Notice of Pending Draft Kansas/NPDES Water Pollution Control General Permit

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has prepared a combined Kansas/NPDES Water Pollution Control General Permit for stormwater runoff from industrial activity. This permit, when finalized, will replace the existing general permit.

A general wastewater permit is provided for those entities engaged in similar activities and discharging the same types of wastewater. The wastewater from these types of activities has a low public health and environmental risk. A general permit is placed on public notice once during the life of the permit and then is made available, without further public notice, to all persons for industrial activities which meet the requirements of the permit. The permittees are also required to meet all other federal, state and local requirements including local zoning ordinances.

Stormwater runoff from industrial activity means the discharge from any conveyance which is used for collecting and conveying stormwater and which is directly related to manufacturing, processing or raw materials storage areas at an industrial facility. The term does not include discharges from facilities or activities excluded or exempted from the Kansas/Federal Water Pollution Control program requirements. These activities exclude areas located on the plant site that are separate from the plants industrial activities. Areas such as office buildings and accompanying parking lots are excluded as long as the drainage from excluded areas is not mixed with stormwater drainage from areas with industrial activities subject to permit coverage.

New permittees are required to complete and submit the Notice of Intent along with the first years permit fee of \$60 and receive a signed and dated authorization from KDHE. To maintain the permit, the permittee is required to achieve and maintain compliance with the permit requirements, pay the annual permit fee and periodically review and update the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan.

Supporting documents include an Executive Summary, Notice of Intent form and instruction, No Exposure Certification form and instructions, a Notice of Termination form, a Notice of Transfer of Ownership form, and Definitions and Acronyms. The Director of Taxation will receive bids for the leasing of oil and gas rights in and to the portion of the Arkansas Riverbed, the property of the state of Kansas, described as follows:

That portion of the Arkansas Riverbed as it meanders through Sections 19, 20 and 29, Township 27 South, Range 1 East, Sedgwick County, Kansas; containing 124.29 acres, more or less.

The bidding shall be considered upon the amount of bonus, annual rental and royalty to be paid. Due to the cost of processing, no bids will be accepted for less than \$100 on small tracts of less than 100 acres.

Bids shall be submitted upon forms obtained from the Director of Taxation, Robert B. Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison St., Topeka, KS 66625.

Lease shall be made on forms provided by the state for

a term of five (5) years. The successful bidder pays publication costs in the local paper and the Kansas Register.

Bids shall be opened at the office of the director of taxation at 2 p.m. September 6, 2016.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations (Rescheduled)

(Editor's Note: The public hearing on proposed administrative regulations of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Division of Water Resources scheduled for October 11, 2016, notice of which was published in the August 4, 2016 Kansas Register, has been cancelled. The hearing has been rescheduled for October 27, 2016, at 10 a.m., as published in the following notice.)

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday, October 27, 2016, in the 1st floor meeting room of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed regulations. Individuals wishing to participate by teleconference may go to the Garden City Field Office, 2508 Johns St., Garden City, on the date and time of the public hearing.

The public hearing originally scheduled for October 11, 2016, notice of which was published in the August 4, 2016, issue of the Kansas Register, has been cancelled.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, KS 66502, or by email at ronda.hutton@ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 5-21-3 – The proposed amendments to the regulation will modify the well spacing in the Dakota aquifer in the Western Kansas Groundwater Management District No. 1 (GMD 1) from one half of a mile to four (4) miles. This regulation was requested by GMD 1, and will be filed for adoption by the Chief Engineer of the Division of Water Resources.

Economic Impact Statement:

The proposed amendment will limit well spacing to ensure the spacing is appropriate so Dakota wells do not impact one another. The four (4) mile spacing will help ensure impairment from a junior Dakota well does not occur. Spacing alone cannot guarantee impairment will not occur, but a four (4) mile spacing requirement will go a long way toward helping to prevent impairment.

This regulation is not mandated by federal law.

The proposed amendment will result in no fiscal impact to the department. The proposed amendment will result in no fiscal impact to GMD 1. The amendment will have a positive fiscal impact to existing water right holders in the areas of concern resulting from the additional protection against impairment by new development.

No other methods were considered by the state. Improved groundwater resource conditions, both quality and quantity, could be achieved through the adoption of this regulation change.

K.A.R. 5-3-6a – The proposed amendment to K.A.R. 5-3-6a clarifies the agency's authority to seal a water flowmeter to ensure the meter installation is not removed or altered without the agency's permission. The Kansas Department of Agriculture, Division of Water Resources (KDA) and the Groundwater Management Districts test meters to determine if they are performing properly and, after testing, the agency or the district will seal the meters to ensure the integrity of the test. To enforce compliance with water use permits, it is crucial to know if and when a tested meter is removed or altered. Accurate meters are critical to ensuring the integrity of water use records statewide.

Economic Impact Statement:

The regulation will apply to new and existing meter installations. It is important to have the ability to seal meters to maintain the integrity of water use data. Sealing water flowmeter installations will discourage water users from diverting without meters, turning meters in reverse or removing meters to tamper with the readings. Currently, the water users are required to contact KDA when a meter is removed. Many users do not because it is easily overlooked. The seal will remind users to contact us in addition to maintaining the water use record.

This regulation is not mandated by federal law.

The proposed amendment will result in a positive fiscal impact to the agency, as it will allow the agency to extend field staff work by saving time in inspecting meter installations, as meters previously tested and sealed can be considered still accurate. The agency will not have to re-test or re-inspect meter installations once the meters are tested and sealed. The proposed amendments will result in a positive fiscal impact to the groundwater management districts for the same reasons stated above for the agency. There will be no fiscal impact to other government agencies. It may have a negative fiscal impact on private businesses and individuals if civil penalties are imposed for removing the seal without permission.

No other methods were considered by the state.

The proposed amendment will have no environmental impact.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, October 20, 2016 at the Seward County Event Center, 810 Stadium Road, Liberal, Kansas, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism.

A general discussion and workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Commission will begin at 1 p.m. October 20 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at approximately 5 p.m. then resume at 6:30 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing and more business. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meeting for any issues not on the agenda and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business may also be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. October 21 at the location listed above.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting and may request the meeting materials in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation to participate in the meeting should be made at least five working days in advance of the meeting by contacting Sheila Kemmis, Commission Secretary, at 620-672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the Kansas Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing at 1-800-432-0698 to request special accommodations.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Chairman of the Commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism, 1020 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 200, Topeka, KS 66612 or to sheila.kemmis@ksoutdoors.com if electronically. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments

submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

K.A.R. 115-2-2. This permanent regulation establishes daily and annual permit prices for vehicles entering and using state parks and other areas requiring a motor vehicle permit. The proposed amendments would set a permit price for unconventional motor vehicle permits.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed version of the regulation is not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, other agencies, small businesses or the public.

K.A.R. 115-2-3. This permanent regulation establishes the overnight and annual camping permit prices, fees for utility connections, and related fees within state parks. This is a user fee regulation and the proposed amendments would increase fees for annual camping permits, daily camping permits and 14 day camping permits.

Economic Impact Summary: If the same number of permits were sold as calendar year 2015, the proposed increases would generate an additional \$1,111,973, all of which would accrue to the park fee fund. Otherwise, the proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any appreciable negative economic impact on the department, small businesses, other agencies, or the public.

K.A.R. 115-7-1. This permanent regulation establishes legal fishing equipment and methods for sportfish and for nonsportfish. The proposed amendment would allow the use of floatlines 24 hours a day.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any negative economic impact on the department, small businesses, other agencies, or the public.

K.A.R. 115-7-10. This permanent regulation establishes special provisions related to fishing. The proposed amendments would update the reference document related to new invasive species waters as well as remove receipt requirements when fishing with baitfish.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any negative economic impact on the department, small businesses, other agencies, or the public.

K.A.R. 115-8-13. This permanent regulation establishes the authorized operation of motorized vehicles and aircraft upon department lands and roads. The proposed amendments provide for the use of unconventional motorized vehicles on department roads within state parks.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any negative economic impact on the department, small businesses, other agencies, or the public.

K.A.R. 115-17-2. This permanent regulation establishes the legal species that can be sold for commercial fish bait. The proposed amendments would eliminate the requirement for commercial baitfish dealers to provide receipts on sale.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any negative economic impact on the department, small businesses, other agencies, or the public.

K.A.R. 115-18-20. This permanent regulation establishes the tournament bass pass. The proposed amendments would allow tournament anglers who possess the bass pass the ability to keep up to five fish that meet the statewide length limit but do not meet the length limit for the specific body of water where the tournament is being conducted.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any negative economic impact on the department, small businesses, other agencies, or the public.

K.A.R. 115-25-5. This proposed exempt regulation establishes hunting unit boundaries, bag limit and season dates for the 2017 fall wild turkey seasons. The proposed change would close the fall season for units 3, 5 and 6 to take into account several years of poor reproduction and correct an error in the boundary descriptions. Otherwise, the regulation would be unchanged from previous seasons.

Economic Impact Summary: In 2015, the department issued 12,133 fall turkey permits of various types, generating \$211,590. It is anticipated that the closure of the fall season in three additional units will reduce permit sales by 7300 permits, and reducing income to the wildlife fee fund by approximately \$130,000. Administrative costs associated with the season are borne by the department.

The department estimates over 24,000 days of hunting activity will occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services. No other economic impact on the general public, small businesses or on other state agencies is anticipated.

K.A.R. 115-25-6. This proposed exempt regulation establishes hunting unit boundaries, bag limits and

season dates for the spring turkey hunting season. The proposed changes would correct an error in the boundary descriptions.

Economic Impact Summary: It is anticipated that approximately 61,973 permits and game tags will be issued in 2017, based on 2016 permit sales. Estimated revenue if the above number of permits and tags are issued would be \$1,925,577. Administrative costs associated with the season are borne by the department.

Approximately 310,000 recreational days of hunting could occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services. No other economic impact on the department, general public, small businesses, or on other state agencies is anticipated.

K.A.R. 115-25-14. This proposed exempt regulation establishes statewide limits and open seasons for fishing in Kansas. The proposed changes relate to removing the length limit on walleye, saugeye and sauger on streams and rivers, allowing floatline fishing year round and 24 hours a day, updates to the reference document related to length and creel limits for specific bodies of water and the addition of one trout water.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed changes would likely have no substantive economic impact to the department, other state agencies, small businesses, or the public.
