The maximum aggregate principal amount of the bonds shall not exceed \$125,455. The proposed sale of the bonds is in all respects subject to approval of a bond purchase agreement between the Issuer and the purchaser of the bonds and the passage of an ordinance and adoption of a resolution by the governing body of the Issuer authorizing the issuance of the bonds and the execution of various documents necessary to deliver the bonds.

The proposed regulation amendments are for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed amendments to the regulation and the economic impact follows:

117-2-1. Licensed classification; education requirements. This regulation is being amended to remove the college level education from this classification.

There will be no economic impact to this agency, other governmental agencies or units, or existing appraisers. There could, however, be a savings to applicants for this classification in the removal of the college level education, resulting in a one-time possible savings of \$17,224.80.

117-2-2. Licensed classification; appraisal experience requirement. This regulation is being amended to modify both the hours of appraisal experience required for this classification, as well as the minimum time frame in which those hours may be accrued. We have also reduced the maximum number of alternate appraisal experience hours allowed. There is an update to the "experience hours table" adopted by reference in (d)(2).

There will be no economic impact to this agency, other governmental agencies or units, or existing appraisers. There could, however, be a savings to applicants for this classification in the reduction of the number of experience hours required, as well as the minimum time in which they must work under the supervision of a certified appraiser. This possible savings is estimated at \$1,425.

117-3-2. General classification; appraisal experience requirement. This regulation is being amended to reduce the minimum time in which an applicant must accrue their experience hours.

There will be no economic impact to this agency, or other governmental agencies or units. There could, however, be a savings to applicants or appraiser upgrades to this classification in reducing the minimum time in which they must work under the supervision of a certified appraiser. Due to variables involved with commercial, agricultural, and industrial appraisals, no figure can be estimated.

117-4-1. Residential classification; education requirements. This regulation is being amended to provide applicants with options for meeting the college level education, as well as allowing an alternative to the college level education for state licensees to upgrade.

There will be no economic impact to this agency, or other governmental agencies or units. There could, however, be a substantial savings to state licensees upgrading to this classification allowing their experience in lieu of the college level education. The possible savings is estimated at \$34,496.60. The possible savings for new applicants or state licensed appraisers who do not meet the criteria set out in 117-4-1(e) is estimated at \$17,224.80.

117-4-2. Residential classification; appraisal experience requirement. This regulation is being amended to reduce both the number of experience hours as well as the minimum time frame in which those hours must be accrued. There is also a reduction in the number of alternate experience hours which may be used.

There will be no economic impact to this agency, or other governmental agencies or units. There could, however, be a substantial savings to state licensees to upgrade to this classification, as well as new applicants in the reduction of the number of experience hours which must be met, and the minimum time frame in which those hours must be accrued. This possible savings is estimated at \$1,425.

117-5-1. Provisional classification; education requirements. This regulation is being amended to reflect the changes to 117-2-1, 3-1, and 4-1 in the qualifying education and/or college level education that must be met.

There will be no economic impact to this agency, other governmental agencies or units, or appraisers. There could, however, be a substantial savings to new applicants in the changes to the college level education required in 117-2-1 and 3-1, as well as the reduction of experience hours in 117-2-2 and 3-2 and the reduction of the minimum time frame in which those hours must be accrued in 117-2-2, 3-2, and 4-2. The possible savings would be the same as those shown in 117-2-2, 3-2, and 4-2.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Division of Public Health, Bureau of Family Health, will conduct a public hearing at 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, October 16, 2018, in Room 530, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 SW Jackson, Topeka, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed new maternal and child health regulation K.A.R. 28-4-95, regarding a fee for fingerprint-based background checks for required individuals working, residing, or regularly volunteering in child care facilities.

A summary of the proposed regulation and estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of Regulation:

K.A.R. 28-4-95. Fee for fingerprint-based background checks. This regulation creates a fee fund for fingerprint-based background checks for required individuals in child care facilities and complies with KSA 65-516, as amended by 2018 HB 2639, and the background check requirements of the federal Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 2014.

Economic Impact:

Cost to the agency: The provisions of 2018 HB 2639 establish a child care criminal background and fingerprinting fund administered by KDHE. Fees submitted by applicants and licensees and KDHE's payments for the background checks will be processed through that fund. The KDHE Child Care Licensing and Registration Information System (CLARIS) will interface with the Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) KanCheck system to enable KDHE to receive the results of the required background checks. Costs to KDHE include establishing the fee fund and the policies and procedures. Costs will be absorbed in the ongoing KDHE budget.

Cost to licensees: The proposed regulation requires applicants and licensees to submit a non-refundable fee to KDHE for each individual who is required to complete a fingerprint-based background check. The fingerprint check will be completed for each individual initially and once every five years thereafter. Currently, the cost for each individual will be \$48 based on the fees charged by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI), the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and the KDADS KanCheck system maintenance fee. In the final rules of the federal block grant, 45 CFR 98.43(f) states that "Fees that a State, Territory, or Tribe may charge for the costs of processing applications and administering a criminal background check as required by this section shall not exceed the actual costs for the processing and administration."

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: The KBI and FBI will have ongoing costs for processing fingerprint-based background checks. KDADS will have ongoing costs for maintenance of KanCheck, an integrated system for requesting and receiving results of fingerprint-based background checks. As with all licensees, local units of government, including cities, counties, and (continued)

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unified school districts that operate a licensed child care facility, will be required to submit a nonrefundable fee for each individual required to complete a fingerprint-based background check.

Cost to the agency: There is no added cost to the agency associated with the amendments to this regulation that only change the required timeframe for specimen collection.

Cost to institutions: There is no added cost to institutions or others collecting specimens in the timeframe required by the amendments to this regulation.

Summary of Regulation:

K.A.R. 28-70-2. Reporting requirements. This amended regulation specifies the cancer screening data for collection and the requirements for reporting when and by what method cancer screening data is to be reported to the Kansas Cancer Registry. The proposed amendments add two types of cancer screening data to be collected and clarify the method of electronic data transfer to the Kansas Cancer Registry. The proposed amendments comply with the national standards from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the National Cancer Institute in regard to routine cancer screenings that provide the opportunity to identify cancers in early stages or before cancers become malignant. The long-term impact of having cancer screening data is to reduce screenable cancers and prolong survivorship.

Economic Impact:

Cost to the agency: There is no additional cost to the agency associated with the amendments to this regulation regarding data collection and reporting.

Cost to reporting parties: There is no additional cost to reporting parties.
