Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Permanent Quarantine

Pursuant to K.S.A. 2-2117, a hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, January 19, in Room 124, Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, in the matter of the issuance of a permanent quarantine regarding Emerald Ash Borer (*Agrilus planipennis* [Coleoptera: Buprestidae]). The proposed quarantine would affect Leavenworth County, Johnson County, Wyandotte County, Douglas County and Jefferson County, Kansas. The quarantine would prohibit movement of regulated items from the quarantined areas, except under specific conditions.

Regulated items under quarantine would include the following:

- The emerald ash borer (*Agrilus planipennis* [Coleoptera: Buprestidae]), in any living stage of development;
- Firewood of all hardwood (non-coniferous) species;
- Nursery stock of the genus *Fraxinus* (Ash);
- Green lumber of the genus *Fraxinus* (Ash);
- Other material living, dead, cut or fallen, including logs, stumps, roots, branches, and composted and uncomposted chips of the genus *Fraxinus* (Ash);
- Any other article, product or means of conveyance that an inspector determines presents a risk of spreading emerald ash borer and notifies the person in possession of the article, product or means of conveyance that it is subject to the restrictions of the regulations.

In addition, the quarantine would require anyone who discovers Emerald Ash Borer in an area not currently under quarantine to report the discovery to the Kansas Department of Agriculture within 72 hours.

All interested persons may attend the hearing and will be given the opportunity to express comments either orally or in writing, or both. Interested parties may appear in person or by counsel.

Written comments and requests for information concerning the proposed quarantine should be directed to Jeff Vogel, Plant Protection & Weed Control Program Manager, Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, 66502, or to jeff.vogel@kda.ks.gov, at or before the time of hearing. A copy of the proposed quarantine may be accessed on the department's website at <https://agriculture.ks.gov/document-services/public-comment>. Comments also may be made through the website under the proposed quarantine. For persons intending to present oral testimony at the hearing, prior notice to the department would be helpful in arranging the agenda. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing, and may request the quarantine in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contact-

Notice Concerning Kansas/Federal Water Pollution Control Permits and Applications

In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57 through 63, 28-18-1 through 17, 28-18a-1 through 33, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, various draft water pollution control documents (permits, notices to revoke and reissue, notices to terminate) have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to waters of the United States and the state of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

The proposed actions concerning the draft documents are based on staff review, applying the appropriate standards, regulations and effluent limitations of the state of Kansas and the Environmental Protection Agency. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 109-1-1, Definitions. This regulation provides definitions for terms utilized in the EMS rules and regulations. Revisions reflect the change in terminology for ambulance types and remove definitions no longer necessary.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-2-1, Ambulance service operator. This regulation details out requirements for ambulance service operators. Revisions reflect the elimination of the requirement for the operator to maintain a current paper copy of each attendant certification card.

There is no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-2-2, Application for ambulance service permit and ambulance license; permit renewal and license renewal. This regulation pertains to the requirements for initial application for a service permit and ambulance license as well as renewal. Revisions reflect the change in terminology for ambulance types and allow

for the issuance of a temporary ambulance license.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There may be minimal economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision with a possible adjustment in fees received. It is anticipated that this will occur on average less than five times per year.

K.A.R. 109-2-6, Types of ambulance services and staffing. This regulation details the types of ambulance services and their requirements. Revisions reflect the change in terminology for ambulance types and details out staffing requirements for each type.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-2-7, Ground and air ambulance staffing. This regulation specifically addressed staffing for ground and air ambulances. This regulation is being revoked due to staffing requirements being addressed in other regulations.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revocation. There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revocation.

K.A.R. 109-2-8, Standards for ground ambulances and equipment. This regulation specifies the standards for all ground ambulances. Revisions reflect the change in terminology for ambulance types.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There may be a reduced financial impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision by allowing them to determine a reduction of equipment to be carried on the ambulances.

K.A.R. 109-2-11, Standards for air ambulances and equipment. This regulation specifies the standards for all air ambulances. Revisions reflect the change in terminology for ambulance types.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There will be no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision.

K.A.R. 109-7-1, Schedule of fees. This regulation details out the fees for licenses, certification and permits issued by the board. Revisions reflect the change in terminology for ambulance types and create a fee for the issuance of a temporary ambulance license.

There will be no anticipated economic impact to the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services associated with this regulatory revision. There may be minimal economic impact on other governmental agencies, private business or individuals with this regulatory revision. There is an added fee to the schedule, which allows for a temporary license for an ambulance. Past practice was to prorate ambulance license fees. In some instances, there may be a reduced fee, and in few cases, there is a poten-

A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impact for each follows: (Note: Statements indicating that a regulation is "not anticipated to have any economic impact" are intended to indicate that no economic impact on the State Corporation Commission, other state agencies, state employees or the general public has been identified.)

K.A.R. 82-4-1. This regulation defines the terms used in Article 4 – Motor Carriers of Persons and Property.

The proposed amendments to this regulation include edits to reflect minor grammatical and form corrections and recent updates to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) regulations. The proposed amendments also add an explanation of "gross combination weight rating" and a definition of "medical waiver." The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-2a. This regulation provides for the authority of agents, employees or representatives authorized by the commission. In addition to minor grammatical and form corrections, the proposed regulation adds a new subsection (d) authorizing various "out of service" enforcement actions by commission agents, employees or representatives. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-3h. This regulation adopts relevant portions of the FMCSA regulations (49 C.F.R. Part 392), which establish the minimum duties and procedures for the driving of commercial motor vehicles. The proposed amendments to this regulation include edits to reflect minor grammatical and form corrections and recent updates to FMCSA regulations. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the proposed amendments to this regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-3i. This regulation adopts relevant portions of the FMCSA regulations (49 C.F.R. Part 393) establishing the parts and accessories necessary for safe motor carrier operation. The proposed amendments to this regulation reflect minor grammatical and form corrections and recent updates to the FMCSA regulations. The proposed amendments also revise the section on "conspicuity systems," adopt several new technical standards and streamline the adoption of various Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards (FMVSS). The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-3j. This regulation adopts relevant portions of the FMCSA regulations (49 C.F.R. Part 396) governing the inspection, repair and maintenance of commercial motor vehicles. The proposed amendments to this regulation include minor grammatical and form corrections and recent updates to FMCSA regulations. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-3k. This regulation adopts relevant portions of the FMCSA regulations (49 C.F.R. Part 397) governing the transportation of hazardous materials with specific respect to driving and parking rules. The proposed amendments to this regulation reflect minor grammatical and form corrections and recent updates to the FMCSA regulations. The proposed amendments to this regulation adopt K.S.A. 66-1,108's definitions for "motor carrier" and "motor vehicle." The proposed amendments also delete various portions of 49 C.F.R. Part 397 for lack of enforcement provisions. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-3n. This regulation adopts relevant portions of the FMCSA regulations (49 C.F.R. Part 387) establishing requirements for the minimum levels of financial respon-

sibility for motor carriers. The proposed amendments to this regulation reflect minor grammatical and form corrections and recent updates to the FMCSA regulations. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-3o. This regulation adopts relevant portions of the FMCSA regulations (49 C.F.R. Part 386, Subpart F) establishing procedures relevant to imminent hazard with respect to motor carriers. The proposed amendments to this regulation include edits to reflect minor grammatical and form corrections and recent updates to FMCSA regulations. The proposed amendments to this regulation substitute Kansas procedures for certain federal procedures. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-8a. The commission is proposing to revoke this regulation. The regulation is no longer needed in light of K.A.R. 82-4-3i's adoption of federal fire extinguisher requirements. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the revocation of this regulation.

K.A.R. 82-4-20. This regulation adopts relevant portions of the FMCSA regulations (49 C.F.R. Parts 171 [except 171.1(a) and 171.6], 172 [except 172.701 and 172.822], 173 [except 173.10 and 173.27], 177, 178 and 180), establishing the minimum requirements and standards to be observed in the transportation of hazardous materials by motor carriers and operators of commercial motor vehicles. The proposed amendments to this regulation include edits to reflect minor grammatical and form corrections, recent updates to the federal hazardous materials regulations, and necessary proof of compliance with federal hazardous materials filings. The proposed amendments adopt K.S.A. 66-1,108's definitions for "motor vehicle" and "person." The proposed amendments also require copies of certain hazardous materials applications and registrations mandated by various subparts of 49 C.F.R. Part 107 to be made available to the commission. The commission does not anticipate an economic impact resulting from the adoption of this proposed regulation.
