## Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulation

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, August 21, at the Kansas Wetlands Education Center, 592 N.E. K157 Highway, Great Bend, to consider the approval and adoption of a proposed regulation of the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism.

A general discussion and workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission will begin at 1 p.m. August 21 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at approximately 5 p.m. then resume at 6:30 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing and more business. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meeting for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business may also be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete business matters, the Commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. August 22 at the location listed above.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting and may request the meeting materials in an accessible format. The regulation that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting is as follows:
K.A.R. 115-4-4. This permanent regulation establishes legal equipment and taking methods for big game hunting. The proposed amendments would allow the use of dogs to track wounded or dead big game animals.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendment to the regulation is not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

## Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Friday, September 5, in the office of the Director of Property Valuation, fourth floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider amendments to K.A.R. 93-4-2, 93-4-3, 93-4-4, 93-4-5 and 93-4-6, rules and regulations of the secretary of revenue pertaining to the Kansas real estate ratio study act.
This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Pete Davis, Ratio Study Supervisor, Division of Property Valuation, fourth floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612-1585 (pete.davis@kdor.ks.gov).

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, orally or in writing, concerning the adoption of the proposed amendments during the hearing. In order to give all persons an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentations to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed amendments and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Request for accommodation to participate in the hearing should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Pete Davis at 785-296-2365. Handicapped parking is located in State Parking Lot No. 2, southeast of the Docking State Office Building facing 10th Street, and the east entrance to the Docking State Office Building is accessible.
A summary of the proposed amendments and their economic impact follows:

93-4-2. Annotation and disposition of real estate sales validation questionnaires; duties of county officials. This regulation is revised to require register of deeds to annotate each real estate sales validation questionnaire with the type of instrument being recorded. Additionally, it is revised to allow register of deeds to retain a one-part real estate sales validation questionnaire when the register of deeds has been authorized by the director of property valuation to process questionnaires by electronic imaging and to allow an electronic copy to be retained if questionnaires are received by means of digital media transmission and retained in an electronic document management system. The costs are currently borne by counties and there will be no additional costs as a result of this revision. Handling documents digitally may represent a cost savings to many counties. There will be no economic impact on the general public.

93-4-3. Split and combined real estate parcel sales; duties of county officials. This regulation is revised to require county appraisers to enter sales information regard-
ing a split or combined real estate sale on the parent parcel when the real estate sales validation is received prior to the creation of working files for the next appraisal year. After the creation of working files for the next appraisal year, the county appraiser is required to enter sales information in the county's computer-assessed mass appraisal system. The costs are currently borne by counties and there will be no additional costs as a result of this revision. There will be no economic impact on the general public.

93-4-4. Assemblage and entering of sales data; accounting for real estate sales validation questionnaires; duties of county officials. This regulation is revised to require county appraisers to electronically upload the recorded monthly sales data from the county's computerassisted mass appraisal system to the current year's ratio study database at the division of property valuation, not later than the 15th day of the following month. Also, it is revised to require county appraisers to submit the complete set of sales validation questionnaire documents recorded in the previous month to the director of property valuation or the director's agents or, alternatively, to electronically upload the complete set of recorded monthly sales as digital image files to the sales validation questionnaire database at the division of property valuation. The costs are currently borne by counties and there will be no additional costs as a result of this revision. Handling documents digitally may represent a cost savings to many counties. There will be no economic impact on the general public.
93-4-5. Access to county records by the director of property valuation; duties of county officials. This regulation is revised to require county appraisers to prepare and submit the electronic assessment administration file of all appraised values to the director of property valuation not later than three business days after the mailing of the annual real property valuation notices. The costs are currently borne by counties and there will be no additional costs as a result of this revision. There will be no economic impact on the general public.

93-4-6. Performance standards. Table 2-3 of the standard on ratio studies, approved by the executive board of the international association of assessing officers in April 2013, is adopted with modifications. The table is modified to require the coefficient of dispersion to have a range of 5.0 to 20.0 , with a confidence level of 95 percent. As modified, the table sets forth the uniformity standards that county appraisers are required to maintain in valuing property for ad valorem property tax purposes. The costs are currently borne by counties and there will be no additional costs as a result of this revision. There will be no economic impact on the general public.

10-10-5. Electronic reporting by district courts. This regulation currently requires district courts to electronically report all case filings and dispositions for violations of K.S.A. $8-1567$ or K.S.A. 8-1025, and amendments thereto, to the central repository.

The proposed amendment to this regulation will require district courts to electronically submit case filings and dispositions for violations of additional statutes. Those statutes are as follows: K.S.A. 21-5426, K.S.A. 216419, K.S.A. 21-6420, K.S.A. 21-6421 and K.S.A. 21-6422.

This amendment is not anticipated to have any economic impact, as district courts are currently submitting filings and dispositions electronically to the central repository.

K.A.R. 123-6-105. Good time credit rate for offenses committed before July 1, 2014. Amendment to this regulation provides that the current $30 \%$ good time credit
rate, capped at the juvenile offender matrix minimum, will only apply to those offenses committed before July 1, 2014.
Economic Impact: This amendment requires no additional resources for the Kansas Department of Corrections and maintains the current good time credit rate scheme, but only for those offenses committed prior to July 1, 2014. This amendment will have no economic impact.
K.A.R. 123-6-105a. Good time credit rate for offenses committed on and after July 1, 2014. This is a new regulation that retains the current $30 \%$ good time credit rate, but authorizes such good time credit to reduce a juvenile offender's sentence to below the juvenile offender matrix minimum. This amendment gives effect to 2014 HB 2588.

Economic Impact: This new regulation will require programming for the JCFS computer database to correctly account for the new good time rate chart. This cost can be absorbed in the existing agency budget. It might be anticipated that the average daily offender population at the two juvenile correctional facilities will decrease with the additional amount of good time credit available to offenders under this new regulation. However, because future juvenile court sentences cannot be predicted, it is not possible to determine the amount of the decrease in bed space and any resulting cost savings.

## Article 2.-AMBULANCE SERVICES; PERMITS AND REGULATIONS

109-2-7. Ground ambulance staffing. Each operator shall staff each licensed ground ambulance in accordance with the board's regulations.
(a) Each operator of a type I ambulance service shall staff each type I ambulance with at least two attendants during patient transport.
(1) At least one attendant shall be one of the following medical personnel:
(A) A paramedic;
(B) a physician;
(C) a licensed physician's assistant;
(D) a licensed professional nurse; or
(E) a licensed advanced practice registered nurse.
(2) The second attendant may be any of the following:
(A) An emergency medical technician;
(B) an emergency medical technician-intermediate;
(C) an emergency medical technician-defibrillator;
(D) an emergency medical technician-Intermediate/defibrillator;
(E) an advanced emergency medical technician;
(F) licensed physician's assistant;
(G) a physician; or
(H) a licensed professional nurse.
(b) Each operator of a type II ambulance service shall staff each type II ambulance with at least two attendants. During patient transport, one of the following shall provide care to the patient in the patient compartment:
(1) An emergency medical technician;
(2) an emergency medical technician-intermediate;
(3) an emergency medical technician-defibrillator;
(4) an advanced emergency medical technician;
(5) a paramedic;
(6) a physician;
(7) a licensed physician's assistant;
(8) a licensed professional nurse; or
(9) a licensed advanced practice registered nurse.
(c) Each operator of a type IIA ambulance service shall staff each ambulance with at least two attendants. In addition, when appropriate staffing is available, ALS, as defined in K.A.R. 109-1-1, may be provided with the appropriate equipment and protocols. One of the following shall provide patient care appropriate to the patient's condition in the patient compartment during patient transport:
(1)(A) For BLS transports, as BLS is defined in K.A.R. 109-1-1, a care provider who is at or above the level of an emergency medical technician; and
(B) for ALS transports, a care provider who is at or above the level of an emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-defibrillator, emergency medical technician-I/D, or advanced emergency medical technician;
(2) a paramedic;
(3) a physician;
(4) a licensed physician's assistant;
(5) a licensed professional nurse; or
(6) a licensed advanced practice registered nurse.
(d)(1) Each operator of a type V ambulance service shall staff each type V ground ambulance with a driver and at least the following:
(A) A licensed professional nurse or a physician; and
(B) any of the following:
(i) A paramedic;
(ii) a physician;
(iii) a licensed physician's assistant;
(iv) a licensed professional nurse;
(v) a licensed advanced practice registered nurse; or
(vi) a licensed respiratory therapist.

Additional staffing shall be commensurate with the patient's care needs as determined by the service's medical adviser or as described in the service's medical protocols. The medical personnel shall remain in the patient compartment during patient transport.
(2) When providing critical care transports as defined in K.A.R. 109-1-1, at least one of the medical personnel on each type V ambulance shall be currently certified in advanced cardiac life support by a certifying entity approved by the board.
(3) When performing neonatal or pediatric missions, at least one of the medical personnel on each type V ambulance shall be currently certified in advanced life support for neonatal and pediatric patients by a certifying entity approved by the board.
(4) When responding to the scene of an accident or medical emergency, not including transports between medical facilities, at least one of the medical personnel on each type $V$ ambulance shall be certified in one of the following areas:
(A) Advanced trauma life support (ATLS);
(B) transport professional advanced trauma course (TPATC);
(C) trauma nurse core course (TNCC);
(D) critical care emergency medical transport program (CCEMTP);
(E) pre-hospital trauma life support (PHTLS); or
(F) advanced care and trauma transport (ACTT). (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6110; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6110, K.S.A. 65-6128, and K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-6135; effective May 1, 1985; amended May 1, 1987; amended, T-88-24, July 15, 1987; amended May 1, 1988; amended Aug. 27, 1990; amended Feb. 3, 1992; amended Jan. 31, 1997; amended July 7, 2014.)

109-2-11. Standards for type $V$ air ambulances and equipment. (a) The operator shall ensure that the patient compartment is configured in such a way that air medical personnel have adequate access to the patient in order to begin and maintain care commensurate with the patient's needs. The operator shall ensure that the air ambulance has adequate access and necessary space to maintain the patient's airway and to provide adequate ventilatory support by an attendant from the secured, seat-belted position within the air ambulance.
(b) Each air ambulance operator shall have a policy that addresses climate control of the aircraft for the comfort and safety of both the patient and air medical personnel.

The air medical crew shall take precautions to prevent temperature extremes that could adversely affect patient care.
(c) The operator shall equip each type $V$ air ambulance with the following:
(1) Either two portable functioning flashlights or a flashlight and one spotlight;
(2) a cot with an elevating head and at least three safety straps with locking mechanisms or an isolette;
(3) one emesis basin or convenience bag;
(4) one complete change of linen;
(5) one blanket;
(6) one waterproof cot cover; and
(7) a "no smoking" sign posted in the aircraft.
(d) Each fixed-wing air ambulance shall have a twoway communications system that is readily accessible to both the medical personnel and the pilot and that meets the following requirements:
(1) Allows communication between the aircraft and air traffic control systems; and
(2) allows air medical personnel to communicate at all times with medical control, exclusive of the air traffic control system.
(e) The pilot or pilots shall be sufficiently isolated from the patient care area to minimize in-flight distractions and interference.
(f) The operator shall equip each type V air ambulance with an internal medical system that includes the following:
(1) An internal oxygen system with at least one outlet per patient located inside the patient compartment and with at least 2,500 liters of storage capacity with a minimum of 200 psi. The pressure gauge, regulator control valve, and humidifying accessories shall be readily accessible to attendants and medical personnel from inside the patient compartment during in-flight operations;
(2) an electrically powered suction aspirator system with an airflow of at least 30 liters per minute and a vacuum of at least 300 millimeters of mercury. The unit shall be equipped with large-bore, nonkinking suction tubing and a semirigid, nonmetallic oropharyngeal suction tip; and
(3) oxygen flowmeters and outlets that are padded, flush-mounted, or located to prevent injury to air medical personnel, unless helmets are worn by all crew members during all phases of flight operations.
(g) The operator shall equip each type $V$ air ambulance with the following:
(1) A portable oxygen unit of at least 300-liter storage capacity complete with pressure gauge and flowmeter with a minimum of 200 psi. The unit shall be readily accessible from inside the patient compartment;
(2) a portable, self-contained battery or manual suction aspirator with an airflow of at least 28 liters per minute and a vacuum of at least 300 millimeters of mercury. The unit shall be fitted with large-bore, nonkinking suction tubing and a semirigid, nonmetallic, oropharyngeal suction tip;
(3) medical supplies and equipment that include the following:
(A) Airway management equipment, including tracheal intubation equipment, adult, pediatric, and infant bag-valve masks, and ventilatory support equipment;
(B) a cardiac monitor capable of defibrillating and an extra battery or power source;
(C) cardiac advanced life support drugs and therapeutic modalities, as indicated by the ambulance service's medical protocols;
(D) neonate specialty equipment and supplies for neonatal missions and as indicated by the ambulance service's medical protocols;
(E) trauma advanced life support supplies and treatment modalities, as indicated in the ambulance service's medical protocols; and
(F) a pulse oximeter and an intravenous infusion pump; and
(4) blood-borne and body fluid pathogen protection equipment as described in K.A.R. 109-2-8.
(h) If an operator's medical protocols are amended, the operator shall submit these changes to the board with a letter of approval pursuant to K.S.A. 65-6112 (r), and amendments thereto, within 15 days of implementation of the change.
(i) Equipment and supplies obtained on a trial basis or for temporary use by the operator shall not be required to be reported to the board by the operator. If the operator's medical equipment list is amended, the operator shall submit these changes to the board within 15 days with a letter of approval from the ambulance service's medical director.
(j) Each air ambulance operator shall ensure that each air ambulance has on board, at all times, appropriate survival equipment for the mission and terrain of the ambulance service's geographic area of operations.
(k) Each air ambulance operator shall ensure that the aircraft has an adequate interior lighting system so that patient care can be provided and the patient's status can be monitored without interfering with the pilot's vision. The air ambulance operator shall ensure that the aircraft cockpit is capable of being shielded from light in the patient care area during night operations or that red lighting or a reduced lighting level is also provided for the pilot and air ambulance personnel.
(l) Each aircraft shall have at least one stretcher that meets the following requirements:
(1) Accommodates a patient who is up to six feet tall and weighs 212 pounds;
(2) is capable of elevating the patient's head at least 30 degrees for patient care and comfort;
(3) has three securing straps for adult patients; and
(4) has a specifically designed mechanism for securing pediatric patients.
(m) Each air ambulance operator shall ensure that all equipment, stretchers, and seating are so arranged as not to block rapid egress by air medical personnel or patients from the aircraft. The operator shall ensure that all equipment on board the aircraft is affixed or secured in either approved racks or compartments or by strap restraint while the aircraft is in operation.
(n) The aircraft shall have an electric inverter or appropriate power source that is sufficient to power patientspecific medical equipment without compromising the operation of any electrical aircraft equipment.
(continued)
(o) When an isolette is used during patient transport, the operator shall ensure that the isolette is able to be opened from its secured in-flight position in order to provide full access to the infant.
(p) Each air ambulance operator shall ensure that all medical equipment is maintained according to the manufacturer's recommendations and does not interfere with the aircraft's navigation or onboard systems.
$(q)(1)$ Each operator of a type $V$ ambulance service shall staff each type V air ambulance with a pilot and one of the following groups of individuals, who shall remain in the patient compartment during patient transport:
(A) At least two of the following: physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or professional nurse; or
(B) one of the individuals listed in paragraph (q)(1)(A) and one of the following:
(i) An MICT or paramedic; or
(ii) an optional staff member commensurate with the patient's care needs, as determined by
the ambulance service's medical director or as described in the ambulance service's medical protocols, who shall be health care personnel as defined in K.A.R. 109-1-1. The medical personnel shall remain in the patient compartment during patient transport.
(2)(A) When providing critical care transports as defined in K.A.R. 109-1-1, at least one of the medical personnel specified in paragraphs $(q)(1)(A)$ and $(B)$ shall be currently certified in advanced cardiac life support by a certifying entity approved by the board.
(B) When performing neonatal or pediatric missions, at least one of the medical personnel specified in paragraphs $(q)(1)(A)$ and (B) shall be currently certified in advanced life support for neonatal and pediatric patients by a certifying entity approved by the board.
(C) When responding to the scene of an accident or medical emergency, not including transports between medical facilities, at least one of the medical personnel specified in paragraphs (q)(1)(A) and (B) shall be certified in one of the following areas by a certifying entity approved by the board:
(i) International trauma life support-advanced (ITLSA);
(ii) transport professional advanced trauma course (TPATC);
(iii) trauma nurse core course (TNCC);
(iv) certified flight registered nurse (CFRN);
(v) certified transport registered nurse (CTRN);
(vi) pre-hospital trauma life support (PHTLS);
(vii) advanced care and trauma transport (ACTT);
(viii) critical care emergency medical technician paramedic (CCEMTP); or

## Article 7.-KANSAS-ONLY ONLINE GAMES

111-7-261. Keno doubler promotion. (a) The Kansas lottery may conduct a Keno promotion entitled "Keno Doubler Promotion" offering Kansas lottery players the opportunity to win double the prize amount won on certain Keno tickets.
(b) The term of the "Keno Doubler Promotion" shall begin on March 12, 2014, at 5 a.m. through the end of the lottery business day on March 23, 2014, which "business day '" concludes at 2:00 a.m. on March 24, 2014. The term of the "Keno Doubler Promotion" shall mean the time during which qualifying Keno tickets may be purchased by lottery players.
(c) A qualifying Keno ticket purchased during the term of the promotion shall be utilized by the player to play a Keno game at a time which is subsequent to purchase of the ticket. Any Keno ticket with multiple draws purchased prior to the term of the promotion shall not be eligible to win a double prize in this promotion. Any Keno ticket with multiple draws purchased before the end of the promotion term with draws after the promotion ended will still be eligible to win a double prize in this promotion.
(d) Keno tickets eligible to win double a prize amount during "Keno Doubler Promotion" and according to the terms of the promotion shall be offered for sale at any Kansas lottery retail selling location which offers the Kansas lottery Keno product to its players.
(e) On every twentieth Keno ticket sold during the promotion which is eligible to win a double prize amount, a qualifying message shall be printed on the ticket front. The qualifying message printed on the ticket front shall read, "Congratulations! Any prizes won on this ticket will be doubled! Good luck! Some exclusions apply."
(f) Keno tickets that shall be excluded from printing a qualifying message and winning a double prize amount during the promotion are: progressive jackpot game on 6 of 6 -spot Keno, progressive jackpot game on 7 of 7 -spot Keno, 8 of 8 -spot Keno, 10 of 10 -spot Keno, and any Keno ticket included in the 6 -pack sampler Keno ticket package.
(g) Any prize amount won on a qualifying doubler Keno ticket which is sold during the term of the promotion shall be double the prize amount won for the game played.
(h) Only Kansas lottery Keno tickets purchased by a player during the term of the promotion which contain a qualifying printed message on the ticket front as specified in subsection (e) and which are not excluded from the promotion as provided in these rules shall be eligible to win double the prize amount won for a qualifying Keno game.
(i) Keno tickets sold by lottery retailers that are eligible to win a double prize amount during this promotion shall not be eligible to be cancelled after the ticket is printed by a Kansas lottery retailer.
