The proposed changes would also increase the cost of the approval of a single continuing nursing
education offering from $\$ 50$ to $\$ 100$. The proposed changes include changing "renewal" to "report" for the annual approval for nursing schools and continuing nursing education providers.

There will be a $\$ 300$ increase for all new applications for nursing programs in Kansas and an increase of \$50 for all single continuing nursing education offering providers in Kansas. The economic impact for any public or private college for an application for the approval of a new nursing program will increase $\$ 300$. The economic impact for any organization for the approval of a single continuing nursing education offering will increase by $\$ 50$. The economic impact to the Board of Nursing will be approximately a fiscal increase of $\$ 2,050$ a year.

K.A.R. 68-16-2. This regulation set out the requirements of who could participate in the Cancer Drug Repository Program.
K.A.R. $68-16-3$. This regulation set out the requirements of what drugs could be donated to the Cancer Drug Repository Program.
K.A.R. 68-16-4. This regulation set out the requirements of dispensing and packaging of drugs that were donated through the Cancer Drug Repository Program.
K.A.R. 68-16-5. This regulation set out the handling fees that could be charged for dispensing drugs through the Cancer Drug Repository Program.
K.A.R. 68-16-6. This regulation set forth the forms that would be used when distributing and dispensing donated drugs.
K.A.R. 68-16-7. This regulation stated the penalty for selling drugs that had been donated to the Cancer Drug Repository Program.
K.A.R. 68-16-8. This regulation set forth the recordkeeping requirements for those participating in the Cancer Drug Repository Program.
K.A.R. 68-16-9. This regulation set forth the forms that would be used for individuals receiving drugs from the Cancer Drug Repository Program.

Economic Impact. The adoption of these amendments does not have any additional economic impact to the Board of Pharmacy. ## Article 21.-PRESCRIPTION MONITORING PROGRAM

68-2 1-7. Drugs of concern. (a) Each of the following shall be classified as a drug of concern:
(1) Any product containing all three of these drugs: butalbital, acetaminophen, and caffeine;
(2) any compound, mixture, or preparation that contains any detectable quantity of ephedrine, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers and is exempt from being reported to the statewide electronic logging system for the sale of methamphetamine precursors;
(3) any compound, mixture, or preparation that contains any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers and is exempt from being reported to the statewide electronic logging system for the sale of methamphetamine precursors; and
(4) promethazine with codeine.
(b) Any individual who wants to have a drug added to the program for monitoring may submit a written request to the board.
This regulation shall take effect 90 days after publication in the Kansas register. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-1692; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-1682; effective Oct. 15, 2010; amended Feb. 4, 2015.)
