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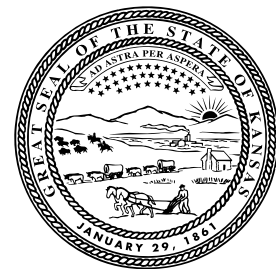

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 5.—FURBEARERS

115-5-1. Furbearers and coyotes; legal equipment, taking methods, and general provisions. (a) Hunting equipment permitted during furbearer hunting seasons and during coyote hunting seasons shall consist of the following:

- (1) Firearms, except fully automatic firearms;
- (2) archery equipment;
- (3) crossbows; and
- (4) optical scopes or sights that project no visible light toward the target and do not electronically amplify visible or infrared light, except as specified in subsection (d).

(b) Trapping equipment permitted during furbearer and coyote trapping seasons shall consist of the following:

- (1) Smooth-jawed foothold traps, except that all types of foothold traps may be used in water sets;
- (2) body-gripping traps;
- (3) box traps;
- (4) cage traps;
- (5) colony traps;
- (6) snares; and
- (7) deadfalls.

(c) The following general provisions shall apply to the taking of furbearers and coyotes:

- (1) Calls may be used in the taking of furbearers and coyotes.
- (2) Handheld, battery-powered flashlights, hat lamps, and handheld lanterns may be used while trapping furbearers or coyotes or while running furbearers.
- (3) Any .22 or .17 caliber rimfire rifle or handgun may be used to take trapped furbearers or trapped coyotes when using a light to check traps.

(4) Any .22 or .17 caliber rimfire rifle or handgun may be used while using a handheld, battery-powered flashlight, hat lamp, or handheld lantern to take furbearers treed with the aid of dogs.

(5) Lures, baits, and decoys may be used in the taking of furbearers and coyotes.

(6) The use of horses and mules shall be permitted while hunting, trapping, or running furbearers and coyotes.

(7) The use of motor vehicles for taking coyotes shall be permitted while hunting coyotes, except as provided in subsection (d).

(8) The use of radios in land or water vehicles shall be permitted for the taking of coyotes.

(9) The use of dogs for hunting and during running seasons shall be permitted.

(10) Each body-gripping trap with an inside jawsread of eight inches or greater, when measured across the jaws at a 90-degree angle, shall be used only in a water set.

(11) Only landowners or tenants of land immediately adjacent to the right-of-way of a public road, or their immediate family members or authorized agents, may set slide-locking wire or snare-type cable traps as dryland sets within five feet of a fence bordering a public road or within 50 feet of the outside edge of the surface of a public road. Only these landowners or tenants, or their immediate family members or authorized agents, may possess the fur, pelt, skin, or carcass of any furbearer or coyote removed from these devices located within these specified limits.

(12) A person shall not have in possession any equipment specified in subsection (a) while pursuing or chasing furbearers with hounds during the running season.

(13) All trapping devices included in subsection (b) shall be tagged with either the user's name and address or the user's department-issued identification number and shall be tended and inspected at least once every calendar day.

(14) Each foothold trap that has an outside jawsread greater than seven inches, when measured across the jaws at a 90-degree angle, shall be used only in a water set.

(d) From January 1 through March 31, the following provisions shall apply to the hunting of coyotes:

(1) Artificial light, scopes and equipment that amplify visible light, and thermal-imaging scopes and thermal-imaging equipment may be used for hunting.

(2) The use of vehicles when hunting with the equipment specified in paragraph (d)(1) shall be prohibited.

(3) The use of the equipment specified in paragraph (d)(1) shall not be authorized on department lands and waters.

(4) Each person using the equipment specified in paragraph (d)(1) in the manner prescribed in this subsection shall first obtain a permit from the department. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 32-807 and 32-1003; effective March 19, 1990; amended Nov. 15, 1993; amended July 19, 2002; amended Feb. 18, 2005; amended Sept. 4, 2009; amended July 22, 2011; amended July 26, 2013; amended May 31, 2019; amended Sept. 18, 2020.)

Article 6.—FUR DEALERS

115-6-1. Fur dealer license; application, authority, possession of furs, records, and revocation. (a) Each application shall be submitted on a form provided by the department. Each applicant shall provide the following information:

- (1) Name of applicant;
- (2) residential address;
- (3) the address of each business location;
- (4) an inventory of raw furs, pelts, skins, and carcasses of furbearing animals and coyotes on hand at time of application; and
- (5) any other relevant information as required by the secretary.

(continued)

(b) Each fur dealer license shall expire on June 30 following the date of issuance.

(c) Each fur dealer shall deal only with properly licensed persons and only at authorized fur dealer business locations.

(d) Any fur dealer may buy, purchase, or trade in the furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses of coyotes.

(e) Any fur dealer may possess legally acquired furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses of furbearing animals for no more than 30 days after the expiration date of the fur dealer's license. Coyote furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses may be possessed without limit in time.

(f) Each fur dealer shall purchase or acquire only those bobcat, otter, and swift fox pelts that have been tagged with a department export tag or with the official export tag provided by the wildlife agency of another state, except for any legally harvested swift fox pelt originating from a state that does not require an official export tag.

(g) Each fur dealer shall maintain a furharvester record book and a fur dealer book provided by the department or shall use a department-approved electronic record system. Entries shall be made in the appropriate record book or electronic record system whenever receiving, shipping, or otherwise disposing of furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses of furbearing animals or coyotes. Each record book or electronic record system, all receipts, and all furs, pelts, skins, and carcasses in the fur dealer's possession shall be subject to inspection upon demand by any conservation officer. Each record book or electronic record and all receipts shall be subject to copying upon demand by any conservation officer. Each fur dealer shall forward all record books or electronic records to the department annually on or before May 1.

(1) The furharvester record book or electronic record system shall include the following information:

- (A) The name of the fur dealer;
- (B) residential address;
- (C) fur dealer license number;
- (D) the date of each receipt of furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses;

(E) name, address, and license number of each person from whom furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses were acquired;

(F) name of the state where the furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses were harvested;

(G) number of each species of furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses acquired; and

(H) any other relevant information as required by the secretary.

(2) The fur dealer record book or electronic record system shall include the following information:

- (A) The name of the fur dealer;
- (B) residential address;
- (C) fur dealer license number;
- (D) date of each receipt or disposal of furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses;

(E) name, address, and fur dealer license number of each fur dealer from which furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses are acquired or to which they are sold;

(F) number and species of furs, pelts, skins, or carcasses acquired or sold; and

(G) any other relevant information as required by the secretary.

(h) In addition to other penalties prescribed by law, a fur dealer's license may be refused issuance or revoked by the secretary under any of the following circumstances:

(1) The application is incomplete or contains false information.

(2) The fur dealer fails to meet reporting requirements.

(3) The fur dealer violates license conditions.

(4) The fur dealer has violated department laws or regulations or has had any other department license or permit revoked or suspended. Temporary Administrative Regulations

Article 45.—ESCORT VEHICLES, ESCORT VEHICLE SERVICE PROVIDERS, AND ESCORT VEHICLE OPERATORS

36-45-1. Definitions. Each of the following terms, as used in this article of the department's regulations, shall have the meaning specified in this regulation:

(a) "Department" and "KDOT" mean the Kansas department of transportation.

(b) "Escort vehicle" and "EV" mean a vehicle that accompanies a load and meets the requirements of K.A.R. 36-45-5.

(c) "Escort vehicle operator" and "EVO" mean a person who is driving a vehicle that is accompanying a load and who meets the requirements of K.A.R. 36-45-4.

(d) "Escort vehicle service provider" and "EVSP" mean a person, firm, owner, or company that operates an escort vehicle for the purpose of accompanying a load as required by K.A.R. 36-1-36 and K.A.R. 36-1-38 and that meet the requirements of K.A.R. 35-45-2 and K.A.R. 36-45-3.

(e) "Escort vehicle service provider registrar" and "EVSP registrar" mean a department employee who makes the initial determination to revoke or deny any EVSP registration. The determination made by the EVSP registrar shall be deemed to be the decision of the secretary.

(f) "Height-measuring pole" and "height pole" mean a retractable and flexible device made of nonconductive material that measures vertical clearance. A height pole shall be used when the height of the permitted load exceeds 16 feet when measured from the ground to the highest point on the load.

Each height-measuring pole shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Be set at the height of the permitted load plus three inches;

(2) be securely attached to the EV and be designed and operated in a manner that will notify the EVO that the

load cannot safely pass under an overhead obstruction without causing damage to the obstruction, the load, or both; and

(3) not interfere with the ability of the EVO to safely operate the EV and communication equipment.

(g) "Large structure" means any load that exceeds either 16 feet, six inches in width or 18 feet in height.

(h) "Law enforcement agency" means the Kansas highway patrol (KHP) or any local law enforcement agency in Kansas.

(i) "Load" means either of the following:

(1) At least one item, object, or device, including self-propelled, that exceeds the maximum sizes or weights prescribed in K.S.A. 8-1902, 8-1904, 8-1908, and 8-1909, and amendments thereto; or

(2) the combination of an item, object, or device and a vehicle transporting the item, object, or device if the combination of these two exceeds the maximum sizes or weights prescribed in K.S.A. 8-1902, 8-1904, 8-1908, and 8-1909, and amendments thereto.

(j) "MUTCD" means the most recent edition of the manual on uniform traffic-control devices for streets and highways issued by the federal highway administration and adopted by the secretary of transportation pursuant to K.S.A. 8-2003, and amendments thereto.

(k) "Nondivisible," when used to describe a load or vehicle, means that the load or vehicle exceeds the applicable dimensions or weight limitations and, if separated into smaller loads or vehicles, would result in having any of the following effects:

(1) Compromise the intended use of the vehicle;

(2) destroy the value of the load or vehicle; or

(3) require more than eight work hours to dismantle, using appropriate equipment.

(l) "Permit" means a document issued by the secretary that grants the movement of a load or vehicle that exceeds the maximum sizes and weights as prescribed in K.S.A. 8-1902, 8-1904, 8-1908, and 8-1909, and amendments thereto, over the highways that are under the jurisdiction of the secretary.

(m) "Permitted route" means a designated course of travel that is over the highways under the jurisdiction of the secretary and has been approved by the secretary.

(n) "Secretary" means Kansas secretary of transportation or Kansas secretary of transportation's designee.

(o) "Superload" means either of the following:

(1) A load or a vehicle transporting a nondivisible load that exceeds a gross weight of 150,000 pounds; or

(2) a load or a vehicle transporting a nondivisible load in which any group or groups of axles exceed the limitations prescribed in K.A.R. 36-1-37.

(p) "Traffic-control operation" means the temporary suspension of normal traffic activity at locations of limited maneuverability, including any bridge or intersection, for the purpose of allowing a load to safely traverse the area in accordance with the MUTCD.

(q) "Vehicle" means any self-propelled device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or can be transported or drawn upon a public highway. The self-propelled device is designed to travel on at least four wheels in contact with the ground. This term shall not include electric personal assistive mobility devices, devices moved by hu-

man power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks, devices propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires but not operated on rails, and motorized nonhighway devices. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-2. Registration. Each EVSP shall register annually with the secretary. Each registration shall meet the requirements of this regulation.

(a) Each registration shall specify the following:

(1) The name and address of the EVSP;

(2) the name and address of the registered agent for the EVSP;

(3) the vehicle identification number (VIN) of each EV operated in Kansas; and

(4) the license plate number of each EV operated in Kansas.

(b) Each registrant shall attest to the following under penalty of perjury and revocation of the registration:

(1) That each EV operated in Kansas maintains the required insurance specified in K.A.R. 36-45-3;

(2) that the vehicle registration of each EV operated in Kansas is current in a state or territory of the United States;

(3) that each EVO possesses a current driver's license issued by the state or jurisdiction in which the EVO resides and, when operating as an EVO, the EVO is operating within any restrictions on the driver's license;

(4) that each EVO has successfully completed an escort vehicle training course from one of the states accepted and approved by the secretary and listed on the department's web site;

(5) that each EVO has a driving history without any conviction of driving while impaired, driving reckless, or both within the previous 36 months; and

(6) that each EVO is authorized to operate an EV for the EVSP. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-3. Insurance. (a) Each EVSP shall have in effect all motor vehicle liability insurance coverage required for each EV traveling pursuant to any EVSP registration approved under this article of the department's regulations on the date of EVSP registration. As a prerequisite for EVSP registration under K.A.R. 36-45-2, each EVSP shall maintain the minimum required insurance, self-insurance, or other financial security required by K.S.A. 40-3104, and amendments thereto, to cover any damage that could occur to any person or property, including highways and highway features, during movement of the load. Each insuring company shall be authorized to conduct business in Kansas.

(b) Each EVSP shall maintain the required insurance coverage for the duration of the EVSP registration and shall furnish proof of insurance upon demand by the department or any law enforcement agency.

(c) Failure to maintain the required insurance coverage throughout the duration of the EVSP registration shall

result in revocation of the EVSP registration. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-4. Escort vehicle operator. Each EVO shall meet the following requirements before operating any EV in Kansas:

(a) Have a driving history without any conviction of driving while impaired, driving reckless, or both within 36 months before operating any EV;

(b) successfully complete an escort vehicle training course from one of the states accepted and approved by the secretary and listed on the department's web site;

(c) be at least 18 years of age; and

(d) possess a current driver's license issued by the state or jurisdiction in which the EVO resides. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-5. Escort vehicle. Each EVSP shall ensure that each EV that is registered to the EVSP and operated in Kansas meets the following requirements:

(a) Meets all statutory requirements to operate legally on the highways;

(b) has at least two axles;

(c) is able to operate safely under the conditions found to exist upon any highway without endangering the safety of the traveling public and the persons involved in moving and escorting the load;

(d) does not exceed a gross vehicle weight rating of 16,000 pounds;

(e) has a clearly visible and current license plate attached to the rear of the EV at least 12 inches from the ground;

(f) has an unobstructed outside rear-view mirror on each side of the EV;

(g) has current registration in the state in which the EV is registered;

(h) has left and right signal lamps on the front and rear of the EV that are in operable condition;

(i) is equipped with a horn that is in operable condition and capable of emitting sound audible under normal conditions from a distance of at least 200 feet;

(j) is at least 60 inches wide and does not exceed 102 inches wide;

(k) has full visibility in all directions from the driver's side from within the vehicle; and

(l) has a sign on the driver's side and the passenger's side of the EV displaying the name of the EVSP during movement of the load. The name of the EVSP shall visibly contrast with the background of the sign so that the name of the EVSP is easily visible. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-6. Equipment. Each EVSP shall ensure that each EV that is accompanying a load in Kansas has, at a minimum, the following equipment meeting the requirements specified in this regulation:

(a) Communication equipment: one two-way communication device capable of transmitting and receiving signals for at least ½ mile and compatible with the device used by the driver of the load and the device used by each EVO during movement of the load;

(b) emergency equipment: one full-size spare tire compatible with the EV to continue travel, one vehicle jack appropriate for the EV, one lug wrench, eight bidirectional reflective triangles, eight red light-emitting flares, three 18-inch cones that are orange in color, and one fire extinguisher having an underwriters' laboratories' rating of 5 B:C or more;

(c) handheld warning flags: two handheld flags that are red or orange in color and at least 24 inches square;

(d) height-measuring pole;

(e) paddle signs: at least one standard "Stop" paddle sign and one standard "Slow" paddle sign. Each paddle sign shall be at least 18 inches wide with letters at least six inches high and shall meet the requirements of the MUTCD;

(f) personal safety equipment: one high-visibility hard hat and one high-visibility vest or jacket that meet the requirements of the MUTCD;

(g) warning sign: one warning sign that states "OVER-SIZE LOAD." The letters shall be black on a yellow background and shall be at least eight inches high with a minimum brush stroke of 1.125 inches. The sign shall not obstruct the warning light or lights. The sign shall be at least five feet long and 12 inches high and shall be visible from a minimum distance of 500 feet;

(h) warning light or lights: either one oscillating or rotating light or two flashing lights. Each warning light shall be amber in color, at least six inches in diameter, and fully visible from all directions from a minimum distance of 500 feet. The warning light or lights shall not be obstructed by the warning sign; and

(i) vehicle warning flags: two vehicle flags red or orange in color and at least 18 inches square. Each flag shall be capable of being placed on the driver's or passenger's side of the EV. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-7. Documentation for permitted route. (a) Pretrip requirements. Each designated EVO shall ensure and document that the requirements of this subsection are met before accompanying each load.

(1) Planning and coordination meeting. A planning and coordination meeting shall be held no more than seven days before accompanying a load. Each person who will be accompanying or moving the load shall attend the meeting. The meeting shall accomplish each of the following:

(A) Designate one or more EVO to complete the pretrip and posttrip evaluation;

(B) establish the communication equipment and hand signals used during movement of the load;

(C) discuss the conditions and restrictions of the permitted route;

(D) review the procedures and requirements of this article of the department's regulations for compliance; and

(E) verify the type and dimensions of the load.

(2) Equipment inspections. Each EVO shall inspect the equipment to verify compliance with K.A.R. 36-45-6.

(3) Escort vehicle inspections. Each EVO shall inspect the EV for defects and verify that the EV meets the requirements of K.A.R. 36-45-5.

(b) Route survey. An EVO who will be accompanying the load shall conduct a survey of the permitted route no more than 14 days before accompanying the load.

(c) Posttrip requirements. A designated EVO shall complete a posttrip evaluation at the conclusion of movement of the load within Kansas. Each posttrip evaluation shall document the following:

(1) Each incident in which any communication equipment was defective, blocked, or otherwise failed to properly function and resulted in property damage, personal injury, or both;

(2) any warnings, citations, and enforcement actions taken by any law enforcement agency, the identity of each law enforcement agency, and, if applicable, each accident report number and citation number;

(3) any issues with the equipment required by K.A.R. 36-45-6 resulting in property damage, personal injury, or both;

(4) any injuries to persons resulting from accompanying the load;

(5) any load incidents, including tipping, spilling, or breaking, and the time, date, and location of each load incident;

(6) any incidents involving property damage resulting from movement of the load, accompanying the load, or both, and the time, date, location, and the property damaged in the incident;

(7) any traffic-control operations that exceeded 15 minutes, and the time, date, location, and purpose of each traffic-control operation;

(8) any vehicle issues, including any signal lamp failure, brake failure, tire failure, and engine failure, if any failure resulted in property damage, bodily injury, or both; and

(9) the identity of any additional persons or entities not identified in the pretrip evaluation that were utilized or contacted during the movement of the load for emergency purposes.

(d) Trip report. The trip report shall consist of each pretrip and posttrip evaluation. The EVSP shall retain each trip report for at least three years from the date of conclusion of movement of the load within Kansas. The EVSP shall submit a complete copy of the trip report to the department upon the department's request. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-8. Trip procedures. Each EVO shall follow the procedures specified in this regulation when accompanying a load in Kansas.

(a) Limitation of the EV. No EV shall carry any item, object, or device that meets any of the following conditions:

(1) Exceeds the maximum sizes and weights specified in K.S.A. 8-1902, 8-1904, 8-1908, and 8-1909, and amendments thereto;

(2) exceeds the width, length, or height of the EV, excluding the height pole and the required safety and visibility equipment;

(3) renders the EV unrecognizable as an EV by the traveling public;

(4) obstructs the view of the EVO, the driver of the load, or the view of the traveling public;

(5) poses a safety risk to the EVO, the driver of the load, or the traveling public; or

(6) restricts or impairs the EVO's ability to operate the EV or limits the EVO's ability to comply with this article of the department's regulations.

(b) Height-measuring pole. At least one EV preceding a load that exceeds a height of 16 feet shall have a height pole.

(c) Number of EVs required.

(1) Superloads. At least one front EV and one rear EV shall be required when accompanying a superload. If the permit requires the superload to slow down at bridges, an additional EV shall be required.

(2) Large structures. At least one front EV and one rear EV shall be required when accompanying a large structure.

(3) Loads exceeding 14 feet in width. At least one front EV and one rear EV shall be required when accompanying a load exceeding 14 feet in width. The rear EV may be eliminated if all of the following conditions are met:

(A) A warning light is attached to the top of the load.

(B) A warning light is attached to the rear of the load no less than two feet but no more than eight feet above the surface of the road.

(C) A warning sign meeting the requirements of K.S.A. 8-1911(l)(1), and amendments thereto, is attached to the rear of the load.

(d) Load. No EV shall transport, push, or pull any portion of the load while accompanying the load.

(e) Permitted route. No EVO shall accompany the load on any roadway on which the load has not been authorized to travel.

(f) Restrictions. No EV shall tow a trailer during movement of the load.

(g) Traffic-control operations.

(1) Any EVO may conduct a traffic-control operation during the movement of the load for the purpose of accompanying the load, not to exceed 15 minutes. A traffic-control operation may be appropriate if any of the following conditions is met:

(A) A bridge or roadway is temporarily closed to allow the load to cross.

(B) An intersection with limited maneuverability is temporarily closed to allow the load to turn.

(C) The load or an EV malfunctions.

(D) An event makes load movement unsafe or impossible.

(2) Each traffic-control operation shall be conducted from outside the EV using the equipment specified in K.A.R. 36-45-6(a), (c), (e), (f), and (h). Each traffic-control operation shall follow the procedures specified in the MUTCD.

(3) If a traffic-control operation is anticipated to last longer than 15 minutes, the law enforcement agency or the local area KDOT office shall be notified.

(continued)

(h) Travel distance.

(1) Front EV and rear EV. Except as specified in paragraph (h)(2), the requirements of paragraph (h)(1) shall apply. When traveling within city limits, the EV immediately preceding the load shall not travel more than 300 feet to the front of the load. When traveling outside of city limits, the EV immediately preceding the load shall not travel more than 1,000 feet to the front of the load. The EV immediately following the load shall not travel more than 300 feet to the rear of the load.

(2) Visibility; temporary conditions. The load shall be visible to the EVs immediately preceding and following the load at all times unless temporary conditions, including blind curves, steep grades, upcoming bridges and overhead obstructions, and intersections requiring traffic-control operations, temporarily dictate a greater lead or follow distance than specified in this subsection.

(i) Trip communications. Each EVO shall communicate verbally using two-way communication equipment with the person transporting the load and with each EVO accompanying the load.

(j) Warning flags. A warning flag shall be securely attached to the driver's side of the EV and to the passenger's side of the EV.

(k) Warning lights. The warning light or lights attached to the EV shall be activated during movement of the load and shall meet the requirements in K.A.R. 36-45-6(h).

(l) Warning signs.

(1) Front EV. Each EV preceding a load shall have a warning sign, as specified in K.A.R. 36-45-6(g), attached to the front or top of the EV and shall be visible to the traveling public preceding or approaching the EV.

(2) Rear EV. Each EV following a load shall have a warning sign, as specified in K.A.R. 36-45-6(g), attached to the top or rear of the EV and shall be visible to the traveling public approaching the load from the rear.

(m) Responsibilities when any EV is not accompanying a load. Each EVO shall meet all of the following requirements when the EV is being driven and not accompanying the load:

(1) The height pole shall be retracted or removed from the EV.

(2) The warning flags shall be removed from the EV.

(3) The warning light or lights attached to the EV shall be removed, deactivated, or covered.

(4) The warning sign attached to the EV shall be removed or covered. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921 and K.S.A. 68-404; implementing K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1911, K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921, and K.S.A. 66-1326; effective, T-36-8-28-20, Aug. 28, 2020.)

36-45-10. Determination of registration revocation or denial; registration committee. The procedures specified in this regulation shall be followed for each determination to revoke or deny any EVSP registration.

(a) Determination of registration revocation or denial.

(1) The registration of an EVSP shall be revoked or denied by the EVSP registrar for failing to comply with any provision of this article of the department's regulations or any other applicable law.

(2) If the registration of an EVSP is revoked or denied by the EVSP registrar, the EVSP registrar shall provide

written notice of the revocation or denial to the EVSP. Each notice of revocation or denial shall be sent by certified mail to the EVSP no more than 15 business days from the date the EVSP registrar revokes or denies the registration of the EVSP.

(b) Appeals of registration revocation or denial.

(1) Each EVSP whose EVSP registration is revoked or denied shall be entitled to an appeal if the EVSP files a written appeal with the EVSP registrar and the appeal is received by the EVSP registrar, either electronically or by U.S. mail, within 30 days of notification of the registration revocation or denial.

(2) Each appeal shall be filed on a form provided by the department. The appeal form for EVSP registration revocation or denial shall be available on the department's web site. Upon the request of the EVSP, the EVSP registrar shall provide a paper copy of the appeal form by certified mail.

(3) If an EVSP files an appeal of a revocation of registration according to this regulation, the EVSP registration shall be valid, pending final determination of revocation by the EVSP registration committee.

(4) If an EVSP files an appeal of a denial of registration according to this regulation, the EVSP registration shall be deemed invalid, pending a final determination of the denial by the EVSP registration committee.

(5) If an EVSP fails to file an appeal according to this regulation, the revocation or denial determination by the EVSP registrar shall become final, upon expiration of the appeal period.

(c) Registration committee.

(1) A committee of at least three members shall be established by the secretary to act as an appellate body to hear and determine appeals concerning revocations and denials of EVSP registrations. The members of the registration committee shall be appointed by the secretary and shall serve at the pleasure of the secretary.

(2) The registration committee shall be chaired by the EVSP registrar. The EVSP registrar shall be a non-voting member of the committee.

(d) Decisions of registration committee.

(1) If an appeal is filed according to this regulation, the EVSP registration committee shall make a final determination to revoke, deny, or reinstate the EVSP registration.

(2) Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-601 et seq. and amendments thereto, the decisions of the registration committee shall not be subject to further administrative review by any officer or committee of the department.

(3) If the registration committee determines that the EVSP registration of the appealing EVSP should not have been revoked or denied, the registration of the EVSP shall be reinstated, effective immediately.

(4) If the registration committee affirms the revocation of the EVSP registration of the appealing EVSP, the EVSP shall not register with the secretary for one year from the original date of the initial revocation made by the EVSP registrar.

(5) If the registration committee affirms the denial of the EVSP registration, the EVSP shall not register with the secretary until the EVSP remedies the cause or causes for the denial. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 8-1921

Article 601.—SOUTHEAST GAMING ZONE

111-601-4. Cards, number of decks, and value of cards. (a) Blackjack shall be played with two or six decks of standard playing cards with no jokers.

(b) The value of the cards contained in each deck shall be as follows:

- (1) Any card from 2 to 10 shall have its face value.
- (2) Any jack, queen or king shall have a value of 10.
- (3) An ace shall have a value of 11 unless that would give a player or the dealer a total in excess of 21, in which case, it shall have a value of one. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-2-17, Nov. 9, 2016; amended, T-111-8-6-20, July 8, 2020.)

111-601-6. Rules of the game. (a) The cards shall be shuffled under the following circumstances:

- (1) A new set of decks are put into play.
- (2) When the cut card appears during the course of the play. The shuffle will take place prior to the next round of play.
- (3) Whenever the cards have been dropped or otherwise mishandled by the dealer.
- (4) Whenever instructed to do so by the table game supervisor or higher ranking casino official.
- (5) At no time will the dealer shuffle at the request of a player unless authorized to do so by a table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official.

(b) The dealer is to maintain physical and visual contact with the cards at all times while the cards are out of the shoe; however, the cards shall be placed back in the dealer's shoe for commencement of play.

- (c) A card shall be burned for the following reasons:
 - (1) After a shuffle of the cards.
 - (2) A card has been exposed or dealt by mistake unless the card was exposed or dealt by mistake to the player in the last occupied player position immediately before the dealer.

(3) When a dealer is relieved, the new dealer shall burn a card.

(4) If for any period of time there are no players at a table, upon the arrival of new players, the dealer shall burn a card.

(d) All cards shall be dealt from a dealing shoe secured to and located on the extreme left-hand side of the table.

(e) All players' cards should be delivered face up, starting on the dealer's left and continuing clockwise around the table.

(f) After each player has received one card, the dealer shall take one card face down. A second card should be dealt to each player face up and the dealer's second card will be dealt face down. The dealer's second card should be placed underneath the dealer's first card, the first card is now turned face up and should cover the second card in such a way that no part of that card is visible.

(g) Cards shall not touch a player's bet and shall be placed in a manner which allows the center spot of each

card to be visible.

(h) Players shall not handle any of the cards.

(i) After two cards have been dealt to each player and the dealer, the dealer shall start with the player to the left and continue to the right until all players have acted upon the hand.

(j) Players shall indicate hit or stand by using visible hand signals.

(k) All hit cards are dealt face-up, utilizing the left hand for positions one and two, and the right hand for positions three through seven.

(l) After all players' hands have stood or broken, the dealer shall turn the dealer's hole card face-up and announce the point total.

(m) If there are players' hands still in action, the dealer must take a hit if the value of the dealer's cards totals 16 or less or a soft 17, but stand on a hard 17 or more.

(n) The dealer shall announce "over", "too many" or "busted" when the dealer's hand exceeds 21.

(o) The dealer shall then take or pay according to the hands dealt.

(p) A dealer accidentally hitting his hand while having a hard seventeen or more shall contact the table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official who shall handle the situation accordingly.

(q) A player may elect to double down with any initial two cards, and bet up to the amount of the player's original bet on the condition that only one additional card shall be dealt to the player.

(r) The additional chips for the double-down bet should be placed next to the original wager before the double down card is dealt.

(s) The double down card will be exposed and placed across the two cards involved, in such a manner as to keep the number exposed on the player's second card.

(t) When paying double down bets, the dealer shall not combine the chips used to pay the bet with the player's chips used to make the bet into a single stack, but instead shall stack the chips used to pay the bet next to the player's chips. The dealer is not permitted to move the player's bet with chips in the dealer's hand.

(u) Whenever the initial two cards to a player are of the same face value, the player may elect to split the cards into two separate hands, provided that the player makes a bet equal to the original bet. The following rules apply to splitting cards:

(1) After splitting, the first hand will receive a card. This hand will be completed by either hitting again or staying before the next hand is dealt to.

(2) The second hand will receive a card. This hand will be completed by either hitting again or staying before moving on to the next hand.

(3) A player may split up to three times excluding aces which may only be split once. When aces are split, the player will only receive one card per ace.

(v) The dealer will ask if any player wishes to place an insurance bet when the dealer's up card is an ace.

(w) Insurance is a separate bet. The player is betting that the dealer has blackjack. If the dealer does not have blackjack, then the player loses the player's insurance bet.

(continued)

(x) The player can take insurance for any amount up to one-half of the original bet.

(y) The insurance bet shall be placed on the insurance line on the table layout.

(z) The dealer will then verbally close the time for accepting insurance bets.

(aa) If the dealer's hand is a blackjack and the player has taken insurance, the dealer will take the losing bet and pay off the winning insurance bet with the losing bet in an amount not to exceed the player's original bet. Insurance will be paid at a rate of 2 to 1.

(bb) If the player's hand is a blackjack and the dealer's up card is an ace, the player can announce even money and be paid the amount of the player's bet.

(cc) Players may insure a toke bet and the bet is handled by the same procedure as any other insurance bet.

(dd) A player may place more than one-half of their original bet on the insurance line but only one-half of their original bet is in action. Any overage will be returned to the player after it is determined that the dealer does or does not have blackjack.

(ee) All blackjacks will be paid at odds of 3 to 2. The dealer shall pay the player having a blackjack during the normal course of the dealer's take and pay procedures.

(ff) If the dealer and a player have blackjack, the player's bet will be a push.

(gg) If the dealer looks at the dealer's hole card and fails to recognize the fact the dealer has a blackjack, the dealer's hand will be played as a total of 21 only, and not as a blackjack. A player that doubles down or splits will receive back any additional wagers made after their initial wager.

(hh) Any player's hand that exceeds a total of 21 has broke or "busted" and their hand loses.

(ii) If the dealer has an up card with the value of ten, the dealer will use the peeking device built into the gaming table to check to see if the dealer has a blackjack.

(jj) If the dealer has a blackjack all losing bets will be collected and all blackjacks will push.

(kk) If the dealer does not have blackjack the hand will continue as normal.

(ll) A card found turned upwards in the shoe shall not be used in that game and shall be placed in the discard rack.

(mm) A card drawn in error without its face being exposed shall be used as though it were the next card from the shoe.

(nn) After the initial two cards have been dealt to each player and a card is drawn in error and exposed to the players, such card shall be placed in the discard rack and will not be offered to any player or to the dealer unless the card was dealt by mistake to the player in the last occupied player position immediately before the dealer. In that case, if the card is needed by the dealer to complete the dealer's hand, then the card shall be retained by the dealer. If the card is not needed by the dealer to complete the dealer's hand, then the card shall be placed in the discard rack.

(oo) If the dealer has a point total of a hard seventeen or more and accidentally draws a card for the dealer, such card shall be placed in the discard rack.

(pp) If the dealer misses dealing his first or second card to the dealer, the dealer shall continue dealing the first

two cards to each player, and then deal the appropriate number of cards to the dealer.

(qq) If there are insufficient cards remaining to complete a round of play, all of the cards in the discard rack shall be shuffled and cut, the first card shall be drawn face down and placed in the discard rack, and the dealer shall complete the round of play.

(rr) If no cards or only one card is dealt to a player's hand, the hand is dead, any wager made is returned to the player and the player shall be included in the next deal.

(ss) If any card is dealt and an error occurs, at no time as a result of the error will any card dealt to a player be taken from that player and dealt to another player.

(tt) If a dispute occurs because of a mistake during a hand by the dealer or a player, the table games supervisor or higher ranking casino official shall be authorized to declare that all or part of the hand is void and can return any disputed money.

(uu) If offered at the blackjack table, a player making a wager against the dealer may also make an optional three card poker wager in the area on the table designated for that optional wager so long as the wager is made prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe.

(vv) If a player makes an optional three-card poker wager, the player may also make a three-card toke bet so long as the toke bet is made prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe.

(ww) Resolution of all optional three-card poker wagers shall be made after all players and the dealer have received their second card and before the blackjack game continues.

(xx) An optional three-card poker wager will win if the dealer's card dealt face up and the player's two cards combined equal one of the following three-card poker hands:

- (1) A "flush";
- (2) A "straight";
- (3) A "three of a kind"; or,
- (4) A "straight flush."

(yy) All winning three-card poker wagers shall be paid at the rate of nine to one.

(zz) All three-card poker wagers shall be taken or paid from the dealer's right to left before the blackjack portion of the game continues.

(aaa) If offered at the blackjack table, a player making a wager against the dealer and three-card poker wager may also make an optional "Top 3" wager. The following describes a list of the permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win and a loss for Top 3 wagers:

(1) An optional Top 3 wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area on the gaming table layout designated for the Top 3 wager.

(2) An additional Top 3 wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(3) A Top 3 wager will win if the dealer's card dealt face up and the player's original two cards combined equal a three of a kind, straight flush, or a suited three of a kind.

(4) A Top 3 wager will lose if the dealer's card dealt face up and the player's original two cards combined do not equal a three of a kind, straight flush, or a suited three of a kind.

(5) Winning Top 3 wagers will be paid out as follows:

(A) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's card dealt face up combined equal a three of a kind the hand will be paid at a rate of 90 to 1.

(B) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's card dealt face up combined equal a straight flush the hand will be paid at a rate of 180 to 1.

(C) When the player's original two cards and the dealer's card dealt face up combined equal a suited three of a kind the hand will be paid at a rate of 270 to 1.

(D) All Top 3 wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues.

(bbb) If offered at a blackjack table at which one, two or six decks of cards are being used, a player making a blackjack wager may also make an optional "Lucky Ladies" wager. The following describes a list of the permissible wagers, payout odds, and what constitutes a win or loss for Lucky Ladies wagers:

(1) An optional Lucky Ladies wager may be made by the player prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe in an area on the gaming table layout designated for the Lucky Ladies wager.

(2) An additional Lucky Ladies wager may be made as a tip for the dealer.

(3) A Lucky Ladies wager will win if the sum of the player's first two cards is twenty (20).

(4) A Lucky Ladies wager will lose if the sum of the player's first two cards is anything other than twenty (20).

(5) Winning Lucky Ladies wagers will be paid out as follows:

(A) When the player's first two cards are both queens of hearts and the dealer's hand constitutes a blackjack, the optional side bet will be paid at a rate of 1,000 to 1.

(B) When the player's first two cards are both queens of hearts and the dealer's hand constitutes anything other than a blackjack, the optional side bet will be paid at a rate of 125 to 1 for games in which six decks of playing cards are being used or at a rate of 200 to 1 for games in which two decks of playing cards are being used.

(C) When the player's first two cards are identical but not queens of hearts, and each card has a value of 10, the optional side bet will be paid at a rate of 19 to 1 for games in which six decks of playing cards are being used or at a rate of 25 to 1 for games in which two decks of playing cards are being used.

(D) When the player's first two cards are not identical but are both in the same suit and the sum of the two cards is 20, the optional side bet will be paid at a rate of 9 to 1 for games in which six decks of playing cards are being used or at a rate of 10 to 1 for games in which two decks of playing cards are being used.

(E) When the sum of the player's first two cards is 20 and the cards are in two different suits and are not identical, the optional side bet will be paid at a rate of 4 to 1.

(F) All Lucky Ladies wagers will be taken or paid before the blackjack portion of the game continues. Beginning from the dealer's right and proceeding counter-clockwise around the gaming table, the dealer shall take all losing Lucky Ladies wagers and pay all winning Lucky Ladies wagers, except that if any player making a Lucky Ladies wager is dealt two queens of hearts and the dealer's card

dealt face up is an ace, king, queen, jack or ten, then the dealer shall immediately notify the casino table games supervisor. Upon the table games supervisor's direction the dealer shall then perform the following steps:

(1) Remove all losing Lucky Ladies wagers and pay all winning Lucky Ladies wagers, except for the player(s) with the two queens of hearts:

(2) If the dealer's card dealt face up is a king, queen, jack or ten, the following steps shall be performed:

(i) Upon the table games supervisor's instruction, the dealer shall view the dealer's card that was dealt face down without revealing the card to anyone else;

(ii) If the dealer determines the dealer's hand does not constitute a blackjack, the dealer shall pay any player with the two queens of hearts and the round of play shall then proceed;

(iii) If the dealer determines the dealer's hand does constitute a blackjack, the dealer shall turn over the card that was dealt to the dealer face down and collect all losing blackjack wagers from all players. The dealer shall then remove all of the players' cards remaining on the table layout, if any, except for any player's hand with the two queens of hearts, at which time the dealer shall pay the Lucky Ladies wager to the player with the winning hand and then remove all remaining cards from the table layout.

(3) If the dealer's card dealt face up is an ace, the following steps shall be performed:

(i) The dealer shall offer insurance to all players;

(ii) If the dealer does not have a blackjack, the dealer shall remove all losing insurance wagers. The dealer shall then pay the Lucky Ladies wager to any player with two queens of hearts and the round of play shall then proceed;

(iii) If the dealer does have a blackjack, the dealer shall turn over the dealer's card that was dealt face down and collect all losing blackjack wagers and pay all winning insurance wagers from all players. The dealer shall then remove all of the players' cards on the table layout except for any player with the two queens of hearts. The dealer shall then pay the Lucky Ladies wager to any player with the two queens of hearts and then remove all remaining cards from the table layout.

(4) The outcome of a Lucky Ladies wager shall have no bearing on the wager against the dealer. Once all Lucky Ladies wagers have been resolved the blackjack game shall proceed as normal.

(ccc) If the optional bonus spin wager is offered at a table, a player may also make a bonus spin wager by placing a \$5.00 wager on the designated wagering area of the layout prior to the first card of the hand being removed from the shoe. The outcome of the bonus spin wager shall have no bearing on any other wager made by the player.

(1) A player placing an optional bonus spin wager may win in one of two different ways. If either of the player's first two cards is an ace but the player's hand does not constitute a blackjack, the player will be paid \$10 on the optional wager, which shall be paid immediately before the game continues. If the first two cards of the player's hand constitute a blackjack, the player will be entitled to a bonus spin, which will take place at the end of the round of play. Split hands cannot win the bonus spin wager.

(continued)

(2) Located on each gaming table that offers the bonus spin wager will be an electronic graphic representation of a wheel equally divided into twelve segments. If no player is entitled to a bonus spin, the next round of play shall commence. If one or more players are entitled to a bonus spin, moving from the dealer's left to right each such player shall in turn touch a lighted sensor located on the table gaming layout, which shall cause the electronic wheel to rotate and eventually stop on one of the twelve segments. If only one prize amount appears in the segment where the wheel stops, the player spinning the wheel shall win that prize amount. If the wheel stops on a segment containing two prize amounts, the player spinning the wheel shall receive the higher of the two prize amounts and the other players at the table that also made a bonus spin wager during that round of play, if any, shall each receive the smaller of the two prize amounts. The prizes available to win on each of the twelve segments and the approximate expected frequency of the wheel stopping on each segment every 40,000 spins are as follows:
