Governmental Ethics Opinion

Opinion No. 2019-01

Written February 27, 2019.

Synopsis: Senate Bill No. 394 (2018) changes to the definition of lobbying may confuse attorneys' representation of clients with issues before state administrative agencies and lobbying. Notwithstanding the statutory changes, the interpretation by the Commission remains unchanged.

Cited herein: K.S.A. 46-222, 46-225.

To All Interested Persons,

Pursuant to K.S.A. 46-254, the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission issues this opinion regarding lobbying laws and attorney practice on behalf of clients before governmental agencies.

Issue

Do the recent changes to the K.S.A. 46-225 definition of lobbying make representation of clients before state agencies lobbying?

Analysis and Opinion

The legislature recently amended K.S.A. 46-225 adding the following subparagraphs to the definition of lobbying:

- (a)(2) promoting or opposing in any manner an action or nonaction by any executive agency on any executive administrative matter;
- (a)(3) promoting or opposing in any manner an action by any judicial agency on any judicial administrative manner[.]

Standing alone, these changes make it seem that lobbying includes representation cases by attorneys practicing before state agencies. However, along with these changes, another change to the same statute adds new subparagraph (g)(2) to the same statute and it specifically excludes attorneys representing clients from the definition of lobbying

(g) "Lobbying" does not include:

. . .

(2) communications by an attorney representing a client involving ongoing legal work with respect to an executive administrative matter or judicial administrative matter, or an administrative proceeding or hearing and negotiations conducted by and with attorneys for executive agencies or judicial agencies, or interactions between parties in litigation or other contested matters, and testimony by a witness in administrative hearings or communications to or by investigators or authorities in the course of any investigation.

Consequently, attorneys representing clients before government entities are not lobbyists and need not register as a lobbyist.

Similarly, attorneys working in-house for organizations do not need to register as a lobbyist for the organization, so long as the attorney is not employed in a considerable degree for lobbying, is not formally appointed by their organization as a lobbyist and does not make expenditures of \$1,000 or more for lobbying. Pursuant to K.S.A. 46-222, such occasional lobbying does not necessitate registration as a lobbyist.

In closing, the Commission suggests that registered lobbyists may seek further guidance from Commission staff regarding services that constitute lobbying, pursuant to K.S.A.46-225.

K.A.R. 68-11-1 and 68-11-2 are being amended to increase application and renewal fees for pharmacists, pharmacies, and other facilities registered by the Board. In response to legislative requests in 2014 related to excess Board fee funds, the Board lowered fees by 20% for all application and renewal license types. In addition, the legislature swept \$800,000 from the Board fee fund to the state general fund after fees were lowered in 2014, depleting the

fee fund balance even more. These increases are within existing statutory caps, allow fees to remain competitive with other state boards of pharmacy, and are necessary to maintain a positive fee fund balance in FY 2020 and beyond. Based on the increases, which range from 25-46% for most licensure categories, the Board anticipates generating \$342,630 of additional revenue per year. For more details, please review the complete economic impact statement.

Article 9.—MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL

51-9-7. Fees for medical and hospital services. Fees for medical, surgical, hospital, dental, and nursing services, medical equipment, medical supplies, prescriptions, medical records, and medical testimony rendered pursuant to the Kansas workers compensation act shall be the lesser of the following:

- (a) The usual and customary charge of the health care provider, hospital, or other entity providing the health care services; or
