- (b) The price of pull tab tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$2.00 each.
- (c) Approximately 1,800,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this pull tab game that shall be packaged in packs of 150 tickets each. The ticket numbers in each pack in this game shall start with 000 and end with 149. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.
 - (d) The play symbols for this game are as follows:

Symbol of a mermaid Symbol of a fish Symbol of a star fish Symbol of an octopus Symbol of a crab Symbol of coins Symbol of a shell Symbol of a treasure chest

(e) For this game, three play symbols shall appear under each of eight tabs on the back of each ticket. On the front of each ticket shall appear a legend of all winning combinations using the play symbols for this game along

- with the corresponding prize amount for each combination, as follows: three symbols of a mermaid equal \$2.00; three symbols of a fish equal \$5.00; three symbols of a star fish equal \$10.00; three symbols of an octopus equal \$25.00; three symbols of a crab equal \$50.00; three symbols of coins equal \$100.00; three symbols of a shell equal \$250.00; three symbols of a treasure chest equal \$2,500.00.
- (f) All tabs on the back of each ticket are to be pulled open. For each combination of three play symbols matching the legend on the front of the ticket, the player wins the prize amount corresponding to each combination as shown in (e) above. All winning combinations shall be within a single window in a horizontal line.
