The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. Article 4.—MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

28-4-133. Reporting critical incidents. This regulation shall apply to all day care homes, group day care homes, preschools, and child care centers.

(a) Reports to parents and legal guardians. In addition to meeting the reporting requirements in K.A.R. 28-4-127, each primary care provider and each program director shall ensure that each of the following critical incidents is immediately reported to the parent or legal guardian of any child affected by the critical incident:

(1) Fire damage or other damage to the facility, or any damage to the property that affects the structure of the facility or the safety of the children in care;

(2) a vehicle collision involving any child in care;

(3) a missing child;

(4) an injury to a child that requires treatment by a health care professional;(5) the death of any of the following:
(A) A child;
(B) a provider in a day care home or group day care
home;
(C) an employee in a preschool or child care center; or
(D) a volunteer in a day care home, group day care
home, preschool, or child care center; and
(6) any other occurrence that jeopardizes the safety of
any child in care.
(b) Written reports to the department. Each primary
care provider and each program director shall ensure
that a written report of any critical incident specified in
subsection (a) is submitted by the next working day to the department. The report shall be submitted on a form
provided by the department. A copy of each critical inci-
dent report shall be kept on file at the facility for at least
