Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act requires states to biennially prepare a list of waters failing to meet State Water Quality Standards. Such waters are required to have Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) prepared by the state to restore their water quality. A Total Maximum Daily Load is the maximum amount of the impairing pollutant that can enter the water without causing a violation of its water quality standards.

Since 1999, Kansas has developed TMDLs for impaired surface waters in each of the state's 12 river basins. KDHE develops and revises TMDLs for selected impairments identified in the current Section 303(d) list by prioritizing watersheds or waters for restoration and protection. Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:00 a.m. Thursday, April 26, 2018, in the 1st floor meeting room 124 of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Dr., Manhattan, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Dr., Manhattan, KS, 66502, or by email at ronda.hutton@ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 11-13-1 through 11-13-6. The Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative consists of new requirements for the Kansas Water Quality Initiative created under K.S.A. 2-1915. The Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative shall follow all criteria and requirements from the amended establishment of the Kansas Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) set out in K.S.A. 2-1933. The new requirements for the Initiative will be implemented by the Kansas Department of Agriculture, Division of Conservation to enhance participation under the Farm Service Agency (FSA) continuous Conservation Reserve Program (CRP). A one-time state incentive payment will be made to participants to supplement federal payments for grassed waterways, shallow water areas for wildlife, filter strips, riparian buffers, wetland restorations, farmable wetland/ farmable wetland buffers, bottomland timber establishment and habitat buffers for upland birds.

The targeted areas for the initiative are in the Big Creek, Delaware, Little Arkansas, Lower Big Blue, Lower Kansas, Lower Little Blue, Lower Republican, Lower Smoky Hill, Neosho Headwaters, Upper Cottonwood and Lower Cottonwood watersheds. The boundaries include HUC12 watersheds that are above the five high priority reservoirs, are identified as target areas for nutrient and sediment reduction in Watershed Restoration and Protection Strategy (WRAPS) plans, and address additional public water supply concerns (Little Arkansas, Big Creek). These boundaries will contain two tiers of priority enrollment. Tier 1 areas include those HUC12 watersheds identified in WRAPS plans as highest priority target areas for nutrient and sediment reduction. Tier 2 areas will encompass the remaining area within the boundaries.

K.A.R. 11-13-1. Definitions. This regulation establishes the operating definitions for words and terms which are used in the program implementation.

K.A.R. 11-13-2. Initiative requirements for new applications; funds for existing contracts. This regulation states that new applications for the initiative will be required to meet the requirements set out in this set of regulations. The new requirements will be known as the Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative which consist of new requirements for the Kansas Water Quality Initiative. Current contracts under the initiative will continue to be paid through funds authorized by K.S.A. 2-1915.

K.A.R. 11-13-3. Selection of applicants for initiative. This regulation outlines the criteria for which eligible applicants are approved for funding. It outlines two tiers of eligible payments based on location and that acres that are enrolled in existing CRP are not eligible for payments.

K.A.R. 11-13-4. Haying and grazing. This regulation sets forth the opportunities for haying and grazing of eligible acres based upon the existing CRP rules.

K.A.R. 11-13-5. Practices eligible for incentive payments. This regulation outlines which practices are eligible to receive incentive payments through the initiative. It also states that incentive payments are in addition to any CRP payments.

K.A.R. 11-13-6. Incentive payments; refunds. This regulation identifies the basis on which approved applications for the initiative will be evaluated and prioritized for a one time sign up incentive payment. Two tiers of payments are identified in this regulation based on location and eligible acres enrolled. This regulation outlines the process in which an incentive payment refund would be made if the federal CRP contract is terminated or a participant fails to meet initiative requirements.

Economic Impact Statement:

The Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative is being developed to be the delivery mechanism for landowner sign-up incentive payments for continuous CRP practices previously authorized by K.S.A. 2-1915 and K.S.A. 2-1933. The new requirements will provide more eligible conservation practices with better state incentives to encourage landowners to enroll in more concentrated, targeted geographic areas as well as providing more water quality improvement benefits.

The Division of Conservation's ability to offer the signup incentive payments to landowners in the targeted areas would not be contingent on the approval of a nutrient and sediment reduction CREP by FSA. Participation in the Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative is contingent on the ability of FSA to approve new applications in the CRP program. The CRP program has a total nationwide acre cap. Once the cap is hit, applications cannot be approved.

The proposed regulations are not mandated by federal law.

Contingent on funding by the Kansas Legislature pursuant to K.S.A. 2-1915 and K.S.A. 2-1933, a maximum enrollment of 10,000 acres, would be estimated at a total financial obligation of approximately \$3.75 million, with (continued)

\$2.0 million provided by the State of Kansas in sign-up incentive payments and \$1.750 million to fund seven Water Quality Coordinator positions for five years. The program will be initiated in FY2018 or FY2019 with \$281,312 of existing start-up money from the Kansas State Water Plan Fund, and requests for additional funds will only be made as the program enrollment develops accordingly. The Water Quality Coordinator positions would be housed in Kansas Natural Resources Conservation Service Management Units and would be employed by local Conservation Districts.

A Division of Conservation's Riparian and Wetland Program Manager will administer the program in addition to several other programs. The personnel costs to the agency for this position would be approximately \$80,000 per year. An estimated additional \$2,000 per year will be expended for supplies, work station, postage, computer equipment, meetings and travel expenses. The agency may incur additional administrative costs to conduct field investigations and monitor program success.

The Department of Administration, Division of Accounts and Reports will incur routine, minimal costs associated with the processing of warrants to support the contract payment procedures for the one time incentive payments allocated to landowners. These minor variations in the work regimen of the agency should not require any additional funding.

The Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative will improve the quality of the project area waterways that serve as drinking water sources for area residents. This program will also support implementation of the Kansas Nutrient Reduction Framework developed by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, thus demonstrating Kansas' commitment to addressing nutrient-related water quality issues. Practices implemented will reduce sedimentation and thereby slow the rate of storage loss in downstream reservoirs. The program will enhance the effectiveness of other programs and activities in the watersheds that focus on reducing nutrients and sedimentation. In addition, the project will improve wildlife habitat. The buffers, filter strips and other practices installed under the Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative will enable farmers to protect water quality while maintaining the productivity of their farms.

Goals:

The primary goals of the Kansas Sediment and Nutrient Reduction Initiative include:

- Secure, restore and protect water supply storage and water quality through the installation of practices that reduce sedimentation and nutrient runoff.
- Reduce sediment loading by up to or more than 58,000 tons and phosphorous loading by up to or more than 92,000 pounds.
- Improve wildlife habitat.

Permanent Administrative Regulation

Article 17.—COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE: TRAINING IN HUMAN TRAFFICKING IDENTIFICATION AND PREVENTION

16-17-1. Training course approval for providers. (a) For purposes of this regulation, "human trafficking" shall have the meaning specified in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 21-5426, and amendments thereto, and shall include "commercial sexual exploitation of a child" as specified in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 21-6422, and amendments thereto.

(b) No person or entity shall provide a training course on human trafficking identification and prevention pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 8-2,157, and amendments thereto, unless the office of the attorney general has issued a letter of approval for that training course.

- (c) Each person or entity seeking approval of a training course on human trafficking identification and prevention shall submit an application to the office of the attorney general, human trafficking identification and prevention training approval, in Topeka, Kansas. The application shall include at least the following information:
 - (1) (A) The name and address of the person or entity;
- (B) the name and title of the person submitting the application on behalf of the person or entity, with the person's signature and a statement certifying that the information and materials submitted will be used in the training course for which approval is being sought; and
- (C) the name, title, and telephone number of the contact person for course approval matters; and
- (2) a copy of all training materials. The training materials shall include at least the following:
 - (A) Written materials or video materials, or both;
- (B) a definition of "human trafficking" consistent with subsection (a);
- (C) strategies on what to look for and how to identify potential victims of human trafficking; and
- (D) information on how and to whom to report suspected human trafficking.
- (d) After a training course on human trafficking identification and prevention has been approved, new or revised written or video training materials shall not be

used until an application for approval of the new or revised training materials has been submitted to and approved by the office of the attorney general pursuant to this regulation. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 8-2,157; effective March 9, 2018.)
