent.

(g) A player who is among the winners selected in this drawing to receive a grand prize or a secondary prize must return his or her completed claim form, and original non-winning ticket entered into the online event drawing and must be received by the Kansas lottery within 30 days following the date of the winners being notified via email. Alternatively, a player who is among the entrants selected as alternate winners in this drawing to receive a prize and as identified in subsection (d) must return his or her completed claim form, and original non-winning ticket entered into the online event drawing within 30 days following the date the alternate winner was sent a claim form via U. S. mail.

or the winners can deliver the completed claim form and non-winning ticket by hand to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during normal business hours between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., excluding holidays and weekends.

(i) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a grand prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.

(j) A player can enter the online event drawings an unlimited number of times, but can win a prize in each drawing only one time.

(k) Each person who enters a Kansas lottery "The Walking Dead" ticket, game number 454, agrees to release The Walking Dead, its parent and affiliated companies, the Kansas lottery and their respective officers, directors, employees, agents, and sponsors from liability of any kind or nature for any loss, claims, damages, or injuries of any kind associated with participation in the drawing or with acceptance and use of any prize.

(l) Any player entering The Walking Dead Second-Chance Drawing agrees to public disclosure.

(m) The Kansas lottery reserves the right to substitute prizes at its sole and total discretion of approximate equal value.

(n) Entrants into the drawing are eligible to win a prize in each drawing, but a non-winning ticket may win only one time. Any alternate entrants selected in the first and second drawings are returned to the pool of eligible entrants for each succeeding drawing. All winners remain in the prize category originally drawn.

(o) Rules applicable to this online event drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-17-10 and K.A.R. 111-16-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-11-13, Aug. 14, 2013.)

#### Article 501.—SOUTH CENTRAL GAMING ZONE

**111-501-107. Wagers.** (a) All wagers at Mississippi Stud Poker shall be made by placing gaming chips and, if applicable, a match play coupon on the appropriate betting areas of the table layout. A verbal wager accompanied by cash shall not be accepted.

(b) Only players who are seated at the Mississippi Stud Poker table may touch the cards. Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, that player must remain seated until the completion of the round of play.

(c) All ante wagers at Mississippi Stud Poker shall be placed prior to the dealer dealing the first card. No ante wager at Mississippi Stud Poker shall be made, increased or withdrawn after the dealer has dealt the first card.

(d) Players who make an ante wager will receive two cards face down. They either fold or buy the first community card by making a 3<sup>rd</sup> Street wager (equal to 1x, 2x, or 3x their ante). When that card is revealed, they either fold or buy the second community card making a 4<sup>th</sup> Street wager (equal to 1x, 2x, or 3x their ante). After that card is revealed, a player may either fold or buy the last community card making a 5<sup>th</sup> Street wager (equal to 1x, 2x, or 3x their ante).

(e) Any player who places a Mississippi Stud Poker wager may also make an optional 3 Card Bonus side wager by placing gaming chips and, if applicable, a match play coupon on the designated betting area of the table layout. The 3 Card Bonus wager will remain in play even if the player folds his or her Mississippi Stud Poker wager. If the player has placed a wager on the 3 Card Bonus side wager and folds his or her Mississippi Stud Poker wager, the dealer will remove the original Mississippi Stud Poker wager and tuck the folded cards under the player's 3 Card Bonus side wager. A player placing a 3 Card Bonus wager will win the wager if the three community cards constitute at least a pair or higher ranking Mississippi Stud Poker hand. See payout table for odds.

(f) After each round of play is complete, the dealer shall collect all losing wagers and pay off all winning wagers in accordance with the payout table. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-18-12, Aug. 15, 2012; amended, T-111-10-11-13, Aug. 14, 2013.)

**111-501-109. Payout odds.** (a) For a winning hand, the ante, 3rd, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> street wagers are paid the same payout odds ranging from 1 to 1 for a pair of jacks, queens, kings or aces to 500 to 1 for a royal flush.

(b) All winning wagers will receive payout odds using the following payout table:

Hand Ranking	Odds
Royal flush	500 to 1
Straight flush	100 to 1
Four-of-a-kind	40 to 1

Full house	10 to 1
Flush	6 to 1
Straight	4 to 1
Three-of-a-kind	3 to 1
Two pair	2 to 1
Pair of jacks or better	1 to 1
Pair of 6s to 10s	Push

Any hand not listed in this table is a losing hand.

(c) Notwithstanding the payout odds set forth in (b) above, the aggregate payout limit on all winning wagers for any hand shall be \$25,000 or the maximum amount that one patron could win per round when betting the minimum wager, whichever is greater. The aggregate payout information shall be displayed at the Mississippi Stud poker table.

(d) All winning 3 Card Bonus side wagers will receive payout odds using the following payout table:

Hand Ranking	Odds
Straight flush	40 to 1
Three-of-a-kind	30 to 1
Straight	6 to 1
Flush	3 to 1
Any Pair	1 to 1
