## **Request for Comments**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. ANR Pipeline Company — Havensville Compressor Station has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

ANR Pipeline Company, 717 Texas St., Suite 2400, Houston, TX 77002, owns and operates the Havensville Compressor Station, a natural gas compressor station located at Section 35, Township 6S, Range 12E, Pottawatomie County, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review during normal business hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, and at the KDHE Northeast District Office, 800 W. 24th St., Lawrence. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact Cathy Richardson, 785-296-1947, at the KDHE central office, or Pat Simpson, 785-842-4600, at the KDHE Northeast District Office. The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Direct written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit to Cathy Richardson, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received not later than noon February 17.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Cathy Richardson, KDHE, Bureau of Air, not later than noon February 17 in order for the secretary of health and environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this

notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. # Request for Comments and Notice of Hearing

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding an addendum to the air emission source construction permit issued December 16, 2010. Sunflower Electric Power Corporation (Sunflower), located at 301 W. 13th St., Hays, Kansas, was granted authorization on December 16, 2010, to construct and operate one new supercritical 895-megawatt (MW) pulverized coal-fired steam generating unit (H2) and associated ancillary equipment (Holcomb expansion) at its generating station located at 2440 Holcomb Lane, Holcomb, Kansas. The Kansas Supreme Court reviewed the decision of KDHE to issue the permit upon litigation filed by the Sierra Club. On October 4, 2013, the Kansas Supreme Court issued an opinion and remanded the permit back to KDHE for: 1) the application of the federal regulations establishing one-hour NO<sub>2</sub> and SO<sub>2</sub> National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS); and 2) requiring KDHE to apply new HAPs emission limits to H2 steam generator. Sierra Club v. Moser, No. 105,493 (Ks. SCt. October 4, 2013)

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each regulated pollutant for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. This evaluation was conducted as part of the application process for the permit issued December 16, 2010. An air quality impact analysis, including increment consumption analysis, was also included as part of the permit application. These analyses remain valid. This addendum has no associated increase in increment consumption. The addendum does not change the existing permit and adds additional conditions as delineated in the Supreme Court opinion remanding the permit to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

Although no emission changes from the December 16, 2010, permit are part of the proposed addendum, any federal land manager who has reason to believe he/she may have a Class I area adversely impacted by the emissions from the expansion project has the opportunity to present KDHE with an analysis of the adverse impact on the air quality-related values of that Class I area during the comment period.

As stated in 40 CFR §52.21(r)(2) and adopted by KDHE in K.A.R. 28-19-350, "[a]pproval to construct shall become

invalid if construction is not commenced within 18 months after receipt of such approval." If the approval becomes invalid, the source can reapply and go through the analyses required to obtain an approval. Since KDHE stayed the permit before the 18-month expiration, the reanalyses is not required.

A public comment period has been established until February 19 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about the amended permitting action. Comments germane to the addendum outlining the two issues that were remanded by the Kansas Supreme Court will be considered in this comment period. All comments should be submitted to KDHE as follows:

- 1) Presented orally or in writing at the public hearing;

A public hearing has been scheduled February 19 at the Garden City High School (auditorium), 2720 Buffalo Way Blvd., Garden City, to receive comments on the addendum to the air quality construction permit. The public hearing will begin at 5 p.m. and continue until all verbal and written comments have been submitted by participants.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally or by submission of written materials during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary that each participant limit oral presentations to a specific time limit.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed materials in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation must be made not later than February 10 by contacting Linda Vandevord at 785-296-6423.

A copy of the permit and proposed addendum, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the review process is available for public review for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., at the KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. # Executive Order 14-01 for Local Emergencies Conditional and Temporary Relief from Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, Extreme cold temperatures and winter weather events have increased the demand for propane delivery, which requires the operation of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles for the purposes of providing direct assistance for relief efforts in the State of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, this disaster has caused or threatens to cause an emergency as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f and which has or threatens to interrupt the delivery of essential services or essential supplies or otherwise immediately threatens physical harm or injury to persons, the public welfare and/or substantial damage to property;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby acknowledge a state of emergency exists in Kansas and declare it necessary to assist and expedite all disaster recovery efforts. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Kansas in this emergency situation, I hereby order the following:

- 1. This declaration only applies to motor carriers delivering propane directly participating in relief efforts; and
- 2. In accordance with Title 49 C.F.R. 390.23, the requirements contained in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Title 49 C.F.R. Parts 390-399 are hereby suspended through the duration of the motor carrier's assistance in the disaster relief effort not to exceed a period of five (5) days from the date of the initial declaration unless the order is rescinded or expanded by further executive order; and
- 3. All other applicable state and federal regulations shall apply to include but not limited to: Title 49 C.F.R. Part 382, Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing; the Kansas Motor Vehicle Driver's License Act, K.S.A. 8-234 et seg. and Title 49 C.F.R. Part 383 Commercial Driver's License Standards as adopted by the Kansas Uniform Commercial Drivers' License Act, K.S.A. 8-2,125 et seq.; the federal Minimum Levels of Financial Responsibility (insurance requirements) Title 49 C.F.R. Part 387 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3n and state insurance requirements as provided in K.A.R. 82-4-23; and, adherence to the regulations governing the Transportation of Hazardous Materials as provided Title 49 C.F.R. 397 and adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3k and Parts: 107, 171-173, 177, 178 and 180 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-20; and
- 4. The registration and fuel tax permits as enforced by the Kansas Department of Revenue are temporarily suspended; and

5. The licensing, certification and permitting rules and regulations as required by the Kansas Corporation Commission are temporarily suspended;

FURTHER, I direct that this executive order shall become effective immediately and shall continue in effect until 11:59 PM on January 14, 2014; or until rescinded upon conditions abating, whichever is less.

# **Temporary Administrative Regulations**

## **Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS**

**111-2-314.** Jingle sells bonus retailer incentive promotion. (a) In addition to any compensation awarded a retailer for lottery product sales, the lottery will also offer the following as additional incentive to enhance the sale of all lottery tickets at authorized retailer locations:

(a) The sales program will commence at start of the business day, as defined in subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1, on December 1, 2013, and end at the close of the lot-

tery business day on January 31, 2014.

(b) Kansas lottery retailers who are authorized to sell instant tickets are eligible to participate based upon an increase in their "base instant holiday sales total." The Kansas lottery instant ticket games included in the instant holiday sales shall be the following:

The "base instant holiday sales total" is arrived at by computing that retailer's total lottery instant holiday ticket sales for December 1, 2012, through January 31, 2013, as compared with instant ticket sales during December 1, 2013, through January 31, 2014. If a retailer has no base instant holiday sales during December 1, 2012, through January 31, 2013, or sales are less than \$300, their base will be set at \$300 and their goal will be \$600 for the promotion. Sales are based on instant holiday pack settlements during promotional period.

(c) Any retailer that utilizes the default base instant holiday sales will only be eligible for the level 3 tier prize

equaling one pack.

(d) Totals will be calculated prior to the drawing. Winners will be announced on February 14, 2014. Ticket returns by the retailer may lower the percentage increase and may make retailer ineligible for the drawing.

(e) Each retailer in this promotion is eligible to receive an additional incentive at one of the following levels:

- (1) If sales increase more than 15.00 percent above the base sales total, a retailer shall receive an entry to win one of 10 prizes of three free packs of instant scratch tickets as determined by the Kansas lottery.
- (2) If sales increase between 10.01 percent and 15.00 percent above the base sales total, a retailer shall receive an entry to win one of 15 prizes of two free packs of instant scratch tickets as determined by the Kansas lottery.
- (3) If sales increase between 5.00 percent and 10.00 above the base sales total, a retailer shall receive an entry to win one of 25 prizes of a free pack of instant scratch tickets as determined by the Kansas lottery. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-20-13, Nov. 13, 2013.)

- (h) Approximately 300,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this instant game. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

## Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES

- **111-17-12.** Powerball football hall of fame giveaway. (a) The Kansas lottery may conduct a second-chance online drawing entitled "Powerball Football Hall of Fame Giveaway" with a qualifying Powerball ticket purchased November 17, 2013, through February 1, 2014. The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the drawing only through the Kansas Lottery Players Club website beginning at 5:00 a.m. November 17, 2013, and ending at noon on February 4, 2014. The drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on February 7, 2014.
- (b) The specific ticket eligible for entry into this online event drawing shall be a \$10 or more single Powerball ticket. The Powerball ticket can be a winning or non-winning \$10 qualifying Powerball ticket and can include multiple plays, multi-draws, and the Power Play option on a single ticket.
- (c) The Kansas lottery shall award four grand prizes in the online drawing. The grand prize package shall consist of round trip airfare for the winner and three guests, departing from an airport in Kansas City, Missouri, or Wichita, Kansas, arriving in Cleveland, Ohio, on May 1, 2014, and returning to the departure location on May 5, 2014; four nights of hotel accommodations for four persons (two rooms total) beginning May 1, 2014, and departing May 5, 2014; ground transportation; passes to the Pro Football Hall of Fame Fan Festival, Pro Football Hall of Fame, Rock N' Roll Hall of Fame, and Ultimate Tailgate Party event; and state and federal mandatory income withholding taxes. In addition, each prize package includes the winner's participation in a winners-only cash prize event to win a minimum of \$1,000 up to and including \$1,000,000. All mandatory federal and state withholding taxes for any cash prizes won in the winners-only cash prize event will be the responsibility of the winner and will be withheld from the prize amount won. Each grand prize has an approximate value of \$15,000.
- (d) The drawing shall select 14 entrants. The first four entrants drawn (identified as number 1, 2, 3, and 4) shall each be awarded a grand prize identified in subsection (c). The next 10 entrants drawn in this drawing (identified as numbers 5 through 14) will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn. An alternate winner will be awarded the first available unclaimed prize.
- (e) A winner of a grand prize shall be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. The winner shall be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.
- (f) A winner shall then be sent a claim form via U. S. mail at the time email notification is sent.
- (g) A player who is among the winners selected in this drawing to receive a grand prize must return his or her

- completed claim form, which must be received by the Kansas lottery within 14 days following the date of the winners being notified via email. Alternatively, a player who is among the entrants selected as alternate winners in this drawing to receive a prize and as identified in subsection (d) must return his or her completed claim form within 14 days following the date the alternate winner was sent a claim form via U. S. mail.
- (h) Completed claim forms can be mailed by the winners via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winners can deliver the completed claim form by hand to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during normal business hours between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., excluding holidays and weekends.
- (i) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.
- (j) A player can enter the online event drawing an unlimited number of times, but can win a prize in this drawing only one time.
- (k) Each person who enters a Powerball ticket in the Kansas lottery "Powerball Football Hall of Fame Giveaway" agrees to release the Kansas lottery and their respective officers, directors, employees, agents, and sponsors from liability of any kind or nature for any loss, claims, damages, or injuries of any kind associated with participation in the drawing or with acceptance and use of any prize.
- (l) Any player entering the "Powerball Football Hall of Fame Giveaway" agrees to public disclosure.
- (m) The Kansas lottery reserves the right to substitute prizes at its sole and total discretion of approximate equal value.
- (n) Rules applicable to this online event drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-17-12 and K.A.R. 111-16-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-20-13, Nov. 13, 2013.)

## Article 501.—SOUTH CENTRAL GAMING ZONE

- **111-501-6. Rules of the game.** (a) The cards shall be shuffled under the following circumstances:
  - (1) A new set of decks are put into play.
- (2) When the cut card appears during the course of the play (the shuffle will take place prior to the next round of play).
- (3) Whenever the cards have been dropped or otherwise mishandled.
- (4) Whenever instructed to do so by the table game supervisor or higher ranking casino official.
- (5) At no time will the dealer shuffle at the request of a player unless authorized to do so by a table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official.
- (b) The dealer is to maintain physical and visual contact with the deck at all times while the deck is out of the shoe; however, the cards shall be placed back in the dealer's shoe for commencement of play.

- (c) A card shall be burned for the following reasons:
- (1) After a shuffle of the cards.
- (2) A card has been exposed or dealt by mistake unless the card was exposed or dealt by mistake to the player who acts immediately prior to the dealer.
- (3) When a dealer is relieved, the new dealer shall burn a card.
- (4) If a table is dead (no players), upon the arrival of new players, the dealer shall burn a card.
- (d) All cards shall be dealt from a dealing shoe secured to and located on the extreme left-hand side of the table.
- (e) All players' cards should be delivered face up, starting on the dealer's left and continuing clockwise around the table.
- (f) After each player has received one card, the dealer shall take one card face down. A second card should be dealt to each player face up and the dealer's final card will be dealt face up. The card should be placed underneath the first card which is now turned face up and should cover the hole card in such a way that no part of that card is visible.
- (g) A player may elect to double down with any initial two (2) cards, and bet up to the amount of his original bet on the condition that only one (1) additional card shall be dealt to the player.
- (h) The additional chips for the double-down bet should be placed next to the original wager before the double down card is dealt.
- (i) The double down card will be exposed and placed across the two (2) cards involved, in such a manner as to keep the number exposed on the player's second card.
- (j) When paying double down bets, the bet is not combined into one stack and the stack is not sized into the other stack. The dealer is not permitted to move the player's bet with chips in the dealer's hand.
- (k) Whenever the initial two cards to a player are of the same face value, the player may elect to split the cards into two separate hands, provided that the player makes a bet equal to the original bet. The following rules apply to splitting cards:
- (1) After splitting, the first hand will receive a card. This hand will be completed by either hitting again or staying before the next hand is dealt to.
- (2) The second hand will receive a card. This hand will be completed by either hitting again or staying before moving on to the next hand.
- (3) A player may split up to three times excluding aces which may only be split once. When aces are split, the player will only receive one card per ace.
- (Í) The dealer will ask if any player wishes to place an insurance bet when the dealer's "up" card is an ace.
- (m) Insurance is a separate bet. The player is betting that the dealer has blackjack. If the dealer does not have blackjack, then the player loses the player's insurance bet.
- (n) The player can take insurance for any amount up to one-half of the original bet.
- (o) The proper (one-half or under) insurance bet shall be placed on the insurance line on the table layout.
- (p) The dealer will then verbally close the time for accepting insurance bets.
- (q) If the dealer's hand is a blackjack and the player has taken insurance, the dealer will take the losing bet and

- pay off the winning insurance bet with it in an amount not to exceed the player's original bet. Insurance will be paid at a rate of 2 to 1.
- (r) If the player's hand is a blackjack and the dealer's "up" card is an ace, the player can announce even money and be paid the amount of the player's bet.
- (s) Players may insure a toke bet and the bet is handled by the same procedure as any other insurance bet.
- (t) A player may place more than one-half of their original bet on the insurance line but only one-half of their original bet is in action. Any overage will be returned to the player after it is determined that the dealer does or does not have blackjack.
- (u) All blackjacks will be paid at odds of 3 to 2. The dealer shall pay the player having a blackjack during the normal course of the dealer's take and pay procedures.
- (v) If the dealer and a player have blackjack, the player's bet will be a push (tie).
- (w) If the dealer looks at the dealer's hole card and fails to recognize the fact the dealer has a blackjack, the dealer's hand will be played as a total of 21 only, and not as a blackjack. A player that doubles down or splits will receive back any additional wagers made after their initial wager.
- (w) Any player's hand that exceeds a total of 21 has broke or "busted" and their hand loses.
- (x) If the dealer has an up card with the value of ten, the dealer will use the peeking device built into the gaming table to check to see if the dealer has a blackjack.
- (y) If the dealer has a blackjack all losing bets will be collected and all blackjacks will push.
- (z) If the dealer does not have blackjack the hand will continue as normal.
- (aa) A card found turned upwards in the shoe shall not be used in that game and shall be placed in the discard rack (burned).
- (bb) A card drawn in error without its face being exposed shall be used as though it were the next card from the shoe.
- (cc) After the initial two cards have been dealt to each player and a card is drawn in error and exposed to the players, such card shall be burned or placed in the discard rack and will not be offered to any player or to the dealer unless the card was exposed or dealt by mistake to the player who acts immediately prior to the dealer. In that case, if the card is needed by the dealer to complete the dealer's hand, then the card shall be retained by the dealer. If the card is not needed by the dealer to complete the dealer's hand, then the card shall be burned.
- (dd) If the dealer has a point total of a hard seventeen or more and accidentally draws a card for the dealer, such card shall be burned.
- (ee) If the dealer misses dealing his first or second card to the dealer, the dealer shall continue dealing the first two cards to each player, and then deal the appropriate number of cards to the dealer.
- (ff) If there are insufficient cards remaining to complete a round of play, all of the cards in the discard rack shall be shuffled and cut, the first card shall be drawn face down and burned, and the dealer shall complete the round of play.

- (gg) If no cards or only one card is dealt to a player's hand, the hand is dead and the player shall be included in the next deal.
- (hh) If any card is dealt and an error occurs, at no time will any card be backed up as a result of the error.
- (ii) If a dispute occurs because of a mistake during a hand, the table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official shall be authorized to declare that all or part of the hand is dead (void) and can return any disputed money. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-23-11, Aug. 17, 2011; amended, T-111-12-20-13, Nov. 13, 2013.)
- **111-501-101. Method of play.** (a) The Kansas Star Casino may designate certain poker games to participate in the Bad Beat Jackpot. The jackpot will be funded by the Kansas Star Casino in the initial amount of \$4,000 (the "primary jackpot"), with additional contributions to the jackpot coming from each pot in the designated poker games reaching a minimum of \$20. When the pot for a game reaches \$20, \$1 is placed in the Bad Beat drop box (a box located at each game table designated for the receipt of chips or cash).
- (b) Unless and until a secondary jackpot is funded as set forth hereinafter, all money placed in the Bad Beat drop box shall be credited as follows:
- (1) fifty percent (50%) shall be added to the primary jackpot;
- (2) forty percent (40%) shall be retained to fund a secondary jackpot as needed, and any portion thereof not needed to fund the secondary jackpot used for poker promotions; and,
- (3) ten percent (10%) shall be retained by the Kansas Star Casino to offset initial funding of the primary jackpot and for the payment of any other expenses Kansas Star Casino may in its sole discretion determine.
- (c) In the event the primary jackpot amount reaches \$6,000, a secondary jackpot will be started in the initial amount of \$4,000. If the amount retained pursuant to subsection (b)(2), above, is insufficient to fund the secondary jackpot Kansas Star Casino shall fund the secondary jackpot in such amount as may be necessary to bring the initial amount to \$4,000.
- (d) Once a secondary jackpot has been funded, all money placed in the Bad Beat drop box shall be credited as follows:
- (1) thirty percent (30%) shall be added to the primary jackpot;
- (2) twenty percent (20%) shall be added to the secondary jackpot as needed, and any portion thereof not needed to fund the secondary jackpot used for poker promotions:
- (3) forty percent (40%) shall be retained to fund future jackpots as needed, and any portion thereof not needed to fund future jackpots used for poker promotions; and,
- (4) ten percent (10%) shall be retained by the Kansas Star Casino to offset initial funding of the primary jackpot and for the payment of any other expenses Kansas Star Casino may in its sole discretion determine.
- (e) The Bad Beat drop box will be taken to the count room during the regular table games drop (the removal

- of chips and money from the gaming tables). The contents of each Bad Beat drop box will be counted daily and the amount credited as provided herein.
- (f) A minimum of \$20 (including pot money and rake) must be in the pot for that hand in order for the hand to qualify for the Bad Beat jackpot.
- (g) The primary jackpot amount shall be paid to any player whose hand consists of four-of-a-kind or a higher ranking hand, and is beaten by another player's hand consisting of a four-of-a-kind or higher ranking hand. Both the winning hand and the losing hand must use both of their hole cards (the cards dealt face down) to qualify.
- (h) Distribution of the primary jackpot shall be as follows:
- (1) Fifty percent (or equal portions of fifty percent if multiple players have identical qualifying Bad Beat hands) of the primary jackpot total for the game in which the Bad Beat occurred will be given to the holder(s) of the second best hand (the losing hand).
- (2) Twenty-five percent (or equal portions of twenty-five percent if multiple players are holding identical winning hands) of the primary jackpot total in which the Bad Beat occurred will be given to the holder(s) of the best hand (the winning hand). If more than one hand meets the qualifications specified for the Bad Beat jackpot losing hand, the best hand will be considered the winner (25%) and the second best will be considered the loser (50%). Only in the event of identical ranking poker hands will the loser's 50% share or winner's 25% share be split.
- (3) The remaining twenty-five percent of the primary jackpot for the game in which the Bad Beat occurred will be split among the remaining players at the table who were dealt a hand in that game.
- (4) All payouts will be rounded up to the nearest dollar, adjusting the remaining jackpot balance accordingly.
- (i) Once the primary jackpot is paid out, the secondary jackpot automatically becomes the new primary jackpot. The new primary jackpot and any new secondary jackpot will then be funded pursuant to these rules. In the event no secondary jackpot is in existence when the primary jackpot is paid out, Kansas Star Casino shall provide \$4,000 to fund the new primary jackpot.
- (j) A minimum of four players must be dealt in a hand in order for the hand to qualify for the Bad Beat jackpot.
- (k) Reduced rake games will not qualify for the Bad Beat jackpot. Bad Beat money will not be taken from a reduced rake game.
- (l) Should there be a deviation (for example a misdeal, a missing card, two cards of the same rank and suit, extra cards, or cheating) the jackpot may be declared null and void by the casino shift manager or higher ranking casino official. Permanent Administrative Regulations

### Article 1.—GENERAL

- **40-1-28.** Insurance holding companies; reporting forms and instructions. The Kansas insurance department's "policy and procedure providing insurance holding company reporting forms and instructions," dated October 15, 2013, is hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103, K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 40-3309; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 40-3304, 40-3305, and 40-3306; effective May 1, 1976; amended May 1, 1989; amended May 1, 1988; amended May 15, 1989; amended, T-40-9-26-91, Sept. 26, 1991; amended Dec. 16, 1991; amended Jan. 31, 2014.)
- **40-1-37.** Audited financial reports; filing requirements. The Kansas insurance department's "policy and procedure requiring annual audited financial reports," dated July 19, 2013, is hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and K.S.A. 40-225; implementing K.S.A. 40-222b, K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 40-222, and K.S.A. 40-225; effective July 10, 1989; amended Jan. 4, 1993; amended Sept. 14, 2001; amended Sept. 21, 2007; amended July 6, 2009; amended March 18, 2011; amended June 29, 2012; amended Jan. 31, 2014.)
- **40-1-48.** Risk-based capital instructions for health organizations. The following document prepared by the national association of insurance commissioners is hereby adopted by reference:

"2012 NAIC health risk-based capital report including overview and instructions for companies as of December 31, 2012," including the appendices and excluding the unnumbered page titled "companion products" and the preceding unnumbered page; the letter dated August 29, 2012 to health risk-based capital vendors from Eva Yeung; the health risk-based capital newsletter, volume 14.1, dated August 2012; pages i and ii; the paragraph titled "trend test" on page 29; the health risk-based capital forecasting spreadsheet instructions; and the "health forecasting" CD-ROM attached to the inside back cover. # Article 3.—FIRE AND CASUALTY INSURANCE

- **40-3-59.** Workers compensation policies. (a) For the purpose of this regulation and K.S.A. 40-955 and amendments thereto, each of the following terms shall have the meaning specified in this subsection:
- (1) "Advisory organization" means an entity licensed by the commissioner for the reporting of claims and experience data for the administration of the workers compensation experience rating system.

- (2) "Client" has the meaning specified in L. 2012, ch. 142, § 2, and amendments thereto.
- (3) "Covered employee" has the meaning specified in L. 2012, ch. 142, § 2, and amendments thereto.
- (4) "Master policy" means a single policy issued to a professional employer organization or professional employer group for the covered employees and any direct-hire employees of the professional employer organization or the professional employer group.
- (5) "Multiple coordinate policy" means an agreement under which a separate policy is issued to or on behalf of each client or group of affiliated clients of a professional employer organization or a professional employer group, but payment of obligations and certain policy communications are coordinated through the professional employer organization or the professional employer group. This term is also known as a "multiple coordinated policy."
- (6) "Professional employer group" has the meaning specified in L. 2012, ch. 142, § 2, and amendments thereto.
- (7) "Professional employer organization" has the meaning specified in L. 2012, ch. 142, § 2, and amendments thereto.
- (8) "Shared employment relationship" means "co-employment relationship" as defined in L. 2012, ch. 142, § 2, and amendments thereto.
- (b) When submitting a master policy to the commissioner for examination, the insurer's filing shall include a detailed rule stating the manner in which the insurer will track and report payroll and claims data for each client to the advisory organization in a manner that identifies both the client and the professional employer organization and that is acceptable to the advisory organization. The adjustment of annual premiums based on previous loss experience, which is also known as experience rating modification, shall be calculated for each client as if the client were the sole employer of the client's covered employees. Failure of the insurer to provide this detailed rule with the insurer's filing to the commissioner shall result in the disapproval of the master policy.
- (c) Each master policy shall cover only one professional employer organization or professional employer group.
- (d) Each master policy shall be issued in the name of the professional employer organization or professional employer group and shall require that each covered client hold a certificate of coverage identifying that client as an alternate employer.
- (e) Each insurer or its authorized representative shall issue a certificate of coverage to each client covered under a master policy. Each certificate of coverage shall meet the following requirements:
- (1) The certificate of coverage shall specify the effective date of the client's coverage and the expiration date of the underlying master policy. A renewal certificate of coverage shall be issued to each client each time the master policy is renewed. If the insurer cancels the master policy for nonpayment of premium, the insurer shall give the professional employer organization or professional employer group and each client at least 10 days' written notice before the effective date of cancellation.

- (2) The certificate of coverage shall provide that the client is entitled to 30 days' notice before coverage can be cancelled or nonrenewed with the client's consent, unless either of the following conditions is met:
- (A) Replacement coverage is provided by the professional employer organization or professional employer group with no break in coverage.
- (B) The insurer has notified the client when the certificate of coverage is first issued that the master policy will be cancelled or nonrenewed in less than 30 days.
- (f) Cancellation or nonrenewal of a client's coverage at the initiative of the professional employer organization or professional employer group without the written consent of the client shall not be effective, unless at least one of the following conditions is met:
- (1) The insurer has given at least 30 days' advance notice to the client.
- (2) The professional employer organization or professional employer group has given at least 30 days' advance notice to the insurer and the client.
- (3) Coverage for all covered clients has been replaced with no break in coverage, and the professional employer organization has given advance notice to the insurer and
- (g) Each professional employer organization or professional employer group shall be responsible for payment to the insurer of any premiums, policyholder assessments, and deductible reimbursement charges under a master policy or a multiple coordinated policy, whether or not the professional employer organization or professional employer group has received timely payment from the client. A client's failure to pay any fees to the professional employer organization or professional employer group when the fees are due shall not constitute nonpayment of premium pursuant to K.S.A. 40-2,120, and amendments thereto, or K.A.R. 40-3-15. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 40-955; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 40-955; effective Jan. 31, 2014.)

## Article 16.—PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYER **ORGANIZATIONS**

**40-16-1.** Professional employer organizations; definition. For the purpose of this article, "act" shall mean professional employer organization registration act. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and L. 2012, ch. 142, sec. 10; implementing L. 2012, ch. 142, sec. 1; effective Jan. 31,

# 40-16-2. Professional employer organizations; fees. The following fees shall be paid to the department:

- (a) For each professional employer organization, the following fees:
  - (1) For an initial application for registration, \$1,000;
  - (2) for a renewal application for registration, \$500; and
- (3) for an initial or a renewal application for limited registration, \$500; and
- (b) for each professional employer group, the following
- (1) For an initial application for registration, \$1,000 for each professional employer organization within the professional employer group that would otherwise be required to individually register under the act;
- (2) for a renewal application for registration, \$500 for each professional employer organization within the professional employer group that would otherwise be required to individually register under the act; and
- (3) for an initial or a renewal application for limited registration, \$500 for each professional employer organization within the professional employer group that would otherwise be required to individually register under the act. (Authorized by K.S.A. 40-103 and L. 2012, ch. 142, sec. 10; implementing L. 2012, ch. 142, sec. 5; effective Jan. 31, 2014.)
