# Notice Concerning Proposed Modifications to Kansas Air Quality Construction Permit and Class II Operating Permit

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding proposed modifications to an air quality construction permit and Class II operating permit. Tenawa Resource Management, LLC, has applied for a construction permit modification in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 and Class II operating permit modification in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-544. Emissions of Oxides of Nitrogen (NO<sub>x</sub>), Carbon Monoxide (CO), Oxides of Sulfur (SO<sub>x</sub>), Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC), Particulate Matter (PM), Particulate Matter less than or equal to 10 microns ( $PM_{10}$ ), Particulate Matter less than or equal to 2.5 microns (PM<sub>2.5</sub>), and Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process. The purpose of a Class II permit is to limit the potential-to-emit for these pollutants to below major source thresholds.

Tenawa Resource Management, LLC, 1201 Louisiana St., Suite 3400, Houston, TX, 77002 owns and operates the Haven Gas Plant located at 13114 S. Kent Rd., Haven, KS 67543.

The purpose of the revocation is to avoid confusion, as these regulations are no longer necessary. The revocation is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

Revocation of K.A.R. 21-46-2 and 21-46-3. This proposal revokes two regulations that the Kansas appellate courts have determined to be invalid. Summaries of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follow (Note: Statements indicating that a regulation is "not anticipated to have any economic impact" are intended to indicate that no economic impact on the Department of Labor, other state agencies, state employees, or the general public has been identified.)

**K.A.R 51-1-1 – Forms.** This regulation is being revoked and replaced with K.A.R. 51-1-26.

K.A.R. 51-1-26 – Submissions; electronic filing (Efiling) system. This regulation will address the new mandatory electronic filing with the division of workers compensation on and after November 30, 2018.

**K.A.R. 51-17-2 – Methods of filing; service.** This regulation will address the methods for filing by represented parties, unrepresented parties and service.

**Economic Impact** – There will be a minimal initial start-up cost in the form of the time it takes to set up accounts (creating user names and passwords) and the time it takes to receive training which will be provided by the Division of Workers Compensation at no cost to the users. Thereafter, users will realize immediate savings through the elimination of document printing, document copying, mailing supplies, postage, courier service charges, document storage costs and the corresponding savings of time and labor no longer required to complete these tasks.
