The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has issued the final Section 401 Kansas Conditional Water Quality Certification for the final 2017 Clean Water Act Section 404 Nationwide Permits issued by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers effective March 19, 2017.

On January 6, 2017, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) published notice in the Federal Register announcing the reissuance of all existing Section 404 Nationwide Permits (NWP), becoming effective March 19, 2017, and expiring March 18, 2022:

The KDHE utilized public comments from the December 1, 2016, Kansas Register announcement to complete the final Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the above referenced Section 404 Nationwide Permits issued in Kansas by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The KDHE's conditional water quality certification documents that the activities authorized under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act will avoid Kansas Water Quality Standard violations if conditions of the Section 401 Water Quality Certification are implemented. Notice Concerning Proposed Air Quality Class I Operating Permit Renewal

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Mid Continent Cabinetry has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards, and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping, and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Norcraft Companies, LP, 3020 Denmark Ave., Suite 100, Eagan, MN 55121, owns and operates Mid Continent Cabinetry, a wood kitchen and bath cabinet manufacturing facility located at 810 and 831 S. Columbus and 900 S. Meridian, Newton, KS 67114.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation, and all information relied upon during the permit application review process are available for public review during normal business hours, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., at the KDHE, Bureau of Air (BOA), 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, KS 66612-1366 and at

The standard departmental cost will be assessed for any copies requested.

Written comments or questions regarding the proposed permit may be directed to Rasha Allen, KDHE, BOA, 1000 SW Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, KS 66612-1366. In order to be considered in formulating a final permit decision, written comments must be received no later than noon Monday, May 1, 2017.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Rasha Allen, KDHE, BOA, no later than noon Monday, May 1, 2017, in order for the secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.
