The scope of the services will vary for each project and may include a bridge type selection, bridge design, road design, traffic engineering, hydrology/hydraulics, designer construction services, and permitting assistance for some projects. Survey will be completed for most projects by Notice to Proceed. Geotech will be provided by KDOT early in the project development. The project scopes include:

Executive Order No. 20-53 Establishing an Annual Report Card for Students in Foster Care

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas is committed to supporting the success and well-being of children in the custody of the Secretary of the Department for Children and Families;

WHEREAS, receiving a quality education is vital to the long-term success and well-being of all Kansans;

WHEREAS, as their legal custodian, the State of Kansas bears a heightened responsibility to make every effort to ensure Kansas students in foster care receive a quality education;

WHEREAS, there currently exists no report or entity that tracks and publishes educational outcomes for students in foster care;

WHEREAS, the Kansas State Department of Education records and maintains data that tracks the educational outcomes of all Kansas students;

WHEREAS, the Kansas State Department of Education is willing to share that data to assist with the creation of a report of educational outcomes for Kansas students in foster care;

WHEREAS, such a report would provide educators, stakeholders, and elected leaders valuable insights regarding needed improvements in the State's efforts to ensure a quality education for all students in foster care;

WHEREAS, such a report would provide additional transparency and accountability to enhance the efforts of the State and school districts to provide a quality education to children in foster care; and

WHEREAS, upholding the values of transparency, cooperation, and accountability between educators, stakeholders, and elected leaders regarding the State's efforts to provide quality education to students in foster care will aid in the development of policies and programs that support all children in DCF custody.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby direct the Kansas Department for Children and Families to produce an Annual Academic Report Card for children in the custody of the Secretary of the Department for Children and Families in collaboration with the Kansas State Department of Education.

- 1. The Report Card shall contain the following data elements for the preceding school year:
 - a. The graduation rate of students in foster care at the end of each academic year;
 - b. the number and percentage of students in foster care who were promoted to the next grade level;
 - the number and percentage of students in foster care who were suspended during the school year, and the average number of days each student spent in suspension;

- d. the number and percentage of students in foster care who were expelled during the school year;
- e. state standardized assessment scores for students in foster care, including the number and percentage of students meeting academic standards as determined by the state board of education;
- f. the number and percentage of students in foster care enrolled in any preschool-aged at-risk program, Kansas preschool pilot program or early childhood special education program under section 619 of part B of the individuals with disabilities act;
- g. the number and percentage of students in foster care who participated in the mental health intervention team pilot program or a similar mental health program;
- h. the total number of students in foster care enrolled in a school district or accredited nonpublic school and the disaggregated number and percentage of students in foster care enrolled in school districts and accredited nonpublic schools; and
- i. de-identified disaggregated race and ethnicity data for each data set required in (a) through (h); and
- j. any additional data elements that both the Kansas State Department of Education and the Kansas Department for Children and Families deem appropriate for inclusion.
- 2. The Report Card shall be published annually and presented to the House and Senate Education committees by the Kansas Department for Children and Families by January 15 of each year.
- 3. For the purpose of this Order, "school" shall include any school of a school district or any nonpublic school accredited by the Kansas State Board of Education.
- 4. For the purposes of this Order, "student in foster" care shall include any youth who was in the custody of the Kansas Department for Children and Families and attended a KSBOE-accredited school at any time during the school year for which the report is being completed.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 20-53. It shall become effective immediately and remain in force until rescinded.

Executive Order No. 20-55
Amended Provisions Related to Drivers'
License and Vehicle Registration and
Regulation During State of Disaster Emergency

WHEREAS, securing the health, safety, and economic well-being of residents of the State of Kansas is this Administration's top priority;

WHEREAS, Kansas is facing a crisis – the pandemic and public health emergency of COVID-19— with effects of illness, quarantines, school closures, and temporary closure of businesses resulting in lost wages and financial hardship to Kansas citizens;

WHEREAS, the United States Departments of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 beginning January 27, 2020, with now more than 2,900,000 cases of the illness and more than 130,000 deaths as a result of the illness across the United States;

WHEREAS, a State of Disaster Emergency was proclaimed for the State of Kansas on March 12, 2020, and such emergency has been extended to September 15, 2020 pursuant to Sec. 5(a) of House Bill 2016 (special session 2020);

WHEREAS, as of this date, there have been over 16,901 positive cases of COVID-19 in Kansas, spread among 98 counties and 280 deaths as a result of the illness;

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020, I executed Executive Order 20-12 regarding driver's licenses and vehicle registration and regulation during the public health emergency, and the justifications for that Order are fully set forth therein and incorporated herein by reference;

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2020, I executed Executive Order 20-36 that extended many of the provisions in Executive Order 20-12, and the justifications for that Order are fully set forth therein and incorporated by reference;

WHEREAS, to protect Kansans, and especially those who may be members of a vulnerable population, it is necessary to extend deadlines for Kansas residents and entities to apply for a motor vehicle title;

WHEREAS, to protect Kansans, and especially those who may be members of a vulnerable population, it is necessary to further extend the terms of Kansas driver's licenses that have expired since this pandemic began;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, including the authority granted me by K.S.A. 48-924 and K.S.A. 48-925(b), (c)(1), and (c)(11), in order to address the effects of the spread of COVID-19, I hereby direct and order the following:

- 1. The Division of Vehicles shall extend any temporary, sixty-day Kansas permits for motor vehicles purchased after January 1, 2020, through May 31, 2020. Kansas residents who have purchased a new or used motor vehicle on or after January 1, 2020, and are operating with a valid, extended sixty-day permit, may continue to use such temporary tag beyond the sixty-day period and the State permit shall continue to authorize road use subject to paragraph 2 below.
- 2. New Kansas owners that have purchased a new or used motor vehicle on or after January 1, 2020, shall not be required to make application for vehicle transfer, certificate of title, and registration, within sixty days of the owners' purchases as required by subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-135, and shall instead be subject to the following, extended deadlines:

- a. For motor vehicles purchased between January 1, 2020, and January 31, 2020, the Kansas owner must title and register the motor vehicle by August 31, 2020, or incur late penalties and loss of authority to operate motor vehicle on State roadways;
- b. For motor vehicles purchased between February 1, 2020, and February 29, 2020, the Kansas owner must title and register the motor vehicle by September 30, 2020, or incur late penalties and loss of authority to operate motor vehicle on State roadways;
- c. For motor vehicles purchased between March 1, 2020, and March 31, 2020, the Kansas owner must title and register the motor vehicle by October 31, 2020, or incur late penalties and loss of authority to operate motor vehicle on State roadways;
- d. For motor vehicles purchased between April 1, 2020, and April 30, 2020, the Kansas owner must title and register the motor vehicle by November 30, 2020, or incur late penalties and loss of authority to operate motor vehicle on State roadways;
- e. For motor vehicles purchased between May 1, 2020, and May 31, 2020, the Kansas owner must title and register the motor vehicle by December 31, 2020, or incur late penalties and loss of authority to operate motor vehicle on State roadways;
- 3. The Division of Vehicles shall extend the terms of drivers' licenses and identification cards for all Kansas residents with State driver's licenses and identification cards that expired or will expire on March 12, 2020, through September 15, 2020, and who are not able to renew at a State driver's license examination office due to the State's COVID-19 response.
- 4. All Law enforcement agencies or officers shall use their discretion in deciding whether to enforce laws related to expired drivers' licenses and vehicle registration and should consider the State of Disaster Emergency when reviewing credentials issued by the State of Kansas, as the Division of Vehicles will not indicate in its system that such drivers' credentials are or will be expired while the State of Disaster Emergency remains in effect.
- All driver's license and identification card renewals extended by this Executive Order must be completed by December 31, 2020, or normal late fees will be assessed.
- 6. No other laws or regulations relating to license and vehicle registration and regulation, including motor vehicle registration renewals, are affected by this order. Vehicle titling extensions in paragraphs 1 and 2 are limited to passenger vehicles and trucks weighing less than 10,000 pounds, and this order does not affect existing IRP and commercial motor carrier rules.

- 7. This order supersedes any contrary order by a local health department regarding drivers' licenses or vehicle registrations and should be read in conjunction with previous executive orders responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. Any contrary provision in previous orders is superseded by this order.
- 8. Executive Order 20-36, as extended by Executive Order 20-49, is rescinded and replaced by this order.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 20-55. It shall become effective immediately and remain in force until rescinded, until September 15, 2020, or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency extended by House Bill 2016 enacted during the June 2020 special session relating to COVID-19 expires, whichever is earlier.

Executive Order No. 20-56 Amended Licensure, Certification, and Registration for Persons and Licensure of "Adult Care Homes" During State of Disaster Emergency

WHEREAS, securing the health, safety, and economic well-being of residents of the State of Kansas is this Administration's top priority;

WHEREAS, the United States Departments of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 beginning January 27, 2020, with now more than 2,900,000 cases of the illness and more than 130,000 deaths as a result of the illness across the United States;

WHEREAS, a State of Disaster Emergency was proclaimed for the State of Kansas on March 12, 2020, and such emergency has been extended to September 15, 2020 pursuant to Sec. 5(a) of House Bill 2016 (special session 2020);

WHEREAS, as of this date, there have been over 16,901 positive cases of COVID-19 in Kansas, spread among 98 counties and 280 deaths as a result of the illness;

WHEREAS, on April 2, 2020 CMS issued the *COVID-19 Long-Term Care Facility Guidance* to all states regarding the recommendations to help mitigate the spread of the 2019 Novel Coronovirus and to advise states on how to comply with CMS and CDC guidance to keep residents and patients safe and to maintain adequate staff levels and thereby to reduce the imminent threat of new outbreaks of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2020 CMS issued a supplemental guidance 2019 Novel Cornovirus (COVID-19) Long-Term Care Facility Transfer Scenarios to all states, which further provided details of how to transfer/discharge residents between facilities for the purpose of cohorting residents based on COVID-19 status as well as other aspects of how to provide care in long-term care facilities;

WHEREAS, as authorized by the *COVID-19 Long-Term Care Facility Guidance* and additional guidance issued by CMS, blanket federal waivers for certain CMS requirements of participation for adult care homes have been issued; thus suspension/waiver of certain state statutes, regulations and administrative rules is necessary to reduce the risk of further exposure and spread of COVID-19 and to assist with mitigation efforts during the COVID-19 public health emergency;

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2020, CMS issued QSO-20-30-NH- Nursing Home Reopening Recommendations for State and Local Officials that includes recommendations for State and local officials to help determine the level of mitigation needed to prevent the transmission of COVID-19 in nursing homes. The recommendations provide guidance in the following areas: (1) criteria for relaxing certain restrictions and mitigating the risk of resurgence through a phased approach; (2) visitation and service considerations; and (3) restoration of certain survey activities in each phase.

WHEREAS, adult care homes for purposes of this order are defined as any nursing facility, nursing facility for mental health, intermediate care facility for people with intellectual disability, assisted living facility, residential healthcare facility, home plus, boarding care home and adult day care facility; all of which are classifications of adult care homes and are required to be licensed by the secretary for aging and disability services in accordance with K.S.A. 39-923(a);

WHEREAS, licensed facilities regularly undergo licensing visits, extensive training, strict adherence to admission/transfer/discharge requirements for residents, specific requirements for how nursing facilities are physically structured, and many other requirements that require approval/collaboration from the various state agencies;

WHEREAS, licensed facilities and units also provide significant services within Kansas, and the current licensing structure, which is carried out regularly when the state and country are not in the midst of a pandemic, would detrimentally impact the provision of services and care provided to Kansans;

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2020, I executed Executive Order 20-23 addressing licensure, certification, and registration regarding adult care homes, and the justifications for that Order are fully set forth therein and incorporated herein by reference;

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2020, I executed Executive Order 20-41 addressing licensure, certification, and registration regarding adult care homes, and the justifications for that Order are fully set forth therein and incorporated herein by reference;

WHEREAS, the operative provisions of Executive Orders 20-23 and 20-41 were not only necessary to deal with the public health crisis caused by COVID-19 but in many respects are still necessary to address the imminent threat of new COVID-19 outbreaks in adult care homes;

WHEREAS, in these challenging times this Administration will do whatever it can to avoid immediate dangers to the health, safety, and welfare of Kansans, including preventing threats to the health and welfare of residents of state facilities.; and

WHEREAS, this Administration will also ensure State and local officials have appropriate statutory and regulatory authority available to protect the rights, health, safety and welfare of residents as each adult care home implements its phased reopening plan in accordance with CMS' May 18, 2020 reopening guidance and reopening guidance documents issued by KDADS.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, including but not limited to the authority granted me by K.S.A 48-924 and K.S.A 48-925(b), (c)(1), and (c)(11), as amended by 2020 HB 2016, in order to respond to and mitigate the spread of COVID-19, I hereby direct and order the following:

Provisions Specific to Persons

- 1. Pursuant to Executive Order 20-49, all state agencies who work with or collaborate with KDADS shall extend renewal deadlines for any occupational or professional license, certificate, or registration issued by a state agency or any board, commission, or other licensing authority within a state agency to a person or any for-profit or non-profit business or organization.
- 2. A temporary license, certification, or registration may be issued for persons who were previously licensed, certified, or registration issued by a Kansas state agency or any board, commission, division or other licensing authority within the State as long as the person was in good standing prior to the lapse of the license, certification, or registration. Additionally, the license, certificate, or registration may not have been issued more than five years from the date of this order.
- 3. A temporary aide authorization may be issued for persons who receive minimum training within the nursing facility as set forth by KDADS. The facility, at a minimum, needs to ensure persons with a temporary aide authorization are competent to perform/execute their duties, including but not limited to: infection control, proper patient handling, and how to effectively assist with the performance of activities of daily living.
- 4. A temporary authorization may be issued for persons who were not previously licensed, certified, or registered by Kansas or any other state in the United States of America. The individuals who may be served by those who hold this temporary authorization are individuals who only require minimal supervision or assistance with activities of daily living. The facility, at a minimum, needs to ensure persons with a temporary authorization are competent to perform/execute their duties, including but not limited to: infection control, proper patient handling, and how to effectively assist with the performance of activities of daily living.

Provisions Specific to Facilities/Units/Locations

5. The Secretary of KDADS shall have authority to issue a provisional license, pursuant to K.S.A. 39-929,

- to an adult care home that submits a checklist, on a form approved by KDADS; and a detailed plan for isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Secretary's approval of the checklist and plan may require temporary suspension of standards, requirements, rules and regulations related to the physical environment, a change in bed capacity or change in bed classification for the adult care home. The requirement of K.S.A. 39-929 that the State Fire Marshal approve issuance of the provisional license shall be suspended only if KDADS has approved the adult care home's submission of the checklist and plan for cohorting residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The provisional license shall be valid for 90 days following the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. Otherwise, if a provisional license is issued by KDADS for reasons other than the isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, all requirements of K.S.A. 39-929 shall be effective.
- 6. If KDADS has granted a provisional license to the adult care home, pursuant to K.S.A. 39-929, for the purpose of isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the duties and responsibilities identified in K.S.A. 39-928 as it relates to the State Fire Marshal, those who contract with the State Fire Marshal, or other entities who perform similar duties to the State Fire Marshal regarding inspections of adult care homes shall be suspended for new or renewal KDADS-licensed facilities, units, or locations for a period of 90 days following the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. K.S.A. 39-928 shall otherwise be effective.
- 7. With the exception of quality care assessments and penalties arising therefrom, any initial, renewal, modification, late, delinquent, penalty, or expiration fees associated with any Kansas-licensed adult care home that occur after March 12, 2020 are suspended until 90 days following the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency.
- 8. Any fees associated with reducing, increasing, or modifying an adult care home's bed capacity for the purpose of cohorting residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, are waived until 90 days following the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. Any modification to bed capacity for the purpose of cohorting residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic during the State of Disaster Emergency shall not impact the amount of quality care assessment owed by the adult care home, unless there is a change of ownership. Receiverships are exempt from this modification to quality care assessments. Every adult care home shall return to the original bed capacity authorized prior to the State of Disaster Emergency.
- 9. If KDADS has granted a provisional license to an adult care home, pursuant to K.S.A. 39-929, for the purpose of isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, K.A.R. 26-39-101(g) is suspended until 30 days after the termination of the (continued)

State of Disaster Emergency. The facility shall provide KDADS written notice within 5 calendar days of such a change in capacity. If KDADS has not issued a provisional license as specified in this section, K.A.R. 26-39-101(g) shall otherwise be effective.

- 10.If KDADS has granted a provisional license to the adult care home, pursuant to K.S.A. 39-929, for the purpose of isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the requirement for at least a 30-day notification before the change of services identified in K.A.R. 26-39-103(c)(2) is suspended until 30 days after the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. K.A.R. 26-39-103(c)(2) shall otherwise be effective.
- 11. The requirement to produce documents for inspection within 2 calendar days of the request under K.A.R. 26-39-103(d)(1) is amended to require production of documents for inspection within 7 calendar days of the request until there is a termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. After the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency, the response time-frame for K.A.R. 26-39-103(d)(1) shall revert to the original requirement that was in effect immediately prior to the State of Disaster Emergency.
- 12. The free choice requirement under K.A.R. 26-39-103(f)(1) related to any change in physician shall be suspended until there is a termination of the State of Disaster Emergency only if one or more of the following events occur in an adult care home: (a) State or local health authorities have not approved the visitation portion of an adult care home's phased reopening plan; (b) State or local authorities have imposed restrictions upon visitation in an adult care home; or (c) the resident's chosen physician cannot meet the screening requirements of the local health authorities. K.A.R. 26-39-103(f)(1) shall otherwise be effective.
- 13.If KDADS has granted a provisional license to the adult care home, pursuant to K.S.A. 39-929, for the purpose of isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the requirement to develop a comprehensive care plan as identified in K.A.R. 28-39-151(h)(2)(A) is suspended until 45 days after the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. The requirement for the adult care home to develop the comprehensive plan may be extended beyond 45 days, at the discretion of KDADS, if extenuating circumstances exist. K.A.R. 28-39-151(h)(2)(A) shall otherwise be effective.
- 14. The right to meet/participate in organized groups identified in K.A.R. 28-39-153(c) is suspended until there is a termination of the State of Disaster Emergency only to the extent necessary to implement an adult care home's phased reopening plan and to implement any applicable recommendations or mandates from State or local health authorities. K.A.R. 28-39-153(c) shall otherwise be effective.
- 15.If KDADS has granted a provisional license to the adult care home, pursuant to K.S.A. 39-929, for the purpose of isolation/cohorting of residents in

response to the COVID-19 pandemic, adult care homes licensing requirements identified in K.S.A. 39-939(a), K.A.R. 26-40-301, K.A.R. 26-40-303 through 26-40-305, and K.A.R. 28-39-254 through 28-39-256 are suspended until 90 days following the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. K.S.A. 39-939(a), K.A.R. 26-40-301, K.A.R. 26-40-303 through 26-40-305, and K.A.R. 28-39-254 through 28-39-256 shall otherwise be effective

General Provisions and Definitions

- 16. Additional guidance shall be provided by the responsible state agency to assist with implementation of this executive order.
- 17. For purposes of this Order, a "state agency" has the meaning set forth in K.S.A. 75-3701, and reports to or is otherwise located within an executive office under the control of the Governor.
- 18. For purposes of this Order, "in good standing" shall include a license, certificate, permit, or registration that is subject to probation, or non-disciplinary conditions, limitations, or restrictions, but shall not include a license, certificate, permit, or registration that is revoked, cancelled, surrendered, or suspended. Any license, certificate, permit, or registration that is subject to disciplinary conditions, limitations, or restrictions shall remain subject to such conditions, limitations or restrictions
- 19. Nothing in this Order shall prevent any state agency or any board, commission, division or other licensing authority within a state agency from exercising its statutory or regulatory enforcement authority during the State of Disaster Emergency.
- 20. This Order should be read in conjunction with previous executive orders responding to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 21. Executive Order 20-41, as extended by Executive Order 20-49, is rescinded and replaced by this order.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 20-56. It shall become effective immediately and remain in force until rescinded, until September 15, 2020, or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency extended by House Bill 2016 enacted during the June 2020 special session relating to COVID-19, expires, whichever is earlier.

A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impact of the regulations follows:

K.A.R. 66-6-1, as proposed, states the specifications for the licensee's professional seal. The proposed regulation clarifies the design of the seal and is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-6-10, as proposed, replaces the term previously used for continuing education from professional development hours to continuing education units or CEU's and states that an individual in inactive status or emeritus status shall not practice a technical profession in Kansas. The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-7-1, as proposed, states the documents and information to be submitted with an application to the board. The proposed regulation lists documents and information to be submitted and is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-8-3, as proposed, allows applicants to take the professional engineering exam after passing the fundamentals of engineering exam and meeting the educational requirements but without meeting the experience requirements under K.S.A.74-7021. The proposed regulation removes the requirement to meet the years of work experience previously required before an applicant may apply to take the professional engineering exam. The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-8-4, as proposed, lists the examinations required for licensure as a professional surveyor in Kansas. These include the national council of examiners for engineering and surveying (NCEES) fundamentals of surveying, the NCEES principals of practice of surveying and the board's state-specific land surveying examination. The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-9-5, as proposed, adds in subsection (f) an alternative acceptable education surveying curriculum. The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-10-4, as proposed, changes the title of the regulation regarding required landscape architecture work experience to eliminate the words experience "of a character satisfactory to the board". The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-10-9, as proposed, changes the title of the regulation regarding required engineering experience to eliminate the words experience "of a character that is satisfactory to the board". The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-10-10b, as proposed, lists the survey experience required for licensure for an applicant who has completed a four year science curriculum other than surveying or engineering.

K.A.R. 66-10-10c, as proposed, lists the experience required for licensure for an applicant who has completed 12 semester hours of approved surveying coursework as allowed by new subsection (f) of K.A.R. 66-9-5. The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-10-12, as proposed, changes the title of the regulation regarding required surveying experience to eliminate the words experience "of a character satisfactory to the board". The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-10-13, as proposed, changes the title of the regulation regarding required geology experience to eliminate the words experience "of a character satisfactory to the board". The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 66-11-5, as proposed, lists the admission requirements for the fundamentals of surveying examination and adds successful completion of the new surveying curriculum specified in K.A.R. 66-9-5 (f). The regulation as proposed is not anticipated to have any economic impact.

A summary of the proposed amended regulations and the economic impact of the regulations follows:

K.A.R. 66-14-1, as proposed, changes the term previously used for continuing education from professional development hours to continuing education units or CEU's and states that 24 of the 30 CEU's required shall be related to health, safety, property and welfare for licensees licensed in one profession and 16 of the 20 CEU's required for licensees renewing their licenses in more than one profession. Additionally, the proposed regulation provides that a maximum of 10 CEU's may be obtained in any 24 hour period and that a maximum of 15 health, safety, property and welfare CEU's may be carried forward into a subsequent renewal period.

K.A.R. 66-14-2, as proposed, defines the terms college or university course continuing education unit, contact hour, continuing education activity continuing education unit and sponsor.

K.A.R. 66-14-3, as proposed, lists continuing education activities that satisfy the continuing education requirements.

K.A.R., 66-14-5, as proposed, states the computation for continuing education activities in continuing education units.

K.A.R. 66-14-6, as proposed, states exemptions for continuing education requirements.

K.A.R. 66-14-7, as proposed, states licensees are required to maintain records on forms prescribed by the board of continuing education units claimed by the licensee.

K.A.R., 66-14-8, as proposed, states continuing education requirements for reinstatement of a cancelled license.

K.A.R. 66-14-9, as proposed, states that each licensee shall provide proof of meeting the continuing education requirements as required by the board.

K.A.R. 66-14-10, as proposed, revokes the provisions of K.A.R. 66-14-10.

K.A.R. 66-14-11, as proposed, revokes the provisions of K.A.R. 66-14-11.

K.A.R. 66-14-12, as proposed, would allow applicants for renewal 120 days following notification of disallowance of any continuing education units by the board to substantiate the original claim or to earn other continuing education units to meet the minimum requirement.

The proposed regulations are not anticipated to have any significant economic impact.
