Entries into the second drawing will close at noon on October 19, 2018, and the winners will be announced by noon on September 21, 2018. Entries into the second drawing will close at noon on October 26, 2018. Entries into the third drawing will close at noon on November 12, 2018, and the winners will be announced at noon on November 16, 2018.

(b) The specific ticket eligible for entry into this drawing shall be winning or non-winning Kansas Lottery Lucky For Life tickets.

(c) A player shall enter the drawing through the Kansas lottery PlayOn program available at www.kslottery.com. The player shall follow the hyperlink specifically designated for the purpose of accessing the "Kansas Lottery Luck of the Draw." The player may enter the required data from the entry ticket manually for entry into the drawing. If the player does not enter the ticket data manually, the player may scan, if available, the ticket to enter data to be used for entry into the drawing using a mobile device and a downloaded Kansas Lottery PlayOn app. After the ticket data is successfully entered either manu-

#### Article 401.-NORTHEAST GAMING ZONE

**111-401-247.** Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lottery facility game at the Hollywood Casino at Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, entitled "TriLux Bonus."

The rules and regulations for the game of "TriLux Bonus" are contained in K.A.R. 111-401-247 through 111-401-252, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-11-18, June 6, 2018.)

**111-401-248.** Object of game and method of play. (a) The object of the "TriLux Bonus" game is to have the total point value of the player's hand exceed the total point value of the dealer's hand without going over a total point value of 21.

(b) The game of "TriLux Bonus" offers an optional 3-card poker wager.

(c) The game of "TriLux Bonus" will be dealt from a dealing shoe or shuffling machine. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-11-18, June 6, 2018.)

**111-401-249. Definitions.** The following definitions when pertaining to the game of "TriLux Bonus" shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Blackjack" shall mean an ace and any card having a point value of 10 dealt as the initial two cards to a player or a dealer, except that this shall not include an ace and a ten point value card dealt to a player who has split pairs.

(b) "Burn" or "burning" a card shall mean to remove a card from play.

(c) "Busts" shall mean the sum of the point value of the cards in the player's hand exceeds twenty-one (21).

(d) "Dealer" shall mean the person responsible for dealing the cards.

(e) "Discard rack" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed after each round of decisions is rendered in a game.

(f) "Flush" shall mean three cards in the same suit.

(g) "Hard total" shall mean the total point count of a hand which contains no aces or which contains one or more aces that are each counted as having one point in value.

(h) "Hit" shall mean the player is dealt one or more additional cards by the dealer.

(i) "Hole card" shall mean the second card dealt to the dealer, which card is dealt face down.

(j) "Shoe" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed to be held for dealing to the players and dealer.

(k) "Soft total" shall mean the total point count of a hand containing an ace when the ace is counted as having 11 points in value.

(1) "Stand" shall mean being dealt no more cards by the dealer.

(m) "Straight" shall mean three consecutive cards, for example 8, 9, and 10.

(n) "Straight flush" shall mean three cards in consecutive order and all in the same suit.

(o) "Three-of-a-kind' shall mean three cards of the same rank.

(p) "Tie" shall mean the player does not lose or win the hand played.

(q) "Up card" shall mean the first card dealt to the deal-(continued) er, which card is dealt face up. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-11-18, June 6, 2018.)

**111-401-250.** Characteristics of the game. (a) The game "TriLux Bonus" shall be played on a table consisting of five to seven individual betting areas.

(b) The game of "TriLux Bonus" is played on a layout approved by the lottery that is similar to a blackjack layout with an additional betting area for the three-card poker bet. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-11-18, June 6, 2018.)

**111-401-251.** Wagers and payout odds. (a) Minimum and maximum wagers will be posted on a sign at each table.

(b) Maximum table payouts, if any, will be posted at each table and will not be less than the maximum wager times the maximum odds.

(c) If a player has been permitted to wager less than the table minimum, the dealer will take or pay the amount actually wagered. If a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the excess will be returned to the player and the dealer will pay the correct odds on the posted maximum amount. The player will be informed of the table minimum or maximum for subsequent wagers.

(d) A player may play two hands at double the table minimum per hand not to exceed the table maximum. A player may play three hands at five times the table minimum, per hand, not to exceed the table maximum. Exceptions to this rule are permitted if approved by the pit manager, casino shift manager, or higher ranking casino official.

(e) The following describes a list of permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win, loss, or tie:

(1) Original wagers:

(A) An original wager will be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being dealt.

(B) An additional original wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) An original wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21.

(D) An original wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is lower than the total point value of the dealer's cards.

(E) An original wager will tie if the total point value of the player's cards is equivalent to the total point value of the dealer's cards. A blackjack beats a hand with a total point value of 21 that uses the point value of three or more cards.

(F) When a player's hand consists of a blackjack, the winning hand will be paid out at a rate of 3 to 2 or at the rate of 6 to 5 as stated on the gaming table layout. All winning original wagers, except hands consisting of a blackjack, will be paid out at the rate of 1 to 1.

(2) Insurance wager:

(A) An insurance wager is a one-time wager in an amount up to one-half of the original wager that may be taken when the dealer has an ace for his up card. An insurance wager will be made prior to the dealer looking at the hole card. (B) An additional insurance wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) An insurance wager will win at the rate of 2 to 1 if the dealer has a blackjack.

(D) An insurance wager will lose if the dealer does not have a blackjack.

(3) Double down wager:

(A) A double down wager is an additional wager made by the player up to the amount of the player's original wager on the condition only one additional card will be dealt to the player. This wager can be made on any hand consisting of two cards including after splitting, except that the wager may not be made after splitting aces.

(B) An additional double down wager may be made as a tip for the dealer only if the player has made an original wager for the dealer.

(Č) A double down wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21.

(D) A double down wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is less than the total point value of the dealer's cards.

(E) A double down wager will tie if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are of equal total point value.

(F) A winning double down wager will be paid at the rate of 1 to 1.

(4) Split wager:

(A) A split wager is an additional wager made when a player's initial two cards are of the same face value provided the player makes a wager equal to the original wager. A player may split up to three times for a total of four hands. A player may double down after splitting with the exception of after splitting aces. A player will only receive one additional card after splitting aces.

(B) A split wager will win if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds the total point value of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total point value of 21.

(C) A split wager will lose if the total point value of the player's cards exceeds 21 or is less than the total point value of the dealer's cards.

(D) A split wager will tie if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are of equal total point value.

(E) A winning split wager will be paid at the rate of 1 to 1.

(F) An additional split wager may be made as a tip for the dealer only if the player has made an original wager for the dealer.

(5) Three-card wagers:

(A) An optional three-card wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area designated for the three-card wager. The player must make an original blackjack wager in order to place the three-card wager.

(B) An additional three-card wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(C) A three-card wager will win if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush.

(D) A three-card wager will lose if the dealer's up card and the player's original two cards combined do not equal a flush, straight, three-of-a-kind, or straight flush. (E) Winning three-card wagers will be paid at a rate of 9 to 1.

(F) All three-card wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-11-18, June 6, 2018.)

**111-401-252. Game operations.** (a) The following procedures for shuffling shall be implemented:

(1) The cards will be shuffled at various times including, but not limited to, the following circumstances:

(A) New decks are put into play.

(B) A shuffle will be performed after the completion of the hand in which the cut card appeared.

(C) The decks have been dropped or otherwise mishandled.

(D) When instructed to do so by a table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official.

(2) The cards may be shuffled manually.

(3) Alternatively, a shuffling machine may be used to shuffle the cards.

(b) The following procedures for card cutting shall be implemented:

(1) Upon completion of the shuffle, the dealer will offer the decks to a player to cut. In the event players at the table fail or refuse to perform the cut, the dealer or table games supervisor will cut the cards.

(2) On a game utilizing more than two decks of cards, the cut will be performed by inserting the cut card a minimum of approximately one deck from either end of the stack, as determined by the dealer.

(3) Once the deck has been cut, the dealer will insert the cut card approximately one and one-half decks from the back of a six deck shoe unless otherwise instructed by the table games supervisor or pit manager.

(c) The following procedures for dealing and taking cards shall be implemented:

(1) Cards are distributed to the players, one at a time, from left to right. The dealer distributes one card to himself face up before continuing. The dealer deals a second card to each player, one at a time, from left to right and deals a second card to himself face down directly under the up card.

(2) Beginning with the first player position to the left of the dealer, each player will indicate whether the player wishes to stand. The player will indicate wanting a hit by making a clearly visible motion with his or her hand. Cards will continue being distributed to each player, one a time, receiving an additional signal from the player after each card, until the player indicates his or her desire to stand or the player's hand busts, whichever comes first. To indicate a player's wish to stand, a player should motion slightly with his or her hands, palm down, toward the dealer.

(3) After all of the players have stood or busts, the hole card will be turned face up announcing the total point value of the two cards. If any player's hand is still in action, the dealer will hit if the dealer holds cards with a total point value of 16 or less or a soft 17. The dealer will stand on a hard 17 or higher total point value.

(4) Winning wagers will be paid and losing wagers will be collected beginning on the right and working towards the left.

(5) The winning three-card bets will be paid and losing three-card bets will be collected prior to the continuation of the game.

(6) If a player has a losing hand, the dealer will remove the player's chips and pick up the cards for placement into the discard rack.

(d) The following procedures for burning cards shall be implemented:

(1) Dealers will burn a card after completion of the shuffle; and,

(2) Dealers will burn a card upon entering a game. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-11-18, June 6, 2018.)

#### Article 501.-SOUTH CENTRAL GAMING ZONE

**111-501-44.** Rules of the game and bet definitions. (a) The stickperson, boxperson, table games supervisor or a higher-ranking casino employee shall have the authority to invalidate a roll of the dice by calling "no roll" for any of the following reasons:

(1) If the wrong player picks up the dice and throws or rolls them.

(2) If the dice do not hit the end of the table opposite the shooter.

(3) The dice do not leave the shooter's hand simultaneously.

(4) Either or both of the dice come to rest on the chips constituting the craps bank (the chips in front of the boxperson).

(5) Either or both of the dice come to rest in the dice bowl in front of the stickperson or on one of the rails surrounding the table.

(6) Either or both of the dice go off the table.

(7) Whenever one die comes to rest on top of the other.(8) The shooter does not have either a pass or don't pass bet.

(9) Either or both of the dice do not move with forward motion.

(10) If the player shooting the dice removes either one or both dice from the view of the boxperson or table games supervisor or higher-ranking casino official immediately before he shoots them.

(11) If the player attempts to deface the dice purposely or unintentionally immediately before the player shoots the dice.

(b) Whenever new dice are put into the game or existing dice are returned to the game, they shall be inspected by the boxperson before being put into the dice bowl.

(c) Permissible wagers shall be as follows:

(1) "Pass bet" shall mean a wager placed on the pass line of the layout immediately prior to the come-out roll.

(2) The "pass bet" shall win if, on the come-out roll a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a total of 7 appears.

(3) The "pass bet" shall lose if, on the come-out roll a total of 2, 3 or 12 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is thrown again.

(4) "Don't pass bet" shall mean a wager placed on the *(continued)* 

don't pass line of the layout immediately prior to the come-out roll.

(5) The "don't pass bet" shall win if, on the come-out roll a total of 2 or 3 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is again thrown.

(6) The "don't pass bet" shall lose if, on the come-out roll a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a 7 appears.

(7) The "don't pass bet" shall be void if, on the comeout roll a total of 12 is thrown.

(8) "Come bet" shall mean a wager placed on the come line of the layout at any time after the come-out roll.

(9) The "come bet" shall win if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a 7 appears.

(10) The "come bet" shall lose if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 2, 3, or 12 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is again thrown.

(11) "Don't come bet" shall mean a wager placed on the "don't come" area of the layout at any time after the come-out roll.

(12) The "don't come bet" shall win if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 2 or 3 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and a 7 subsequently appears before that total is again thrown.

(13) The "don't come bet" shall lose if, on the roll immediately following placement of such bet a total of 7 or 11 is thrown, or a total of 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 is thrown and that total is again thrown before a 7 appears.

(14) The "don't come bet" shall be void if, on the roll following placement of such bet a total of 12 is thrown.

(15) "Place bet to win" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time on any of the numbers 4,5,6,8,9 or 10 which shall win if the number on which wager was placed is thrown before a 7 and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before such number. All place bets shall be active on any roll, except the come-out roll, unless called "on" by the player and confirmed by the dealer through placement of an "on" button on top of such player's wager.

(16)"Buy bets" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, on the 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10. A buy bet shall win if the particular number is thrown before a 7 is thrown and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before that number is thrown. In addition to the payout odds set forth in these rules for place bets on 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10, the player may also be offered the option of receiving true odds on these bets in return for the player paying at the time of making the bet an amount not to exceed five percent of such wager.

(17)"Lay bets" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, against any of the numbers 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10. A lay bet shall win if a 7 is thrown before the particular number against which the wager is placed and shall lose if a particular number against which the wager is placed is thrown before a 7 is thrown. The player may also be offered true odds on these bets, for which the player may be charged a fee not to exceed five percent on the amount to be won.

(18)"Four the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 4 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 2 appearing on each die, before a 4 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).

(19)"Six the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 6 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 3 appearing on each die before 6 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).

(20) "Eight the hardway" shall mean a wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 8 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 4 appearing on each die before 8 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).

(21) "Ten the hardway" shall mean a wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if a total of 10 is thrown the hardway (i.e., with 5 appearing on each die before 10 is thrown in any other way and before a 7 is thrown).

(22) "Field bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if any of the totals of 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bets and shall lose if a total of 5, 6, 7, or 8 is thrown on such a roll.

(23) "Any seven" or "big red" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 7 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such a bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(24) "Any craps" shall mean a one roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 2, 3, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(25) "Two Craps," "aces," or "low" shall mean a oneroll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 2 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(26) "Three Craps" or "ace-deuce" shall mean a oneroll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 3 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(27) "Twelve Craps," "high," or "boxcars" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(28) "Eleven" or "yo" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 11 is thrown on the next roll and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(29) "Horn bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time which shall win if a total of 2, 3, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown.

(30) "Horn high bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if any one of the totals 2, 3, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose, if any other total is thrown. A horn high bet will be placed in units of five, with four units wagered as a horn bet and an additional unit wagered on one of the totals 2, 3, 11, or 12. (31) "World bet" shall mean a one-roll wager that may be made at any time, which shall win if any one of the totals 2, 3, 7, 11, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown. A world bet shall be placed on the lower line of the any seven wager area in units of five with one unit wagered on each of the totals 2, 3, 7, 11, or 12.

(32) "3 way craps" shall mean a one-roll wager, that may be made at any time, which shall win, if any one of the following totals 2, 3, or 12 is thrown on the roll immediately following the placement of such bet and shall lose if any other total is thrown. A "3 way craps" bet will be placed with one unit wagered on each of the totals 2, 3, or 12. The dealer shall place such a wager touching the "C" of the any craps wager area and the horn or horn high wagering area.

(33) "Hop bet" means a one-roll wager that may be made at any time on a specific combination designated by the player which will win if the combination is thrown on a roll immediately following placement of such bet and will lose if any other combination is thrown.

(34) "Big six" or "big 6" means a wager placed in the area of the layout marked "big six" or "big 6," which shall win if a total of 6 is thrown before a 7 and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before a 6.

(35) "Big eight" or "big 8" means a wager placed on the area of the layout marked "big eight" or "big 8" and shall win if a total of eight is thrown before a 7, and shall lose if a 7 is thrown before an 8.

(36) "Split bet" means a one-roll wager that is placed on the line or area between two proposition bets. One half of the split bet is being bet on each side. Both bets will be left up and a net payoff is made to the player.

(37) "Craps-eleven" or "C and E" means a one-roll split bet on any craps and eleven.

(38) "High-low" means a one-roll split bet aces (2) and twelve (12).

(39) "Ace deuce–any craps" means a one-roll bet which is unique because if ace deuce (3) rolls, both sides of the bet win.

(40) "Put bets" are bets that are made directly on any number at any time, including the point, after the comeout roll has already been made. Put bets are allowed full odds as well.

(41) "All small" is an optional wager that may be offered on selected craps tables that is placed before the point is established by a new shooter. The wager will win if a 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 are all rolled by the shooter before a 7 is rolled. The numbers 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 may be rolled in any order, the same number may be rolled more than once, and rolling the numbers 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12 are irrelevant to the wager. The wager will lose if a 7 is rolled before a 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 are all rolled by the shooter.

(42) "All tall" is an optional wager that may be offered on selected craps tables that is placed before the point is established by a new shooter. The wager will win if an 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter before a 7 is rolled. The numbers 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12 may be rolled in any order, the same number may be rolled more than once, and rolling the numbers 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6 are irrelevant to the wager. The wager will lose if a 7 is rolled before an 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter. (43) "Make 'em all" is an optional wager that may be offered on selected craps tables that is placed before the point is established by a new shooter. The wager will win if a 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter before a 7 is rolled. The numbers 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 may be rolled in any order and the same number may be rolled more than once. The wager will lose if a 7 is rolled before a 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 are all rolled by the shooter. **111-501-45.** Making and removal of wagers. (a) All wagers at craps shall be made by placing gaming chips on the appropriate areas of the craps layout.

(b) Wagers shall be made before the dice are thrown.

(c) Wagers may be made by a player or may be made by verbal confirmation of a desired bet communicated to the dealer by the player with subsequent placement of said bet on the appropriate portion of the layout by the dealer.

(d) A wager made on any bet may be removed or reduced at any time prior to a roll that decided the outcome of such wager except that a pass line bet and a come bet shall not be removed or reduced after a come-out point or some point is established with respect to such bet. Pass line and come bets are always active.

(e) A don't come bet and a don't pass bet may be removed or reduced at any time but may not be replaced or increased after such removal or reduction until a new come-out roll.

(f) All place bets, come odds and hardways shall be inactive on any come-out roll unless requested "on" by the player and confirmed by the dealer through placement of an "on" button on top of the wager. All other wagers shall be considered active unless a player requests to have his bets inactive. The dealer through placement of an "off" button must confirm this.

(g) Minimum and maximum table limits will be posted.

(h) If a player wagers less than the table minimum bet and the dealer does not notice it, the dealer shall take or pay the amount actually bet and instruct the player of the minimum amount that must be wagered on subsequent bets.

(i) If in error a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the dealer shall remove the excess and return it to the player, pay the bet at the correct odds, and inform the player of the permissible amount that can be wagered on subsequent bets.

(j) In the event of a dealer placing a bet for a player, chips shall not be taken from the player's hands or from the rack in front of the player. All chips for the bet shall be set down on the layout by the player and the dealer shall clarify the purpose of the chips before picking them up.

(k) Wager and payout odds shall be as follows:

(l) A horn bet shall be paid as if it were four separate wagers on 2,3,11, and 12.

(m) All charges for vigorish that are less than one dollar amounts, will be rounded down to the nearest dollar figure.

(n) For lay bets against a 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10, a player shall receive true odds on these bets in return for the player paying at the time of making the bet a percentage of the amount the player could win on such bet, which in no event shall exceed five percent of such amount.

(o) A lay bet against a number shall win if a seven rolls before the number is rolled.

(p) A lay bet against a number shall lose if the number rolls before a seven is rolled.

(q) A player may remove the player's lay bet at any time before the number or seven is rolled. If the player removes the lay bet, the amount of the vigorish will also be returned.

(r) Lay bets pay at the following odds:

1 to 2
2 to 3
5 to 6

(s) Players may take odds on their pass and come bets as follows:

(1) On a pass line point/come bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to 3 times the pass line bet.

(2) On a pass line point/come bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to 4 times the pass line bet.

(3) On a pass line point/come bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to 5 times the pass line bet.

(t) Players may take odds on their put bets. Put bets are made the same way as pass line and come bets, except that put bets are placed directly on the number without going through the pass or come, as follows:

(1) On a put bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to three times the pass line bet.

(2) On a put bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to four times the pass line bet.

(3) On a put bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to five times the pass line bet.

(u) Players may lay odds on their don't pass and don't come bets up to:

(1) 4 and 10 can lay to win 3 times the don't pass/don't come bet.

(2) 5 and 9 can lay to win 4 times the don't pass/don't come bet.

(3) 6 and 8 can lay to win 5 times the don't pass/don't come bet.

(v) Players may make an optional wager on either the All Small, All Tall or Make Em All bonus bet. The payout odds on winning "All small," "All Tall," and "Make 'em All" wagers are as follows:

(1) All small 34 to 1

(2) All tall 34 to 1

(3) Make 'em all 175 to 1

#### Article 601.—SOUTHEAST GAMING ZONE

**111-601-37.** Making and removal of wagers. (a) All wagers at craps shall be made by placing gaming chips on the appropriate areas of the craps layout.

(b) Wagers shall be made before the dice are thrown.

(c) Wagers may be made by a player or may be made by verbal confirmation of a desired bet communicated to the dealer by the player with subsequent placement of said bet on the appropriate portion of the layout by the dealer.

(d) A wager made on any bet may be removed or reduced at any time prior to a roll that decided the outcome of such wager except that a pass bet and a come bet shall not be removed or reduced after a come-out point or some point is established with respect to such bet. Pass line and come bets are always active and cannot be changed or withdrawn until the bet either wins or loses.

(e) A don't come bet and a don't pass bet may be removed or reduced at any time but may not be replaced or increased after such removal or reduction until a new come-out roll.

(f) All place bets, come bet odds and hardways shall be inactive on any come-out roll unless requested "on" by the player and confirmed by the dealer through placement of an "on" button on top of the wager. All other wagers shall be considered active unless a player requests to have his bets inactive. The dealer through placement of an "off" button must confirm this.

(g) Minimum and maximum table limits will be posted.

(h) If a player wagers less than the table minimum bet and the dealer does not notice it, the dealer shall take or pay the amount actually bet and instruct the player of the minimum amount that must be wagered on subsequent bets.

(i) If in error a player has been permitted to wager more than the table maximum, the dealer shall remove the excess and return it to the player, pay the bet at the correct odds for the maximum allowable wager, and inform the player of the permissible amount that can be wagered on subsequent bets.

(j) In the event of a dealer placing a bet for a player, chips shall not be taken from the player's hands or from the rack in front of the player. All chips for the bet shall be set down on the layout by the player and the dealer shall clarify the purpose of the chips before picking them up.

(l) A horn bet shall be paid as if it were four separate wagers on 2, 3, 11, and 12.

(m) All charges for vigorish that are less than one dollar amounts, will be rounded down to the nearest dollar figure.

(n) A player may remove the player's lay bet at any time before the number or seven is rolled. If the player removes the lay bet, the amount of the vigorish will also be returned.

(o) Players may take odds on their pass and come bets as follows:

(1) On a pass line point/come bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to 10 times the pass line bet.

(2) On a pass line point/come bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to 10 times the pass line bet.

(3) On a pass line point/come bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to 10 times the pass line bet.

(p) Players may take odds on their put bets. Put bets are made the same way as pass line and come bets, except that put bets are placed directly on the number without going through the pass or come, as follows:

(1) On a put bet of 4 and 10, odds can be taken up to ten times the pass line bet.

(2) On a put bet of 5 and 9, odds can be taken up to ten times the pass line bet.

(3) On a put bet of 6 and 8, odds can be taken up to ten times the pass line bet.

(q) Players may lay odds on their don't pass and don't come bets up to:

(1) 4 and 10 can lay to win 10 times the don't pass/don't come bet.

(2) 5 and 9 can lay to win 10 times the don't pass/don't come bet.

(3) 6 and 8 can lay to win 10 times the don't pass/don't come bet.

(r) Minimum and maximum odds will be posted at each table.

(s) The payout odds on a winning fire bet are as follows:
