Notice to Private Activity Bond Applicants

Applications for allocation of 2017 Private Activity Bond (PAB) authority are now being accepted for qualified uses, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and amendments thereto.

The state of Kansas is projected to receive \$305,315,000 of federal authority for the issuance of PABs in calendar year 2017. Historically, the primary uses of this federal authority have included "qualified small issue bonds" used for construction and equipping of manufacturing facilities and beginning farmer programs; "exempt facility bonds" used by for-profit entities providing a public benefit, i.e., certain waste treatment facilities, qualified residential rental facilities, etc.; and "qualified mortgage bonds" issued to benefit first-time homebuyers. Allocations awarded by the secretary of Commerce are subject

to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-5060 et seq. and the limitations of state volume cap.

In 2017, fees associated with PAB application and issuances have changed to the following:

- (1) Application Fee—A \$750 nonrefundable fee must accompany all applications before the request can be processed; and
- (2) Issuance Fee—An issuance fee is assessed on the amount of allocation actually issued, excluding Qualified Mortgage Bonds, and shall be due and payable at bond closing. Issuance fees shall be determined as follows:

Allocation Used/Issued Fee

Up to \$5,000,000 10 basis points (.10%) \$5,000,001 and above 20 basis points (.20%)

"Qualified Mortgage Bond" programs will be assessed a fee equal to .5% of the PAB allocation used upon issuance of each mortgage loan assisted through the program.

Issuance fees shall be remitted within 30 days of bond closing. Checks for both the application and issuance fees for non-housing issues shall be payable to the "Kansas Department of Commerce Bond Fee Fund." Checks for the issuance fees for residential rental housing activities shall be payable to the "Kansas Housing Resources Corporation" or "KHRC."

The station consists of a pressurized nuclear reactor steam supply system and an electric turbine-generator. The nuclear steam supply system is comprised of a reactor vessel and four primary coolant loops, each with a reactor coolant pump and steam generator. The net turbine generator output is a nominal 1,250 MWe. Wastewater discharge consists of circulating water, radwaste system, service and essential service water discharge via the essential service water discharge. The Wolf Creek cooling impoundment (WWCI) was created to provide source water storage for routine operations, to serve as a heat sink for cooling purposes (cooling lake), and was designed to provide an emergency water source to enable a safe emergency shutdown of the nuclear reactor in the event the WWCI dam were to fail. A two cell domestic waste stabilization pond is intermittently discharged on as needed basis into a slough of the WCCI. Radioactive wastewater processed through filters, demineralizers, and RO to the secondary liquid waste monitoring tanks A & B and/or A & B waste monitoring tanks as batch releases to WCCI. Overflow of earthen settling basins when sediment accumulations are dredged from the Auxiliary Cooling Water Intake Structure area and from the Ultimate Heat Sink area to maintain hydraulic capacity for emergency facility operations. Eisenhower Learning Center is serviced by a three-cell non-overflowing domestic wastewater stabilization lagoon. The proposed permit contains limits for total suspended solids, biochemical oxygen demand, oil and grease, total residual oxidant, and pH, as well as monitoring for temperature, whole effluent toxicity, metals, and flow. Notice of Draft Kansas/NPDES Water Pollution Control Permit for the Discharge of Hydrostatic **Test Water from Pipelines and Storage Tanks**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a draft combined Kansas/NPDES Water Pollution Control general permit for the discharge of hydrostatic test water from new pipelines and storage tanks, and/or existing pipelines and storage tanks exposed to crude oil and refined petroleum products or natural/liquefied petroleum gases or other chemicals. This permit, when approved, will replace the current general permit for similar discharges scheduled to expire February 28, 2017.

A general wastewater permit is provided for those entities engaged in similar activities and discharging the same types of wastewater. The wastewater from these types of activities has a low public health and environmental risk. A general permit is placed on public notice once during the life of the permit and then is made available, without further public notice, to entities for activities which meet the requirements of the permit. The permittees are also required to meet all other federal, state, and local requirements. To be covered under the draft permit, the permittee is required to submit the Notice of Intent and receive a signed and dated permit from KDHE.

The draft permit contains limits for oil and grease, pH, and total suspended solids and monitoring for flow and total residual chlorine (if present in the source water) for all discharges plus chemical oxygen demand, naphthalene and benzene limits for pipelines and storage vessels exposed to petroleum products. In addition, this permit covers hydrotest of pipes/tanks used to transport/store other chemicals. Parameter limits for these other chemicals are based on the Kansas Water Quality Criteria and Federal Regulations.

Synopsis: A state-owned or leased medical care facility must either allow concealed carry inside the facility or install adequate security measures and post signage to prohibit concealed carry, unless the facility has temporarily exempted itself from the provisions of K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 75-7c20. After any such exemption expires, a stateowned or leased medical care facility must comply with the provisions of K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 75-7c20. If concealed carry is allowed inside a state-owned or leased medical care facility, the facility may regulate the manner of carrying concealed handguns inside the facility. Medical personnel of a state-owned or leased medical care facility may require patients to temporarily store concealed handguns during medical treatment.

A municipal-owned or leased medical care facility must either allow concealed carry inside the facility or install adequate security measures and post signage to prohibit concealed carry, unless the facility has temporarily exempted itself from the provisions of K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 75-7c20. After any such exemption expires, a municipal-owned or leased medical care facility must comply with the provisions of K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 75-7c20.

The governing body of a municipality may not adopt an ordinance, resolution or other regulation to govern the carrying of concealed handguns inside a municipal-owned or leased medical care facility. However, a physician, nurse, or other medical personnel of a municipal-owned or leased medical care facility may refuse to allow a patient to carry a concealed handgun while medical services are being provided, as long as such action is not implementing a local law, official policy, or decision by the governing body of the municipality.

K.S.A. 2015 Supp. 75-7c20 does not apply to a state or municipal-owned medical care facility that is leased in its entirety by a private entity, whether for-profit or not-for-profit.

The Personal and Family Protection Act does not require a state or municipal building to provide storage facilities for concealed handguns carried into the building by members of the public.
