Executive Order 15-07 Protecting Kansas From Terrorism

WHEREAS, the well-being of the State of Kansas and its citizens is threatened by the scourge of international terrorism; and

WHEREAS, Kansas locations previously have been targeted for terrorist acts of violence, and the perpetrators have been apprehended and prosecuted; and

WHEREAS, the recent terror attacks in Paris have heightened concerns about protecting Kansas and ensuring the safety and security of our citizens; and

WHEREAS, the terrorist perpetrators of the Paris attacks appear to have ties to the Syrian refugee population; and

WHEREAS, I have concluded that the admission of Syrian refugees to the State of Kansas presents an unacceptable risk to the safety and security of the State of Kansas

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby order and direct as follows:

No department, commission, board, or agency of the government of the State of Kansas shall aid, cooperate with, or assist in any way the relocation of refugees from Syria to the State of Kansas, until such time as an adequate vetting process is in place. This Order includes, but is not limited to, the Kansas Refugee Program, the Refugee Resettlement Program, and the Refugee Social Service Program administered within the Kansas Department for Children and Families, and the Kansas Refugee Preventive Health Program administered within the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. Furthermore, this Order also includes the funding or administration of any grant program under the authority of the State of Kansas.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 15-07 and shall become effective immediately.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company (Goodyear), located at 2000 N.W. U.S. 24, Topeka, 66618, has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to make an operational change at its rubber tire manufacturing plant by permitting an existing mixer (mixer #1) to mix rubber compound formulations containing coupling agent at temperatures that would release ethanol emissions. The use of coupling agent enables Goodyear to meet the increasing demands of manufacturers and to meet the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Corporate Average Fuel Economy Standards. As a result of coupling agent use in mixer #1, a new regenerative

thermal oxidizer (RTO) will be installed for the purpose of controlling emissions from the mixer when rubber compound formulations containing coupling agent are mixed at temperatures that would release ethanol emissions. Additionally, curing is an existing, downstream process affected by the operational change to mixer #1.

Emissions of oxides of nitrogen (NO_x); sulfur dioxide (SO₂); carbon monoxide (CO); particulate matter (PM); PM with an aerodynamic diameter less than or equal to 10 micrometers (PM₁₀); PM with an aerodynamic diameter less than or equal to 2.5 micrometers (PM_{2.5}); ozone (O₃), which is regulated as volatile organic compounds (VOC) or NO_x (both pollutants are precursors to O₃ formation); hazardous air pollutants (HAPs); lead (Pb) and greenhouse gas (GHG) were evaluated during the permit review process.

The proposed permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, which adopts by reference the federal standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21, Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) of Air Quality. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary sources and major modifications of major stationary sources located in areas designated as "attainment" or "unclassifiable" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or is better than the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). Unclassifiable areas are areas where the air quality cannot be classified on the basis of available information as meeting or not meeting the NAAQS.

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each regulated pollutant for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each regulated pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions for the proposed mixer #1 project indicates that the emission rate of VOC exceeds the significant level. Goodyear conducted the required BACT analysis. The department reviewed the BACT analysis for the mixer #1 project and concurs with its findings as follows:

- BACT for VOC is good design and operation when mixing rubber compound formulations in mixer #1.
- BACT for VOC is use of the aforementioned RTO whenever mixer #1 is in operation and mixing rubber compound formulations containing coupling agent at temperatures that would release ethanol emissions.

An ambient air quality analysis using a qualitative approach was performed on the potential VOC emissions from the mixer #1 project. After considering data specific to the project and the area, the department has concluded that the proposed project will not will not cause or significantly contribute to air pollution in violation of any NAAQS. The EPA has not established a one-hour Class II maximum allowable increment for VOC or ozone. Therefore, no calculation of the potential consumption of such increment is possible.

No adverse impacts on soils and vegetation in the area are expected. Any federal land manager who has reason

to believe they may have a Class I area adversely impacted by the emissions from the proposed project has the opportunity to present KDHE with a demonstration of the adverse impact on the air quality-related values of the federal Class I area during the comment period.

A public comment period has been established until noon December 28, 2015, to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have regarding the proposed permitting action. All comments should be submitted in writing to Rasha S. Allen, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366.

Any member of the public may request that the department conduct a public hearing to receive comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. If a pertinent request is received, a public hearing is tentatively scheduled by KDHE at 6 p.m. December 30 the Topeka and Shawnee County Public Library, Marvin Auditorium 101B, 1515 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka, and continuing until audience members have an opportunity to submit comments. If no pertinent requests for public hearing are received by noon December 28, the public hearing will be cancelled. A notice of the cancellation will be posted at the KDHE website at http://www.kdheks.gov/bar/publicnotice.html.

If a hearing is conducted, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally or by submission of written materials during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit oral presentations to a specific time limit.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed materials in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation must be made no later December 14 by contacting Rasha S. Allen at 785-296-1693.

105-5-6. Reasonable compensation; non-tried cases.

- (a) Each appointed and assigned attorney shall be compensated for time expended in representing indigent defendants and other indigent persons at the hourly rate prescribed in K.A.R. 105-5-2. Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$1,300 in the following cases:
- (1) Those felony cases in the trial court that are classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 1 through 5 that are not submitted to a judge or jury, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable; and
- (2) those felony cases in the trial court that are classified as drug offenses, that have not been submitted to a judge or jury, and in which there have been six hours or more spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.
- (b) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8 and K.A.R. 105-5-6(a), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$975 in the following cases:
- (1) Those felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable, and are classified as severity levels 6 through 10 non-drug offenses; and
- (2) those felony cases in the trial court that are not submitted to a judge or jury, that are classified as drug offenses, and in which there have been fewer than six hours spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant, including services at a preliminary hearing and sentencing, if applicable.
- (c) Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, K.A.R. 105-5-6(a), and K.A.R. 105-5-6(b), reasonable compensation shall not exceed \$650 in the following types of cases:

- (2) cases filed pursuant to K.S.A. 60-1507 and K.S.A. 22-4506 and amendments thereto;

- (4) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 22-3428 and K.S.A. 22-3428a and amendments thereto; and
- (5) habeas corpus cases as authorized by K.S.A. 59-2965 and amendments thereto.

- (1) Representation of grand jury witnesses determined to be indigent and called to testify pursuant to K.S.A. 22-3009 and amendments thereto;
- (2) representation of indigent persons committed to custody as material witnesses pursuant to K.S.A. 22-2805 and amendments thereto;

Except as provided in K.A.R. 105-5-8, reasonable compensation for felony cases tried on pleas of not guilty and submitted to a judge or jury for adjudication, including compensation for services at the preliminary hearing, sentencing, and motions to modify the sentence, shall not exceed the following:
- (a) \$1,950 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 5 through 10;
- (b) \$2,600 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity level 4 and felonies classified as drug offenses of severity levels 2 through 5; and
- (c) \$6,500 for felonies classified as non-drug offenses of severity levels 1 through 3, off-grid felonies, and felonies classified as drug offenses of severity level 1. - (2) any felony case tried on a not guilty plea in which there have been 25 or more hours spent in court in defense of the indigent defendant;

- (3) any felony case not submitted to a judge or jury in which there have been 10 hours or more of in-court time spent in defense of the indigent defendant; or
- (4) any case that has been declared an exceptional case by the court due to its complexity or other significant characteristics.
- (b) Each claim for compensation in an exceptional case shall be accompanied by a specific finding in a court order specifying the basis for the declaration that the case is exceptional.
- (c) Reasonable compensation for attorneys' services in exceptional cases shall not exceed \$6,500 per case. However, additional compensation may be approved by the board if warranted by the extreme complexity of the case.
