for Architectural Services**

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for architectural services for renovations and a new addition for the Kelce College of Business on the Pittsburg State University campus in Pittsburg, Kansas. The project includes renovation and additions to Kelce Hall on the corner of Broadway and Cleveland Streets at the front door of campus. An Architectural Building Program will need to be developed as part of the services as the first step in the design process. Currently, a project budget has been identified of \$15,000,000. Project square footages will be established and the budget will be confirmed during the Architectural Building Program development.

Once the program is approved by the Kansas Board of Regents, design will commence through Design Development. A Design Development submittal package will include an itemized cost estimate and 3D renderings to provide visual tools for use in fund-raising the remaining balance needed to proceed with the project. The design services contract will be executed only through Design Development. Once the funds are in place the design services contract may be amended to proceed with remaining services through construction administration.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Coffeyville Municipal Light & Power Generating Facility No. 2 has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300. Emissions of nitrogen oxides (NO_x), carbon monoxide, (CO), sulfur oxides (SO_x), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), hazardous air pollutants (HAPs), particulate matter (PM) and PM with aerodynamic diameter less than or equal to 10 micrometers (PM₁₀) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Coffeyville Municipal Light & Power Generating Facility No. 2, P.O. Box 1629, Coffeyville, KS, 67337 is proposing to construct a 56.0-megawatt electric generating facility located at 2601 N. 5th Industrial St., Coffeyville, KS 67337, which will consist of three 18.76-MW natural-gas fired spark ignition four-stroke lean burn stationary reciprocating internal combustion engines, one 755-HP diesel-fired emergency generator, one 197-HP emergency diesel-fired fire pump engine, one 5.0-MMBtu/hr natural gas-fired dew point heater, one 500-gallon vertical fixed roof diesel storage tank, one 300-gallon fixed roof diesel storage tank and two circuit breakers.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review from the date of publication during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, and at the KDHE Southeast District Office, 1500 W. 7th St., Chanute. Notice of Hearing

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air, will conduct a public hearing, if requested, on Wednesday, October 7, in the Flint Hills Conference Room, third floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the State Implementation Plan (SIP) revision for the Cross-State Air Pollution Rule (CSAPR).

Any member of the public may request a public hearing or submit comments regarding this public action. If requested, this hearing will be held directly after the hearing for the new proposed air quality regulation K.A.R. 28-19-274, which is scheduled for 10 a.m. October 7. If no request for a hearing is received by September 25, the tentatively scheduled hearing will be cancelled with an announcement on the KDHE Bureau of Air website at <http://www.kdheks.gov/bar/planning/pnplanning.html>. Inquiries may be made to 785-296-8142 or zgraves@kdheks.gov. A summary of the SIP revision and the estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of the SIP revision:

KDHE is revising this SIP in order to assume allocation authority for the Kansas existing unit source allocations, new unit set-aside allocations, and Indian county new unit set-aside allocations in the Transport Rule (TR) Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) Annual Trading Program for the 2017-2019 control periods under the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's CSAPR. The SIP revision adjusts individual unit level allocations, which will replace the allocations from the existing budget established by the CSAPR Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) for the 2017-2019 control periods.

Economic Impact:

Cost to agency: There are no costs to KDHE to implement this proposed SIP revision. This revision was developed for the sole purpose to ensure industries within the state do not lose valuable NO_x annual allowance allocations.

Costs to the regulated community and consumers: There will be no additional cost burdens placed on either the regulated community or consumers due to the enactment of this SIP revision. The regulated community stands to gain NO_x annual allowance allocations, which can be traded on an open marketplace. If this SIP revision is not approved, those allocations will not be allotted to the regulated community and, consequently, the value would be lost.

Cost to other governmental agencies or units: There are no costs to other governmental agencies or units by implementing this proposed SIP revision.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the tentative hearing satisfies the 30-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed SIP revision. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to 5 p.m. on the day of the hearing to Zac Graves, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000

During the hearing, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed SIP revision as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. The proposed action consists of reissuance of an existing Kansas/NPDES Water Pollution Control permit for an existing facility. This is a site of a former cement manufacturing facility, cement kiln dust landfill, and limestone quarry that is being closed. No mining or manufacturing is being conducted at this site. Most support buildings and facilities have been dismantled, the materials and structures removed, and the site is undergoing restoration. Facilities that remain include administration building and parking area, an unused off-road vehicle/equipment maintenance building, and a small pile of crushed rock for road resurfacing projects. The cement kiln dust (CKD) landfill is undergoing closure with construction of a cap. Limestone quarrying has ceased but the quarry permit remains active until reclamation activities are approved by the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Division of Conservation. The proposed permit contains generic water-quality language to protect waters of the state.

K.A.R. 16-14-3. Computation of time. This regulation establishes the process for computing any time period prescribed by the Act. Since this regulation simply clarifies current policy, this regulation is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 16-14-4. Hearings. This regulation establishes the procedure for requesting a hearing on an order denying, suspending or revoking a scrap metal dealer application or registration. Since this regulation simply clarifies current policy, this regulation is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 16-14-5. Notice of hearing. This regulation establishes the notice of hearing requirement for denial, suspension or revocation hearings. Since this regulation simply clarifies current policy, this regulation is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 16-14-6. Service of order or notice. This regulation establishes the procedure for serving an order or notice, as required under the Act. Since this regulation simply clarifies current policy, this regulation is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 16-14-7. Hearing procedure. This regulation establishes the procedure to be followed at a hearing regarding the denial, suspension or revocation of a scrap metal dealer's application or registration. **Article 3.—GUIDELINES FOR THE
DETERMINATION OF RESIDENCY
FOR FEE PURPOSES**

88-3-8a. Military personnel and veterans. (a) "Armed forces" and "veteran" shall have the meanings specified in L. 2015, ch. 76, sec. 3, and amendments thereto.

(b) The resident fee privilege shall be accorded to any person who meets the following conditions:

(1) Is enrolled at any state educational institution, as defined by K.S.A. 76-711 and amendments thereto; and

(2) meets one of the following conditions:

(A) Is currently serving in the armed forces or is a veteran of the armed forces who is eligible for benefits under the federal post-9/11 veterans educational assistance act or any other federal law authorizing educational benefits for veterans; or

(B) is the spouse or dependent child of a person who qualifies for resident tuition rates and fees pursuant to paragraph (b)(2)(A) and who, if qualifying through a veteran, is eligible for benefits under the federal post-9/11 veterans educational assistance act or any other federal law authorizing educational benefits for veterans.

(c) This regulation shall not be construed to prevent a person covered by this regulation from acquiring or retaining a bona fide residence in Kansas.

(d) Each person seeking the resident fee privilege pursuant to this regulation shall be responsible for providing the appropriate office at the state educational institution at which the person seeks admission or is enrolling with the information and written evidence necessary to support the claim that the person meets the applicable requirements of L. 2015, ch. 76, sec. 3 and K.S.A. 76-729, and amendments thereto, and this regulation. This evidence shall include the following:

(1) If claiming current status in the armed forces, written evidence of that status;

(2) if claiming veteran status, the following:

(A) Written evidence of official separation from the armed forces and receipt of either an honorable discharge or a general discharge under honorable conditions;

(B) written evidence that the veteran qualifies for benefits under the federal post-9/11 veterans educational assistance act or any other federal law authorizing educational benefits for veterans;

(C) written evidence that the veteran lives or will live in Kansas while attending the state educational institution; and

(D) a letter signed by the veteran attesting an intent to become a resident of Kansas;

(3) if claiming spouse or dependent child status based upon the relationship to a current member of the armed forces, the following:

(A) Written evidence of the required relationship to the current member of the armed forces; and

(B) written evidence that the member of the armed forces is currently serving; and

(4) if claiming spouse or dependent child status based upon a relationship with a veteran, the following:

(A) Written evidence of the required relationship to the veteran;

(B) written evidence that the veteran was separated from the armed forces and received either an honorable discharge or a general discharge under honorable conditions;

(C) written evidence that the spouse or dependent child qualifies for benefits under the federal post-9/11 veterans educational assistance act or any other federal law authorizing educational benefits for veterans;

(D) written evidence that the spouse or dependent child of the veteran lives or will live in Kansas while that person is a student attending the state educational institution; and

(E) a written letter signed by the spouse or dependent child of the veteran, attesting that the spouse or dependent child intends to become a resident of Kansas. (Authorized by K.S.A. 76-730; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 76-729, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 76, sec. 4, and K.S.A. 76-730; effective July 27, 2007; amended Jan. 18, 2013; amended, T-88-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

(a) Each institution shall determine residency, for state aid purposes, pursuant to statutes or regulations that apply to determination of residency by the institutions, including, for community colleges, K.S.A. 71-406 and K.S.A. 71-407 and amendments thereto. The factors that may be considered in determining residency for state aid purposes shall include, when applicable or appropriate, a Kansas driver's license, evidence of payment of Kansas real estate taxes, payment of Kansas income taxes, reliance on Kansas sources for support, acceptance of permanent employment in Kansas, ownership of a home in Kansas, registration to vote in Kansas, and commitment to an educational program that indicates an intent to maintain a permanent presence in Kansas upon graduation.

(b) The governing board of each institution shall consider L. 2015, ch. 76, sec. 3, and amendments thereto, when setting tuition rates based on residency. Temporary Administrative Regulations

Article 14.—SCRAP METAL DEALERS' REGISTRATION AND HEARING PROCEDURE

16-14-1. Fees. Each applicant or registrant shall pay one of the following nonrefundable fees, as applicable, for registration of each place of business for which a registration is sought:

- (a) Scrap metal dealer's initial registration certificate \$1,000
- (b) Annual renewal of a scrap metal dealer's registration certificate \$1,000

(Authorized by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 50-6,112a, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 15; effective, T-16-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

16-14-2. Initial application. (a) Each person seeking an initial registration certificate shall submit an application that consists of the following:

- (1) An initial application form provided by the attorney general and fully completed by the applicant;
- (2) payment of the initial registration certificate fee specified in K.A.R. 16-14-1; and
- (3) a copy of the applicant's current state or federal government-issued photographic identification.

(b) An application for an initial registration certificate shall be deemed incomplete if the application fails to include all information required by the application form and if the applicant fails to submit the items required in paragraphs (a)(2) and (3). If the applicant fails to provide all missing information, documents, and the applicable fee within 30 days of notification by the attorney general that the application is incomplete, the application shall be deemed abandoned, and all fees accompanying the application shall be retained by the attorney general and shall not be refunded to the applicant. (Authorized by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 50-6,112a, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 15; effective, T-16-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

16-14-3. Computation of time. (a) In computing any period of time prescribed by the scrap metal theft reduction act or this article concerning registration, the day of the action or default from which the designated period of time begins to run shall not be included. The last day of the period so computed shall be included, unless that day is a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, in which event the period shall include the end of the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.

(b) Unless otherwise specified in this article, each of the following terms shall have the meaning specified in this subsection:

- (1) "Day" means calendar day and not business day. Intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays shall be included in the computation.
- (2) "Business day" means any day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.
- (3) "Legal holiday" shall include any day designated as a holiday by any Kansas statute or regulation.

(c) If the attorney general's office is not open to the public on the last day of any time period prescribed by this article, the time period shall be extended until the next business day on which the attorney general's office is open for business. (Authorized by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 50-6,112c, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 17; effective, T-16-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

16-14-4. Hearings. Any applicant or registered scrap metal dealer may request a hearing on an order denying, suspending, or revoking that individual's application or registration by submitting a written request for a hearing to the attorney general's office within 15 days of the date of service of the order denying, suspending, or revoking the registration. (Authorized by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 50-6,112c, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 17; effective, T-16-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

16-14-5. Notice of hearing. The time and place of each hearing shall be set at least 10 days before the hearing. Notice of the hearing shall be provided to all parties. (Authorized by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 50-6,112c, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 17; effective, T-16-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

16-14-6. Service of order or notice. (a) Service of an order or notice shall be made upon each party and, if any, each party's attorney of record by delivering a copy of the order or notice to the person to be served or by mailing a copy of the order or notice by first-class mail to the person at the person's last known address. Service shall be presumed if the attorney general, or the attorney general's designee, delivers a written certificate of service. Delivery of a copy of an order or notice to a person shall mean handing the order or notice to the person or leaving the order or notice at the person's principal place of business or residence with a responsible person who works or resides there. Service by mail shall be complete upon mailing.

(b) Whenever a party has the right or is required to perform an action within a prescribed period after service of a notice or order and the notice or order is served by mail, three days shall be added to the prescribed period. (Authorized by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 50-6,112c, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 17; effective, T-16-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

16-14-7. Hearing procedure. The following provisions shall apply at each hearing:

- (a) The proceedings shall be conducted by the attorney general or the attorney general's designee.
- (b) To the extent necessary for full disclosure of all relevant facts and issues, each party shall have the opportunity to respond, present evidence and argument, conduct cross-examination, and submit rebuttal evidence, except as restricted by a limited grant of intervention or by the prehearing order.
- (c) Nonparties may be given an opportunity by the attorney general or the attorney general's designee to present oral or written statements. Each party shall be given an opportunity to challenge or rebut these statements. On motion of any party, the statements shall be required by

the attorney general or the attorney general’s designee to be given under oath or affirmation.

(d) The hearing may occur by telephone or other electronic means, if each participant in the hearing has an opportunity to participate in the entire proceeding while it is taking place.

(e) The hearing shall be recorded at the expense of the attorney general’s office. The attorney general’s office shall not be required at its own expense to prepare a transcript, unless required to do so by a provision of law. Any party, at the party’s expense and subject to any reasonable conditions that the attorney general’s office may establish, may cause a person other than the attorney general’s office to prepare a transcript from the record or cause additional recordings to be made during the hearing.

(f) Each hearing shall be open to public observation, except to the limited extent as determined by the attorney general or the attorney general’s designee, that it is necessary to close parts of the hearing pursuant to any provision of law requiring confidentiality or expressly authorizing closure. (Authorized by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 1; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 50-6,112c, as amended by L. 2015, ch. 96, sec. 17; effective, T-16-8-10-15, Aug. 10, 2015.)

16-14-8. Evidence. (a) At each hearing, the parties shall not be bound by technical rules of evidence, and the parties shall have reasonable opportunity to be heard and to present evidence. The attorney general or the attorney general’s designee shall act reasonably and without partiality. The rules of privilege recognized by law shall be followed by the attorney general or the attorney general’s designee. Evidence shall not be required to be excluded solely because the evidence is hearsay.

(b) All testimony of parties and witnesses shall be given under oath or affirmation. The power to administer an oath or affirmation for that purpose shall reside with the attorney general or the attorney general’s designee.

(c) Any statements presented by nonparties in accordance with this article may be received as evidence.

(d) Any part of the evidence may be received in written form if doing so will expedite the hearing without substantial prejudice to the interests of any party.

(e) Documentary evidence may be received in the form of a copy or excerpt. Upon request, the parties shall be given an opportunity to compare the copy with the original if the original is available.

(f) Official notice may be taken of the following:

(1) Any matter that could be judicially noticed in Kansas courts;

(2) the record of other proceedings before the attorney general or the attorney general’s designee;

(3) technical or scientific matters within the specialized knowledge of the attorney general’s office; and

(4) codes or standards that have been adopted by an agency of the United States, of Kansas, or of another state or by a nationally recognized organization or association.

(g) The parties shall be notified before or during the hearing, or before the issuance of any order that is based in whole or in part on matters or material noticed, of the specific matters or material noticed and the source thereof, including any staff memoranda and data. The parties shall be afforded an opportunity to contest and rebut the matters or material so noticed. 16-14-9. Default. If the party requesting a hearing defaults by failing to attend or participate in a hearing or any other stage of an adjudicative proceeding, the request for a hearing shall be dismissed and the order denying, suspending, or revoking the registration shall become final.
