Facility Description: The proposed action is to reissue a permit for an existing deep disposal well. The fluids to be injected are to be nonhazardous liquid waste from this facility consisting of spent brine water from the curing of cattle hides. In addition, should the Tyson Fresh Meats (Finney County facility) need to haul hide brine or wastewater from their facility to the Tyson Fresh Meats (Emporia) facility, Tyson Fresh Meats-Emporia will submit and seek approval for a wastewater transfer plan, detailing all aspects of the proposed process, including consideration of monitoring for daily maximum chromium, prior to commencing disposal of waste in the injection well. Injection is to be made into the Arbuckle formation from a bottom depth of 2,951 feet to a top depth of 2,732 feet below ground surface.
