Request for Comments

The following ICFsMR cost center limits are being set forth for public comment. Comments should be sent to Rhonda Boose, reimbursement manager, Financial and Information Services, 503 Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603. The comment period will expire 30 days from the publication of this notice.

K.A.R. 30-10-214 provides for the annual review and adjustment of Class II ICFsMR cost center limits, approved by the secretary of KDADS or designee, based on current cost information supplied by the enrolled, licensed providers of ICF-MR services, and formula set forth in the Kansas State Medicaid Plan (Attachment 4.19-D, Part II, Subpart O, page 1). The formula is as follows: Total allowable costs, including an inflation factor, are compared to the amount to be reimbursed under the current limits. The formula threshold requires that 60 percent of all ICFsMR are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs. If less than 60 percent of the facilities are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs, then the cost center limits are adjusted until the threshold is met. The inflation factor is based on the Data Resources, Inc. (DRI) WEFA, National Skilled Nursing Facility Total Market Basket Index.

To determine where to make the adjustments, two major cost centers are analyzed according to the following prescription:

- Administrative costs are based on facility size.
- Habilitation costs are based on facility size and level of care (LOC).

The cost analysis for 2015 showed that 80 percent of the Class II ICFsMR were being reimbursed 90 percent or more of their allowable costs. Per the state plan the analysis indicates that adjustments are not required.

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, December 1, in Room 560 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of amended administrative regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendments to the regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Board of Emergency Medical Services, Room 1031, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612, or by email to Curt.Shreckengaust@ems.ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed amendments to the regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentations to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. The regulations are being proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations follows:

K.A.R. 109-5-1, Continuing education, is a regulation that further defines continuing education for EMS attendants and educators. The purpose of this regulation is to address the acceptable forms of continuing education and the supporting documentation needed to validate the training courses taken.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-5-1a, Emergency medical responder continuing education standards, is a regulation that defines the continuing education requirements for renewal of an emergency medical responder certificate. The regulation was revised to appropriately reflect the continuing education standards approved by the board and adopted by reference.

There may be a minimal economic impact on other governmental agencies or private business if the agency or private business provides compensation for attendants to complete continuing education. There are four additional hours of continuing education to be obtained over each two-year period. There is not an anticipated economic impact for individuals not regulated by this board with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-5-1b, Emergency medical technician continuing education, is a regulation that defines the continuing education requirements for renewal of an emergency medical technician certificate. The regulation was revised to appropriately reflect the continuing education standards approved by the board and adopted by reference.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There may be a minimal economic impact on other governmental agencies or private business if the agency or private business provides compensation for attendants to complete continuing education. There are 12 additional hours of continuing education to be obtained over each two-year period. There is not an anticipated economic impact for individuals not regulated by this board with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-5-1c, Emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-defibrillator, emergency medical technician-intermediate and defibrillator, and advanced emergency medical technician continuing education, is a regulation that defines the continuing education requirements for renewal of an emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-defibrillator, emergency medical technician-intermediate and defibrillator, and advanced emergency medical technician certificate. The regulation was revised to appropriately reflect the continuing education standards approved by the board and adopted by reference.

There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revocation. There may be a minimal economic impact on other governmental agencies or private business if the agency or private business provides compensation for attendants to complete continuing education. There are 14 additional hours of continuing education to be obtained over each two-year period. There is not an anticipated economic impact for individuals not regulated by this board with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-5-1d, Paramedic continuing education, is a regulation that defines the continuing education requirements for renewal of a paramedic certificate. The regulation was revised to appropriately reflect the continuing education standards approved by the board and adopted by reference.

There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on emergency medical services attendants, agencies or other emergency medical services-related entities associated with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-5-2, Documentation of continuing education, is the regulation that defines the requirements of documentation for continuing education. The regulation is being revoked and all pertinent language has been appropriately inserted into other existing regulations.

There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on emergency medical services attendants, agencies or other emergency medical services-related entities associated with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-8-1, Examination, is the regulation that defines the requirements for the examination process for certification. This regulation was revised to better define the examination process for certification, specifically addressing the number of attempts allowed to pass the examination and the time frame for successful completion.

There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on emergency medical services attendants, agencies or other emergency medical services-related entities associated with this regulatory revision.

111-15-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery may conduct a lotto game entitled "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" beginning at 5:00 a.m. September 11, 2015, for a drawing to be conducted on December 31, 2015.

The rules and regulations for the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-15-1 through 111-15-11 and K.A.R. 111-15-21, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-12-7-10, Sept. 8, 2010; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012; amended, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013; amended, T-111-9-4-14, Aug. 13, 2014; amended, T-111-9-14-15, Aug. 12, 2015.)

- **111-15-2. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game:
- (a) "Available ticket(s)" or "ticket(s) available for sale" means one or any number of tickets from one through 175,000 that is available to sell during the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game.
- (b) "Check-A-Ticket Machine" means an electronic machine operated by the Kansas lottery for the purpose of determining whether or not an online ticket is a winning ticket.
- (c) "Computer pick" or "quick pick" means the selection of a six-digit number by the computer system, which appears on a ticket and is played by a player in the game. This is the only type of ticket sold by a retailer for the game.

- (d) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.
- (e) "Early Bird Drawings" means a series of drawings for prizes to be held on October 11, 18, 22, 25, and 29, 2015, and November 1, 5, 8, 12, 15, and 19, 2015, before the final raffle drawing on December 31, 2015.
- (f) "Electronic drawing machine" or "random number generator" means the electronic device approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery to electronically select the winning numbers for this drawing.
- (g) "Final Drawing" means the last and final drawing in the series of "Holiday Millionaire Raffle Drawings" which shall be conducted on December 31, 2015, selecting the grand prize winner along with secondary prize winners identified in these rules.
- (h) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the ticket a person has purchased.
- (i) "Online lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.
- (j) "Order drawn" means the sequential order in which a "WINNING" ticket or tickets are selected during the drawing process.
- (k) "Pari-mutuel prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game.
- (l) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.
- (m) "Serial number" means the identifying number printed on the top line of the ticket.
- (n) "Set Prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, and which will be equal to the prize amount established by these rules for the prize level.
- (o) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.
- (p) "Ticket Number" means the six-digit number that was selected by the computer, which appears on the face of the ticket and is identified on the ticket as such.
- (q) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.
- (r) "Winning number" or "winning numbers" means a six-digit number which is selected by an electronic drawing machine to be a winner of a prize in this drawing.
- (s) "Winning ticket" or "winning tickets" means a raffle ticket which was available for sale for this game where the ticket number matches a winning number drawn for the raffle, in exact order, reading from left to right. (Au-

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thorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012; amended, T-111-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013; amended, T-111-9-4-14, Aug. 13, 2014; amended, T-111-9-14-15, Aug. 12, 2015.)

If 169,000 of the 175,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid as a cash lump sum payment. If less than 169,000 tickets available for sale are sold, all prizes may be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a
